I write these few lines to inform you that I am an Armenian and have taken over the administration of the affairs of the Armenian Church at Dhaka from the month of July, 1986.

Prior to my taking over the responsibilities there were manifold problems as endeavours were made from quarters outside the Community to get possession of the properties, but on taking over control the situation as been tackled and the full control is with the Armenian Community.

The Church building needs immediate repairs, painting, white-washing and the surrounding area where there are graves needs raising by about a foot due to severe flooding during the monsoons and overflow of the Municipal drain on the road outside the Church premises.

The work of repairs of the Church is being taken in hand and in the latter part of this month we will be attending to the surrounding area by lifting the marble tombstones and resetting them in their respective places after the necessary raising of the ground level.

Inspite of the very meagre funds available, which is insufficient, the work is being taken up before further damages may be caused, so we would appeal to you to use your good offices in approaching the benevolent Armeniansa in your Diocese to come forward with donations at this hour of need. Donations should be sent to me which will be duly acknowledged and detail account of the utilisation will be furnished.

While writing this letter it has been brought to my notice that a Mrs. Rose Mary Keymer has made two correspondences with you for financial help. According to enquiries and informations consideration of the appeal should not be made as there is an attempt to exploit the generosity of the benevolent Armenian Community. If you desire, a confidential report can be forwarded to you.

In ending this letter I seek your devine blessings that I be able to undertake the duties entrusted to me of maintenance of the Church.  $\Lambda$
