#### DEAR ACYOA DELEGATES

I am very happy to be here today to share with you this memorable occasion, to be better acquainted with each one of you and to learn from you. [It also gives me a great spiritual uplift to have with us as guests the Primates of California and Canada, His Eminence Archbishop Vatche Hovsepian and the Very Rev. Hovnan Derderian. Their presence here signifies the unity of the Armenian Church on the North American continent and the brotherly love that prevails in our Church. Having them here at my side gives me greater strength, assurance and determination to carry the heavy burden of the yoke of Christ on my weak shoulders.]

The present Convention in particular will help me as your new Primate to understand you and your needs better. This is a most opportune time in my life to turn to you, since I am not agewise far removed from you by a wide gap. The past experience of my predecessors, Archbishops Tiran Nersoyan and Torkom Manoogian, serve as a witness to the fact that if a newly-elected Primate of this vast Diocese wishes to achieve any results during his tenure of office, he must be sensitive to the youth movements in our Church. From the first day of my election as Primate of the Eastern Diocese last May, I decided to follow the example of great churchmen such as Archbishop Tiran and Patriarch Torkom, now the occupant of the Holy Apostolic See of Jerusalem, by directing my attention to the youth and the ACYOA. One of the points I made in my acceptance speech to the Diocesan Assembly that elected me was the promise that I would make every effort to strengthen the ACYOA and create a department of youth at the Diocesan Headquarters.

Today I come here with a more elaborate proposal, one that aims at reviving our traditional values and strengthening the roots of our Church community. We shall try to establish within our Diocese a FAMILY MINISTRY, of which the YOUTH MINISTRY will be a part. Family Ministry will draw the people of our Diocese together into a single unit or a family so that everyone will feel himself or herself as a member of the one and the same corporate body of Christ. In all the parishes throughout our Diocese we would like to see a spirit of love, brotherhood, tolerance and acceptance, so that the youth may not be patronized by their elders, the old may not be rejected by their juniors, the newly-arrived immigrants may not feel alien and the American-born may not be led to think of themselves as less Armenians. We would like to see an interaction among the different church and community organizations, generations, classes of people and Armenians in general. The resultant atmosphere from such interaction may perhaps keep within the fold of the community the thousands of youth, college and post-college age men and women living away from home, who drift away from Armenian life, get involved in non-Armenian institutions and usually never return to the bosom of our Church.

I realize that the Family Ministry is a most ambitious program that deserves a great deal of attention. For that reason, I felt that we should tackle the first step as soon as possible. Consequently, the Diocese contacted a professional organization to assess our resources on a national scale, examine our needs and make recommendations. The research by this firm is already on its way and representatives will get in touch with various individuals in our parishes during the next several months.

It was unfortunate for the organization that the ACYOA Executive Secretary, Douglas Tashjian decided to return to his profession after two and a half years of very useful service to the youth of our Diocese. We were fortunate to have him and are thankful for all the wonderful work he did, including the revival of the ACYOA monthly publication and his exemplary accomplishments in the earthquake relief effort. While the Diocese is still looking for a replacement, Antranig Barsamian was appointed as interim Executive Secretary. Having served in this capacity in the past for over a year, he will bring his knowledge and experience to this office. In addition to this appointment, Steve Sarkisian was assigned to pursue a special project researching the state and needs of our young people from Birth until marriage. Steve's report will be made available soon and we are very thankful for his effort throughout the summer months. Realizing well that the Youth Ministry in our Church could not succeed without bringing into the Church the young people who are in college, Nicole Mazmanian was appointed as our College Coordinator. For the past several months she has gathered information on Armenian students in colleges and compiled an impressive list. Ultimately these young Armenians will be contacted and encouraged to enlist in various Diocesan or parish programs. One such program, called "MY KINSMAN PROGRAM" had already been established four years ago and has served as an extended family for Armenian students away from home.

The ACYOA can and must play an important role in implementing our plans for a Family Ministry in order to help in these difficult times the extended Armenian family, the Armenian people, here in America, in the Middle East and particularly in Armenia. The future leaders of our people and the Parish Council members, delegates, priests and bishops of our Church will come from your ranks. You are young, vibrant and idealistic; your zeal is what the Armenian people and the Church community need. Get involved, and involve your friends and relatives in the Church. Be a part of Christ's family. May God bless you and give all of you the wisdom to choose His way.

# **PROPOSAL**:

# To create a National Convention Committee. The Convention Committee shall be charged with the following responsibilities:

- (1) To present annually to the ACYOA General Assembly a minimum of two sites for the following year's General Assembly and Sports Weekend. The presentation must include convention hotel and sports facilities, complete itinerary, complete event, hotel and sports participation rates. The presentation must also include arrangements for religious services.
- (2) To completely organize and manage the convention.
- (3) To maintain accurate and complete financial records. All profits generated from the convention shall be released to the Central Council by the end of the fiscal year in which the convention was held. All rebates due convention participants shall also be awarded by the end of this same fiscal year. The Central Council at the request of the Convention Committee may disburse to the Committee additional operating funds to supplement those funds mandated annually by the General Assembly.
- (4) To report quarterly to the Central Council and General Assembly Delegates it's progress.

# **Committee Membership and Elections**

-The Primate shall serve as President of the Convention Committee.

-The Central Council Chairman shall be an ex-officio member.

-The Committee shall consist of seven additional members to be elected by the General Assembly.

-The Committee shall elect from amongst it's elected members a Convention Committee Chairman and Treasurer. All other appointments will be made by the Committee Chairman, with the approval of the Committee. -Committee members will serve for a term of two years.

If the proposal is approved, the 1990 General Assembly shall elect seven members to the Convention Committee. The four nominees receiving the highest vote totals shall serve a term of two years, the remaining nominees will serve a one year term. The Committee will begin it's responsibilities upon the approval of the Diocesan Council.

# NATIONAL CONVENTION COMMITTEE PROPOSAL RATIONAL.

- (1) Mandates the opportunity for General Assembly Delegates to choose the site of the National Convention.
   -For conventions in the years 1985, 1987, 1988, and 1991 delegates were offered no choice in the selection of the convention site because either no bid or one bid was submitted to the Assembly for approval.
- (2) Enables the ACYOA to hold it's conventions in traditional convention and vacation areas. These locations will appeal to a broader spectrum of young Armenians. New and exciting locations may enhance our ability to attract new participants, who have been increasingly flocking to other competing organizations.
- (3) Allows for continuity from year to year. The staggered elections of the Convention Committee creates a mix of both experienced and novice members.
- (4) Allows for financial continuity. As many Host Committees can attest to, there is a significant time lag between the awarding of a bid and t he time they receive seed money from the Central Council. The Central Council, in turn, waits for a year or more in some instances, to receive profits from the Host Committee. Convention participants wait for many months to receive rebates due from the previous convention. These practices are all unacceptable, participants need to be reimbursed rapidly, and the Central Council needs effective cash flow to operate efficiently.
- (5) Revenues to the ACYOA will be increased. With increasing budgetary difficulties, the ACYOA is hard pressed to find funds in order to keep a status-quo, let alone offering expanded programming. With 100% of all profits ear marked for the National organization, this revenue shortage can be ebbed.
- (6) Mandates that only a completely researched proposal is acceptable. The General Assembly will no longer allow bids without hotels, sports facilities and pricing confirmed in advance.

APPENDIX "D"

Proposed Change ACYOA Anniversary Ball Guidelines

#### Currently:

#### ACYOA Anniversary Ball Guidelines

- 1. The event shall be hosted annually and shall be called "The ACYOA Anniversary Ball."
- 2. The host chapter, in each region, shall be selected from those submitting bids to the Central Council. If no bids are received in a timely manner, the Central Council shall appoint a chapter to host the Anniversary Ball.
- 3. The event will have an alumni orientation (i.e. reunion, etc.) as well as encourage the participation of current ACYOA members.
- 4. The format for the Anniversary Ball shall be left to the discretion of the host chapter:

Option A A weekend format consisting of a Friday evening mixer; a daytime attraction/event followed by a banquet and ball on Saturday; and Sunday Badarak followed by a brunch or picnic.

Option B A one-day banquet and ball format.

- 5. The Central Council treasurer shall provide the host committee with seed money of \$1,000.00, immediately upon request.
- 6. This event is subject to the Membership Incentive Program. All dues-paid members on record with the ACYOA Central Council at least one week prior to the event and who have paid the full package plan price shall receive a refund of \$10.00.
- 7. A detailed report including financial records shall be kept. The report shall be turned over to the Central Council at the close of the event. The Central Council shall lend prior years' reports to the host chapter upon request.
- 8. The financial report, with all necessary receipts, statements, etc., shall be turned over to the Auditing Committee for review.

Proposed:

#### National

#### ACYOA<sup>A</sup>Anniversary Ball Guidelines

1. The event shall be hosted annually and shall be called "The ACYOA National Anniversary Ball."

- 2. The host chapter XXXXBBCXXXBBCXXXBBCXXX, shall be selected from those submitting bids to the Central Council. If no bids are received in a timely manner, the Central Council shall appoint a chapter to host the Anniversary Ball.
- 3. The event will have an alumni orientation (i.e. reunion, etc.) as well as encourage the participation of current ACYOA members.
- 4. The format for the Anniversary Ball shall be left to the discretion of the host chapter:

Option A A weekend format consisting of a Friday evening mixer; a daytime attraction/event followed by a banquet and ball on Saturday; and Sunday Badarak followed by a brunch or picnic.

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- 8. The financial report, with all necessary receipts, statements, etc., shall be turned over to the Auditing Committee for review.

#### Rationale:

The concept of having regional balls is not working. In 1989, there were only two balls. One was successful, the other was not -- and both drew only a handful of people from outside the home parish. A National ball will attract more people. Additionally, the return on the investment of time of the people involved is not sufficient to warrant having four balls in one year.

Consistency is also very important. When we establish a program and set guidelines, we must strive for consistency within that program. If we do not, it gives the impression that the program is not a viable one.
