FIRST SESSION (Saturday, September 3, 1960, 10:15 A.M.)

His Eminence, Archbishop Sion Manoogian, Primate of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of North America and President of the Armenian Church Youth Organization of America, opened the Assembly at the Statler-Hilton Hotel in New York City with a prayer and recitation of the ACYOA prayer and pledge by all present.

Folders with pertinent materials were distributed to the delegates.

OPENING ADDRESSES

His Eminence, Archbishop Sion Manoogian, Primate, greeted the Assembly in the name of His Holiness, Vasken I, Catholicos of All Armenians, and expressed his confidence in the youth of our Church and wished us a fruitful Assembly for the greater glory of our Lord and our organization.

A welcoming address was delivered by Mr. Leon Hojegian, Chairman of the Assembly Assembly, who presented the Chairman, Mr. Dennis Papazian, with a gavel on behalf of the Metropolitan New York Chapters.

CENTRAL COUNCIL REPORT

Motion was made by the West Philadelphia Chapter and seconded by Lawrence

THAT the Central Council Report (Summary of Central Council Activities) be accepted by the Assembly to be discussed under Old Business.

Motion passed.

A copy of the Central Council Report is attached as Appendix III.

FINANCIAL REPORT

Motion was made by the Detroit Chapter and seconded by New Britain

THAT the Financial Report be accepted by the Assembly to be discussed under Budget.

Motion passed.

A copy of the Financial Report is attached as Appendix IV.

At this time, the Chairman noted the presence of the Very Rev. Fr. Torkom Manoogian and called upon him to say a few words to the Assembly. The Chairman also introduced Carol Hanenian, a spectator representing ACYOC.

The first session recessed at 12:30 P.M.

SECOND SESSION (Saturday, September 3, 1960, 3:30 P.M.)

ASSEMBLY RESUMED

A roll call indicated that 41 delegates and 17 clergymen were present for a total of 58, constituting a quorum.

The Very Rev. Fr. Muron Gourdjikian acted as President in the absence of Archbishop Sion Manoogian.

OLD BUSINESS

ARMENIAN GUARDIAN

The Chairman announced the resignation of Harry Sarkisian as Editor of The Armenian Guardian and thanked him for his years of dedicated service on the staff of the Guardian. Rev. Fr. Dajad Davidian was then introduced as the new Guardian editor, and the moving of the Guardian from the Boston area to New York in the near future was announced.

PUBLICATIONS

Each delegate was asked to urge his local Chapter or Parish to purchase a set of the slides on "The Vessels, Vestments, and Practices of the Armenian Church".

YOUTH CAMP

There was general discussion on the purchase of a youth camp. Rev. Fr. Levon Arakelian suggested using the Youth Camp Fund for making improvements in the camp he has purchased, renaming this camp in the name of A. C. Y. O. A. , and using it as the A. C. Y. O. A. Camp.

Motion was made by the West Philadelphia Chapter and seconded by Long Island

THAT the Chairman appoint a committee of five to study the recommendations made for purchase of a youth camp and report back at the next session whether definite steps should be taken now or

further investigation should be conducted and a report submitted to the 1961 Assembly.

Motion passed.

The Chairman then appointed the following to serve on this Committee: Rev. Fr. Vartan Megherian, Rev. Fr. Levon Arakelian, Very Rev. Fr. Vatche Hovsepian, Guy Amboian and Ralph Yagjian.

PART-TIME SECRETARY

Betty Ekmanian was highly commended for her services as our part-time secretary during the past year. In the future, there will be a greater need for part-time help since we have a new Executive Secretary who will require secretarial services.

EXECUTIVE SECRETARY

Rev. Fr. Dajad Davidian was introduced as the A. C. Y. O. A. Executive Secretary taking up his post as of the 14th General Assembly on a part-time basis. Father Davidian at this time thanked the Primate for the opportunity to work for the A. C. Y. O. A. as its Executive Secretary.

UNITED CHRISTIAN YOUTH MOVEMENT

Motion was made by the Bergen County Chapter and seconded by Worcester

THAT the Central Council be authorized to apply for admission into the UCYM on a minimum participation basis.

Motion passed.

MAILING LIST

One copy of the mailing list prepared by Central Council for Chapter use was given to each Chapter.

NEW SYSTEM FOR RAISING FUNDS

A copy of the report on the Canister Campaign for raising special funds is attached as Appendix V.

Motion was made by the Long Island Chapter and seconded by Montreal

THAT permission be granted to Central Council to invest up to but not more than 1/2 of its Reserve Fund in a conservative fashion.

Motion passed.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATIONAL CONFERENCES

Motion was made by the Bergen County Chapter and seconded by North Philadelphia

THAT this portion of the Central Council report be deleted.

Motion passed.

The second session was recessed at 7:00 P.M.

THIRD SESSION (Sunday, September 4, 1960, 2:30 P.M.)

ASSEMBLY RESUMED

His Grace Archbishop Sion Manoogian opened the Third Session of the Assembly with a prayer.

A roll call indicated that there were 42 delegates and 15 clergymen present for a total of 57, constituting a quorum.

Seven Central Council members were present.

RELIGIOUS THEME

Motion was made by the Detroit Chapter and seconded by Watertown

THAT the religious theme recommended by Central Council for the coming year, "Christ the Way, Christ the Goal", be adopted.

Motion passed.

C. E. O. Y. L. A.

Motion was made by the Long Island Chapter and seconded by New Britain

THAT the Central Council keep up its fraternal contacts with the Council of Eastern Orthodox Youth Leaders of the Americas.

Motion passed.

SEMINARY STUDENT DRIVE

A poster, designed on the theme, "Is God Calling Me", and prepared by Central Council for distribution to the parishes, was displayed at this time and comments received from the delegates.

Motion was made by the West Philadelphia Chapter and seconded by North Philadelphia

THAT a Poster Committee be set up consisting of Deacon Hovhannes Kasparian, Miss Carol Armen, and Mr. Robert Goshgarian to study the poster further and produce it with the Primate's approval.

Motion passed.

NORTH AMERICAN ECUMENICAL YOUTH ASSEMBLY

Motion was made by the Watertown Chapter and seconded by Lawrence

THAT the Central Council be authorized to spend a sum up to \$300 to send five participants to the North American Ecumenical Youth Assembly at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, in 1961.

Motion passed.

NEW BUSINESS

AMENDMENTS

The following amendment submitted by the Detroit Chapter was passed by a roll call vote of 50 affirmative and 7 negative.

ARTICLE 13, Section 3: Candidates for the offices of Chapter Chairman, Vice Chairman, and Advisor must have been members of the organization for not less than one year immediately preceding their nomination.

PROPOSALS

Proposed by Central Council and seconded by West Philadelphia

THAT inasmuch as the situation of the Armenian Church in Jerusalem is rather precarious and there is no immediate prospect of a functioning Armenian Seminary being developed there, the Central Council be authorized to transfer any funds heretofore earmarked for Jerusalem to the Armenian Seminary Fund.

Proposal passed.

Proposed by the Detroit Chapter and seconded by Cleveland

THAT the June Festival be made optional in the Midwest.

Amendment to the proposal made by the St. Gregory Chapter and seconded by Bergen County

THAT the June Festival be made optional in all ACYOA regions.

Proposal as amended passed.

Proposed by Bergen County and seconded by North Philadelphia

THAT the proceeds from the 1961 June Festivals go to the Seminary Fund.

Proposal passed.

Proposed by the East St. Louis Chapter

THAT ACYOA Central Council investigate acting as headquarters for national magazine subscriptions and the Chapters as agents with the Chapter retaining 50% of the commission.

Proposal defeated.

Proposed by the New York Holy Cross Chapter and seconded by Detroit

THAT the Annual ACYOA Day be held during Lent.

Proposal passed.

Proposed by the Watertown Chapter and seconded by Bergen County

THAT the Watertown Chapter compile a book containing the best of the ARMENIAN GUARDIAN 1946-1960, obtain printing estimates, and present a complete report through the Central Council to the 15th Annual Assembly.

Proposal passed.

Proposed by the West Philadelphia Chapter and seconded by Boston

THAT the West Philadelphia Chapter sponsor a pilgrimage to Etchmiadzin on behalf of ACYOA during the time of the Armenian Church Congress in October, 1961.

Amendment to the proposal was made by the Haverhill Chapter and seconded by Long Island

THAT the pilgrims must be of the youth.

Amendment defeated,

Proposal as originally made passed.

FOURTH SESSION (Monday, September 5, 1960, 9:30 A.M.)

ASSEMBLY RESUMED

His Grace, Archbishop Sion Manoogian, opened the Fourth Session of the Assembly with a prayer.

A roll call indicated that there were 36 delegates and 15 clergymen present for a total of 51, constituting a quorum.

Seven Central Council members were present.

PROPOSALS

Proposed by the Detroit Chapter and seconded by East St. Louis

THAT the third Sunday in September be designated as ACYOA
Communion Sunday.

Amendment to the proposal made by the Watertown Chapter and seconded by
New Britain

THAT installation of officers also take place on this Sunday.

Amendment passed.

Proposal as amended passed.

Proposed by the Newark Chapter and seconded by Lawrence

THAT \$1,000 be given to the Primate to be used for a seminarian
studying for the Armenian priesthood in the United States.

Amendment to the proposal was made by the New Britain Chapter and seconded by
Providence

THAT the money be used for the seminarian's tuition and books.

Amendment passed.

Proposal as amended passed.

YOUTH CAMP COMMITTEE REPORT

The Youth Camp Committee reported that more time was needed to study the
suggestions and offers made and asked that the committee's tenure be extended
one year.

Motion was made by the Watertown Chapter and seconded by New Britain

THAT the Youth Camp Committee's report be accepted and their
tenure extended one year.

Motion passed.

Proposed by the Providence Chapter and seconded by Haverhill

THAT the profits of the 1962 ACYOA Day go to the Youth Camp Fund.

Amendment to the proposal was made by the New York Holy Cross Chapter and
seconded by New Britain

THAT two-thirds of the 1962 ACYOA Day proceeds go to the Youth
Camp Fund and the other one-third remain with the Chapter.

Proposal as amended passed.

APPROVAL OF BUDGET

Motion was made by the West Philadelphia Chapter and seconded by New Britain

THAT the Budget as submitted by the Budget Committee be adopted.

Motion passed.

The Budget as approved by the Assembly is attached as Appendix VI.

PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE

1. Where there exists any conflict between the Parliamentary Rules and the Constitution or rules of procedure, the Constitution will be upheld.
2. Rules of Conduct
 - a. A member should raise his hand and speak only after being acknowledged by the chair.
 - b. All remarks should be addressed to the chair.
 - c. Each member has the right to speak once before any member can speak twice.
 - d. The person introducing the motion has the right to speak first and last on the motion.
 - e. A member may not speak more than twice on the same motion.
 - f. Individual speeches on a motion are limited to 5 minutes.
3. Motions
 - a. Motion - Second - Debatable - Amendable - Majority Vote
4. Withdrawing Motion
 - a. Motion - No second - Not debatable - Not amendable - Majority
 - 1) A stated and seconded motion becomes the property of the meeting.
 - 2) Introducer may withdraw motion if no one objects to request of withdrawal.
 - 3) If there is an objection to motion of withdrawal, motion is acted upon unless another member makes a motion that member who made original motion be allowed to withdraw it.
5. Objection to Consideration of a Motion
 - a. Motion - No second - Not debatable - Not amendable - Two-thirds vote
 - 1) The member need not be recognized by the chair, but may get up at any time before debate is well underway and state his motion.
6. Amendments
 - a. Motion - Second - Debatable - Amendable - Majority Vote
 - 1) Amendment may be for or against motion.
7. Close Debate
 - a. Motion - Second - Not debatable - Not amendable - Two-thirds vote
 - 1) Motion to close debate on an amendment applies only to amendment.
8. Refer to a Committee
 - a. Motion - Second - Debatable - Amendable - Majority Vote
 - 1) Motion can be made while motion or amendments are being debated.
 - 2) Removes whole subject from the floor, motions and amendments.
9. Postponed to a Definite Time
 - a. Motion - Second - Debatable - Amendable - Majority Vote

10. Tabling of Motion

- a. Motion - Second - Not Debatable - Not Amendable - Majority Vote
1) Whole matter is tabled, motion and amendments.

11. Take From The Table

- a. Motion - Second - Not Debatable - Not amendable - Majority Vote

12. Recount of Vote

- a. Motion - Second - Not debatable - Not amendable - Majority Vote

13. Reconsideration

- a. Motion - Second - Debatable - Not Amendable - Majority Vote
1) Motion can be made only by a member who voted on the winning side of the original motion (i.e. the prevailing side)
2) Debate may cover motion to reconsider and the original motion.
3) Motion may be made regarding the main motion or an amendment which has been passed.
4) Motion must be introduced at the same meeting or the following meeting and only if action called for by the motion has not been taken.
5) Action on motion being reconsidered is suspended until vote of reconsideration is taken.
6) Motion is debatable or not debatable according to the original motion at the time it was voted on.
7) Debate on a debatable motion can be closed.
8) Motion to reconsider may interrupt business and can be made even after motion of adjournment is adopted but meeting has not been declared closed by chair.
9) Passing of motion does not permit revocation of action or commitments already taken.

14. Informal Consideration

- a. Motion - Second - Debatable - Not Amendable - Majority Vote

15. Repeal or Rescind Motion

- a. Motion - Second - Debatable - Amendable - Two-thirds vote
1) If notice of proposed action has been given to members prior to meeting, only a majority vote is necessary.
2) If no notice has been given, a two-thirds vote is necessary.

16. Expunge from Record

- a. Motion - Second - Debatable - Amendable - Two-thirds Vote of entire membership.
1) If the motion is passed, a line is drawn through the record and a notation made to explain action. The record must not be destroyed.

17. Questions of Privilege

- a. Motion - no second - not debatable - not amendable - majority vote
1) The motion takes precedence over all other business.

- 2) The motion cannot be postponed, referred to a committee, or tabled.

b. Examples:

- 1) Reputation of the member
- 2) Rights of the organization
- 3) Voting rights of the members
- 4) Comfort of the members

18. Recess

a. Motion - Second - Debatable - Amendable - Majority Vote

- 1) Motion must include length of time and reason.

19. Adjournment

a. Motion - Second - Not debatable - not amendable - majority vote

- 1) Motion may be debated except
 - a) When relating to the conduct of a member
 - b) While a vote is being taken
- 2) A tie vote sustains the chair.

20. Miscellaneous

a. Offensive remarks

- 1) Offended person may object to remarks of a personal nature. Offender must apologize. If he does not, chair may deny the offender the floor during debate on the question.

b. Majority equals one more than half of the votes cast.

c. Two-thirds means two-thirds of the votes cast unless otherwise stated.

d. The chair votes only in case of a tie vote.

e. If the chair takes part in the discussion on the floor, the chair remains on the floor until the question is disposed of.

f. If there are no objections voiced, chair may state:

- 1) Minutes are approved.
- 2) Report of the committees accepted, etc. - to eliminate unnecessary voting.

g. Point of information

- 1) A member may at any time during the course of the meeting take the floor without permission from the chair when the member states "point of information". The chair must grant the speaker the floor.

21. Definitions

a. Majority Vote - more than half of the votes cast ignoring blanks, at a legal meeting where a quorum is present, unless a larger vote for its adoption is required by the constitution of the assembly.

b. Two-thirds Vote - means two-thirds of the votes cast, ignoring blanks. This must not be confused with a vote of two-thirds of the members present, or two-thirds of the members.

Rules of Procedure

Section A:

1. There shall be no absentee voting. Voting shall be on individual basis; however, each Chapter shall report its total affirmative and negative votes at one time.
2. Only those delegates present during the discussion of an Amendment, Proposal and/or Resolution shall be allowed to vote on the consideration.
3. A roll call vote shall be taken on the demand of one member when seconded by at least five members.

Section B:

1. The Nominating Committee shall submit twice the number of nominees as there are vacancies to be filled to the Central Council.
2. An unlimited number of nominations may be made from the floor of the Assembly.
3. A primary vote shall be taken, each delegate must cast two votes for each of the vacancies. The individuals with the highest votes (equaling twice the number of vacancies) shall be retained and the others dropped.
4. A second vote shall be taken with each delegate casting one vote for each of the vacancies. The candidates receiving the majority votes for the offices shall be elected.

Section C:

1. For each committee, the number of nominees shall not exceed twice the number of committee members required for each committee. Voting shall be by hand.

Section D:

1. No Chapter will be allowed to bid for an assembly until their delegates attend for a second time.

Section E:

1. Officially credited delegates from Chapters which have expired may have voice at the Assembly, but no vote.
2. Official Theological students of the Diocese may have voice, but no vote, unless they come as President of the Chapter or as official representative of the head of the Chapter, in which case, they may vote.

SUMMARY OF CENTRAL COUNCIL ACTIVITIES

The Central Council of the ACYOA met six times during the 1959-1960 year with four one-day sessions and one two-day session at the Diocesan Office in New York City and a two-day session in New York City prior to the Assembly.

At its first meeting on Sept. 19, 1959, called to order by past Chairman Dennis Papazian, the Central Council elected the following Officers:

Guidance

His Eminence Archbishop Sion Manoogian was not able to attend any of the CC meetings this year, but he met several times with the Chmn. prior to the meetings and gave advice on the CC's work. Very Rev. Fr. Maron Gourdjikian, despite his pressing duties at the Diocese, was able to attend a portion of one of the Council's meetings. We feel that this limited clerical guidance will be more than compensated in the future by the appointment by the Primate, Archbishop Sion Manoogian, of Father Dajad Davidian as Exec. Secretary of the ACYOA.

Visit of His Holiness, the Catholicos

His Holiness Vasken I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians, visited the U.S. this past summer. The Chairman of the CC greeted the Catholicos on behalf of the ACYOA, the text of whose speech can be found in the GUARDIAN. The Catholicos granted the ACYOA members an audience in New York City and other parishes of our Diocese.

Directives and Bulletins

The CC has continued to send various directives and bulletins to guide the Chapters in regards to ACYOA work and procedures.

Letters and Statements

The CC has engaged in extensive correspondence with the Chapters administering National ACYOA affairs, as well as with various dignitaries and individuals within the Armenian Church and with other churches, individuals, and groups. It is unfortunate that some of the Chapters have not been as cooperative in answering correspondence and in paying bills as they should. The CC can only carry out the organization's program if each Chapter gives full cooperation in these matters. It is only in this way that our organization can operate effectively.

Assembly Minutes

Assembly minutes were sent out rather late this year and CC will make an attempt to rectify this in the future.

Amendments, Proposals, and Resolutions

The Primate approved the minutes of the 13th Annual General Assembly. There were three constitutional amendments passed by the 13th Annual General Assembly but the CC did not distribute them to the Chapters and Diocesan Primate for ratification. This will be done immediately following the 14th Annual General Assembly.

Chapter Report Forms

Report forms were studied by the CC members as usual and correspondence was carried on with the Chapters regarding their problems. The Council would like to stress that the Chapters should be more compliant in sending in their quarterly reports so that the Council can use them in improving its services to the Chapters.

Publicity

Publicity reports prepared by the Council have appeared in several Armenian-American newspapers.

Letters of Appreciation, Telegrams, etc.

All letters, telegrams, etc. as listed in the minutes of the 13th Annual General Assembly have been sent.

Armenian Guardian

Harry Sarkisian, Managing Editor of the Armenian GUARDIAN, resigned as of the July-August issue. This, along with the fact that the new Exec. Sec. of the ACYOA, Father Dajad Davidian, has expressed a willingness to take up the editorial duties of the GUARDIAN, has precipitated the moving of the GUARDIAN from the Boston vicinity to the New York area. After receiving recommendations for staff members from Der Hayr, the CC will appoint the new staff to aid him in his work. Having professional services for editing the GUARDIAN should aid immensely in improving the general quality of the ACYOA's publication. The CC looks forward to a period of unprecedented

growth and improvement in the GUARDIAN and we hope that the improvement of the publication will lead towards it receiving advertisement to offset its publication cost. The value of this inter-Chapter communication cannot be over-stressed.

The GUARDIAN has continued to make space available to the CRE for its News and Views column without reservation whenever material has been received.

Also, as instructed, the CC has sponsored an Armenian GUARDIAN essay contest and the winner will be announced shortly.

Publications

Archbishop Sion Manoogian's excellent book, "The Armenian Church and Her Teachings," has been republished in an edition of over 1400 copies and these are being distributed through the CC office. Chapters are urged to purchase these books. The second printing of over 900 copies of "Prayers and Sacraments of the Armenian Church" has been made as instructed by the 12th Annual Assembly. Corrections were made in this edition as well as a few other improvements.

40 sets of 57 slides on the "Vessels, Vestments, and Practices of the Armenian Church" have been made up for distribution and are available through the CC office. These attractive and informative slides are accompanied by a printed text. All Chapters should accept it as a prime obligation to purchase a set of these slides for their own use or for the use of their Church School or Parish.

Youth Camp

Inasmuch as the 13th Annual Assembly accepted the report of the CC that the Youth Camp project should be held in abeyance until a more favorable time for establishing such a project, no new action has been taken and the funds are being held in escrow.

Part-Time Secretary

CC hired a part-time secretary as per the authorization of the 13th General Assembly and found her services most valuable. The Council hopes to obtain more part-time help in the future particularly since we have a new Executive Secretary who will require secretarial services.

Exec. Secretary

In fulfillment of the instructions of the 13th General Assembly, CC has worked with the Primate, Archbishop Sion Manoogian, and has secured the services of an Executive Secretary, Father Dajad Davidian. Father Dajad will take up his post at the 14th General Assembly in New York City. Father Dajad will also serve as editor of the Armenian GUARDIAN and the staff of the GUARDIAN will be moved to the New York area to help him with his work.

United Christian Youth Movement

The ACYOA has continued with its fraternal relation with UCYM as per instructions from the 13th Annual General Assembly. The CC feels that it is appropriate that the ACYOA apply for membership in UCYM at this time on

a minimum participation basis. In regard to the above, Central Council sent an ACYOA representative to the UCYM General Council Meeting at Lake Geneva, Wisconsin. Please see report on this meeting in your Assembly folder.

Mailing List

The Central Council has prepared a new, inclusive mailing list for the use of all the chapters, a copy of which is enclosed in the Assembly folders.

New System for Raising Funds

The canisters have been sent to the chapters for fund-raising purposes. Please see the report in your folder for further information.

Investigation was made as to better investment of ACYOA Reserve Fund and the report is contained in your delegate folder.

June Festivals

The Midwest Chapters were allowed to exercise option on the type of June Festival which was held in their area. Many June Festivals were held throughout the Diocese and the financial statement may be found in the Financial Report. In order to assure the success of this venture in the future, if it is to be continued, the wholehearted cooperation of our chapters and members will be necessary.

Uniform Accounting System

A uniform accounting system for the chapters is being prepared by the Central Council and the information will be distributed to the chapters shortly.

Religious Education Conferences

The Council co-sponsored a Religious Education Conference in the Midwest area which was a spiritual and educational success.

Christmas Cards

The Central Council found upon investigation that the cost for producing a four-colored Christmas card was prohibitive. Inasmuch as the sale of any other type of card would probably not be worthwhile, the Council set aside this project.

Office Furniture and Equipment

The Council has purchased three typewriters and an excellent, automatic mimeograph machine.

Athletic Program

A report on the athletic program is included in the delegate folder.

Diocesan Assembly

Three Central Council members represented the Council at the Diocesan Assembly, two of whom were given the right to speak as per the request of the Central Council. A short address on behalf of the Council was delivered at the banquet. The ACYOA appreciates this favorable overture made by the Diocesan Council and looks forward to participation in future Diocesan Assemblies.

Religious Theme

Central Council recommends the following religious theme for the coming year, "Christ the Way, Christ the Goal." It is suggested that the Chapters keep this theme in mind while preparing their religious program for the year.

Chapter Visitations and Regional Conferences

In accordance with past practice, the Central Council organized several regional conferences. These conferences were found to be quite valuable for exchanging ideas, discussing policy, and increasing enthusiasm amongst the various chapters. This is a practice which will be continued.

The chapters in our organization were divided into districts and assigned to several Central Council members for chapter visitations. A number of visitations were made and the chapters found these very helpful. The Council hopes to develop this aspect of their work more fully in the future.

Resignation of Council Members

Joseph Kalemkerian, Vice Chairman of the Council, found it necessary to resign his position. The Council elected Mr. Robert Goshgarian to replace Mr. Kalemkerian as Vice Chairman.

Miss Grace Heroian, because of her marriage and relocation in Texas, also found it necessary to resign from Central Council. It will be necessary at this Assembly to elect a Council member to complete her unexpired term.

Assembly

The Metropolitan New York Chapters have been very cooperative in making preparations for the Assembly and we are grateful for their ardent efforts.

C.E.O.Y.L.A.

The "A" Award

The Central Council reviewed all the chapter annual and quarterly report forms and after much serious deliberation selected the Detroit Chapter as the recipient of the "A" Award for its excellent accomplishments. Honorable mention awards were given to the Boston and Racine Chapters for their excellence during the past year. The awards will be announced and presented at the Assembly Banquet.

Educational Program

The Central Council has prepared a tape recording comprised of 15 lectures each of 30 minutes duration consisting of explanatory material pertinent to Divine Liturgy and Christian behavior. These tape talks will be distributed to each chapter soon after the Assembly.

Seminary Student Drive

The Primate of the Diocese, Archbishop Sion Manoogian, has requested the assistance of the ACYOA in the Diocesan drive to find students to study for the priesthood. In this regard, Central Council has prepared a poster to be distributed to each parish for public display. This poster was designed on the theme, "Is God Calling Me." This prototype will be displayed at an Assembly session and the final color copies will be distributed at an early date.

North American Ecumenical Youth Assembly

The ACYOA has been invited to participate in the North American Ecumenical Youth Assembly which will be held at the University of Michigan, Ann Arbor, in August 1961. All major and most minor Protestant and Eastern Orthodox Churches throughout the world will be represented. The Central Council suggests that the ACYOA send a number of young people from the Midwest area to this Assembly to enrich our relationships with other denominations.

Anti-Discrimination Letters

In regard to our organization's policy of democratic equality to all people regardless of race, color, or creed, the ACYOA wrote letters expressing its aforementioned feeling to the Kress and Woolworth home offices stating that discriminatory practices in the South were against the principles of the United States Constitution and the Bill of Rights. Favorable response was received from both companies; and, since these communications were made, subsequent integration in these companies leads us to believe that our letters, along with hundred of other interested parties, was of benefit.

ACYOA Library

Several books were purchased for the ACYOA library in the prelacy building as authorized by the 13th Annual General Assembly.

Delegates to the ACYOA 13th General Assembly held in 1959 voiced the concern of our members throughout the country that a method would be devised to raise money for the ACYOA sponsored Armenian Seminary in America Scholarship Fund and for the Youth Camp Fund. We all know how important these projects are, and our delegates were anxious to see that something specific be done.

After much thought and deliberation, the Assembly passed a motion instructing the Central Council to prepare canister banks to be sent to the Chapters.

These canisters were distributed to each chapter in the Spring of this year.

Individuals who receive the canisters are keeping them in a convenient place in their home as a type of mite box where they are depositing small coins and paper currency from time to time. This new drive is replacing the envelope plan of contribution, which was found to be too burdensome for the chapters to administrate.

These canisters have been distributed to ACYOA members, their parents and friends; and other people interested in helping the Seminary and Youth Camp funds. They may also be made available following Divine Liturgy to the congregation after a special sermon on the subject.

Chapters should plan to send in the proceeds to the Central Council for deposit to the credit of these funds following Lent in 1961 as a Christian thank offering.

We expect your full and warm cooperation in this drive, that it may prove to be successful in your area.

NOTE: Due to a misunderstanding on the part of the Chapter handling the canister campaign, the canisters were sent to the Chapters "collect". Each Chapter is requested to inform Central Council of amount they were charged and the amount will be refunded.
