THE STRUCTURE

The structure and procedures of the ACYOA follow a similar outline as that of the Diocese itself. The following is an outline of the administrative and operational aspects of the organization:

Primate

A celibate priest, usually a bishop or archbishop, the Primate is the hierarchical leader of Armenians within the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America. He is the President of the ACYOA on the National level and presides at the annual ACYOA General Assembly.

General Assembly

The General Assembly is presided over by the Primate and convened by the ACYOA Central Council. The Assembly is made up of representatives (delegates) from each chapter. It is the annual business meeting of the organization. The Assembly elects its own officers, the ACYOA Central Council, the Nominating and Auditing Committees, and other committees and officers as it deems necessary. All the decisions of the ACYOA General Assembly must be approved by the Primate and the Diocesan Council.

Central Council

The ACYOA Central Council is a 5-member body responsible for executing the decisions of the ACYOA General Assembly and maintaining the operations and programs of the National Organization. The Council is elected by the delegates of the General Assembly and must act in the best interests of the ACYOA and fulfill requirements and meet standards through coordinating, directing, supervising, and initiating ACYOA programs and activities. The Council elects its own officers and each member is assigned to represent a region of the Diocese as well as take on specific assignments in the operations of the ACYOA on the national level.

Executive Secretary

Appointed by the Primate, the Executive Secretary is responsible for ~~the administrative and developmental aspects of the National Organization on the Diocesan~~ ^{the National} level. The Executive Secretary assists the ACYOA Central Council in executing the decisions of the ACYOA General Assembly.

Chapters

The core of the ACYOA is the local chapter. Each chapter is comprised of young adults, ages 18 and older, and is organized under the guidelines and structure of the ACYOA and follows its Constitution. Five members are necessary to form a Chapter. Every Chapter is affiliated with a local parish, follows national standards and procedures, has meetings once or twice a month and should organize a variety of activities to interest the membership. Assisting in parish-sponsored events is also a part of the Chapter's schedule of activities
