



FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



Our new Parish Christian Education and Family Worship schedule and program is being implemented since September. At this stage of the life of the program, I think it will be useful to take a quick look at it in order to make our efforts more effective and more productive. First, I think, we must all agree

whether such a new approach was necessary. Before embarking on this project I tried to make the case for its need. The former schedule of simultaneously held Sunday School for children and Divine Liturgy long lost its effectiveness of providing the opportunity for Christian Education and Worship for every member of the community, the whole family, adults and children alike. This conclusion has been recognized for a long time by religious educators and many dieroy. We do not need to look too far to see the truth of this sad reality. Our young people. many of them graduates of our Sunday Schools, are not in Church. Many of our young parents bring their children to Sunday School but only few remain to participate in the worship service of the community, it will not be an overstatement to say that the vast majority of our people who are in church are "unchurched", they lack the basic understanding of the teachings of the church. they were not nurtured by the church in their faith and therefore never learned what it is to be a Community of God. This does not necessarily mean that our people are "unbelievers" and that they do not care about their faith. Not at all, it only means that the faith they received at baptism, which was to have been nurtured within the Church Community, remained an infant and did not grow. The need for the nurture of our infant faith is an undeniable reality and something had to be done about it.

The ultimate purpose of Christian Community life is to study the Word of God and to worship Him together, and bear witness to Him in our lives. Our effort is indeed to refocus our personal commitment to the Gospel of Our Lord in a growing and worshipping community. I am very pleased and encouraged by the overwhelmingly positive reception of our new program. There are more young people in church, worshipping together, participating in the liturgy and sharing the Body and Blood of Our Lord. The message of the Gospel is being heard more loudly and more clearly and the mission of the Church is being refocused. If the comments from people on the pews is any evidence, more than 80% are positive. That does not mean that we have no problems and everything is running smoothly. Not at all. The process of adjustment has just begun and we all have to be patient with ourselves and with one another while we make our steady progress. Some parents still need to learn to remain in Church for the Divine Liturgy with their children after Church School classes are dismissed. Some of us have to get used to worshipping with the children in truly adhering to the words of our Lord that "whoever welcomes one such child for my sake welcomes me." (Matt.18:5) In short, we all have to rethink our often misaligned notions of what it means to be "The Church", the community of Christian helievers

And as we take our little steps toward that goal, let us continue to pray for the Lord's blessings on us and on our efforts.

THE PARISH COUNCIL CORNER



It is a busy time for our parish as we come to the end of the year and start closing the books, both literally and figuratively. As busy as the year has been, so has the last few weeks.

Our Interfaith Community Thanksgiving Service on Sunday, November 24 was very successful in bringing together the

religious communities of our town. Over 500 people from the Christian and Jewish communities attended the service headed by their clergy and a combined children's choir provided the music. Once again our Women's Guild did a marvelous job in hosting the reception that followed.

In response to a directive from the Diocese we embarked on a clothing collection and fund raising campaign to help our brother and sisters in Armenia who are going through hard times this winter. Thanks to everyone's efforts our clothing collection drive ended very successfully and thousands of people in Armenia are a little warmer. Our fundraising drive is still going on and we hope that everyone will contribute to the fund to send food and other necessary items.

On Sunday, November 24, following the Divine Liturgy, more than 15 couples were in church to celebrate a service of thanksgiving on the occasion of their wedding anniversaries which they marked during the year. Der Hayr performed a special service of Blessing of Wine which the couples shared.

We welcome the newly formed Men's Fellowship as one of our Church Organizations, its formations, it seems, was long overdue, judging from the successful start. We look forward to their contributions to our parish community life.

Our upcoming New Year's Eve Gala is a sellout. About 350 tickets were sold out within two weeks and we are looking forward to a wonderful time together.

Our new Christian Education and Family Worship Divine Liturgy program and schedule is progressing very satisfactorily. It is heartwarming to see adults and children learning and worshipping together.



In a very short time we were able to make a commitment to provide a dinner once a month to residents at Eva's Shelter in Paterson, and to a men's shelter in Hackensack in the summer. In addition to these, we also participate with the other churches in Fair Lawn to provide dinner for a whole week to a family shelter in Englewood twice a year. Occasionally we are asked to cook and serve a meal on a Sunday afternoon to a walk-in shelter in Hackensack. Words cannot express the feeling of gratification one experiences when one meets the Lord in the personal encounter of the hungry and the poor. CLOTHING DRIVE FOR ARMENIA

On very short notice and in very short time St. Leon's proved once again that when love, care and concern are the motivators all obstacles can be overcome. And thus it was during the two weeks before Thanksgiving.

The Diocese had sent directives to all parishes that there is an urgent need for winter clothing in some remote villages in Armenia. Within less than two weeks we collected more than 20,000 lbs of clothing. Our church served as the center of collection where all the collections from other metropolitan area churches were brought, sorted out, baled and trucked to the airport. Our thanks first and foremost to all the donors. But we would also like to thank a few people for specific tasks that they performed: to Grace Pinajian and Anne Kachigian -

for organizing the whole effort of sorting out, labeling and bagging the clothes with assistance from Care and Share mothers, Armenian School Board members and mothers, Women's Gulid members and over 25 individual parishleners both from St. Leon's and St. Thomas; to Joseph and Ira Marootian of Marootian Trading Co. for balling the clothes; to The Treasure Island Company for providing their own trucks and drivers to pick up all the clothes from all the churches in the area and transporting them to the bale house and to the airport; to Richard Temasian for providing the plastic bags; and last but not least to our custodian Minas Arakelian for working extra hard to get things done on time. Thank you all Just think, as a direct result of your contributions and your labor hundreds of people in Armenia are a little warmer this winter.
