Very Reverend Arshag Khatchadourian

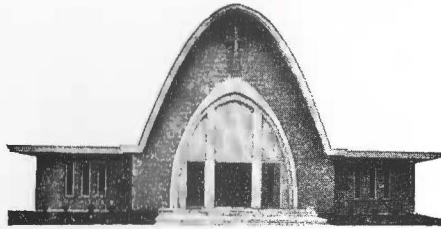
On December 1, 1974, Holy Resurrection Armenian Church of South Milwaukee (Soorp Haroutune) will celebrate the 50th Anniversary of its founding with His Grace, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, the Primate of the Eastern Diocese of North America and Canada, presiding.

Our Holy Churches, in conjunction with their adjacent cultural centers, have become the embodiment of their expression of faith and hope, and to our ancestors, every word of the Bible was holy. In 301 A.D., the year of Armenian conversion, the inspiring prayers of St. Gregory the Illuminator and St. Gregory of Narek, the sweet scent of the many churches and monasteries, and the secular sound of the Armenian troubadours inspired Armenians to coexist as Church and nation through many centuries.

Although practically devoured through constant persecutions, Armenians in Diaspora were desperate to maintain their Christianity and practice their religious beliefs. So deep were their feelings that in 1912, in South Milwaukee, the first Parish Council was organized in St. Mark's Episcopal Church. In 1924, at Franke's Hall in South Milwaukee, the Reverend Vartan Tavidian along with twelve local Armenians, purchased St. Luke's Lutheran Church and transformed it into an Armenian Church where they could listen to the songs of Gomidas and the beautiful Sharagans.

Let us pray to God on the auspicious occasion of our 50th Jubilee, that He may accept with His all-loving sympathy, the departed souls of Soorp Haroutune Armenian Church who labored so unstintingly to perpetuate His glory. May He grant His blessings upon us who are still laboring in this world, and give us the strength and ability to carry on our duty in His love.

Let the bells of Holy Resurrection Armenian Apostolic Church (Soorp Haroutune) ring out forever to spread love, obedience, and the fear of God along the paths of the Orthodox Doctrine that was entrusted to us by our forebearers; that we, in this hospitable land, may grow and become stronger in our faith for the sake of His people and His Church.

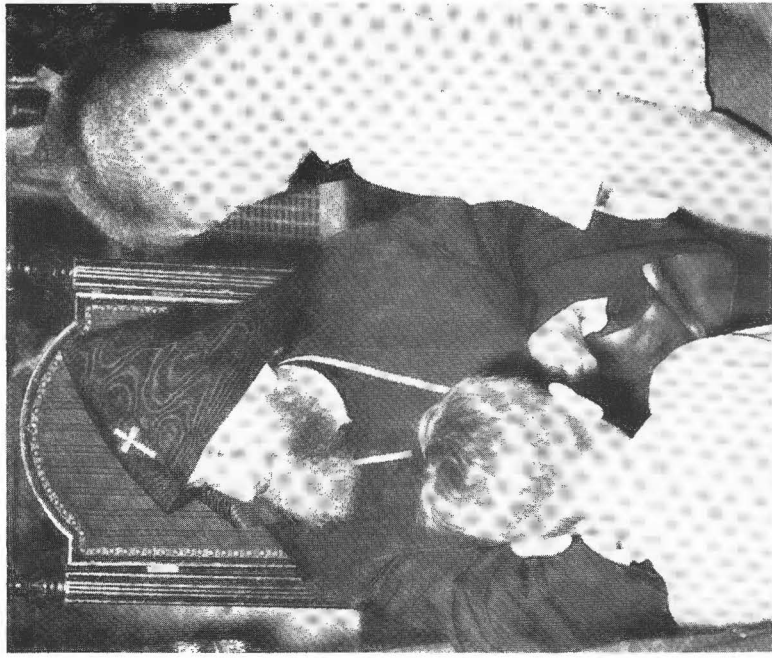

The Armenian Community in South Milwaukee Brief History

1910 — Five Armenian men arrive in South Milwaukee to work in local factories, and shortly after established a rooming residence.

1912 — New emigrants swell their numbers to over 100, the majority from Kayseri province in Turkish Armenia from the villages of Tomarza, Jujoon, Everek, Chomaglou, others from Sivas and Kharpet.

1912-1913 — Feeling a need for religious services, a Board of Trustees is elected, with Hagop Yelanjian, Chairman; Mgerditch Vahradian, Vice Chairman; and Kaloust Dadian, Treasurer. Services are held by visiting Armenian clergymen at St. Mark's Episcopal Church.

1914-1918 — Among the men serving in the U.S. Army during World War I were: Ohannes Barsamian, Aram Chorbajian, Krikor Dgermanjian, Haji Baderian, Mihran Bashirian, Hadji Hajinian, Vahan Hougasian, Mgerditch Jakarian, Barsam Kaloustian, Hacher Kaloustian, Ghevont Kamakian, Vartanes Sahagian, Toros Savagian, Mateos Torosian and Owagim Yelanjian. The Armenian community is cited for its participation in the Liberty Bond program.

1915 — The first Armenian family arrives to live in South Milwaukee — Hoogas and Zarouhee Torosian with daughters, Roxie and Margaret, and infant son Harry.

1918 — After the war, many of the men travel back to their homeland, some to bring back wives who were left behind, others to return with brides for themselves and prospective brides for their friends.

1924 — Recognizing the need for a church to serve the increasing Armenian population, the city's Armenian elders call a meeting at Franke's Hall to organize a building fund committee. Soon after the initial meeting the committee purchased the former St. Luke's Church at 909 Michigan Avenue, for \$3,200 and invested an additional eleven thousand dollars to remodel the structure to meet their needs.

On October 3 and 4, 1924, Soorp Haroutune Armenian Apostolic Church was consecrated by Archbishop Dirayr Hovanessian. Charter Parish Council members included Apkar Salbashian, Godfather of Soorp Haroutune. Others were Haroutune Degermanjian, Vahan Jandegian, Boghos Kachigian, Hairabed Kalajian, Ghevont Kamakian, Mihran Hayalian, Hagop Samuelian, Hoogas Torosian, Hairabed Vahradian, Hagop Yelanjian and Krikor Zakian.

Der Vartan Tavidian was appointed the first permanent pastor, Shnork Mouradian the first Deacon. The Ladies Aid and Choir were also formed in 1924, and in that same year Mr. and Mrs. Mihran Hayalian became the first couple to be married in the new church.

1934 — With a fairly large Armenian-American community in South Milwaukee, Armenian language

classes were instituted at the local High School.

1942 — A number of Soorp Haroutune's members living in West Allis and other distant areas of Milwaukee County form St. John's Armenian Church in West Allis.

1943 — The Sunday School is established with an initial enrollment of 40 students.

1941-1945 — World War II disrupts the life of parish members as almost 80 young men serve in the U.S. Armed Forces during the conflict. Three make the supreme sacrifice, and Gold Stars appear at the homes of George Mouradian, Charles Baderian and Reuben Markarian.

1946 — The ACYOA receives its charter.

1947 — The Soorp Haroutune takes a pioneer step and establishes the first Armenian cemetery in the United States. Founding fathers of the cemetery: the Very Rev. Soukias Kalfayan, Simon Tertadian, Kerovpe Balian, Kazar Barsamian, Shnork Barsamian, Tarkis Barsamian, Sarkis Dadaian and John Sarian.

1960 — On February 7, fire strikes Soorp Haroutune and the Altar is destroyed. On July 1, His Holiness Vasken I pays a visit to Soorp Haroutune's damaged church. During a brief service, Rev. Kalfayan is presented with a special cross from His Holiness in recognition of service to the Armenian Church. During this same year the membership voted to construct a new church. Plans and designs were presented to the congregation and on December 10, construction was started on a new \$125,000 edifice. Steven Barsamian, a member of Soorp Haroutune Parish, is ordained a priest and given the name of Der Arsen. A graduate of Catholicate Cilicia, a seminary near Bierut, he also studied at Seaburg Western Seminary and Garrett Biblical Institute in Evanston, and St. James Patriarchate in Jerusalem.

1961 — On July 6, Archbishop Sion Manoogian officiated at the cornerstone blessing of the new church.

1962 — The new Soorp Haroutune Church is consecrated on April 15, Archbishop Sion officiating. A dedication banquet held in the new church hall was

attended by 300 people. In October, Miss Rosemary Jeknavorian and Dr. S. Armagan became the first couple to be married in the new church. On November 25, an Open House provided the public with an opportunity to view our new church.

1963 – Holy Resurrection Church becomes the new name of Soorp Haroutune through a directive from the Diocese. Holy Resurrection is a translation of Soorp Haroutune.

1964 – May 1-3, Holy Resurrection is honored to host the 62nd Annual Assembly of the Diocese of the Armenian Church. Approximately 30 clergymen and 100 delegates attend the sessions. In September the Divine Liturgy was televised over Station WTMJ-TV, with Rev. Guregh Kalfayan officiating and Deacon Hovhannes Kasparian directing the choir.

1965 – April 24-25, Holy Resurrection and our sister churches in West Allis and Racine participate in services commemorating the Fiftieth Anniversary of Armenian Martyrdom.

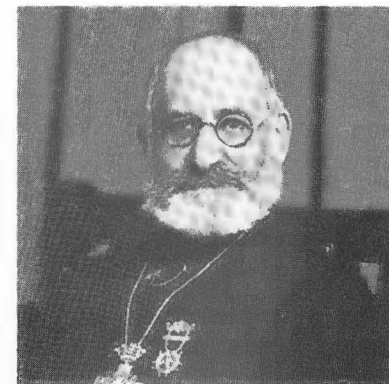
1969 – Holy Resurrection celebrates its 45th Anniversary, with Archbishop Sion as guest speaker. About 180 people attend a banquet on December 7, where mortgage burning ceremonies for the new church were performed. Three of the original founders were in attendance: Haroutune Degermanjian, Mihran Hayalian and Hairabed Kalagian.

1970 – Former members from out of town were invited to return to South Milwaukee July 24-26 for a weekend reunion celebration. Festivities included a concert presented by the Choir, a reunion dance, and the annual picnic. A new church organ is donated by the United Association of Tomarza Central Committee, South Milwaukee.

1974 – Holy Resurrection Church celebrates 50 years of service to the Armenian community of South Milwaukee. An Armenian dance features the November 30 program. Highlight of the two-day event is the Commemorative Service on Sunday, December 1, conducted by Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, followed by a banquet to close the celebration.

BIOGRAPHIES OF CLERGY – PAST AND PRESENT

REV. VARTAN TAVIDIAN

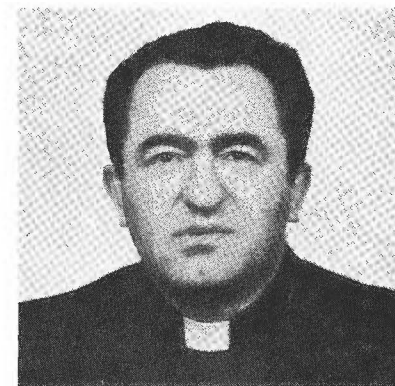
Rev. Vartan Tavidian came to South Milwaukee in 1924 and served as the first priest for the new parish of Soorp Haroutune for two years. During the second year — 1925 — he served both South Milwaukee and Racine. In 1926 he was assigned to California, and returned to Soorp Haroutune in 1934 to serve another four years.

REV. GUREGH KALFAYAN

Father Guregh Kalfayan was born in Aleppo, Syria, in 1932. A graduate of the Armenian Seminary in Antilias, Lebanon, he was ordained in 1958 by Archbishop Mampre Kalfayan, Primate. Father Guregh also studied psychology for 3 years at Springfield College, Mass., and served 4 years at St. John The Divine in Springfield. Assigned to Holy Resurrection in 1962, he simultaneously served St. John's Armenian Church, West Allis.

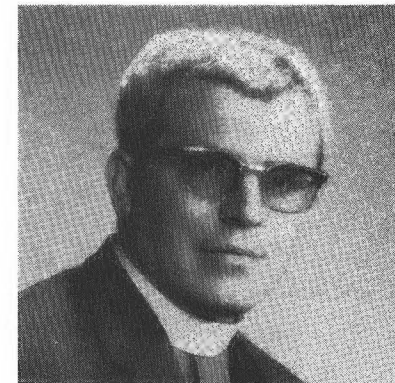
REV. KRIKOR HAIRABEDIAN

Father Hairabedian was born in Beirut, Lebanon. He entered the Armenian Theological Seminary in Antilias, Lebanon and upon graduation was ordained a priest on June 28, 1953. Father Krikor served as parish priest in Beirut for six years and came to the U.S. in 1960. He was assigned to the Holy Resurrection parish in South Milwaukee and is presently engaged with missionary work "Renewal in Christ" and with the monthly publication for the same. He graduated with a B.A. degree in Elementary Education from the Dominican College, Racine, Wis.



VERY REV. VAZKEN KESHISHIAN

Father Keshishian was born in Beirut, Lebanon. He studied in the Armenian Theological Seminary in Antilias, Lebanon (1949-1954). He was ordained a priest by the late Archbishop Mampre Sirounian in Cairo, Egypt and was assigned to the Armenian parish in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia in 1960. He later served in the parishes of Marseilles, France and Argentina. He came to the U.S. in 1963 and was assigned to the pastorate of Holy Resurrection Armenian Church in South Milwaukee in 1968. In 1972 he was transferred to the East Coast by Archbishop Torkom Manoogian.



VERY REV. ARSHAG KHATCHADOURIAN

Very Rev. Arshag Khatchadourian was born in 1938 in Beirut, Lebanon. He entered the St. James Armenian Seminary in Jerusalem in 1953. Jarankavor Simon was ordained a deacon in 1956. Deacon Simon received ordination in Celibate Priesthood in 1960. As a member of the St. James Brotherhood, he served in the St. James Monastery from 1960 to 1966. His responsibilities to the Patriarchate were Choirmaster of the monastery and the local Armenian secondary school; in charge of the brotherhood's daily food; teaching Armenian history and religion. In addition, he assumed the pastorship of the Armenian community of Jerusalem and vicinities; the Superior of the Archangel's church and of the Armenian nuns residing in the same place. Hayr Soorp Arshag came to the United States in February, 1966 and was appointed pastor of the St. George Armenian church of Hartford, Conn. In January of 1967, he became the pastor of St. Gregory of Narek church in Cleveland, Ohio and in September, 1972, he assumed the pastoral duties of Holy Resurrection Armenian Church in South Milwaukee, Wis.





VERY REVEREND SOUKIAS KALFAYAN

Very Rev. Soukias Kalfayan

The Very Rev. Soukias Vardapet Kalfayan was ordained to the priesthood on September 16, 1943, and served the South Milwaukee church from 1943 until 1961, when he passed away. During that period he also served the parishes of Racine and West Allis on a part-time basis.

Born in Feneseh, Turkey, Rev. Kalfayan had served the Armenian church as an acolyte, choir member, and ordained Deacon. Following graduation from law school in Constantinople and service in the Turkish army in World War I, he opened a law office. Subsequently he moved to France, then came to the United States in 1923 and operated a printing business in Detroit, Michigan, prior to entering the clergy.

The doctoral degree of Vardapet (Abegha) was conferred on Rev. Kalfayan by his Grace Archbishop Sion Manoogian in December, 1948. He was also honored in July of 1960, during services in South Milwaukee by His Holiness Catholicos Vasken I. His Holiness presented Father Kalfayan with a Holy Cross from Etchmiadzin — seat of the Armenian Church — in recognition of his long and faithful service to the church.

Father Kalfayan was also instrumental in establishing in South Milwaukee the first Armenian cemetery in the United States, where he is interred.

During the past fifty years, Holy Resurrection Armenian Church (Soorp Haroutune) was fortunate to have dedicated men working along with the pastors at all Services. Among them were Deacon Shnork Mouradian, who served in Soorp Haroutune Armenian Church for 45 years. In 1963, after his many years of labor, he was awarded a plaque by the Parish Council. He will ever be in our memory.

Kalousd Tavidian served not only as Deacon until 1947, but he further served his Church by acting as Choir Director during that period of time.

Deacon Parsegh Vahradian has also served at the Altar for many years. He was ordained by Archbishop Torkom Manoogian at Holy Resurrection.

Sub-Deacon Harold Baylerian has served the Church in many capacities since his early childhood. He is presently serving at the Altar as well as instructing the parish children in the procedures of assisting the priest during the Divine Liturgy.

BUILDING OF THE CHURCH



Consecrated on October 4, 1924, Soorp Haroutune Apostolic Church, 909 Michigan Ave., South Milwaukee, was the first Armenian church in Wisconsin.

A significant stride is made in building the new structure with completion of the foundation and walls of the church hall early in 1961.



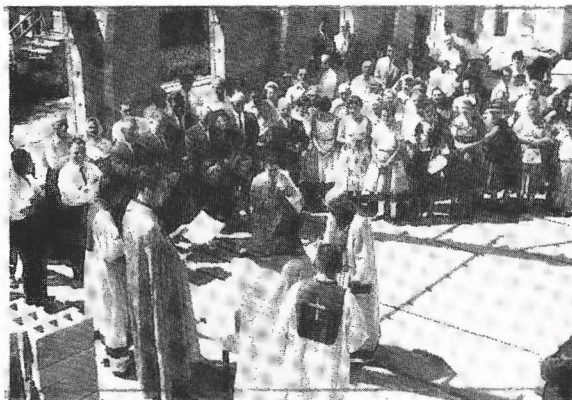
Work proceeds on schedule and the parabolic arches of the modern Byzantine design are erected in the Spring of 1961.



On July 6, 1961, Archbishop Sion Manoogian officiated at the laying of the cornerstone.



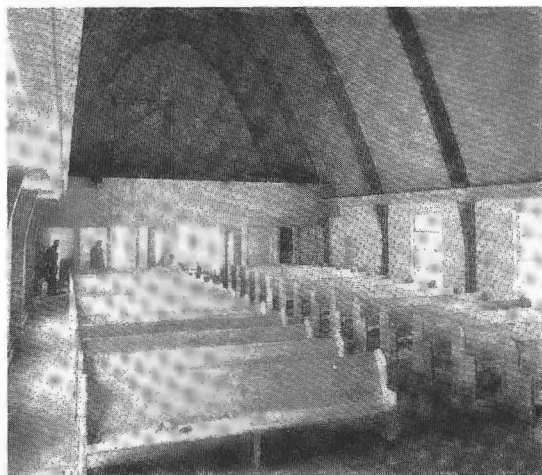

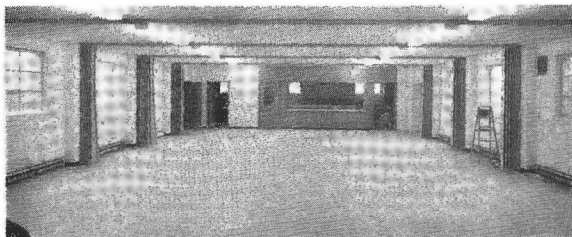

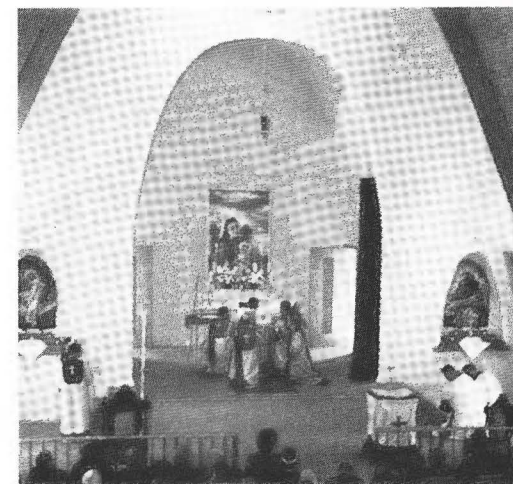
The new church begins to take its final exterior form in the winter of 1961-2.

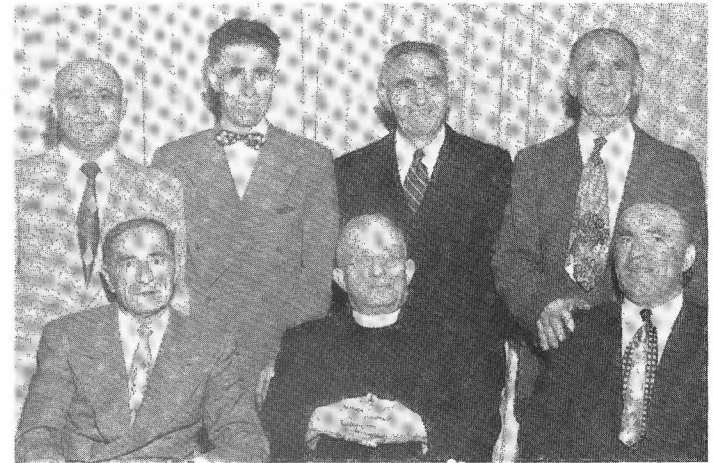

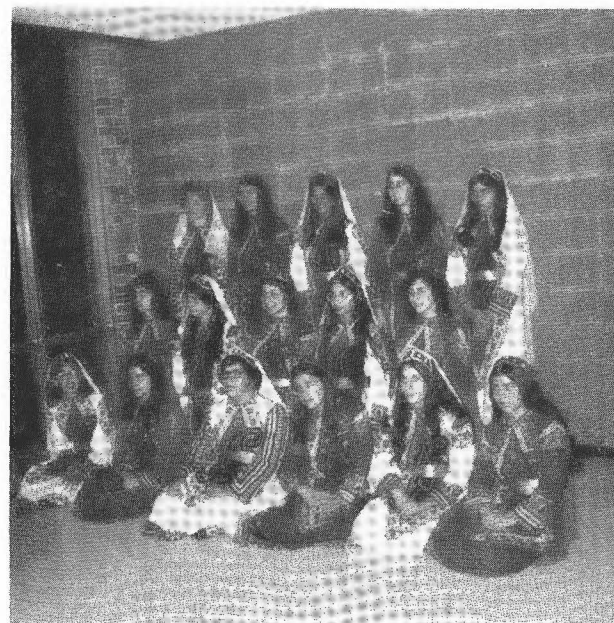

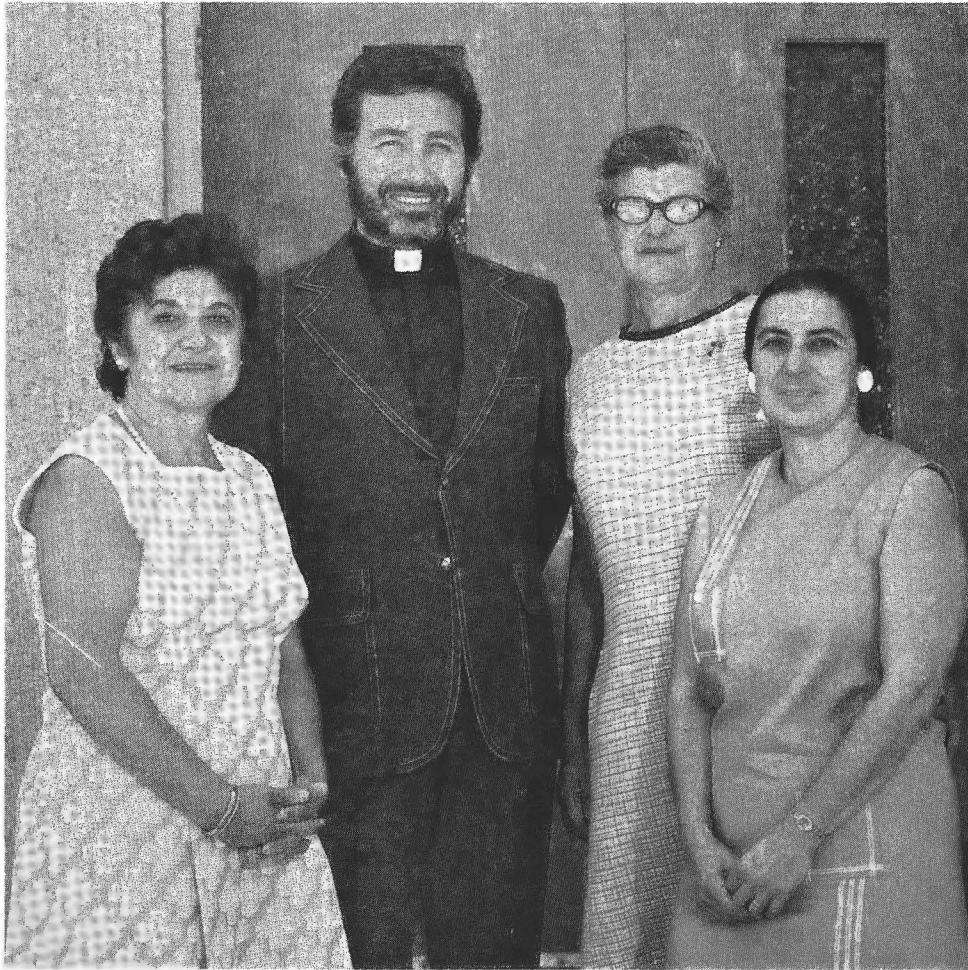
In the history of Holy Resurrection, there existed two other organizations which functioned under the auspices of the Church.

The Dartball Club was formed Circa 1963. In the eight years of league competition, the team won several trophies and regional championships.



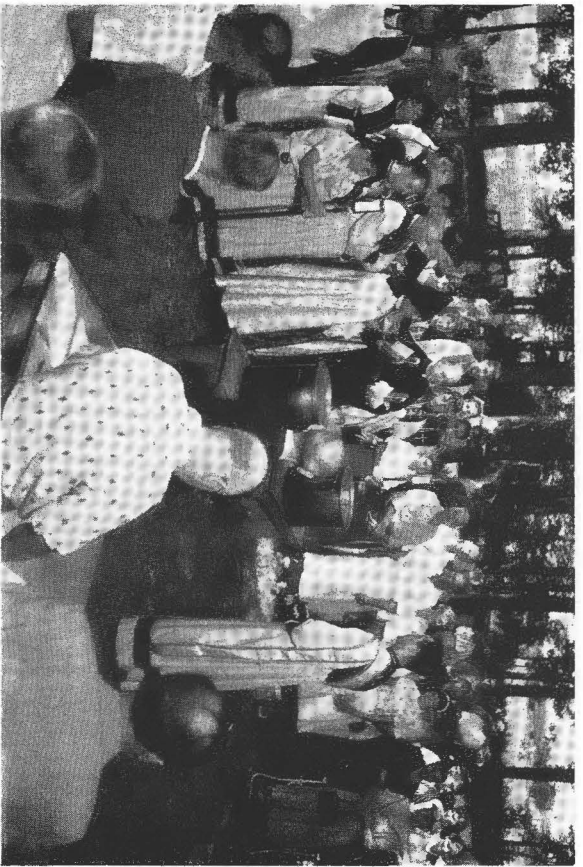
Holy Resurrection Dartball Team, 1967.



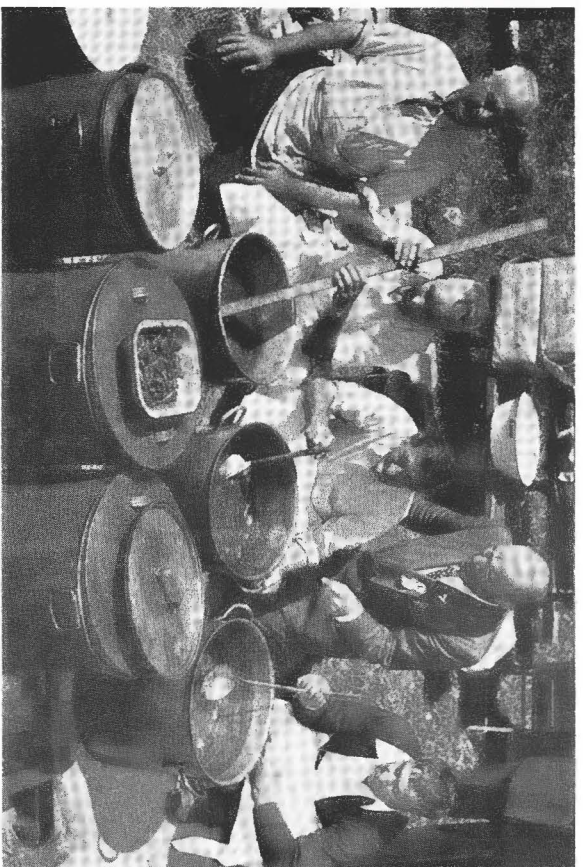

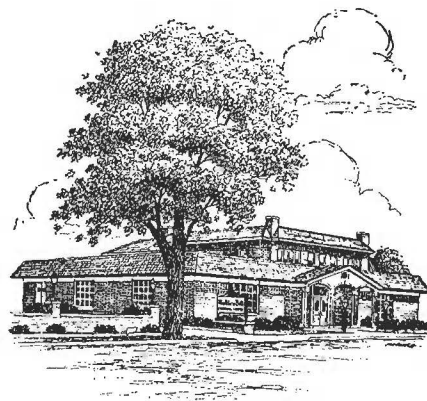
