Gentlemen:

Pursuant to a telephone conversation which I had with Father several weeks ago, I am enclosing a map on which is outlined a tract of land comprising 70 acres which the owner is willing to donate to some benevolent or religious organization. The owner has stupilated two general conditions: (1) that she be permitted to live in her house near the junction of the railroad track and the highway pictured at the bottom of the map (2) that the land be put to use as quickly as possible during her lifetime.

I believe that this opportunity should not be missed and I urge the officers of the council to seriously consider acquisition of this land for a good purpose which will meet the requirements of the owner.

She has expressed the desire in the past that it be utilized as an old folks home. I have mentioned to her my contacting the Diocese and she has voiced no objection. In suggesting the possibility of an ACYO Camp she stated more or less firmly that she would rather see the land used the year around.

I do not have any power of attorney in this situation. I am acting as an intermediary until we can arrange a meeting which may be at almost any time. May I suggest however that a meeting be arranged after a specific purpose for the land has been decided upon.
