A MESSAGE FROM THE PRIMATE

It gives me great pleasure to congratulate my brother in Christ, the Very Reverend Fr. Haigazoun Melkonian, on the occasion of the 20th anniversary of his ordination into the holy priesthood of the Armenian Church.

The vocation of the priesthood was established by Jesus Christ Himself, when He laid His hands upon His apostles, and sent them forth to evangelize and minister to all mankind. Guided by the Holy Spirit, the original apostles ected and ordained others to carry on this work, and this apostolic successhas been preserved and handed down, from one generation to the next, through the holy tradition of the Church. VERY REV. FATHER HAIGAZOUN MELKONIAN

The Very Rev. Father Haigazoun Melkonian, Pastor of Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church of Cheltenham, PA, was born in Detroit, Michigan on August 22, 1949. He is the son of Byron and Virginia Melkonian, brother of Jacqueline El Chemmas and Patricia Muskat.

Fr. Haigazoun graduated from St. John's Church School where he later served as teacher, Worship Director and acolyte training program instructor and coordinator. He also taught Armenian language and folk dancing at the St. John's Calouste Gulbenkian Armenian School. He was an active member of the A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors and Seniors, and has held various positions in the Junior and Senior Chapters, both locally and on the national level in the A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors.

He also served as a teacher and counselor at the A.G.B.U. Camp $\mbox{Ararat.}$

Fr. Haigazoun earned his Bachelors of Education and Masters Degree in Guidance and Counseling from Wayne State University, and taught in the Detroit Public School System at the high school level for two years.

Before entering St. James' Seminary in Jerusalem in 1974, Fr. Haigazoun studied at the Seminary of Holy Etchmiadzin for one year. While studying for the priesthood in Jerusalem, he was a teacher of English and Geography, for which he prepared a bilingual text, at the Seminary.

On June 13, 1976 on the Feast of Pentecost, he was ordaine the sacred priesthood of the Armenian Apostolic Church. He is member of the St. James' Brotherhood of the Armenian Patriarchate of Jerusalem.

In the spring of 1978, Fr. Haigazoun was elevated to the rank of Vartabed, Doctor of the Church.

Very Rev. Fr. Haigazoun Melkonian became a member of the clergy of the Diocese of the Armenian Church in America in October of 1978, at which time he assumed his responsibilities as pastor of St. Gregory the Illuminator Armenian Apostolic Church of Haverhill, Massachusetts.

In January of 1984, the Primate, His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian appointed Fr. Haigazoun as pastor of Holy Trinity Armenian Apostolic Church he is presently serving.

Fr. Haigazoun has written THE ACOLYTE TRAINING PROGRAM OF THE ARMENIAN APOSTOLIC CHURCH, which is printed under the auspices of our Diocese. He was asked and has corrected for publication the A.C.Y.O.A. booklet, SACRAMENTS AND PRAYERS and a DICTIONARY OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH. He has translated and edited SAINIS AND FEASTS OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH which was printed in 1990 for the Department for Religious Education.

Very Rev. Haigaroun Melkonian received the rank of Dzayrakouyn Vartabed on September 14, 1991 from His Eminence, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate of the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church.
