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1970 Report of Board of Trustees of St. Gregory the Illuminator Church of Haverhill

During the course of the year 1970, this board comprised of 9 members, with Father Michael in attendance, held 23 regular meetings, along with many additional special meetings. These meetings were held with practically 100% attendance by all members. The members of this board are as follows:

1970 was a big year for our church. It was the year of our celebration of our 25th anniversary and this board drew it's plans around this celebration and was up to the task and really capitalized on it. I, as chairman of this board, would like to take this opportunity to thank all the parishioners for their cooperation, and special thanks to Der Hayre and the entire board of trustees and their wives for a job well done. Despite the many hours of meetings, of hard physical labor, of hustle. of frustration, of frayed tempers, of worry and consternation, I'm sure it was well worth it. We've had a very successful financial year and gentlemen, you should be proud of your accomplishments.

1. This board started the year by calling special meetings with all segments of this church organization, designed to coordinate all efforts and activities and to formulate plans for fiscal year 1970. These meetings were fruitful and led to better harmony and understanding of responsibilities for each group to the master plan. More meetings of this nature should be conducted to further promote the future progress of this church.

2. We actively and financially supported a reunion of all church choir members held on May 2, the purpose of which was to initiate perhaps a new interest in the choir. The party was highly successful, and it's immediate result created a renewed interest, but I'm not sure if this interest has maintained itself. Nevertheless, the purpose and the thought and the general reaction was healthy for this church community.

3. On April 26 we held a commemorative dinner of the 55th anniversary of the Armenian massacres in 1915. This Martyr's Day dinner was a first for our church in the community and placed the church in a community leadership role. We had a capacity crowd, not only in the hall but also in church, and it was refreshing to see so many Armenians of all faiths under one roof, with the Mother Church being the guiding and influential force in making this brotherhood day possible. 4. To further enhance the celebration year, we kicked off an ambitious raffle, 1st prize being a vacation for two to Bermuda, with a T.V. as second prize. This drawing was held at the church banquet and proved to be very successful both publicity wise and financially. A good job done by all.

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5. Our fourth and most vigorous adventure was our church's participation in the five day celebration from June 10 - 15 of Haverhill's 100th centennial. Besides the introduction of a couple of new words in the city's vocabulary; namely Lulu Kebab, plus the instant plunging of all personnel into the preparation and culinary experience of mass production, we somehow all survived this frightful dilemma and came out of it wholehide, financially happy, but better still having left a good reputation in the community. It certainly was a shining hour for Armenians in Haverhill's civic community life.

6. The next major project was the opening of summer camp, which entailed probably the greatest physical strain ever put on any board of trustees. The cleaning up and sprucing up of the picnic grounds and the camping area of Attitash Acres after the rigors and damage of winter with practically no expense to the church, was an accomplishment by this board of sheer brute force and determination. A job well done.

7. The annual picnic held on August 16 was another social and financial success, a tribute to the hard work and planning of the entire community.

8. In October we inaugurated the purchase of a parsonage, a move we all feel has enhanced the social and physical image of this Armenian church community. This is a step in the ever forward progress of our church.

9. This was followed by a major landscaping cleaning of the lot next docr, another major effort in physical duress by the board of trustees, who gave of themselves to save the hiring of people to do this job. The lot looks good now, plus we eliminated the camping headquarters of hippies and less fortunate people.

10. We climaxed the year with our 25th anniversary dinner held on November 15 at DiBurro's Restaurant with many dignitaries in attendance coupled with a good program. This effort was superb, because it coincided with an ad book program which proved to be financially successful and really capped the dreams of this board of trustees.

11. Last but not least, we ended the year with our participation, perhaps weakly, but nevertheless participation, in the visitation of the Patriarch of Istanbul in Lowell with our fellow parishes.

In summation we had a great year, one we, as board of trustees, will never forget. Again my thanks to the entire community and my fellow board members.

1. We propose that the goal of the board for 1971 be to renovate the church upstairs. To study and then/outline a full program for all segments of the church contributing towards this goal.

2. We propose that this Church study and activate ways in making the church the focal point of Armenian community life; namely by strengthening all activities of this church, namely on a religious, cultural and educational basis. Have something to offer to entire community and made available to entire community, and publicized and pushed. We could begin by offering and setting up a college scholorship for deserving high school student or students.

3. Taking a stronger active role in civic community affairs.

In as much as this will be my last report to you as your pastor, I would like, in  $\mathcal{MCS}$ brief, to present to you a report of progress and growth of our parish during the past 4 years that I served as your pastor.

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Let me say at this time that when you hear the reports from the auditors and Parish Council, you will see that we have had a very successful year financially. I feel that spiritually it has been an extremely successful year too. I have found that many of my long range plans have brought forth much fruit this year and this is heartening to me to know that much of your and my labor has not been in vane.

1. During the past year I offered the Divine Liturgy every Sunday except for the Sunday that His Grace Archbishop Tiran Nersoyan was the guest celebrant for the 25th Anniversary of the consecration of our church. I have paid special attention to preparing Sermons that were topical and meaningful. I also conducted special services during lent.

2. I visited the sick and those in mourning offering them spiritual help and prayers. Special attention was paid to visiting the various hospitals. During the past year, 187 visits were made in this connection.

3. I have tried to be present and preside at all of the various meetings of our church organizations and have been absent only when some pressing church work kept me away. This year I was elected chairman of the Choir Association of our Diocese and also appointed chairman of the Armenian School committee for our Diocese as a result I have had to attend several meetings in New York.

4. During the year I participated in the Clergy Conference, Diocesan Assembly, the Choir Association Central Council meeting as well as Clergymen association meetings and special meetings with regard to arrangements for the Patriarch Shnork Kalousdian of Constantinople's visit. I also participated in the Good Friday and Thanksgiving Day s service sponsored by the Haverhill Council of Churches and the cumenical service sponsored by the Haverhill centennial committee. I also gave a series of messages for the radio station and wrote an article for the Haverhill Gazzette "The Puplit" column.

5. The church paper was well as all organization circulars and bulletins were done by myself. This paper was one of our long range projects and it was my hope to be a parish undertaking, to date only Deacon Vahag Bogosian and Sylvia Tavitian have presented articles on a regular basis. How successful this paper has been I really don't know, the only comments we receive are from a few people who complain about the typigraphical errors in it. Let me say at this time, that I am not a typist and never claim to be one nor did I come to this parish with the understanding that I was to take over the typing duties of the parish. In fact, when I first undertook this project, I was only to Edit and contribute some articles. Unfortunitely even though I have constantly asked for help, I find that I must type the articles, mimeograph the paper and address the enevelopesmyself. This does not seem to be a parish undertaking.

6. Armenian School this year has 5 classes and 41 students. Our teachers are Mrs. Roxie Derderian, MrsAzadoohi Loosian, Onig Zerounian, Yeretzgin and myself. Classes are held every saturday. We would like to thank the Armenian School Committee who worked very hard this year. They gronsored a cake sale and have given of their time and money during the year for our children. The committee is chairman, Mrs. Movses Movsesian, Sec. Roxie Sarofian, Tres. Roxie Derderian, members Mrs. Helen Bejian, Mrs. Zumruck Der Bogosian, Mrs. Yeranig Kezerian, Mrs. Berjoohi Serabian. The Armenian school was another long range program to bring our children closer to their Armenian Heritage and give them an opportunity to enjoy each others fello wship. I have been pleased with the result of the Armenian School.

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7. This year we were fortunate to have the services of George Krikorian Jr., again.

Through his efforts we have established a curriculum for our Sunday School which is excellent. We have also removed the Jr. High and Sr. High departments out of the Sunday School and they now receive instructions tuesday evenings. This had enabled the students to become part of our choir on Sundays, also this year trained 4 boys to serve at the altar. It was my hope that they would also learn to do the deacons part.

8. Our summer study bible camp was a great success this year. The teachers were Fr. Michael, Gale Cifra, Barbara Norsigian and Yeretzgin. Thesummer camp is also a long range plan to bring our youth together in Christain fellowship and give them an opportunity to know each other. I feel it was quite successful and important. I hope it will be continued. We would like to thank the parents who supplied transportation for the children to and from the camp, Mrs. Sylvia Tavitian, Mrs. Mary Der Boghosian and Mrs. Betty Shahanian, and also our Jr. youth councilors, Andrea Der Boghosian, Toni Ann Devejian, Craig Basmajian. We would like to thank the trustees who worked very hard to get the camp in order and gave much of their time for the youth of our church.

Here in a brief outline are some of the many duties I have performed during the year. There are many things left to be dome and certainly plenty of room for improvement. We would like to thank the church organizations, parish council, who in my opinion worked very hard this year and gave me excellent co-operation and without whose help many projects and plans for our church could not have been realized, and allof those who assisted us during the past year. A special thanks to our church Deacons, choir members and organists, and choir and Sunday School directors and teachers, Armenian School teachers, ladies Aux., Mr. & Mrs. Club and to all who worked so hard.

In conclusion I and my family thank each and everyone of you who have made our stay here in Haverhill so pleasant. I am sure you well extend the same comperation and hospitality to whom ever is appointed here as my successor. May God Bless you and may the Holy Spirit continue to guide his church in Haverhill.

This had enabled the students to become part of our choir on Sundays, also this year we trained 4 boys to serve at the altar. It was my hope that they would also learn to do the deacons part.

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8. Our summer study bible camp was a great success this year. The teachers were Fr. Michael, Gale Cifra, Barbara Norsigian and Yeretzgin. Thesummer camp is also a long range plan to brightenr youth together in Christain fellowship and give them an opportunity to know each other. I feel it was quite successful and important. I hope it will be continued. We would like to thank the parents who supplied transportation for the children to and from the camp, Mrs. Sylvia Tavitian, Mrs. Mary Der Boghosian and Mrs. Betty Shahanian, and also our Jr. youth councilors, Andrea Der Boghosian, Toni Ann Devejian, Craig Basmajian. We would like to thank the trustees who worked very hard to get the camp in order and gave much of their time for the youth of our church.

Here in a brief outline are some of the many duties I have performed during the year. There are many things left to be dome and certainly plenty of room for improvement. We would like to thank the church organizations, parish council, who in my opinion worked very hard this year and gave me excellent co-operation and without whose help many projects and plans for our church could not have been realized, and allof those who assisted us during the past year.
