PARISH VISITATION WATERTOWN ACYOA

PARISH: St. James Armenian Church, Watertown, MA

DATE OF VISITATION: October 24, 1986

On October 24, 1986, I met with the St. James ACYOA in Watertown, MA. There were ten members present along with Rev. Fr. Dajad Davidian.

The meeting began with the general business of the Watertown Chapter. The Chairman (Armand Paboojian) outlined the various activities, and appointed members to coordinate specific events. Der Dajad was up to date with these activities, and had a clear understanding of all ACYOA functions. Suggestions were presented for future programs, and the general business meeting was concluded.

We then went into a group discussion session led by the Acting Executive Secretary of the ACYOA. The first question presented to the membership was — What is the purpose of the ACYOA? As we went around the group everyone contributed an answer. We then passed around the ACYOA Constitutional objectives, and realized that there is a specific purpose to the ACYOA. My next question was — how do we fulfill this purpose?

We then discussed the new ACYOA National Committees as a way to give purpose to the ACYOA (Committees are included with this evaluation). These committees were very well received, and a lengthy discussion took place regarding the implementation of this program.

I informed the membership that it was the Watertown ACYOA that proposed the adoption of this National Committee structure at the National Assembly in August. Therefore, my hope is that this chapter will lead the organization in implementing this program.

In evaluating the Watertown ACYOA, it is easy to see that this chapter is in a stage of rebirth. In recent years there has been a transition in Watertown. Younger members are coming up the ranks, and older members are moving into other Parish organizations. The powerful Watertown ACYOA machine had begun to slow during this transitional period, as the older members left. But now a new generation is taking over with the help of the Alumni, and the watchful eye of Der Dajad. It is imperative that we instill purpose in this new group of ACYOA members, and lead them constructively.

The ACYOA recently lacks a sense of purpose, and has become dependent upon social gatherings as a form of existence. It is important that the ACYOA leaders form a well rounded agenda which captures the entirety of the ACYOA's goals and objectives. Parties and Dances are fine, but these do not prepare a young Armenian to carry on the mission of the Armenian Church.

I encourage the Watertown ACYOA to continue with there current programs. But it's time to evaluate the long-range goal of this chapter. The leaders of the Watertown ACYOA must focus there goals and objectives, and ask those important questions. What is the purpose of the ACYOA? What is our purpose as Christian Armenians? How do we reach our goals and objectives?

These are the questions that must be answered. Answered by the ACYOA member, answered by the clergy, and answered by the entire parish membership. The ACYOA is the training ground for the Armenian Church. It takes a total commitment by all members. The entire Parish Membership must get involved for this mission to work to its fullest extent.

I have no doubt that this chapter will succeed. It has a dynamic priest, a caring parish membership, and quality members. Please consider these points which I have raised, and I'm sure you will make active progress.
