

#### MESSAGE FROM THE PRIMATE

It is with great joy that we mark the dedication of this new extension to the St. Leon Armenian Church. It crowns the efforts and embodies the hopes of many dedicated parishioners, symbolizing the spirit of a growing vital community.

The Armenian word for the consecration of a new Church is navakatik, a borrowed ancient foreign word, meaning "new" (nava) "house" (katak). A house can be the locus of many kinds of endeavors, from the raising of a family to the celebration of the Divine Liturgy. For Armenians, though, the words "house" and "Church" are inextricably intertwined, for where God makes His home, in the depths of the human heart, there will all manner of blessings flourish, and family life, cultural life and Church life become as one.

Education - Christian Education and the study of our Armenian heritage is the cornerstone of the house of every man, the architect of the mind that gets right at the heart in which Our Lord will dwell. We rejoice that this new extension will serve directly the goals of Christian Armenian education which are the most certain insurance of the future vitality of our nation in every land, and of our children's development as compassionate and creative human beings.

The spirit of our Armenian thirst for knowledge is alive in these walls: classes have been held in a trailer, in the Church auditorium, in the vestry, but the people of our parish have continued undaunted. It is not for nothing that the epithet "the Invincible" (Armenian "Anhaght") was applied to an Armenian scholar rather than a general.

Let us continue, to grow and to build new houses of the Lord in our communities and in our hearts. And may the Lord bless us, and grant success to our endeavors to serve Him and to teach our children to serve Him, for the sake of His redemptive message and His Holy Church.

They shared hope. They believed in God, themselves and each other. They had learned well their lessons from childhood, their heritage handed down to them through the centuries. Those early parishoners, the Armenian faithful, are remembered fondly today.

The modest beginnings of the St. Leon parish can be traced from as early as 1880 from Union City to Paterson to Fair Lawn. At first, Armenians living in New Jersey attended Holy Cross Armenian Apostolic Church in Union City. Until 1930, the Armenians of Greater Paterson occasionally received visiting clergy who celebrated Divine Liturgy and administered the sacraments.

In 1932, St. Luke Episcopal Church on Bloomfield Avenue, in Paterson was purchased. Despite depression years, the faithful gave generously. The entire mortgage was paid within two years! Extensive renovation costs were also covered during that time.

Plans to build a new church to accommodate the growth of the parish were in progess by the 1950's. The present three acre property on Saddle River Road was purchased in 1958. The original plan called for the building of the Community Center followed by the construction of the church. Priorities were later reversed. The Armenian faithful, who had survived the 1915 genocide, and who were struggling to preserve their heritage, recognized the role of the church in nourishing the spirit.

The vision, wisdom and leadership of the clergy sustain the people. The dedication of the people, in turn, sustains the church. "If the Lord does not build the house, the work of the builders is useless."

Since the consecration of St. Leon Armenian Church in Fair Lawn in September of 1965, the parish has continued to expand. It is a parish faithful to tradition; it is active, vibrant, healthy. Weekdays and nights the church is engrossed with the activities of the Parish Council, Choir, Women's Guild, Sunday School, Armenian School, Senior Citizens and ACYOA.

Again growth stirs the parish to make plans for the future. On June 6, 1980, a special parish assembly authorized the Building Committee to proceed with construction of the Community Center and the conversion of the existing church hall into classrooms. The Community Center will encourage more and varied functions. Classrooms will safeguard the religious and cultural education of the youth.

Worldwide uncertainty foreshadows the 1980's. The energy crisis and inflation threaten. However, those early parishoners, the Armenian faithful, have gently handed down their courage and hope. Their spirit walks with us.
