

PRIMATE'S MESSAGE

We rejoice with the parish priest, officials, members and friends of the St. Leon Armenian Church on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of the consecration of the newly constructed church in Fair Lawn, New Jersey.

In 1934, when a small group of dedicated Armenian men and women living in and near south Paterson put together \$6,000 and purchased a modest church on Bloomfield Avenue, none of them dreamed that their children and grandchildren would someday enjoy the facilities of a large church building, with its detached social hall, spacious picnic area, all set in a more desirable environment.

We bless the memory of the founders in this parish. It was their wish that the humble house of prayer purchased with so much sacrifice during the Depression be named after St. Leon, the patriotic Armenian priest who inspired St. Vartan Mamigonian, commander of the loyalist troops resisting the Persian oppressor. In 1941, the south Paterson church was consecrated and named St. Leon by the Diocesan Primate, Archbishop Karekin Hovsepian, later Catholicos of the Great House of Cilicia in Lebanon.

The new St. Leon Church created opportunities for inner growth and outreach. Easily accessible by automobile and bus, it attracted more families and visitors. Communication with the Diocesan Center, St. Vartan Cathedral, sister parishes and Armenian institutions in northern New Jersey improved. The Abajian Hall built during the 1980's brought new vigor and increased the dimensions of church activities. Leaders of the new St. Leon Church have distinguished themselves during the past 25 years on the Diocesan and national level by their valuable services and philanthropies.





A TIME FOR RENEWED COMMITMENTS



E. GEORGE DABAGIAN

A member of St. Leon Armenian Church for over 45 years, George was the Chairman of the Sons and Daughters of St. Leon Armenian Church, a young adults' group formed by the late Archbishop Mampre Calfayan. He became a member of the Parish Council and later served as Chairman. He was the General Chairman of the Building Committee for the construction of the newly built St. Leon Armenian Church of Fair Lawn, 25 years ago.

He co-chaired, with his wife, the banquet for Rev. Carnig Hallajian on the 10th anniversary of his ordination. He co-chaired the Fund Raising Committee for the construction of the Community Center of the church.

At the Armenian Diocese, he was President of the Pro Musica and Arts Committee, a committee member for the consecration of St. Vartan Armenian Cathedral, of the 100th birthday celebration for the late Haik Kavookjian, of the One World Festival and other projects.

He is a member of the Diocesan Board of Trustees, a member of the Board of Trustees of the Armenian Church Endowment Fund, a former member of the Board of Directors of St. Nersess Seminary, a committee member of the visit of His Holiness, Vasken I in 1960 and 1987.

He was a member of the Diocesan Pacesetter's Committee and Fund Raising Committee for St. Vartan Cathedral mortgage. Also the Archbishop's Fund campaign committee. George was Chairman of the 25th anniversary banquet for our former Primate, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian. He is presently the Honorary Chairman of the St. Leon Armenian Church Renovation Committee.



LUCY DABAGIAN

It was at the age of 15 that Lucy became the organist in the Armenian Church of Newark, now St. Mary Armenian Church in Livingston. Having studied accompanying and two piano music, she accompanied vocalists and musicians for various church luncheons and banquets, locally and out of state. She has been the organist for special services at St. Vartan Armenian Cathedral; also for the Women's Saints Day services since 1973. She was organist and choir director at St. Leon Armenian Church for over 25 years. Although she is not regularly on duty, she is "on call" always. In her very early years, she attended and graduated Armenian language school, thus had great interest in teaching music and accompanying in St. Leon's Armenian School.

Her love and deep feeling of Armenian liturgical music inspired her to join members of the Armenian church choirs to go to Etchmiadzin, by invitation from His Holiness, Vasken I for further study and participation in the Etchmiadzin choir.

Lucy has been a former Chairman of St. Leon's Women Guild. She has chaired many social and fund raising functions and worked on committees as well. She has been Co-chairman and committee member for functions at the Armenian Diocese. She was a member of the Primate's Women's Advisory Council from 1973-1985. In 1986, she became Chairman of the Ad-Hock Committee of the Women's Guilds to form the Women's Guild Central Council. After its formation, she became the Chairman for 2 years and then served on the Council for 1 year. She has been a member of St. Leon Church for 42 years.

She has received the St. Vartan Award from our former Primate, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian.




ZAVEN MAROOTIAN

The late Zaven Marootian was Memorials Chairman of the Building Committee for the construction of St. Leon Armenian Church in Fair Lawn. He served on the Parish Council for many years and was Chairman of the Parish Council from 1950 to 1953 and again in 1957. In 1960, Zaven was a Diocesan Delegate and in 1964 he was Chairman of St. Leon's Mr. and Mrs. Club. Anne Marootian said of her late husband, "God rest his soul. He always told me, GET INVOLVED. In 1940, when we moved from New York to Paterson, Zaven became active in St. Leon's right away. At that time, he was probably the youngest parish council member and was always involved. He never stopped serving his church, but was a firm believer in stepping down and nurturing the young people to take over as he had been nurtured. Zaven was always proud of the young people."



HAROTUNE NAKASHIAN

The late Harotune Nakashian is being honored today for taking the initiative to purchase the land on Saddle River Road in Fair Lawn where St. Leon was constructed and consecrated in 1965. He is credited with possessing the vision to see its potential, providing enough property for later expansion. The parish was enabled to construct the community center behind the church edifice in 1980 because of this vision. The Nakashian family involved itself in the tremendous job of decision making when the parish contemplated the move from Paterson. John Nakashian, Harotune's son and a long-standing member, said of his parents, "It was my mother's devotion to the church that inspired my father." John Jr., John's son (4 years old at the time), became Godfather of our church at the consecration in memory of his grandfather Harotune, who did not live to see the memorable day.



ANDREW S. TILBIAN

Andrew Tilbian began his church life at St. Leon's as a teenager. He joined the Sons and Daughters organization, one similar to the present ACYOA.

This was short-lived as he was inducted into the U.S. Navy as an Ensign in 1942 and returned four years later as a Lt. Commander, having served in the Pacific Theater where he received the Purple Heart. Upon his return, he married Dovie (nee Dikijian) and became active in St. Leon's along with his parents, Mary and Aram Tilbian.

Andrew served his beloved church in many ways and wore many hats . . . including Treasurer, Vice-Chairman and Chairman of the Parish Council. He served as Diocesan Delegate for many years.

He — along with Charles Pinajian — instituted the envelope system for collection of dues at St. Leon. During his chairmanship, the plans were made for the move from Paterson to Fair Lawn and he was deeply involved in the planning and building of the new church. He formed the Building Committee for the Fair Lawn church and served on it from beginning to end. Andrew was a Godfather of the Church and one of the Co-signers of the mortgage.

He was a member of the Mr. and Mrs. Club and the Men's Club which was formed at the time of his Parish Council Chairmanship. He was Toastmaster at the banquets and affairs which St. Leon had.

Andrew loved his church deeply and served in every possible capacity, even to the extent of doing plumbing and cleaning in the Paterson Church. On Sunday mornings, he was always there to greet the parishioners and guests with a warm smile and a bit of humor.

However, in 1967, his health failed and he was no longer able to be active. We are certain that he is happy with, and proud of, the progress of St. Leon Armenian Church.

THE SIGNIFICANCE OF CONSECRATION

The ritual origins of the consecration of a Christian Church go as far back as Hebrew times, to the consecration of Solomon's temple.


Consecration is "the act by which a person or thing is separated from common use and permanently dedicated to the service of God." Besides its permanence, a consecration is distinguished from simple blessing by its greater solemnity.

The word church (ecclesia) originally referred to the group of people who came together in order to celebrate the Divine Luturgy. It is only by extension that it came to mean the building in which people congregated for that purpose. Naturally the first Christians did not have special buildings for their religious services. They gathered together in private houses. It was only after the end of the third century that church buildings began to be erected. Thus our own Mother Church of Holy Etchmiadzin has the distinction of being one of the very first buildings in the world built especially as a church.

The essential part of the consecration of an Armenian Church is first the anointment of the Altar, then of the two pillars of the Apse, then of the center of the front of the Ambon (where the lectern is placed), then, consecutively, of the western, northern, and southern sides of the church, and finally of the Main Door. All but the Altar, Ambon, and Main Door are consecrated in the name of the twelve Apostles and of St. Paul. The anointing is done with Holy Chrism or muron and incense is used throughout the service. Holy Chrism is the symbol of grace or divine presence. Incense is the symbol of praise.

In a truly Christian community all buildings and all things should serve God. An Armenian church is a building where our Lord Himself is bodily present because the Divine Liturgy is celebrated there at least every Sunday. For this reason it has a very special function. It should be set apart. It should be consecrated.

Originally the word "church" did not apply to a building. It applied to the people who came together in order to celebrate the Divine Liturgy. To this day it keeps that meaning.



GODFATHERS OF NEWLY CONSECRATED CHURCH

On September 19, 1965 John H. Nakashian, Jr. became the main Godfather of St. Leon Armenian Church, in memory of his grandfather, Harry H. Nakashian, who was instrumental in purchasing the beautiful grounds on Saddle River Road, Fair Lawn, New Jersey.






