REPORT ON THE DEPARTMENT OF YOUTH MINISTRY PLAN AND DISCUSSIONS OF YOUNG ADULT LEADERSHIP MEETING JUNE 8TH, 1991

This is a brief report of the meeting of ACYOA Chapter Chairmen and Young Adult Leaders held at the St. James Armenian Church in Watertown, Massachusetts, on June 8th, 1991.

Thirty-eight young adults from twenty-two parishes participated; only one parish with an existing ACYOA Chapter was absent. The meeting began at 10:45 a.m and concluded at 3:05 p.m., with one ten minute break.

The Acting Executive Secretary began the meeting by expressing the sincere wish of His Grace Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, to strengthen the youth and young adult programs of the Diocese. As part of a general restructuring of the Eastern Diocese, the Primate had brought in outside consultants to evaluate the structure of the Diocese. He had also commissioned an evaluation of all past committees of ACYOA, including the 1968 Study, the 1970 Study, the 1980 re-evaluation, and most recently the 1987 Blue Ribbon Committee Report.

The Primate announced at the 1991 Diocesan Assembly that he has been working on a new Department of Youth Ministry (DYM), and the first step in its implementation is to go directly to the young adults of the Diocese so that they may review the structure and give their opinions and concerns. Bishop Barsamian set this date of June 8th to meet with young adult leaders, and to present the plan to them. The plan is to resume discussion of the DYM plan at the ACYOA General Assembly in the presence of the Clergy Delegates and the ACYOA Delegates. A report of the June 8th meeting is to be distributed prior to the Assembly Session.

Next the Department of Youth Ministry was outlined. It was explained that the DYM is a sub-department of the Family Ministry Plan for the Diocese; the Family Ministry Plan will follow the progression of the life of all Christian Armenians throughout their lives in the Church.

The new Department of Youth Ministry is an administrative structure to facilitate better programs for our youth, young adults, young professionals and young married couples. After full implementation, the Department of Youth Ministry will consist of a director, three national coordinators, six regional coordinators, and a parish coordinator for each parish. The concept is to provide a better administrative structure to develop programs for distinct age group's based on each groups specific and unique needs.

DISCUSSION AND COMMENTS

The meeting participants began by discussing the structure of the proposed department, in terms of how it would affect them in their parishes.

It was suggested that the DYM focus on acquiring a Director of the Department, and then make it a priority to place regional coordinators in the field. In order to have the greatest direct impact on the parishes themselves, it was reasoned that the best strategy would be to have one director supported by several regional coordinators.

The meeting participants felt uncomfortable with the age group distinctions in the upper categories - i.e. "18 to 24 range " or the "25-35 range." At the very least it was suggested that age groups overlap, and that there be no upper age limit regarding the young married group.

Some members felt that while the structure provided a good skeleton, the critical questions were not being answered in the structural plan: What is the ACYOA trying to accomplish? What is our purpose and goal? Where are we heading? What is the five or ten year plan? The Primate feels that such questions will provide the points of departure in the formative discussions which will take place over the next year. The Primate is clear that an effective plan cannot be coordinated within a small group of participants; rather, the Primate would like to carefully survey many youth, young adults, and young married Armenian Church members to understand their needs, and then with their participation tailor the DYM to their wants and needs.

It was added that while the ACYOA fulfills a social need for young Armenians in the Armenian Church, there is a question whether it should focus on just social activities. If ACYOA is to be more than a social organization, what are its priorities, and how is the DYM Plan going to lead us towards better administering certain programs?

Many expressed the concern that our clergy, Parish Leaders, and Seminarians do not have experience in youth ministry, and therefore, are not helpful to the youth and young adults.

Many of the participants feel that the clergy are too quick to comment on problems, rather than listening to the needs of youth and working with them to try to improve parish life. Of serious concern is the present lack of manpower with in the ACYOA, and organization's deficiency in following up on chapters and parish programs. In this regard, the June 8 meeting was

applauded as a model forum which should be continued. Youth leaders would like to meet annually prior to each ACYOA Assembly to discuss issues, as they did during this weekend.

All the participants felt that the choice of Boston as the meeting location was conducive towards building brotherhood and sisterhood through group discussions.

CONCLUSIONS

The conference recommended that dues should be done away with and that an emphasis should be put on generating a duespaying parish membership. All would like to see better representation on a Diocesan level by this age group, and an effort will be made to have more young adults active as Parish Council members and Parish Delegates.

Many felt their was a need to have better liturgical instruction and education for our Church. A special emphasis was added to have better programs to educate non-Armenian spouses with regard to the Armenian Church and its doctrines.

A suggestion was made that all seminarians should be required to perform an internship in Young Adult and Youth Ministry.

A suggestion was made that there be one national sports competition on Labor Day Weekend, rather than two Sports Weekends, one of which is the Archbishop's Invitational. It was further suggested that the Assembly be convened on a seperate weekend. It was recommended that the ACYOA discuss this with the Primate.

Another topic considered the feasibility to open discussions with the Armenian Youth Federation towards holding one major event on Labor Day Weekend, rather than two separate conventions.

Finally, it was suggested that the current ACYOA structure continue until the new modified DYM administrative structure is in place and running. The ACYOA should streamline its programs, while the DYM increases its activities.
