

BISHOP TIRAN NERSOYAN

Bishop Tiran was born in 1904 in Aintab, Turkey. In 1915 he, with his parents, brothers and sisters was deported to a Syrian village where they remained, enduring great hardship, until 1919, at which date they returned to their native city. In 1921 he went to Jerusalem and entered the Seminary School of the Armenian Patriarchate of Jerusalem. In 1924 he graduated, and began to teach as well as take lessons from Patriarch Elisee Tourian. In 1928 he went to England, Kings College, London University, where he studied theology for two years. In 1930 he returned to Jerusalem, became the editor of the religious magazine "Sion" for one year. In 1932 he was appointed principal to the Armenian Seminary in Jerusalem and professor of Church History and other subjects. In July 1938 he came to Paris, as the assistant and vicar of the Armenian Bishop there. In December 1939 he went to London as the chaplain of the Armenian Church in London. In 1943 he was elected and appointed bishop of the Armenian Church in North America and arrived in New York, a year later, in November 1944, in which office he still remains.
