A MESSAGE FROM THE PRIMATE

It gives me great pleasure to congratulate my brother in Christ, the Very Reverend Fr. Haigazoun Melkonian, on the occasion of the 20th anniversary of his ordination into the holy priesthood of the Armenian Church.

The vocation of the priesthood was established by Jesus Christ Himself, when He laid His hands upon His apostles, and sent them forth to evangelize and minister to all mankind.
