MAY 21, 1935 Around the World in Cleveland-No. 114 Armenian Apostolic Church Maintains Language Classes

Congregation in Cleveland Holds Services in Episcopal Church on East Side

More than 200 families comprise the congregation of the local Armenian Apostolic Church, whose services are held at Grace Episcopal Church, E. 91st street and Harvard avénue.

The Armenian Church, with its seat in Etekmizdzin; Armeniz, near the historic Mt. Ararat, claims to be ; the only democratic Christian church in existence. Heads of the church are elected by the members of the congregation.

Because of scarcity of funds the congergation does not maintain a clergyman in Cleveland. About once a month the pastor of the Armenian Church in Detroit is called upon to officiate here. Church services are held in the Armenian language. Two classes where native tongue is taught are maintained by the congregation. Mrs. Marie Bagdasarian teaches the downtown class at 2023 Prospect avenue, and Mrs. Yester Minasian the uptown class, E. 71st street and Broadway.
