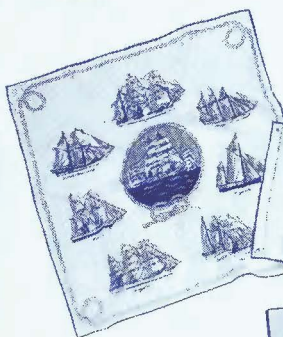

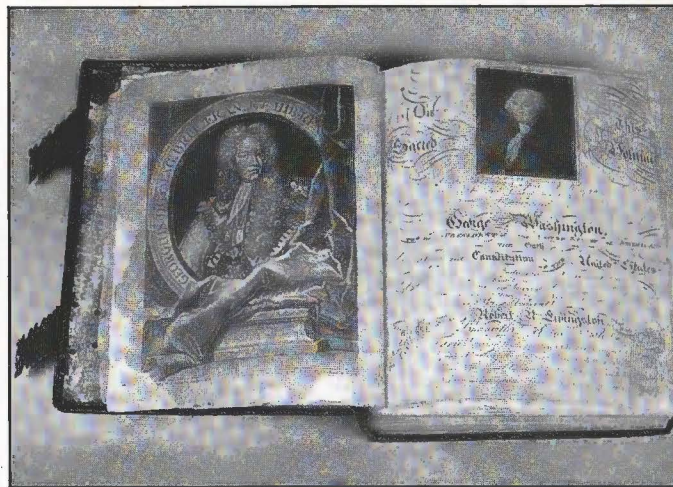

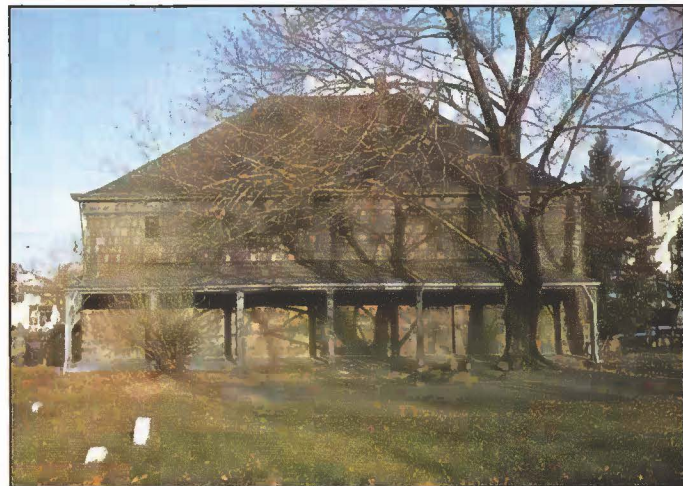

On the morning of April 30, 1789, the church bells throughout New York City—the Nation's first Capital under the Constitution—summoned the people to prayer in anticipation of the Inauguration of George Washington as the President of the United States.

In a solemn ceremony on the balcony of Federal Hall (on the site of the present Federal Hall at Broad and Wall Streets), George Washington took the oath of office. With his right hand resting on the Bible of St. John's Lodge, he said in a clear and distinct voice, "I swear, so help me God."

At the close of the Inauguration, the President, together with members of both houses of Congress and a large crowd of spectators, proceeded on foot to St. Paul's Chapel on Broadway where the *Te Deum* was sung and the Church's prayers were said by the Right Reverend Samuel Provoost, the first Bishop of New York and one of the Chaplains of Congress.

The first President of the United States was inaugurated at a time when the nation was fully conscious of the cost of its freedom and sensed it had a special destiny in the history of nations. In these present days of national celebration and reappraisal "nations are terrified" and "kingdoms are shaken," people can seek God as their "shelter and strength, always ready to help in times of trouble" (from Psalm 46).

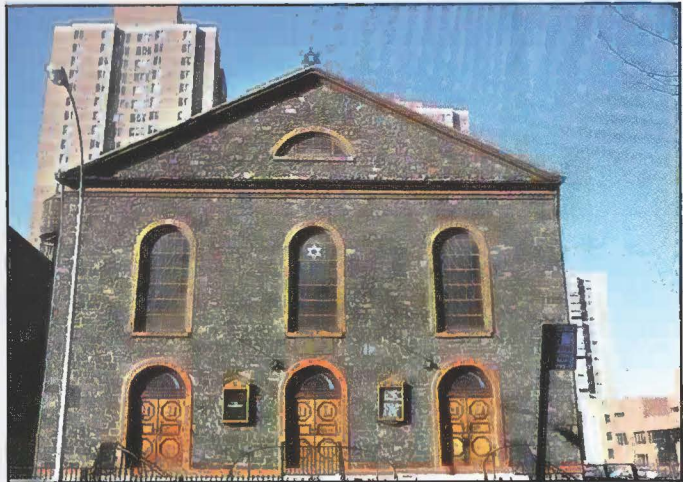

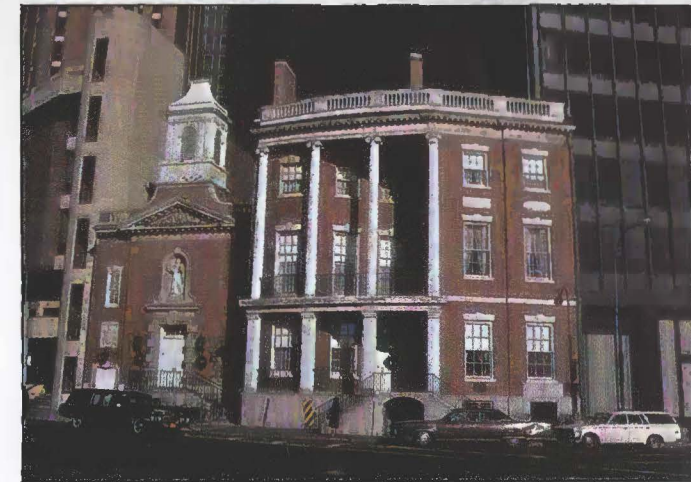
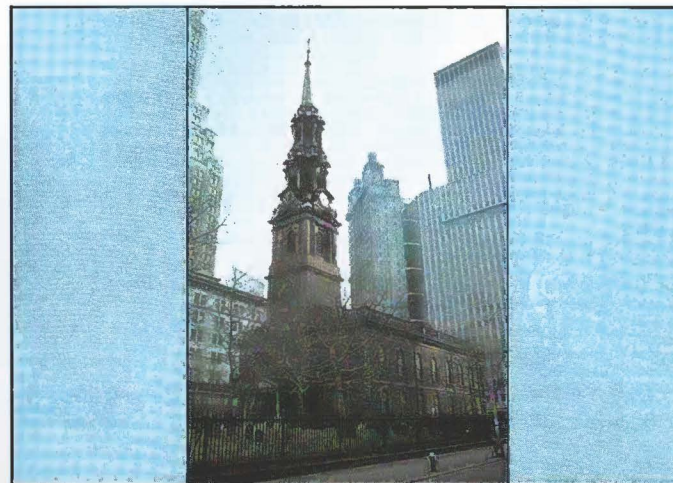

the God of Jacob is our refuge!

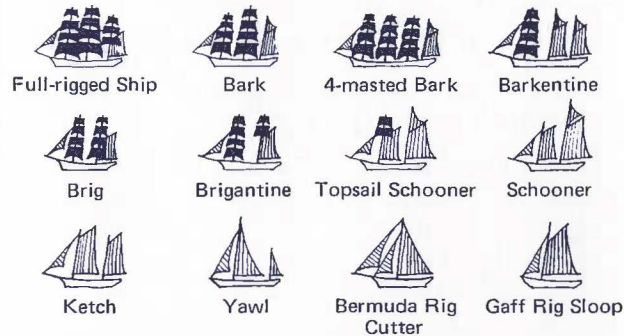

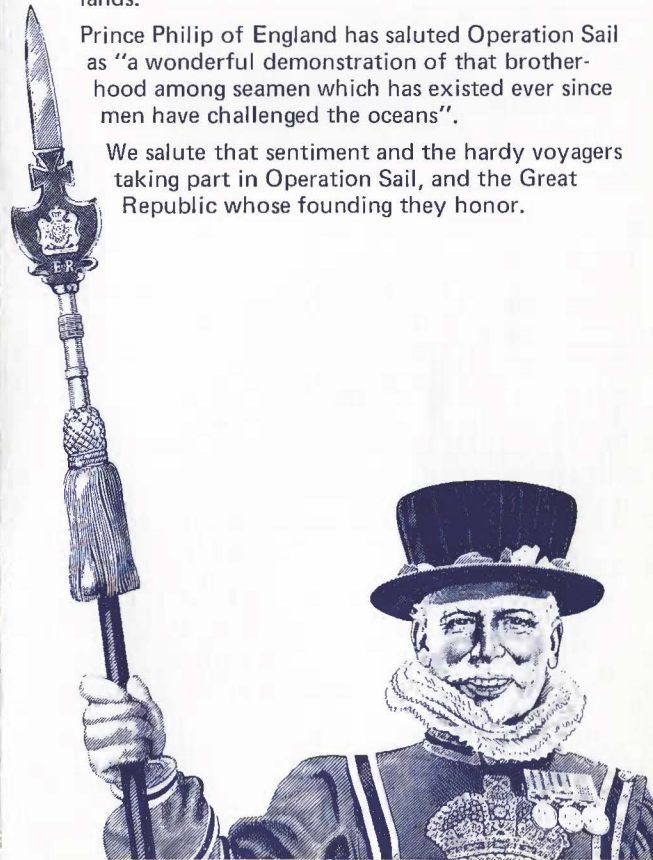

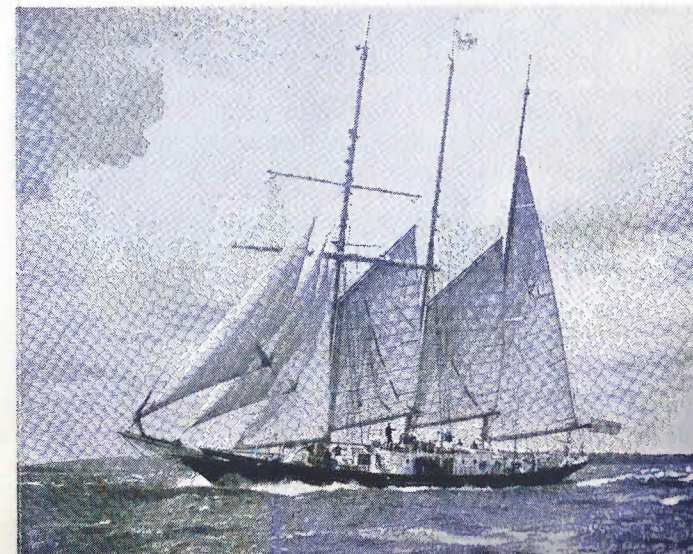
Their race across the Atlantic is organized by the Sail Training Association in England, and the American Sail Training Association in Newport, R.I. 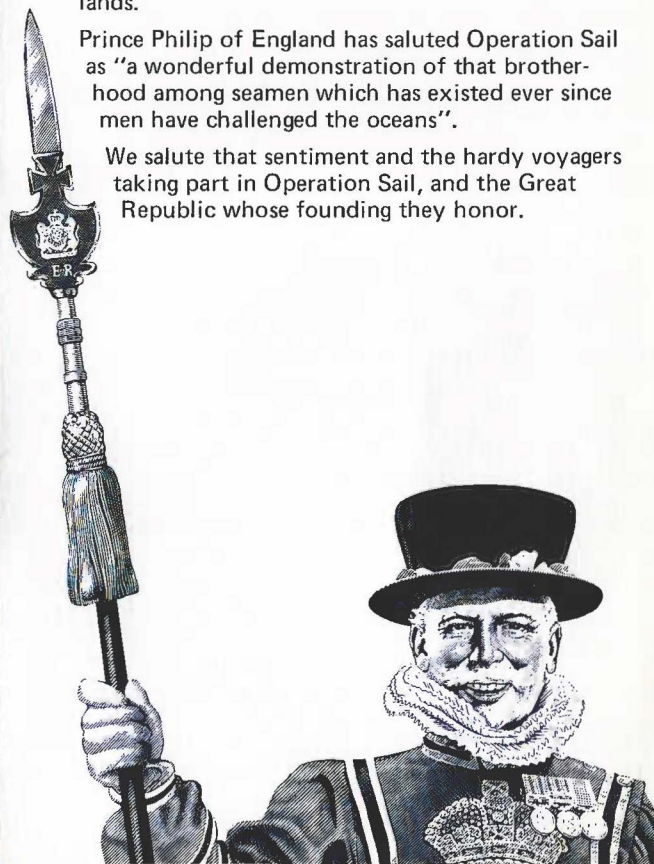
