SEPTEMBER 1993

- Transitional meeting at Sports Weekend with the Primate and new (John Megrdichian, Kavork Hagopian, Meline Kasparian) and out-going Council members. Officers were elected (Lucine Chair, Kavork Vice Chair, Pam Treasurer, Meline Corresponding Secretary, Arpi Recording Secretary, John Megrdichian Advisor, John Diradourian Advisor).
- Council had a breakfast meeting after the installation ceremony at Badarak on Sunday in Watertown
- Council distributed a news release to the Armenian newspapers to introduce ourselves, written by Arpi and Pam
- Council appointed a Sports Weekend Committee, chaired by Scott Najarian.

JULY 1994

Weather prohibited Council members from attending the Canadian Sports Weekend, as had been previously planned

Mardiros Chevian, a visit to the Armenian exhibit at the Pierpont Morgan Library, a visit to the Empire State building, and a home-cooked meal at the Diocese

Council planned a Chapter Chair meeting for July 30, but postponed it until Sports Weekend. Instead, Council had a working session to plan for 1994 General Assembly

August 1994

Working meeting to discuss cancelled Sports Weekend.

September 1994

Kavork Hagopian was ordained as a Deacon. Council worked on General Assembly. Attended Der Arsen Barşamian's presentation on his current publication, Haig & Armen.

1995 ANNUAL REPORT ACYOA CENTRAL COUNCIL

MEETINGS

Central Council held a total of five meetings over the course of the year, at which the Primate of the Eastern Diocese, His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, or Diocesan Chancellor, Rev. Fr. Garabed Kochakian presided. Laura Gononian and Dn. Greg Doudoukjian, both of the Diocesan Department of Youth Ministry were also present at most meetings.

ACTIVITIES

Fall - All Council members sent introductory letters to chapter contacts and contacted the ACYOA Chapter Chairmen or Youth Directors in their respective parish assignments. Council Chairman addressed a gathering of the ACYOA Juniors of the Bayside parish of Holy Martyrs on the occasion of their Thanksgiving celebration. Central Council held its first meeting at the Diocesan complex in New York

Winter - Central Council had plans to sponsor retreats in two regions this year. Because of lack of attendance, the Northeast/Mid-Atlantic Retreat was canceled. The retreat held in the Midwest, which consisted of a one day rather than weekend format, was very successful. Council's second meeting was held in conjunction with a visit to St. David, Boca Raton, by the Primate and Diocesan staff. Council members were pleased to meet Mrs. Helen Mardigian, wife of the late Edward Mardigian, both of whom have been great benefactors of the ACYOA. Council members attended a banquet in honor of the parish priest, Rev. Fr. Zaven Arzoomanian. Council members attended a weekend sponsored by the ASCA of the University of Michigan with the Primate, St. Nersess Seminary and Diocesan Staff. Various presentations were given to inform the students of details regarding the ACYOA Armenian Service Program. Council's third meeting took place in Southfield, MI in conjunction with a visit to St. John's accompanied by Diocesan Staff. Council members participated in a program hosted by the DYM for the ACYOA Junior-age group, and met with the ACYOA Senior Executive Board to discuss plans and prospects for future events.

Spring - Two Council members organized assisted with a meeting of a prospective young ACYOA group in the Lansing, Michigan area. Two Council members attended a meeting of a prospective ACYOA Junior group in Livingston, NJ with Department of Youth Ministry staff. Council members attended various celebrations of "ACYOA" Day" on Palm Sunday as well as the 80th Anniversary Martyrs Day commemorations throughout our Diocese. Two Council members attended Diocesan Assembly, participated in the panel with Diocesan delegates and Diocesan staff entitled "Total Youth Ministry" and Council Chairman addressed the Assembly. Central Council members attended the Archbishop's Invitational Tournament which was hosted by the ACYOA chapter of the Church of our Savior (Worcester), and held their fourth meeting of the year. Central Council approved the sponsorship of publication of a Lectionary and the book of "Prayers & Sacraments," both of which will be made available to the Diocesan community at large. Council participated in a working meeting directed primarily at the revision of the Chapter Resource Handbook and preparation for the General Assembly.

Summer - Central Council continued with plans to host a Cultural Workshop in Southfield, MI at St. John's in conjunction with the annual "November Dance" held over Thanksgiving Day weekend. Greg Arpajian Memorial Scholarships were given to two young ACYOA members to attend the St. Nersess Summer Conferences, and the Sam Nersesian Memorial Scholarship was given to another young ACYOA member to attend St. Vartan Camp. The ASP program was held from mid-July to August with the participation of 15 ACYOA members from our Diocese. Council will continue to work with the DYM on plans for two trips to Armenia next summer; the ASP and a young professionals trip to Armenia. 1994 ACYOA National Sports Weekend, which carried the appropriate theme "Run the Good Race", was organized by the St. Leon ACYOA chapter of Fair Lawn, NJ, and was held over Labor Day weekend. Representatives from Central Council attended several Sports Weekend planning meetings, and assisted the committee in preparation for the event.

CHAPTER INFORMATION

Central Council members were in contact with parish priests, chapter chairs, youth directors, or other chapter representatives throughout the year through telephone contact, personal communication, and frequent mailings. Council conducted surveys of the above listed through a questionnaire in an effort to determine areas for concentration. Central Council is happy to report that several formerly active chapters have been revived, and several other chapters are considering hosting National Events in the coming years. Council members have attended chapter meetings, addressed ACYOA functions, and offered the resources of Central Council to chapters.

SUMMARY

This has been a transition year for our organization. The traditional chapter structure consisting of an Executive Board and regular chapter meetings has disintegrated. While most groups maintain some degree of activity as an ACYOA and within their parishes, most have met less frequently than in previous years. We are encouraged by the existence of very strong Junior groups within our Diocese, but we are concerned that the lack of an active Senior group in many parishes may leave those of age to become involved on the Senior level at a loss for where to go. We realize that we must redirect our energies on the Junior groups to assist and guide them towards staying within our church, especially as they prepare for the challenges of college. We also recognize that we must change our structure to reflect the current status of our group, by eliminating the current dues structure which has become obsolete. Our aim is to be as flexible as possible while maintaining the existence of less-formal ACYOA groups throughout the Diocese, which are active both as ACYOA groups and within their own parishes and communities.

Unfortunately, attendance at both National Events this year was low in comparison to recent years. As this is the second year in which Sports Weekend and General Assembly have been held separately, and chapters have had difficulty in meeting the financial requirements of sending representatives to the Assembly, we have submitted a proposal to reunite the two events. We are pleased to report that in 1996, the 50th Anniversary of our organization, a planning committee headed by Scott Najarian will coordinate the 50th Anniversary Celebration/Sports Weekend to be held over Memorial Day. We hope that this date will be more convenient to college-aged students, and we hope to make this a multi-generational celebration at which current ACYOA members and ACYOA alumni will come together to celebrate the founding of our organization. We all look forward to making the changes which we feel will result in a stronger, healthier ACYOA. Central Council needs the assistance of local youth, parish priests, youth directors, and any other concerned church member to accomplish this task.


