Activities from January 1, 1996 through December 31, 1996

Our Sunday School consistently offered age appropriate classes on a weekly basis for our children consisting of topics concerning God, Jesus, the Bible, The Armenian Church, Armenian Culture and Christian Teachings. We continue to utilize the DRE curriculum with added material from individual teachers. Our children range in age from one and a half years to ten years old and are taught within three learning levels. We have begun taking Communion on a scheduled basis allowing our children to learn not only about the Sacrament but about regular church behavior and etiquette. We conduct an Assembly period before classes begin where we read the Gospel, conduct discussion, and pray together. The Sunday School parents continue to support the fellowship hour with their donations of baked goods and ask for minimal parishioner donations to help fund things such as Sunday School supplies, Christmas gifts for the children as well as end of the year recognition gifts.
