In an effort to create a better understanding of how the Central Council functions and what duties it performs, a summary of each Council meeting is provided:

August 31, 1990: The Council met for two hours during the National Sports Weekend in Cleveland to select officers and distribute regional and program assignments. The following were thoroughly reviewed and

discussed: the Central Council Operations and Procedures Guide, parish visitations, program assignments, the 1990 ACYOA General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the Christian Leadership Seminar, Cultural Day, the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament, <u>Hye Hokin</u>, National Fund Raising, the Membership Handbook and Directory, the National Mailing List, and the Chapter Resource Handbook. The Council also reviewed the calendar for 1991.

**Specifics of Meeting:** Administrative - As this was the first year the Council had been expanded to seven members, there was a need to re-distribute the regions. Once this was accomplished, regional and program assignments were made. <u>Regional Conferences</u> - It was decided to coincide regional conferences with activities and to attempt to establish regional committees. <u>Chapter "A" Assistance Program</u> - The Council decided to send the mission team to the parish of Sts. Joachim and Anna in Palos Heights, IL.

**November 9-10, 1990:** The Council met for one full day at the Diocese in New York City. The following were thoroughly reviewed and discussed: the organization's financial status, correspondence, parish visitations, the 1990 ACYOA General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the Hye Christian Encounter, the Chapter "A" Assistance Program, the National Anniversary Ball, the Cultural Weekend, Cultural Day, the Christian Leadership Seminar, the commemoration of Armenian Martyrs' Day, the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament, the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Armenian Studies Program, the Summer Internship in Jerusalem, the 1991 ACYOA General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, he Chapter Resource Handbook.

**Specifics of Meeting:** 1990 National Sports Weekend - The Council discussed in great length an issue brought to its attention by a parish priest who expressed a concern about individuals who are not involved in the life of their local chapters/parishes and yet actively participate in tournaments and weekends by simply paying dues. <u>Cultural Weekend</u> - The Council reviewed a draft of a tentative schedule, scheduled speakers, hotel accommodations and budget for the weekend. <u>Summer Internship in Jerusalem</u> - The Council reviewed a draft proposal for the program. <u>National Anniversary Ball</u> - The Council reviewed the preparations made and a tentative weekend schedule. <u>College Student Program</u> - The Council reviewed guidelines for the 1991 Diocesan Summer Internship and two new programs.

January 25-16, 1991: The Council met for several hours during the National Anniversary Ball in Boca Raton, FL. The following were thoroughly reviewed and discussed: the organization's financial status, correspondence, parish visitations, the 1990 General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the National Anniversary Ball, the Cultural Weekend, Cultural Day, the Chapter "A" Assistance Program, the Christian Leadership Seminar, the Hye Christian Encounter, the commemoration of Armenian Martyrs' Day, the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament, the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Armenian Studies Program, the Summer Internship in Jerusalem, the 1991 General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, <u>Hye Hokin</u>, the Membership Handbook and Directory, National Fund Raising, the National Mailing List, the College Student Program, and Inter-Diocesan Communication.

> <u>Specifics of Meeting:</u> <u>Cultural Weekend</u> - The Council approved the weekend itinerary. <u>Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament</u> - The Council discussed and reviewed the plans for this year's Tournament. <u>Commemoration of Armenian Martyrs' Day</u> - The Council reviewed several proposals. <u>Inter-Diocesan Communications</u> - The Council decided on several dates to present to the Western and Canadian Dioceses for possible meeting dates. A tentative agenda was also prepared. <u>Hye Hokin</u> - The Council went over the new procedures for the review of <u>Hye Hokin</u> prior to publication. <u>Special Project to Assist Young Artists in Armenia</u> - The Council received a letter from the Rev. Fr. Abraham Megerditchian of St. Sarkis Armenian Church in Yerevan requesting art supplies for young Armenian artists who have been gathering to paint pictures according to the traditions of the Armenian Church. The Council decided to send a letter to all ACYOA chapters requesting that a portion of the profits raised from ACYOA Day activities be sent to the Council in care of this project. <u>Chapter "A" Assistance Program</u> - The Council reviewed the program schedule.

**April 19-20, 1991:** The Council met for two days at the Diocese in New York City. The following were reviewed and discussed: the organization's financial status, membership dues, correspondence, parish visitations, the 1990 ACYOA General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the National Anniversary Ball, the Cultural Weekend, the Christian Leadership Seminar, the Chapter "A" Assistance Program, the commemoration of Armenian Martyrs' Day, the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament, the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Armenian Studies Program, the Summer Internship in Jerusalem, the 1991 General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, Cultural Day, the Hye Christian Encounter, <u>Hye Hokin</u>, the Membership Handbook and Directory, national fund raising, the Chapter Resource Handbook, the National Mailing List, the College Student Program and Inter-Diocesan Communication.

Specifics of Meeting: Cultural Weekend - The Council spent a great deal of time discussing the problems associated with the planning of this year's weekend and solutions for better coordination for next year. Armenian Studies Program - The Council reviewed the program outline for this summer's trip. 1990 General Assembly - The Council discussed the problems concerning the Minutes. 1991 General Assembly/National Sports Weekend - The Council discussed the possibility of inviting to the Assembly/Weekend young adults representing various youth organizations in Armenia as guests of the Diocese.

July 19-20, 1991: The Council met for two days at the Sheraton Tara Hotel in Newton, MA. The following were reviewed and discussed: the organization's financial status, membership dues, correspondence, parish visitations, the 1990 General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the 1991 General Assembly/National Sports Weekend, the 1991 Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament, the Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Armenian Studies Program, <u>Hye Hokin</u>, the Membership Handbook and Directory, the National Mailing List, the College Student Program, Inter-Diocesan Relations, the proposed structure of the new Department of Youth Ministry, and other issues relating to the General Assembly.

<u>Specifics of Meeting</u>: <u>ACYOA Central Council Report</u> - The Council reviewed a draft of this report as well as the other materials to be sent to the delegates prior to the Assembly. <u>1991 General</u> <u>Assembly/National Sports Weekend</u> - The Council evaluated the information and materials sent in during the course of the year by each chapter to determine the recipients of the Chapter "A" Award, the Honorable Mention Award, the Chapter Achievement Awards, the Sam Nersessian Award and the Outstanding Young Christian Awards.

The Council thanks the staff at the Diocese for their gracious hospitality in accommodating us during our meetings at the Diocese.

## 1990 ACYOA General Assembly August 29 - August 31, 1990

The 1990 ACYOA General Assembly convened at the Holiday Inn in Cleveland, on Wednesday, August 29th and was hosted by the Cleveland ACYOA of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church.

His Grace, the Rt. Rev. Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate and National President of the ACYOA, presided over the Assembly proceedings.

Assembly officers were: <u>Chairman</u> - Scott Najarian (Worcester); <u>Vice Chairman</u> - Richard Mardirosian (Hartford); <u>Secretary</u> - Christine Kondralian; <u>Parliamentarian</u> - Edward Marootian, Jr. (Cambridge); <u>Asst.</u> <u>Parliamentarian</u> - Charles Shooshan (Hartford); and <u>Sergeant-at-Arms</u> - Rena Jebejian (Boca Raton).

Fifty-five delegates participated in the Assembly from the following chapters: Bayside, Boca Raton, Cambridge, Cleveland, Detroit, Fair Lawn, Hartford, Providence, Springfield, Watertown, Watervliet, Westchester, Worcester and Wynnewood. Special guests included ACYOC Youth Director, Harry Sakarya and ACYOC Central Council Chairman, Annie Marashlian.

The Minutes of the Assembly were never received by the Central Council despite numerous attempts by several individuals to obtain them as well as the tapes from the meetings. Five individuals made repeated attempts to contact the Assembly Secretary throughout the course of the year. In May, she informed the Council that the Minutes were sent to the Diocese to the attention of the Central Council Chairman. After contacting the Diocese, the Council Chairman was informed that no such package was received. The Council is currently in the process of preparing a summary of the Assembly proceedings which will be made available to the delegates at the 1991 ACYOA General Assembly.

Activities included a reception at the hotel and a dinner/cruise on the Cuyahoga River.

The Primate hosted a luncheon on Friday afternoon, wherein the delegates were given an opportunity to discuss various issues with Him.

This was the first General Assembly in which we were graced with the presence of the three Primates of the North American Dioceses: His Eminence, Archbishop Vatche Hovsepian (Primate of the Western Diocese);

His Grace, the Rt. Rev. Bishop Khajag Barsamian (Primate of the Eastern Diocese); and His Grace, the Rt. Rev. Bishop Hovnan Derderian (Primate of the Canadian Diocese).

#### 1990 ACYOA National Sports Weekend August 31 - September 3, 1990

The 1990 ACYOA National Sports Weekend was hosted by the Cleveland ACYOA of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church from August 31st - September 3rd. Weekend Chairman was Mona Karoghlanian. Events were held at the Holiday Inn, Stouffers Tower City Plaza and the Cuyahoga Community College.

Over 500 people were in attendance throughout the weekend and over 200 athletes representing over 15 chapters competed in the athletic competitions. Members of the ACYO-WD and ACYOC also participated.

The Awards Banquet took place on Sunday evening. Winners of the major athletic awards were: Greenfield - Babayan Cup (most total points); Greenfield - Masis Cup (highest average # of average points per participant); Washington, D.C. - John Kulhanjian Memorial Award (outstanding team sportsmanship); and Randy Dagley (Watertown) - Charles Yaghoobian Individual Sportsmanship Award (outstanding individual sportsmanship).

The 1990 Sam Nersessian Award (annually given to a member who demonstrates the Christian virtues of love, patience, humility and understanding) was presented to Paula Bechakian (Watertown) and Richard Mardirosian (Hartford). Outstanding Young Christian Awards were presented to Louis Mikitarian (Worcester) and Lauren Koshgarian (Providence).

The Chapter "A" Award (given to the chapter which best fulfills the standards and requirements set forth by the National Organization) went to Hartford. The Honorable Mention Award was given to Watertown and a Chapter Achievement Award was presented to Worcester. Certificates of Special Recognition were also awarded to the chairmen of all national and regional events and committees, as well as the General Assembly officers.

Dean Shahinian once again organized and directed the "Insights" series of lectures and discussions which took place at the athletic facility and coincided with the games.

## National Anniversary Ball Weekend January 25-27, 1991 (Boca Raton, FL)

The 45th Anniversary of the ACYOA was celebrated during January 25-27th in Boca Raton, Florida, with members and alumni from throughout the Northeast and the Midwest joining in the festivities.

The weekend included a cocktail party on Friday night and a cookout on the beach organized by members of the local chapter.

Saturday evening began with a Hrashapar service at St. David Armenian Church, followed by a cocktail hour for banquet attendees. Master of Ceremonies for the evening was Mr. Khachadour Kazarian, an ACYOA alumnus, and guests of honor were long-time supporters and benefactors of the Armenian Church, Edward and Helen Mardigian. The Council presented the Mardigians with a crystal emerald-cut paperweight. The program included various speakers as well as musical selections performed by the Karatsayn Singers and Shami Arslanian. The dance followed the banquet and featured the Roger Krikorian Ensemble and Shami & Steve.

On Sunday, the Primate celebrated the Badarak and ordained three seminarians -- Dikran Bohajian, Robert Boyajian and Krikor Doudoukjian -- to the rank of sub-Deacon. The church was filled to capacity. A farewell brunch was served following church services.

Over 275 attended the banquet while an additional 144 came for the dance. The brunch drew 266 people. 31 package plans were sold.

The Council thanks Rena Jebejian and Melanie Mikaelian, who along with the members of the Boca Raton ACYOA and parishioners of St. David Armenian Church, provided a well-planned and truly memorable weekend for all.

## Cultural Weekend February 15-18, 1991 (Worcester, MA)

## Christian Leadership Seminar March 9, 1991 (Wynnewood, PA)

The 1991 ACYOA Christian Leadership Seminar was hosted by the Wynnewood chapter on Saturday, March 9th at St. Sahag & St. Mesrob Armenian Church in Wynnewood, PA. The theme for the day was "Armenian Youth in the 1990s: What Is Their Leadership Role Within the Church"? and the leader was the Rev. Fr. Arshen Aivazian. There were twelve individuals in attendance.

## Chapter "A" Assistance Program April 12-14, 1991 (Palos Heights, IL)

The ACYOA Chapter "A" Award, annually given to the chapter that best fulfills the standards and requirements set forth by the ACYOA Central Council, is based on a point system, whereby the chapter accumulating the most total points receives the award. Chapters accumulating a pre-determined number of points receive an Achievement Award. The awarding of points is based on: (1) the fulfillment of certain obligations to the National Organization; (2) a balanced schedule of local activities; and (3) service within the parish and local communities. The chapter is sent to a new, inactive or reorganized chapter to assist in the organization of programs and the implementation of strategies to help increase the chapter's membership.

This program serves a dual purpose in that it rewards the chapter for its exemplary performance and allows the host chapter to receive the benefits of the experience and expertise of a well-organized chapter.

This year's "mission team" from Hartford (Andrea Bagdigian, Peter Bedrossian, Anoush Khachoyan, Christine Shooshan and Charles Shooshan) visited the parish of Sts. Joachim & Anne Armenian Church in Palos Heights, IL. The group spent several weeks preparing for the visit and was led by Council member, Steve Megrdichian. Their presentation is summarized through the following five topics:

<u>Community Building</u>: Thought-provoking role plays designed to simulate personal reflection towards understanding of oneself and the manner in which individuals relate to each other in groups.

Individual Profile: How each person plays a vital role in their church community and ACYOA chapter.

<u>Community Profile</u>: How the organization fits into the church community and the roles members must play within this church family -- and how to set goals and delegate responsibilities to people with the right talents.

Prayer: An important part of everyday life and how it fits into the group as a family.

<u>ACYOA</u>: The procedures of the organization and the programs and activities which it sponsors nationally, regionally and locally.

The group was very well received by and very successful in their presentation to the parish. Approximately twenty parishioners were in attendance throughout the entire day and were highly impressed with the presentation. The Council extends its appreciation to the Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian, Yeretzgin Rosalie Papazian, Anna Giragosian, Violet Bargamian, Debbie Simonian and Irene Arakelian for their assistance and gracious hospitality.

## Martyrs' Day Commemoration April 26, 1991 (New York City, NY)

The ACYOA sponsored an art exhibit by Armenian artist, Valery Boyakchian, entitled "Reflections of Armenia: Paintings, Pastels and Collages." Mr. Boyakchian is a member of the National Association of Artists of the USSR and has had similar exhibitions in Moscow, Tiflis, Yerevan, Vienna, Brussels and Detroit. During the exhibit, Mr. Valentin Oskatsky, Co-Chairman of the Committee of Russian Intellectuals for Nagorno-Karabagh, gave a presentation entitled "Land, Culture, Freedom: The Ongoing Struggle in Karabagh." Following the presentation, the ACYOA hosted a reception. The evening was organized by the Executive Secretary and Council members, Suzie Ashijan and Lynda Chagachbanian.

## 1991 Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament May 10-12, 1991 (Tenafly, NJ)

The 1991 Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament was once again held in conjunction with the annual Diocesan Assembly from May 10-12, 1991.

Participating were 12 men's basketball teams and 4 co-ed volleyball teams from 12 chapters.

The winners were: Men's Basketball - Bayside and Co-ed Volleyball - Watervliet.

Approximately 118 young adults were in attendance at the Saturday night dance. Although a package plan was initially offered, it was dropped due to lack of response.

The Council thanks Karen Saraydarian, Christine Jamgochian, the members of the Tenafly ACYOA, and the parishioners of St. Thomas Armenian Church for their time and efforts in organizing this year's Tournament.

## Special Meeting w/Chapter Chairmen June 8, 1991 (Watertown, MA)

On Saturday, June 8, 1991, the ACYOA Central Council and Chapter Chairmen convened for a special meeting to discuss the proposed structure of the Department of Youth Ministry as developed by the Primate. The meeting was called by the Primate and was solely for chapter chairmen and ACYOA chapter representatives. In attendance were 38 individuals representing 22 parishes.

The meeting centered on the discussion of the current structure of the ACYOA and the proposed structure of the new Department of Youth Ministry. This included discussion of the ACYOA's current programs and how they would fit in with the proposed structure.

The Council extends its thanks to the New England Regional Committee, as well as the members of the Cambridge ACYOA and the Watertown ACYOA for assisting with preparations for the meeting.

## ACYOA College Student Program

## Diocesan Summer Internship June 16 - July 27, 1991

This year the Diocesan Summer Internship received four interns. Three of the interns worked in the Krikor and Clara Zohrab Information Center while the fourth intern worked in the Public Relations Department. The internship was six weeks long, as opposed to four weeks in the past, and each intern was required to produce a research paper as part of the new internship structure.

Each intern was given a weekly stipend of \$100.00. Accommodations were provided by New York University and meals included breakfast, lunch and dinner.

Services were also held on a daily basis with seminarian, Richard Bohajian, serving as the chaplain.

## New College Programs

This year the ACYOA implemented two pilot programs for college students. They are summarized below:

The "Armenian College Open House" was created to give New York area students the opportunity to meet and discuss Armenian and college issues. The first Open House was held on February 21st and featured a slide presentation on Armenian Church Architecture, presented by Dr. Lucy DerManuelian, Professor of Armenian Architecture at Tufts University. Over 100 students from the metropolitan New York/New Jersey area attended the lecture.

The "Armenian Students' Educational Series" offered a series of lectures to Armenian Clubs on their university campuses. The first program was held on March 21st and was hosted by the Brown University Armenian Club. Dr. Dennis Papazian, Director of Armenian and Soviet Studies at the University of Michigan in Dearborn, spoke on "The Armenian Political Process and the Emerging Armenian State."

## PUBLICATIONS

## Hye Hokin

The ACYOA quarterly was issued once this year. The 1990-91 Editorial Staff was comprised of: Leda Nakas (Editor), Lucine Baronian (Design/Layout) and Laurie Onanian (Coordinator).

In early May, <u>Hye Hokin</u> was temporarily suspended by the Diocese due to a budgetary freeze on publications.

## ACYOA Membership Handbook

The Membership Handbook and Directory was published again this year. Copies have been sent to all 1990 dues-paid members who did not previously receive the Handbook. Those individuals who have binders will receive inserts at the Assembly.

## FUND RAISING ACTIVITIES

1988-89 National Fund Raising Committee: The David Onanian Challenge

At the 1988 General Assembly in Providence, General Assembly Chairman, David Onanian, challenged the delegates to make an investment in the organization through a monetary donation. David pledged to donate dollar for dollar, up to \$100.00, for each donation made by a delegate. Through the efforts of the National Fund Raising Committee led by Chairman, Greg Arpajian, \$1,800.00 was raised. The monies were placed in the ACYOA Armenian Church Endowment Fund, the interest of which is to be used for ACYOA programming. David was formally contacted by the Council via a letter dated June 25, 1990 regarding matching the monies raised. In early August, the Council sent David a follow-up letter. To date, the Council has not yet received the matching funds nor a response from David.

## Armenian Church Endowment Fund (ACEF)

The ACYOA/ACEF account has grown significantly due to the generous contributions of Mr. & Mrs. Edward Mardigian. Mr. & Mrs. Mardigian are kept apprised throughout the year of the organization's growth and accomplishments. More information will be provided in the Central Council's financial report, which will be presented at the General Assembly.

## SCHOLARSHIPS AND AWARDS

The ACYOA offered seven awards and one scholarship in 1990. Listed below are descriptions for each and the names of the recipients.

## Chapter "A" Award/Honorable Mention Award/Achievement Awards

The ACYOA Chapter "A" Award, annually given to the chapter that best fulfills the standards and requirements set forth by the ACYOA Central Council, is based on a point system, whereby the chapter accumulating the most total points receives the award. The chapter coming in second, receives the Honorable Mention Award and chapters accumulating a pre-determined number of points receive an Achievement Award. The awarding of points is based on: (1) the fulfillment of certain obligations to the National Organization; (2) a balanced schedule of local activities; and (3) service within the parish and local communities. The criteria used are listed with detailed explanations in the "ACYOA Chapter "A" Award Guidelines," attached as Appendix "B" to this report.

#### Certificates of Special Recognition

Certificates of Special Recognition are given to the chairmen of all national and regional events and committees, as well as the General Assembly officers. The Certificates are awarded by the ACYOA Central Council and presented at the ACYOA National Sports Weekend Awards Banquet.

## The Sam Nersessian Scholarship

This scholarship is annually given to an applicant to attend one of the St. Nersess Summer Studies Programs. Applications are sent to all chapters and parishes and the recipient is selected by the ACYOA Central Council.

No applications were received this year.

## The Archbishop's Essay Contest

The Archbishop's Essay Contest includes Armenian and English categories and the emphasis is on writing style and literary ability, not subject matter; however, subjects must be Armenian-oriented. The winner in each category receives a monetary award of \$150.00.

At its October 1990 meeting, the Central Council discussed several ideas with which to honor the memory of His Grace, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan, the founder and father of the ACYOA. Tiran Srpazan's commitment and dedication to the St. Nersess Armenian Seminary inspired the Council to coordinate a project with the building of the Nersoyan Library. The Council decided to commission a khatchkar for the Library in Srpazan's memory. No steps have yet been taken to move ahead with this project.

# ACYDA CHAPTER "A" AWARD GUIDELINES

The <u>Chapter 'A' Award</u> is given annually to the chapter that best fulfills the standards and requirements set forth by the ACYOA Central Council. Chapters are expected to meet deadlines, file proper reports and meet the needs of ACYOA members in their parishes with a well-rounded schedule of activities throughout the year. The Award is based on a point system, whereby the chapter accumulating the most points wins. Chapters accumulating a pre-determined number of points receive an achievement award. The criteria required and explanations thereto are as follows:

Delegation at General Assembly: Each chapter must be represented by the chapter chairman or a delegate as outlined in the ACYOA Constitution. 20 Points

Representation at Regional Conference: At least one representative from each chapter must attend any regional conference held in their respective region.

Representation at Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament: At least one member from each chapter must attend the Tournament. It is not necessary to participate in the Tournament. A list of those who purchase package plans will be forwarded to the ACYOA Central Council. Those who do not purchase package plans must provide the Council with a means of verification.

Team Representation at Archbishop Torkom Manoogian Invitational Tournament: A minimum of one team from each chapter must participate in basketball and/or volleyball. Participation is subject to the rules and regulations that govern the Tournament.

Representation at National Sports Weekend: A minimum of one member from each chapter must attend the National Sports Weekend. It is not necessary to participate in athletic events. The verification procedure for the Archbishop's Tournament applies here also.

Athletic Representation at National Sports Weekend: A minimum of two members from the chapter must participate in a minimum of one athletic event each. Participation is subject to the National Sports Weekend Rules and Regulations.

Service to Parish/Armenian Community: Points will be awarded to each chapter based on the degree of service it bestows upon its respective Parish/Armenian community. Chapters will be judged at the end of the fiscal year. The number and quality of the programs as well as the manner in which the chapter communicates with the ACYOA Central Council will determine the number of points.

Service to Local Community: The same criteria that applies to the Parish/ Armenian Community, applies here. Examples include "Toys for Tots," donating Armenianrelated books to a local library, a general donation to a selected charity, participating in a blood drive or walk for hunger, etc.

ACYOA Day Recognized in Parish: Each chapter in conjunction with its local parish must designate one day a year as ACYOA Day (usually held on Palm Sunday).

Educational/Cultural Program: Each chapter must sponsor a minimum of one program that is educational and/or cultural. The program may be open to the chapter, the Armenian community, and/or the general public.

Spiritual Program: Each chapter must sponsor a minimum of one program that is spiritual. Examples include religious retreats, Bible studies, etc.

Annual Fund Raising Activity: Each chapter must sponsor a fund raising event, at its discretion, and forward the proceeds to the Central Council for national and regional programs. Suggestions include bake sales, car washes, luncheons after Church, etc.

Submission of Monthly Fact Sheets:\* The fact sheets inform the ACYOA Central Council of local happenings. They must be postmarked 15 days following the reported month and should be sent regardless of whether activity takes place.

## Submission of General Armenian Youth Listing:\*

Listing of the names and addresses of all Armenians living within the parish jurisdiction. Initially, a master list is established, names for which can be obtained from the parish's baptismal records, as well as from ACYOA membership lists. The list is forwarded to the ACYOA Central Council, which then integrates it with the National Mailing List.

Submission of Chapter Membership Listing:\* Listing of names, addresses, and phone numbers of all members of chapter. The list must be submitted to the ACYOA Central Council by January 1st and updated periodically.

Executive Committee Listing w/Delegates:\* Consisting of the names, addresses, phone numbers and positions of each member, this list must be forwarded to the ACYOA Central Council within thirty (30) days following elections.

Membership Dues/Membership Renewal Forms:\* Memberships must be renewed and the designated form forwarded to the ACYOA Central Council Treasurer by January 1st. Dues are \$10.00 per person, half of which is forwarded to the Council. Chapters which have not renewed by January 1st will be assessed a penalty fee. New members must fill out an application form. All membership applications, dues, and renewal forms must be submitted by January 1st (beginning of fiscal year).

Sam Nersesian Award Nomination:\* The Priest and/or Executive Body should nominate at least one individual from their chapter. Nominations are due by June 30th. 2 Points/Per Month

Annual Chapter Report:\* A self-explanatory form requiring general information, the report must be filed with the ACYOA Central Council by June 30th (end of third quarter of fiscal year).

- 1. Those criteria marked with a (\*) are the responsibility of the Executive Body.
- 2. A "member" is defined as a dues-paid member for the current fiscal year (January 1st to December 31st).
- 3. Each program is eligible for only one category. For example, a cultural program held on ACYOA Day will only be credited towards ACYOA Day.

As an incentive to this program, the Executive Body (maximum of 5 members) of the winning chapter will receive funding to visit a new, inactive, or reorganized chapter. This is known as the <u>Chapter 'A' Mission Program</u>. The ACYOA Central Council will subsidize the transportation, lodging and meals for the group. The winning chapter is announced at the National Sports Weekend Awards Banquet.
