The following is a translation of the attached letter \$23618 dated July 14, 1972

We are in the process of making a number of reassignments of the pastors in our Diocess. In this connection, we had informed you earlier that we would communicate with you as soon as specific arrangements were made.

In accordance with these arrangements, we are appointing you the Pastor of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church Parish in Cleveland, Ohio.

You are to assume your new pastorate following the celebration of the Divine Liturgy in St. John Church in Detroit on Sunday, September 10, 1972.

We are sure you will continue with the same devotion as the servant of our Lord and the spiritual shepherd of the Armenian Church, placing at the disposition of spiritual and oultural live of our people, the special talents God has granted you.

We recommend that your Parish Council make the appropriate announcements of these arrangements to the Detroit community, — and organize a public gathering on September 10, as a formal farewell in the name of the Detroit faithful.

We pray that you never lack for the Lord's blessings, and that you remain always healthy in body and epirit.
