This action coming before this Court on a Petition for Dissolution of Marriage, and the parties having reached an agreement which equitably settles their marital rights, and the Petitioner having presented oral testimony to the Court, and the Court so finding that:

1. The parties have resided in the Commonwealth of Kentucky for more than 180 days next preceding the filing of the Petition for Dissolution of Marriage.

2. The conciliation provisions of KRS 403.170 do not apply.

3. The parties have lived apart for more than 60 days.

4. The Respondent is not pregnant.

5. The marriage between the Petitioner, Andrew C. Sosnowski, and the Respondent, Patricia B. Sosnowski, of the 30th day of December, 1990, is irretrievably broken.

6. The parties have entered voluntarily into an Agreement which is found not to be unconscionable, and the Court being otherwise sufficiently advised,

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED AND ADJUDGED as follows:

1. That the marriage between the Petitioner, Andrew C.

Sosnowski, and the Respondent, Patricia B. Sosnowski, of the 30th day of December, 1990, be and it is hereby dissolved.

2. That the Agreement filed herein on the 17th day of December, 1990, is incorporated herein and made a part hereof by reference.

3. It is further ordered that a wage assignment pursuant to KRS ~~403.215~~ ^{403.215 (4)} shall issue.
