



Without the church to guide, inspire and teach, our nation would have long been lost. There is no measure of the great service this humble edifice has rendered our people throughout the past 25


In generations to come, your children and your children's children will continue reaping the spiritual harvest we sowed in



#### 25 YEARS IN THE NEW CHURCH

#### 1966 - 1991

- 1966 September 18, His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, the Primate consecrated our new church edifice.
- 1967 February 5, Testimonial Banquet honoring Harry A. Kuljian.
- 1967 April 13, His Eminence the Primate, consecrated the new Baptismal font, donated by Mr. & Mrs. Sarkis Baldadian.
- 1967 May 2 & 3, Recital by Kohar Kasparian, famed soprano from Armenia took place in Town Hall. A banquet was tendered in her honor in the church hall.
- 1967 November 19, His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian presided over church's First Anniversary Banquet.
- 1968 April 21, our Church Choir celebrated the 40th Anniversary of its foundation.
- 1968 May 8, the Armenian community of Philadelphia, and our church in particular, were blessed with a pastoral visit of His Holiness L. L. Vazken I, Supreme Patriarch and Catholicos of All Armenians.
- 1969 April 13, Gomidas Centennial Commemoration with Gomidas Choral Group of New York hosted by Diocesan Auxiliary Ladies.
- 1969 September 21, 3rd Anniversary of Consecration Banquet, Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan presides.
- 1970 May 1-2, our parish hosted the Annual Diocesan Aseembly, which elected His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian to a second term of office as Primate.
- 1970 December 12-13, the 4th Anniversary of the Consecration of our church and the 30th Anniversary of the ordination to the priesthood of His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, the Primate, were celebrated jointly in our church.
- 1970 December 18-20, His Beatitude Archbishop Shnork Kaloustian, Patriarch of Constantinople, paid a visit to our parish and the Armenian community of Philadelphia.
- 1971 May 9, the 25th Anniversary of the ACYOA was celebrated by our chapter with a banquet honoring the past Chapter chairmen.
- 1971 July 9-11, ACYOA hosts 25th Anniversary and National Assembly of the ACYOA.
- 1971 In September, the Very Rev. Zaven Arzoumanian, pastor of our church since 1963, was assigned to Montreal, Canada as Vicar General, and the Reverend Father Michael Buttero assumed his responsibilities as the new pastor.
- 1971 October 17, the Centennial and the birth of His Holiness Karekin Hovsepiantz, the late Catholicos of the See of Cilicia and former Primate of our Diocese, was celebrated jointly by SS. Sahag-Mesrob and Holy Trinity.
- 1973 March 18, His Eminence Torkom Abp. Manoogian, Primate, paid a pastoral visit and bestowed the order of sub-deacon upon Garbis Kelyan, Albert Kapeghian, Sebouh Minassian, George Kashikjian and Albert Keshgegian.
- 1973 August 31-September 3, the Senior Chapters of the ACYOA of SS. Sahag-Mesrob and Holy Trinity churches hosted the 4th Annual Sports Weekend.
- 1974 January 13, in a Testimonial Banquet, the parish honored the past chairmen of Parish Council.
- 1974 In October, the Rev. Father Michael Buttero, pastor since 1971 was transferred and the Very Rev. Arshen Aivazian was assigned to our parish.
- 1974 November 7, His Beatitude Archbishop Shnork Kaloustian, Patriarch of Constantinople, visited our parish for the third time in a decade.
- 1975 April 24, the 60th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide of 1915 was commemorated in our church with a solemn Divine Liturgy.
- 1976 April 30-May 2, the 74th Annual Diocesan Assembly was held in Philadelphia, hosted by SS. Sahag-Mesrob and Holy Trinity Churches.
- 1976 September 19, the tenth Anniversary of the consecration of our church is being celebrated with a solemn Divine Liturgy, followed by a banquet, presided over by His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, the Diocesan Primate.
- 1978 October 22, Holy Trinity burns its mortgage.

- 1979 April 8, Golden Anniversary of Holy Trinity Church Choir.
- 1979 October 28, Dedication of Memorial Stained Glass Windows, His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian presides.
- 1982 August 15, Holy Trinity bids farewell to pastor the Very Reverend Fr. Arshen Aivazian.
- 1982 November 5-7, Holy Trinity Church Choir hosts 36th Annual Assembly of Armenian Church Choirs.
- 1983 March 27, ACYOA and Parish Council sponsor luncheon welcoming the Very Rev. Nourhan Manougian (visiting pastor).
- 1983 November 5, Holy Trinity Church Choir receives the Gomidas Award from the Association of Armenian Church Choirs.
- 1984 January 14, 20th Anniversary celebration of Archbishop Torkom Manoogian's Episcopal Consecration, jointly celebrated with SS. Sahag-Mesrob Armenian Church. Garbis Kelyan and Albert Keshgegian are elevated to the rank of deacon, Garo Garibian, Krikor Mahserejian, Shahab Minassian and Karnig Torossian to Sub-deacon, the rank of Tbir and the blessing of veils also took place.
- 1984 January 22, Very Rev. Haigazoun Melkonian assumes pastorate, Parish Council sponsors welcoming luncheon.
- 1984 April 15, Parish Council sponsors welcoming Banquet in honor of the new pastor, Very Rev. Fr. Haigazoun Melkonian on Palm Sunday.







#### **HONORARY CHAIRMEN**

#### **AZAD ATTARIAN**

Azad has served as chairman of the ACYOA several times, he was chairman of the first ACYOA convention that was held in Philadelphia.

Azad was the Godfather of our new Church at its consecration in 1966.

He has been the General Chairman of or a members of several consecration anniversary committees, and has served on our Parish Council.

Azad was Chairman of the 'Project '78' committee, which was responsible for additions, changes and memorials of dedicated in many parts of our Church, including the beautiful stained glass windows.

Azad is a lifelong member of Holy Trinity parish, the Men's Club and has served his parish in many capacities.

#### JACK C. GOUSHIAN

Jack was educated in Philadelphia Public Schools. Graduate of St. Joseph's University (1950) and Temple University Law School (1953).

He served in U.S. Army on staff of the Commander-in-Chief. Far East and United Nations Commands, Tokyo, Japan (1954-55).

Jack served two terms as National President of the Armenian Students Association of America, and nine years as First Vice-President of the Armenian General Benevolent Union of America.

He served as Vice-Chairman of Diocesan Assembly held at Holy Trinity Armenian Church and in charge of Philadelphia itinerary of His Holiness Vasken I, Catholicos of All Armenians during first pontifical visit to U.S.

Jack has represented Holy Trinity Armenian Church, Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, and Holy Etchmiadzin in various matters, including negotiation of insurance claim arising out of destruction by fire of former church edifice, zoning hearings and condemnation proceedings in Cheltenham Township, and "Iron Curtain" case involving bequest to Holy Etchmiadzin.

He established the Garabed Goushian Memorial Fund for St. Nersess Seminary and the Kayane Goushian Fund for Armenian Language Programs with the Armenian Church Endowment Fund.

He was past Master of St. Paul's Lodge No. 481, A.F. and A.M. Jack is a founding partner of Goushian, Mooradian and Goldsmith Law Offices (1963), now Goushian, Mooradian and Goldsmith, P.C.

#### HONORARY CHAIRMEN

#### **ZAVEN A. HOVSEPIAN**

Zaven has been a life-long member of Holy Trinity Armenian Church Parish and beginning 1935 was a member of the Church Choir

Between 1942 and 1944 he served in U.S. Army and in 1946 graduated Rutgers University School of Law with Juris Doctor Degree

Zaven served as Chairman of the Holy Trinity Church ACYOA and was the first Chairman of the ACYOA Central Council

He has served his Church in many ways over the years including in 1959 he was the Co-Chairman of the Building Fund Committee.

Presently Zaven is engaged in Business as distributor, manufacturer, and consultant in the coin-operated vending and amusement machine industries.

#### **DEACON MENAS MALOUMIAN**

Deacon Menas Maloumian's life is brilliantly reflected in the Sixty-year history of the Philadelphia Armenian Community. After arriving in Philadelphia in 1928, Deacon Menas has served under seven diocesan Primates as Tbir, Choirmaster, and Deacon. Menas' involvement in the Armenian community has been above else a history of uninterrupted service to the Armenian Church.

Deacon Maloumian's service is a living witness to our yesterday's history. When Archbishop Ghevont Tourian paid his first visit to Philadelphia, Deacon Menas was there to lead the choir for the episcopal celebration of the Holy Badarak. In 1941, Menas traveled to New York and Boston to organize choirs and to sow seeds for the national organization of Armenian Church Choirs.

When the North Philadelphia Armenians were forced to leave their edifice and purchase another church, Menas beacme involved and he personally designed the Holy Trinity Church Altar, where he was ordained Deacon by Archbishop Mampre Kalfayan in 1955.

When the Church was destroyed by fire in 1964, Deacon Maloumian stood firm at the side of the Pastor by exploring, finding and arranging a temporary chapel for Sunday services until 1966, when the new Church was built in Cheltenham. Deacon Maloumian has been serving the same Church in its third location as he stands tall at his remarkable age as the Honorary Chairman of the 25th Anniversary of his Church in Cheltenham.

Deacon Maloumian was awarded the St. Vartan Medal by the Primate, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian in 1973, and the grateful parish dedicated the new Altar in honor of Deacon Menas. Five years ago His Holiness Vasken I, Catholicos of all Armenians, awarded Deacon Maloumian the coveted St. Nerses Medal with an encyclical, praising his many years of service to the Armenian Church. Congratulations also reached Menas from the White House, signed by President Ronald Reagan in 1986.

# THE ORTHODOX CREED OF THE ARMENIAN APOSTOLIC CHURCH

#### St. Gregory of Datev

This is the orthodox confession of our faith, which every Christian ought always keep in his heart and have it on his tongue. For with the heart man believes unto righteousness, and with the mouth confession is made unto Salvation, says the Apostle. This is the foundation upon which good works ought to be built; for these are the steps of faith through which we go up to heaven unto God, pace by pace, through mind and faith. And after death, through spirit and good works. But after resurrection, through body and soul. (The Chief Bishop [Catholicos] shall demand from all those who are going to be ordained, to have this creed recited at all ordinations.)

We confess and believe with all our heart in God the Father, uncreated, unbegotten and without beginning; He also being the Begetter of the Son and Source of the Holy Spirit. We believe in God the Word, uncreated, begotten and originated of the Father before eternity. He neither came after nor is younger than the Father but as long as the Father is Father the Son is Son with Him.

We believe in the Holy Trinity, uncreated and timeless. Not begotten but proceeding from the Father; coexistent with the Father and sharing the same glory with the Son.


We believe in the Holy Trinity, one Nature, one Godhead, not three Gods; one God, one Will, one Kingdom, one Power; Maker of things visible and invisible. We believe in the Holy Church, the forgiveness of sins and the communion of saints.

We believe that One of the Three Persons, God the Word, begotten of the Father before the ages, in the course of time came down into the Mother of God, Mary the Virgin and taking blood from her united it with His divinity. He was content to be for nine months in the womb of the Immaculate Virgin; and thus He became perfect God and perfect Man in soul, mind and body; One Person, One Hypostasis and One United Nature. God became Man without change and without alteration, by immaculate conception and incorruptible generation. There is no beginning to His Godhead nor to His humanity (for Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today, yea and forever).

We believe that our Lord Jesus Christ walked upon the earth and after thirty years He came to be baptized. The Father bore witness of Him from above, saying; "This is my beloved Son" and the Holy Spirit as a dove descended upon Him. He was tempted by the devil but overcame him. He preached Salvation to men. He labored bodily, was fatigued, became hungry and thirsty, suffered by His own will, was crucified and died in the body but lived by the Godhead. The body was placed in the tomb, being united with the Divinity; in Spirit He descended into hell, being indivisible from His Divinity. He preached unto the spirits, devastated hell and freed the spirits. After three days He rose from the dead and appeared to the disciples.

We believe that our Lord Jesus Christ ascended into heaven, in the same body and sat at the Right Hand of the Father. He also is to come in the same body to judge the quick and the dead and give resurrection to all mankind.

We also believe in the recompense of deeds, in the everlasting life of the righteous and in the everlasting suffering of the wicked.
