> <u>Specifics of Meeting:</u> 1989 ACYOA General Assembly - The Minutes of the 1989 ACYOA General Assembly were thoroughly reviewed and corrections were made. <u>ACYOA Cultural Day</u> - The Council met with the Rev. Fr. Vertanes Kalayjian, Pastor of St. Mary Armenian Church in Washington,

D.C., to discuss program details. <u>Fund Raising</u> - Stephanie Masoian and Linda Minassian, Co-Chairmen of the ACYOA National Fund Raising Committee, presented several fund raising suggestions for the Council's consideration. Hye Hokin - The theme for the Winter issue ("Directions For A New Decade") and potential contributors were discussed. Chapter "A" Assistance Program - The Council decided to send the "Mission Team" from Providence to Livingston. 75th Anniversary Commemoration of the Genocide - As the Council was unaware at this time of what the Diocesan plan was with regard to the commemoration, it decided to recommend that each chapter sponsor a hokejash after church services on the Sunday of commemoration, so as to not put the organization in a situation of conflict. Memorial Project In Memory of His Grace, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan - The Council discussed many ideas and possibilities with which to honor our beloved founder. In light of Srpazan Tiran's commitment and dedication to the St. Nersess Armenian Seminary, the Council wanted to coordinate the project with the building of the After much discussion, the Council Nersoyan Library at the Seminary. felt that it would be most befitting to commission a khatchkar for the Library in Srpazan's memory.

The following were thoroughly reviewed and discussed: the organization's financial status, correspondence, parish visitations, the 1989 General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the New England Regional Anniversary Ball, the Mid-West Regional Anniversary Ball, 1990 Anniversary Balls, the Christian Leadership Seminar, the ACYOA Cultural Day, the 1990 Chapter "A" Assistance Program, the banquet in honor of His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, the ACYOA Cultural Weekend, the Hye Christian Encounter, the 1990 Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament, the 1990 Armenian Studies Program, <u>Hye Hokin</u>, the national mailing list, the membership status, the ACYOA Membership Handbook/Directory, the ACYOA Chapter Resource Handbook, National Fund Raising, and the ACYOA College Coordinator position.

> <u>Specifics of Meeting:</u> <u>Administrative</u> - The Central Council reviewed the organization's financial status in detail, correspondence sent and received, and changes in the ACYOA Chapter Chairmen & Parish Contact Listing. <u>1989 ACYOA General Assembly/National Sports Weekend</u> - A great deal of discussion took place concerning those individuals who "illegally" participated in the athletic competitions and how to stop future activity of this kind from taking place. <u>National Anniversary</u> <u>Ball</u> - As no bids were received for regional anniversary balls, the Central Council decided to sponsor a National Anniversary Ball.

<u>March 17, 1990</u>: The Council met for one full day at the Diocese in New York City. Present at the meeting was Dr. Edward Onanian, our Diocesan Council liaison. The following were reviewed and discussed: the organization's financial status, membership dues, correspondence, parish visitations, the 1989 ACYOA General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the 1990 ACYOA General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the National Anniversary Ball, the 1990 Chapter "A" Assistance Program, the banquet in Honor of His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, the ACYOA Cultural Weekend, the Hye Christian Encounter, ACYOA participation in a special program commemorating the 75th Anniversary of the Genocide, the 1990 Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament, the Bibles for Armenia project, the 1990 Armenian Studies Program, <u>Hye Hokin</u>, the national mailing list, the purchase of the computer, the ACYOA Membership Handbook/Directory, the ACYOA Chapter Resource Handbook, National Fund Raising, regional meetings, and the ACYOA College Coordinator position.

<u>Specifics of Meeting:</u> <u>Administrative</u> - The Council reviewed the financial status of the <u>ACYOA</u> and correspondence sent and received. <u>1990 ACYOA General Assembly/National Sports Weekend</u> - The Council reviewed Cleveland's plans and discussed the possibility of adding a golf tournament to attract older participants and ACYOA alumni. <u>ACYOA</u> <u>Participation in Special Program Commemorating the 75th Anniversary of the Genocide</u> - A basic outline for a program involving the ACYOA, AYF, the Armenian Network, the ASA, and the Homenetmen, was reviewed. <u>Hye</u> <u>Hokin</u> - The theme for the Spring issue ("Politics") and potential contributors were discussed. <u>National Fund Raising</u> - Many new suggestions were received from and discussed with Dr. Onanian. <u>Discussion Re: Youth Involvement in the Armenian Church</u> - A lengthy discussion was held re: the lack of youth involvement with the Armenian Church, the support and lack of support of youth in general, and possible ways to combat problems and gain support.

May 4, 1990: The Council met for two hours during the beginning of the Archbishop's Tournament weekend in Worcester, MA. The issues discussed were: membership dues, the ACYOA Membership Handbook/Directory, the organization's financial status, the 1990 ACYOA General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, and the resignation of the ACYOA Executive Secretary.

June 8-9, 1990: The Council met for 8-10 hours over a period of two days to review and discuss the following: the organization's financial status, visitations, the 1989 membership status, correspondence, General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the 1990 General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the National Anniversary Ball, 1990-91 Christian Educational and Cultural Programs, the special Martyrs' Day Commemoration program sponsored by the youth, the 1990 Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament, the Bibles for Armenia project, the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Armenian Studies Hye Hokin, Mailing National Program. the List, the Membership Handbook/Directory, the Chapter Resource Handbook, National Fund Raising, College Student Program, the ACYOA Executive Secretary, the Chapter "A" Award and other matters relating to the General Assembly.

> <u>Special of Meeting:</u> <u>National Anniversary Ball</u> - The Council set January 26, 1990 as the date for the National Anniversary Ball with Mr. & Mrs. Edward and Helen Mardigian as our guests of honor. <u>Archbishop</u> <u>Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament</u> - The Council discussed the feasibility of having the Tournament in conjunction with the annual <u>College Student Program</u> - ACYOA College Coordinator, Nicole Mazmanian, provided the Council with a report of her activities since coming on board in March. General Assembly Preparation - The Council thoroughly

reviewed a draft of the annual report and discussed various responsibilities associated with the Assembly.

The Council thanks the staff at the Diocese and the Najarian family for their gracious hospitality in accommodating us at our meetings at the Diocese and in Sandwich, MA.

PROGRAMS

Armenian Studies Program: ACYOA Earthquake Relief Team Project June 20 - July 22, 1989

In place of the regular Armenian Studies Program, the Central Council accepted an invitation from His Holiness, Vasken I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, to send an ACYOA Earthquake Relief Team to Armenia to assist in the reconstruction efforts in the city of Stepanavan, Armenia. On June 20th, twenty-six ACYOA members journeyed to Armenia to build a onefamily house in the stricken city of Stepanavan. The task was completed successfully except for some interior finishing work subsequently completed by Monte Ricketts and Allan Cronk, construction professionals assigned by Kevork Hovnanian to be in charge of the project. All construction materials, food and camping supplies were sent in advance of the group; and Mr. Ricketts and Mr. Cronk also went earlier to supervise all infrastructure work.

The group was housed in a music school, a wooden structure replacing the one destroyed by the quake. They assembled showers and toilets shipped with their supplies and took care of all personal living requirements. They had occasion to visit many historical and religious sites in the area, as well as hospitals and homes, being exposed first-hand to the suffering and deprivation. Badarak was celebrated in various parishes by the Very Rev. Fr. Houssig Bagdasian, who led the group and helped to maintain a proper attitude at all times.

The people of Stepanavan were extremely hospitable, treating the group almost like family, grateful for what was being done and particularly grateful for the spirit which motivated them. Their attitude made it easier to bear the delays and difficulties that sometimes hampered the project.

The project proved to be successful in many ways. The house itself symbolized the intent of the Diocese to help rebuild. A strong bond developed between the people and the team members. And most importantly, the project represented a trial run for the massive community the Diocese is embarking upon, under the direction of the K. Hovnanian Company.

Sixty-four delegates participated in the Assembly from the following chapters: Bayside, Boca Raton, Cambridge, Cleveland, Dallas, Detroit, Evanston, Fair Lawn, Greenfield, Hartford, Houston, Lawrence, New Britain, Providence, San Antonio, Tenafly, Union City, Watertown, Watervliet, Westchester, Worcester and Wynnewood. Special guests included ACYO-WD Central Council Chairman, Darlene Ouzounian and ACYOC Central Council Chairman, Harry Sakarya.

Social highlights included a reception at the hotel and dinner at a Mexican restaurant.

In the final session on Friday morning, the Assembly expressed its sympathies and sorrow with respect to the passing of the former Primate and beloved founder of the ACYOA, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan.

His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, hosted a luncheon on Friday afternoon, wherein the delegates were given an opportunity to discuss various issues with the Primate.

1989 ACYOA National Sports Weekend September 1-4, 1990 (Houston, TX)

The 1989 ACYOA National Sports Weekend was hosted by the Houston ACYOA of St. Kevork Armenian Church from September 1-4, 1990. Co-Chairmen for the weekend were Monica Feredjian and Annabella Sahakian. Events were held at the Westin Galleria Hotel, the Farm & Ranch Club, and the University of Houston.

Approximately 350 people were in attendance throughout the weekend and over 200 athletes representing 15 chapters competed in the athletic competitions. Members of the ACYO-WD and ACYOC also participated.

The Awards Banquet took place on Sunday evening. Winners of the major athletic awards were: Greenfield - Babayan Cup (most total points); Greenfield - Masis Cup (highest average # of average points per participant); Team Canada - John Kulhanjian Memorial Award (outstanding team sportsmanship); and Greg Arpajian (Cleveland) - Charles Yaghoobian Individual Sportsmanship Award (outstanding individual sportsmanship).

The 1989 Sam Nersessian Award (annually given to a member who demonstrates the Christian virtues of love, patience, humility and understanding) was presented to Robert Shamgochian (Worcester). Outstanding Young Christian Awards were presented to: Sara Andonian (Detroit); Ara Bagdasarian (Cleveland); Liza Hartounian (Cambridge); Dawn Maksud (Greenfield); Armand Paboojian (Watertown); and Greg Yekhtigian (Providence).

The Chapter "A" Award (given to the chapter which best fulfills the standards and requirements set forth by the National Organization) went to Providence. The Honorable Mention Award was given to Watertown and Chapter Achievement Awards were presented to Cambridge, Cleveland, Detroit and Worcester. Certificates of Special Recognition were also awarded to the chairmen of all national and regional events and committees, as well as the General Assembly officers.

His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, presented the 1989 ACYOA Alumni Award to astronaut, Dr. James Bagian, a member of the Orbiter Discovery Shuttle Crew launched in March of 1989.

Dean Shahinian once again organized and directed the "Insights" series of lectures and discussions which took place at the athletic facility and coincided with the games.

In light of the passing of His Grace, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan, the founder and father of the ACYOA, all dances were cancelled.

ACYOA New England Regional Anniversary Ball September 29 - October 1, 1989

The Hartford chapter hosted the 1989 New England Regional Anniversary Ball Weekend from September 29 - October 1, 1989.

Dr. Dennis Papazian, noted Armenian scholar and former ACYOA Central Council Chairman, was the guest of honor at the banquet on Saturday evening. Over 350 people attended the dance, entertainment for which was provided by the Roger Krikorian Ensemble and Shami Arslanian.

Following Badarak on Sunday, Stephanie Masoian and Linda Minassian spoke on their experiences in Stepanavan, Armenia, as part of the ACYOA Earthquake Relief Team. Following their presentation, a brunch was served in the church hall.

The weekend was very well organized and also included an evening at "Cafe Hagop" on Friday night, a scavenger hunt on Saturday morning and a picnic on Saturday afternoon.

Christian Leadership Seminar November 11, 1989 (New Britain, CT)

The Christian Leadership Seminar was held in New Britain on Saturday, November 11th. Over 60 people attended the seminar sponsored by the ACYOA Central Council and organized by the New Britain chapter. Speakers included the Rev. Fr. Michael Buttero, Pastor of the Armenian Church of the Holy Resurrection; Mr. Clement Ashekian, a member of the Diocesan Council; and a management consultant from Pratt Whitney. Much thanks to Arthur Simonian for coordinating the program. The seminar is conducted annually as part of an ongoing effort to educate our members about effective leadership within the Armenian Church.

ACYOA Cultural Day December 2, 1989 (Washington, D.C.)

The first ACYOA Cultural Day was held on Saturday, December 2nd in Washington, D.C. and was hosted by the Washington ACYOA. Over 85 people were in attendance at the one-day symposium sponsored by the ACYOA Central Council and organized by the Armenian Language Lab and Resource Center (ALLARC) under the direction of ALLARC Director, Sylva Der Stepanian. The theme was "Charting The Course For A Golden Era" and featured presentations by the Rev. Dr. Krikor Maksoudian, Dr. John Vartan, Dr. Kevork Bardakjian, Dr. Abraham Terian, Dr. James Jacobson and Sylva Der Stepanian.

The program included breakfast, lunch and dinner and was free of charge to ACYOA dues-paid members.

The Council extends its thanks to Sylva, the Rev. Fr. Vertanes Kalaydjian, the Washington ACYOA and the parish of St. Mary Armenian Church.

Chapter "A" Assistance Program January 20-21, 1990 (Livingston, NJ)

The ACYOA Chapter "A" Award, annually given to the chapter that best fulfills the standards and requirements set forth by the ACYOA Central Council, is based on a point system, whereby the chapter accumulating the most total points wins. Chapters accumulating a pre-determined number of points receive an Achievement Award. The awarding of points is based on: (1) the fulfillment of certain obligations to the National Organization; (2) a balanced schedule of local activities; and (3) service within the parish and local communities. The winning chapter is sent to a new, inactive or reorganized chapter to assist in the organization of programs and the implementation of strategies to help increase the chapter's membership.

This program serves a dual purpose in that it rewards the winning chapter for its exemplary performance and allows the host chapter to receive the benefits of the experience and expertise of a well-organized chapter.

This year's "mission team" from Providence (Jeff Masoian, Stephanie Masoian, John Megrdichian, Steve Megrdichian and Linda Minassian) was sent to Livingston. The team was led by Suzie Ashjian and Doug Tashjian.

The mission team's presentation is summarized through the following five topics:

<u>Community Building</u>: Thought-provoking role plays designed to simulate personal reflection towards understanding of oneself and the manner in which individuals relate to each other in groups.

<u>Individual Profile</u>: How each person plays a vital role in their church community and ACYOA chapter.

<u>Community Profile</u>: How the organization fits into the church community and the roles members must play within this church family -- and how to set goals and delegate responsibilities to people with the right talents.

<u>Prayer</u>: An important part of everyday life and how it fits into the group as a family.

ACYOA: The procedures of the organization and the programs and activities which it sponsors nationally, regionally and locally.

The team members participated in a workshop one week prior to making their presentation.

The Council congratulates the "mission team" on an excellent presentation and thanks Vahe Baboomian and the members of the Livingston chapter for the hospitality accorded to the team.

1990 ACYOA Cultural Weekend February 16-19, 1990 (Diocese - New York City)

The ACYOA Cultural Weekend has been one of our most successful programs since its inception two years ago. Over 35 individuals participated in the 1990 Cultural Weekend which featured seven noted Armenian lecturers who provided insight into and led discussions on some of the most contemporary issues facing our people today.

The lecturers and the subjects covered were as follows:

- Dr. Dennis Papazian Professor of History and Director of the Armenian Research Center at the University of Michigan, Dearborn "The Politics of the Armenian Genocide and Political Amnesia"
- Dr. Kevork Bardakjian Marie Manoogian Professor of Armenian Language and Literature at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor "Armenian Identity: Definition and Challenges"
- Dr. Rouben Adalian Academic Affairs Director of the Armenian Assembly
- "The Significance of the Social Transformations in Armenia for Armenians in the Diaspora"

Dr. Artin Arslanian - Vice President for Academic Affairs at Belmont Abbey College, Belmont, N.C. "The Karabagh Conflict - The Root Causes"

Dr. Lucy Der Manuelian - noted Armenian scholar and a member of the faculty of Tufts University "Ani: The Fabled Capital of Armenia" Dr. John Vartan - Professor at Kean College "Armenian Musical Instruments: History and Performance"

The Rev. Dr. Krikor Maksoudian - Director of the Krikor and Clara Zohrab Information Center at the Diocese "The Rise of the National Church and the Development of the Armenian Liturgy"

The weekend began on Friday night with registration at the East Gate Tower Hotel, followed by an evening reception. It included participation in the Divine Liturgy on Sunday, all meals, and visits to the St. Nersess Armenian Seminary, the South Street Seaport and the Metropolitan Museum of Art.

The ACYOA Cultural Weekend was created in an effort to enable ACYOA members to experience the teachings of trained professionals in the fields of Armenian culture, language, arts, religion, etc. In some cases, participating members have been exposed to this type of program for the first time.

Following the weekend, ACYOA College Coordinator, Nicole Mazmanian, sent out questionnaires to all participants, inviting comments from them. Every individual responding indicated that they were very enriched and more aware of their culture and the majority indicated that they would attend again next year.

Commemoration of the 75th Anniversary of Martyrs' Day April 28, 1990 (New York City)

In cooperation with the AYF, the ASA, the Armenian Network and other Armenian youth organizations, the ACYOA participated in a special program on Saturday, April 28th on Liberty Island, during which a national gathering of the remaining survivors of the Genocide took place. Our portion of the program consisted of a group recitation and a salute to the survivors. Denise Meshejian, from the Bayside chapter, spoke from the ACYOA.

1990 Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament May 4-6, 1990 (Worcester, MA)

The 1990 Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament was once again held in conjunction with the annual Diocesan Assembly from May 4-6, 1990.

Participating were 13 men's basketball teams, 3 women's basketball teams, and 10 co-ed volleyball teams from 14 chapters.

The winners were: <u>Men's Basketball</u> - Watertown; <u>Women's Basketball</u> - Northern New Jersey (combined chapters); and Co-ed Volleyball - Washington, D.C.

Over 300 young adults were in attendance at the Saturday night dance. Approximately 35 package plans were sold.

ACYOA COLLEGE STUDENT PROGRAM

Though with the organization for less than a year, ACYOA College Coordinator, Nicole Mazmanian, has begun making significant strides in attempting to administer to college youth across the country. She has compiled a mailing list, created a newsletter, serves as coordinator for both the My Kinsmen and Diocesan Summer Internship programs and has been in frequent contact with Armenian clubs in various colleges and universities. Listed below are some details:

ACYOA College Mailing List

An ACYOA College Mailing List has been established with over 700 names. The names were obtained through mailing lists and directories received from various deans of student affairs and Armenian clubs. The list represents about 40 colleges and Armenian Clubs throughout the East Coast.

Armenian Students' College Communicant

The <u>Armenian Students' College Communicant</u> was introduced this year as a newsletter for college students. The first issue was sent out in April and the next issue will be sent out in September.

DIOCESAN EDUCATIONAL PROGRAMS

The Diocese of the Armenian Church of America once again offered programs to satisfy the educational needs of young adults in ACYOA chapters and parishes, and the directors of the Department of Religious Education (DRE) and the Armenian Language Lab and Resource Center (ALLARC) once again provided the necessary services for chapters to organize programs for their parish communities. The Worcester chapter was the only chapter to utilize these services this year.

PUBLICATIONS

Hye Hokin

The ACYOA quarterly was issued three times this year and has been well received by many. The 1989-90 Editorial Staff was comprised of: Karen Sirabian (Editor), Lucine Baronian (Design/Layout) and Laurie Onanian (Coordinator). The Summer 1990 issue will be distributed in late August.

The Council is making every effort to ensure that <u>Hye Hokin</u> is produced on a quarterly basis. The materials for each issue are submitted within the time frame requested by the Editor; however, delays have occurred during the review and production processes, making it difficult to produce each issue. While <u>Hye</u> <u>Hokin</u> is an ACYOA publication, it is produced by the Diocese and as such, must be reviewed by the Diocese prior to publication. The Council is making every attempt to facilitate the review process for forthcoming issues so that the quarterly is produced and distributed on schedule.

The Council thanks Karen for helping the ACYOA get <u>Hye Hokin</u> off the ground and serving as its first Editor. Karen has resigned from the publication and will be succeeded by Leda Nakas. Leda is a graduate of the University of Toronto and has worked on many newsletters and publications and occasionally writes feature articles. She is currently working at the Diocese as an Administrative Assistant for Diocesan earthquake relief efforts.

ACYOA Membership Handbook

In view of the way our dues are rolling in, it has become increasingly difficult, if not impossible, to prepare and publish the Membership Handbook and distribute it to our members within a timely manner.

The Central Council had originally planned to send the Handbooks out in mid-May. The concept is a rather simple one: Assuming that chapters submit dues on time, the Council would have enough time to process the dues, create a directory, get the material to a printer and distribute the Handbooks in two or three batches.

Due to the slow response on the part of many chapters in submitting their dues, the Council was not able to begin preparing the directory until July. Additionally, the Council felt that it would serve little purpose to prepare the Handbook in time for the Assembly when deliberations during the Assembly would undoubtedly require updating of the Handbook immediately following the Assembly. Therefore, the 1990 ACYOA Membership Handbook will be distributed in the Fall.

The Handbook will be printed in a loose-leaf format to allow for updating on a yearly basis. Binders will only be given to those who did not receive them previously. The Handbook contains the following:

1989-90 National Fund Raising Committee

Co-Chairmen, Stephanie Masoian and Linda Minassian, presented several suggestions to the Council at its meeting on October 28th. The Committee had decided to sponsor several art shows as an initial project and to prepare a fund raising booklet as a long-term and continual project. Research into the possibility of art shows proved unfeasible. Additionally, due to personal reasons, Linda and Stephanie were unable to continue chairing the committee and resigned in June. The Central Council decided not to appoint a new Chairman until after the General Assembly.

Armenian Church Endowment Fund (ACEF)

The ACYOA/ACEF account has grown significantly due to the generous contributions of Mr. & Mrs. Edward Mardigian. Mr. & Mrs. Mardigian are kept apprised throughout the year of the organization's growth and accomplishments. SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

The ACYOA offered seven awards and one scholarship in 1989. Listed below are descriptions for each and the names of the recipients.

Chapter "A" Award/Honorable Mention Award/Achievement Awards

The ACYOA Chapter "A" Award, annually given to the chapter that best fulfills the standards and requirements set forth by the ACYOA Central Council, is based on a point system, whereby the chapter accumulating the most total points wins. The chapter coming in second, wins the Honorable Mention Award and chapters accumulating a pre-determined number of points receive an Achievement Award. The awarding of points is based on: (1) the fulfillment of certain obligations to the National Organization; (2) a balanced schedule of local activities; and (3) service within the parish and local communities. The criteria used are listed with detailed explanations in the "ACYOA Chapter "A" Award Guidelines," attached as Appendix "C" to this report.

1989 Winners: <u>Chapter "A" Award</u> - Providence. <u>Honorable Mention</u> - Watertown. Achievement Awards - Cambridge, Cleveland, Detroit and Worcester.

1990 winners will be announced at the Awards Banquet during the 1990 ACYOA National Sports Weekend in Cleveland, OH.

The Sam Nersessian Award

This award is given to an ACYOA member who best exemplifies the character of a true Christian and servant of the Church. Individuals are nominated by the executive bodies of the chapter or the parish priest and the selection is made by the ACYOA Central Council.

1989 Recipient: Robert Shamgochian (Worcester).

The 1990 recipient will be announced at the Awards Banquet during the 1990 ACYOA National Sports Weekend in Cleveland, OH.

Outstanding Young Christian Award

Introduced last year, the award is given to those individuals nominated by their chapter for the Sam Nersessian Award. It is the Council's belief that those who are singled out by their chapters as fine Christians are truly deserving of an award and should be recognized accordingly.

1989 Recipients: Sara Andonian (Detroit); Ara Bagdasarian (Cleveland); Liza Hartounian (Cambridge); Dawn Maksud (Greenfield); Armand Paboojian (Watertown); and Greg Yekhtigian (Providence).

The 1990 recipients will be announced at the Awards Banquet during the 1990 ACYOA National Sports Weekend in Cleveland, OH.

Certificates of Special Recognition

Certificates of Special Recognition are given to the chairmen of all national and regional events and committees, as well as the General Assembly officers. The Certificates are awarded by the ACYOA Central Council and presented at the ACYOA National Sports Weekend Awards Banquet.

The Sam Nersessian Scholarship

This scholarship is annually given to an applicant to attend one of the St. Nersess Summer Studies Programs. Applications are sent to all chapters and parishes and the recipient is selected by the ACYOA Central Council.

No applications were received this year.

The Archbishop's Essay Contest

After a six-year hiatus, the ACYOA Central Council re-instituted the Archbishop's Essay Contest last year. The contest includes Armenian and English categories and the emphasis is on writing style and literary ability, not subject matter; however, subjects must be Armenian-oriented. The winner in each category receives a monetary award of \$150.00.

No essays were submitted to the Council in 1989; therefore no award was given. The 1990 recipient will be announced at the Awards Banquet during the 1990 National Sports Weekend in Cleveland, OH.

MISCELLANEOUS

Bibles For Armenia Project

In the Winter 1990 issue of the ACYOA Central Council Update, the Council requested each chapter to conduct a fund raiser and forward the proceeds to the Council Treasurer by June 15th. To date, no one has responded.

Purchase of Computer

The Central Council finally purchased a computer for the organization, which should assist us in updating the national mailing list and producing our work with more frequency and efficiency.

The Council thanks Diocesan Council member, Clement Ashekian, for assisting us with this project.

Updating of National Mailing List

The work of updating and computerizing the national mailing list is a major responsibility. For the past several years, Linda Minassian (Providence) has graciously taken on this responsibility; however, during this past year, it became increasingly difficult for Linda to continue updating the list.

While the computer was purchased in the Spring, Linda was unable to gain access to the computer at the Providence parish to produce any labels and/or copy any data onto a disc to be programmed into the ACYOA computer at the Diocese. This, in addition to problems which arose when an attempt to copy the data was finally made, made it increasingly difficult for the National Sports Weekend Committee to get its publicity out on schedule. The Central Council apologizes for the inconvenience and frustration the Committee had to go through.

The Council is trying to get the data transferred to the ACYOA computer at the Diocese where it will be maintained thereinafter under the Central Council's direction.

LOOKING AHEAD: INITIAL PLANS FOR 1990-91

Armenian Studies Program

Due to increased travel to the Soviet Union and increased difficulty in travel to Armenia, this year's Armenian Studies Program will consist of a 12-day pilgrimage to the Holy Land, Israel and Egypt and will be held from October 8-19, 1990 in conjunction with the Department of Religious Education. The cost is \$1,825.00 plus tax and includes round-trip airfare from New York, first-class hotels with double occupancy, three meals a day and all tours and transfers.

Hye Christian Encounter

The 1990 Hye Christian Encounter will be held during October 27-29, 1990 and will be hosted by the Providence ACYOA.

National Anniversary Ball

As no bids were received for regional anniversary balls, the Central Council decided to sponsor a National Ball to be held on January 26, 1991 in Boca Raton, Florida on the occasion of the 45th Anniversary of the birth of the organization. Our honored guests will be ACYOA benefactors, Mr. & Mrs. Edward and Helen Mardigian. The Ball will be hosted by the Boca Raton ACYOA and sponsored by the ACYOA Central Council.

Memorial Project in Memory of His Grace, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan

At its meeting on October 28, 1990, the Central Council discussed many ideas and possibilities with which to honor Srpazan Hayr. Tiran Srpazan's commitment and dedication to the St. Nersess Armenian Seminary inspired us to coordinate our project with the building of the Nersoyan Library. After much discussion, the Central Council felt it would be most befitting to commission a khatchkar for the Library in Srpazan's memory.

SUMMARY OF PROPOSALS AND AMENDMENTS TO THE CONSTITUTION PASSED AT THE 1989 ACYOA GENERAL ASSEMBLY - HOUSTON, TEXAS

General Proposals

- 1. To rename the Armenian Studies Program: In honor of the 50th Anniversary of Archbishop Torkom Manoogian's ordination, the Armenian Studies Program will now be known as the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Armenian Studies Program. Additionally, four scholarships will be established (one in each region), with the amount being determined by the ACYOA Central Council.
- 2. The Central Councils of the ACYOA, ACYO-WD, and ACYOC shall do the following: (a) exchange names and addresses of Council members and chapter chairpersons; (b) send all Diocesan-wide mailings to the Central Council members and chapter chairpersons of each Diocese (indicating whether or not the activity is open for Inter-Diocesan participation); and (c) meet at least once a year or have a teleconference.
- 3. The Central Council shall appoint a committee to develop guidelines and instructions for the 75th Commemoration of Armenian Martyrs' Day.
- 4. The Central Council shall appoint a committee to organize a Diocesan-wide collection drive of specific items (toothbrushes, cough syrup, alka selzer cold medicine, soap, blankets, hats, gloves, etc.) and prescription medications which would be collected and stored throughout the year and sent to Armenia to be personally distributed with the next Armenian Earthquake Relief Team (or ASP). Additionally, the committee would also be responsible for developing an operational plan to consolidate and store all supplies as well as insure that the recipients are trained in their proper use.
- 5. The Executive Secretary's office shall distribute quarterly press releases describing the current situation in Armenia as well as efforts ongoing in the United States.
- 6. The <u>Sacraments and Prayers of the Armenian Church</u> shall be republished. Any necessary assistance will be provided by the Cambridge ACYOA Seniors.
- 7. A "Bibles for Armenia" project shall be created in conjunction with the existing Diocesan plan. Each chapter shall conduct a fund raiser, specifically for this, and all proceeds from that fund raiser will be used to purchase Bibles written in Eastern Armenian at an approximate cost of \$5.00 per Bible.
- 8. An "Ecumenical Youth Fellowship and Dialogue" program shall be created to include mainstream Christian denominations such as the Roman Catholic, Greek Orthodox, and Episcopal churches. The program should bring together two to three members from five to six area churches for an informal presentation/open forum-type setting.

- 9. A "Social Service Project" shall be held once a year by each chapter. The project shall be designed to be an investment of time and talent, not just a monetary investment.
- 10. It was recommended that we publish a series of "Bible Study Outlines" which reflect the teachings of the Armenian Church. These would be used on a parish or regional level and would be designed to include biblical passages, background information, discussion questions, a bibliography and resources.

Amendments to the ACYOA Constitution

The underlined sections within the body of each amendment indicate the changes within that amendment:

- 1. Article 11, Section 1: From among the members of the ACYOA, the General Assembly shall elect <u>seven</u> members to constitute the ACYOA Central Council. Only one person from any chapter may be elected to the ACYOA Central Council in any given year. The ACYOA Central Council term of office shall commence following the confirmation of the election by the Primate and Diocesan Council.
- 2. Article 11, Section 2: As the ACYOA Central Council terms of office expire, the vacancies shall be filled by members elected for two-year terms. If the total number of members of the Central Council is changed by amendment, the General Assembly at which the amendment is adopted shall decide how best to accommodate the change so as to keep alternate year elections as even in number as possible. No member shall hold office in excess of two consecutive terms.
- 3. Article 11, Section 4: In case of a vacancy in the ACYOA Central Council created by resignation or otherwise, the ACYOA Central Council shall invite the individual who received the next highest number of votes short of election at the last General Assembly to fill the vacancy to complete the term of office. In the event that the first alternate is unable to fill the vacancy, the second alternate shall be invited to fill the position. Should no alternates be available, the ACYOA Central Council shall select an ACYOA member in good standing to fill the vacancy with the same rights, privileges, and responsibilities as the elected National Committee members.

A resolution was also passed with regard to the passing of His Grace, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan, our founder and father. The resolution expressed the delegates' sympathies and sorrow to the Primate, all reverand clergy and members of Srpazan's family. It also called for the designation of an appropriate date in the near future, whereby all chapters would be directed to sponsor a program in their respective parishes to recognize and highlight the life of the late Primate and his efforts on behalf of the Armenian Church and his accomplishments in the United States.

ACYOA CHAPTER "A" AWARD GUIDELINES

The <u>Chapter 'A' Award</u> is given annually to the chapter that best fulfills the standards and requirements set forth by the ACYOA Central Council. Chapters are expected to meet deadlines, file proper reports and meet the needs of ACYOA members in their parishes with a well-rounded schedule of activities throughout the year. The Award is based on a point system, whereby the chapter accumulating the most points wins. Chapters accumulating a pre-determined number of points receive an achievement award. The criteria required and explanations thereto are as follows:

Delegation at General Assembly: 20 Points Each chapter must be represented by the chapter chairman or a delegate as outlined in the ACYOA Constitution.

Representation at Regional Conference: 10 Points At least one representative from each chapter must attend any regional conference held in their respective region.

Representation at Archbishop Torkom5Manoogian Invitational Tournament:5At least one member from each chapter must
attend the Tournament. It is not necessary
to participate in the Tournament. A list of
those who purchase package plans will be
forwarded to the ACYOA Central Council.Those who do not purchase package plans
must provide the Council with a means of
verification.

Team Representation at Archbishop Torkom10 PointsManoogian Invitational Tournament:10 PointsA minimum of one team from each chapter10 Pointsmust participate in basketball and/or10 Pointsvolleyball. Representation at National Sports Weekend: A minimum of one member from each chapter must attend the National Sports Weekend. It is not necessary to participate in athletic events. The verification procedure for the Archbishop's Tournament applies here also. 5 Points

Athletic Representation at National Sports Weekend: A minimum of two members from the chapter must participate in a minimum of one athletic event each. Participation is subject to the National Sports Weekend Rules and Regulations.

Service to Parish/Armenian Community: Points will be awarded to each chapter based on the degree of service it bestows upon its respective Parish/Armenian community. Chapters will be judged at the end of the fiscal year. The number and quality of the programs as well as the manner in which the chapter communicates with the ACYOA Central Council will determine the number of points.

Service to Local Community:

The same criteria that applies to the Parish/ Armenian Community, applies here. Examples include "Toys for Tots," donating Armenianrelated books to a local library, a general donation to a selected charity, participating in a blood drive or walk for hunger, etc.

ACYOA Day Recognized in Parish: Each chapter in conjunction with its local parish must designate one day a year as ACYOA Day (usually held on Palm Sunday).

Educational/Cultural Program:

Each chapter must sponsor a minimum of one program that is educational and/or cultural. The program may be open to the chapter, the Armenian community, and/or the general public.

Spiritual Program:

Each chapter must sponsor a minimum of one program that is spiritual. Examples include religious retreats, Bible studies, etc.

Annual Fund Raising Activity:

Each chapter must sponsor a fund raising event, at its discretion, and forward the proceeds to the Central Council for national and regional programs. Suggestions include bake sales, car washes, luncheons after Church, etc. 10 Points

Submission of Monthly Fact Sheets:* The fact sheets inform the ACYOA Central Council of local happenings. They must be postmarked 15 days following the reported month and should be sent regardless of whether activity takes place.

Submission of General Armenian Youth Listing:* Listing of the names and addresses of all Armenians living within the parish jurisdiction. Initially, a master list is established, names for which can be obtained from the parish's baptismal records, as well as from ACYOA membership lists. The list is forwarded to the ACYOA Central Council, which then integrates it with the National Mailing List.

Submission of Chapter Membership Listing:* 20 1 Listing of names, addresses, and phone numbers of all members of chapter. The list must be submitted to the ACYOA Central Council by January 1st and updated periodically.

Executive Committee Listing w/Delegates:* 2 Consisting of the names, addresses, phone numbers and positions of each member, this list must be forwarded to the ACYOA Central Council within thirty (30) days following elections.

Membership Dues/Membership Renewal Forms:* 20 Memberships must be renewed and the designated form forwarded to the ACYOA Central Council Treasurer by January 1st. Dues are \$10.00 per person, half of which is forwarded to the Council. Chapters which have not renewed by January 1st will be assessed a penalty fee. New members must fill out an application form. All membership applications, dues, and renewal forms must be submitted by January 1st (beginning of fiscal year).

Sam Nersesian Award Nomination:* The Priest and/or Executive Body should nominate at least one individual from their chapter. Nominations are due by June 30th. 2 Points/Per Month

As an incentive to this program, the Executive Body (maximum of 5 members) of the winning chapter will receive funding to visit a new, inactive, or reorganized chapter. This is known as the Chapter 'A' Mission Program. The ACYOA Central Council will subsidize the transportation, lodging and meals for the group. The winning chapter is announced at the National Sports Weekend Awards Banquet.
