Miss Haigazian took the opportunity of the Closing Day Luncheon to showcase the newly published outstanding Church School Books, which are indicative of the emphasis the Diocese is putting on teaching Church School students. Mrs. Sara Babaian, a member of Holy Trinity, participated in this project with her artwork.
