The Arcibishop was born in Aynteb, Turkey, August 23, 1904. His baptismal name was Merses. His father, a graduate of of the Seminary of Armash, was a priest. From 1920 to 1924 Archbishop Tiran attended the Seminary of the Armenian Patriarch of Jerusalem. In 1926 he was ordained Archdeacon and in 1928 a celibate Briest, by His Beatitude the Patriarch Elisez Teuri an. From 1928 to 1930 énclusive, he studied in King's College, London, England.

Returning to Merusalem, Archbishop Tiran held various offices in the patriarchate. In 1 932 he was appointed Dean of the Seminary by the Patriarch Torkem Kousha gian. In 1938 he was transferred to Paris and in the fall of 1939 was invited by the executives of the Armenian Church in London to assume the pastorate of the community.

On November 6, 1944 he arrived in the United States as the Primate of the Armenian Church of America, succeeding the Most Rev. Archbishop Karekin Horsepian, who was elected to be the Catholikos of Cilicia. In 19 45 the National Ecclesiastical Council conveiled in Etchniadsin and elected the Supreme Patriarch of all Armenians. The newly-elected Catholikos, His Holiness Georg VI. ordained ten Bishops. The Primate of the Armenian Church is America was one of the ten. Bishop Tiden returned from Armenia and devoted his time and efforts to the realization of the spiritual mission of the Armenian Church in America. Through his vision and encouragement twenty young people volunteered for the service of God, all of them from the Near East, and ten of them alre ady ordained priests of the Armenian monasteries of Jerusalem and Antibelia.

In November 1951, His Heliness the Catholiges, Georg VI. honored the Primate of the Armenian Church of America by giving him the right to use as his signature, Archbishop Tiran.
