PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT

- 1973 -

Dear Parishioners:

One of the duties of the parish priest according to our By-Laws is to present annually a report of his activities to the Parish Assembly and to the Ordinary of the Diocese.

Herewith I submit to our Parish Assembly for review a resumé of my pastoral activities for the year 1973, with my evaluations, recommendations and a message. With the close of 1973 I completed my first full year service which covers the year 1973 in its entirety. Last year at this time I was new in the parish and my services covered only the last couple of months of the previous year, though my report covered all of the year 1972, to give a complete picture of the year's activities, digging my information from the church records and publications, which unfortunately provided very scanty information.

Pastoral work covers varied and multiple phases. For convenience I have categorized them.

A. LITURGICAL LIFE

Divine Liturgy was celebrated and sermon was delivered, in Armenian and English on every Sunday throughout the year, with the exception of the Diocesan Convention weekend (May 6) and my annual vacation (June 24, July 1).** Divine Liturgy was preceded, as a rule with short morning service except summer season, when we executed summer schedule. The regular hours for church services are 10:00 a.m.- 10:30 a.m. morning service; 10:30 a.m.-12:30 p.m. Divine Liturgy; summer schedule 10:00 a.m.- 12:00 noon Divine Liturgy. Of course for major feast days, we altered slightly this schedule, starting morning services at 9:30 a.m., so that we could conclude the church services at the appointed time.

Special ceremonies and rituals were performed whenever the occasion arised.

The feast of Holy Theophany, so called Armenian Christmas celebration, with the traditional ceremony of "Blessing of Water" (Jur-ornnek), at which time also "prayer service for Pontiff" was held, being the first Sunday of the year; the little John Mirakian was god-father of the cross (January 7).

Vartanantz feast day, as an Armenian national holiday, at which time "prayer service for Pontiff" was held, being the name day of His Holiness, Vasken I (March 4).

Lenten period was observed with "closed liturgy", (kotz Badarak) and "sunrise service" (Arevakal), every Sunday (March 11 - April 8).

Palm Sunday observance, with palm branches, and with a special ceremony of "opening of curtain" (Turn-patzek) (April 15).

** Also we could not perform Holy Badarak on March 18, Sunday of Prodigal Son, because of a snow storm that paralyzed the entire city; however the pastor opened the church and conducted church service with the presence of four people and two children in the entire church.

During Holy Week, on Maundy Thursday, with "Feet-washing" ceremony and Tenebrae or the Order of Betrayal of Christ (April 19) and on Good Friday with the order of "Burial of Christ" (Gark Taghman Krisdosi) which was conducted with all the necessary rituals (April 20).

Easter Eve Liturgy (April 21).

Easter celebration (April 22).

Commemoration of Armenian Martyrs Day with a special procession to the martyrs shrine (April 29).

Pentecost or Whitsunday celebration with special rituals (June 10).

Transfiguration with rose-water sprinkling during the church services according to our ritual traditions (July 29).

Assumption with special ceremony of "grape blessing" (khaghog-orhnek) in the church yard (August 12).

Exaltation of the Holy Cross with special ceremony of "Blessing of field" or "four corners of the world" (Antasdan) with basils (September 16).

Holy Cross of Varak and "prayer service for Pontiff" on the 18th anniversary of his enthronement (September 30).

Requiem Services (Hokehankist) were performed on different and appropriate occasions. Armenian memorial days (Hishadag Merelotz) were commemorated on Sundays following major feast days which are designated in memory of all the deceased; similarly general requiem services were performed also on specially designated days for Armenian martyrs (Vartanantz day - March 4, Armenian memorial day - April 29, the 55th anniversary of the Battle of Sardarabad, with ceremonious reading of pontifical encyclical (Gontag) - May 20). Also special hokehankist were performed whenever directives were received from the Diocese on the death of clergymen of the Armenian church and other prominent personalities who passed away during the year, beside this, special hokehankist also were performed on the death of two ex-presidents of the United States, the 10th anniversary of the assassination of president John F. Kennedy, the 10th anniversary of the assassination of Bishop Terenig Poladian and 40th anniversary of the assassination of Archbishop Leon Tourian. And of course requiem services were performed whenever requests were made by our parishioners.

For the coming year Parish Council has passed decision to receive requests for Requiem Service for the first Sundays of every month to make these performances more orderly, except of course fortieth day memorials.

B. SACRAMENTS AND RITES

The sacraments and rites were performed with detail and conscientiously since they are intended as services for the individual needs of the families involved. These services have been totalled 20 in number and have been duly recorded in our parish registry during the year 1973.

Baptisms, Confirmations: 8 (1 of these for an Indian Orthodox infant, and 1 adult confirmation of a non-Armenian, in preparation of his wedding in our church)

Weddings : 5

Funerals : 7

C. CHURCH PULPIT

Sermons were delivered to worshipers in both languages during each celebration of Divine Liturgy. The pastor tried to give a message every time depending on the character of the day and expounding the significance of the feast day which was being observed. On two occasions the sermon was delivered by guests; on one occasion an Indian Orthodox clergyman, from Church of Malabar, Fr. Simon, of New York, who was at our church on the occasion of the Baptism of an infant from his flock (August 5), and on another occasion Miss Valerie Geokjian, daughter of parishioners Dr. & Mrs. K. Geokjian, who is a seminarian at St. Nerses Theological School at St. Vladimir Russian Orthodox Seminary in New York. The latter was a first occasion in its kind, since, for the first time a woman was preaching in an Armenian church (September 2).

D. PASTORAL CALLS AND VISITATIONS

Pastoral calls include sick calls in hospitals, emergency cases for last rites, home blessings during Christmastide and Eastertide, Christian fellowship visitations to families, family counseling in case of request and spiritual guidance and pastoral counseling to young couples prior to their marriage in our church. Some of the counseling conferences conducted in relation with performance of sacraments and rites, such as baptism, weddings and funerals.

Admittedly we lacked home visitations to parishioners as well as procuring prospective members for our church on an organized regular basis, since the Parish Council could not appoint a Visitation and Pledge Membership Committee; we hope this phase of the operation of the church will be dealt with adequately in the future.

Despite some obvious handicaps, the pastor tried to visit people as much as his time and circumstances were permitting. With better acquaintance with the city environment, the pastor hopes to accomplish more in this important area of visitation.

E. EDUCATIONAL - CULTURAL AND SOCIAL FUNCTIONS.

Our community life became undoubtedly richer with varied cultural-educational programs and social functions throughout the year, some sponsored by the Parish Council and some by Church Auxiliary Organizations. Also some other affairs were community-wide programs which gave opportunity to Armenians to enjoy the programs. Some of them are mentioned hereby in chronological order. Needless to say the pastor participated in their promotion some way or another.

Armenian Women's Guild dinner-dance (February 24).

Vartanantz hantes and banquet with main speaker Dr. Hagop Dikranian from Lorain (March 4).

A lecture was given by the pastor on the cultural contributions of the Armenian Church to Armenian Women's Guild (March 6).

A concert by Cleveland Women Orchestra at Severance Hall. Our church promoted this concert since guest pianist was an Armenian descent, Rosemary Boyajian Christopherson (March 25).

Lenten Michink supper with vigil service, sponsored by Ladies Auxiliary (April 4).

The pastor spoke at AGBU School Parents-Teachers meeting (April 7).

ACYOA Palm Sunday pan cake brunch (April 15).

Church Sunday School 20th anniversary program with elaborate coffee hour (May 27).

Fish day and educational lecture with Matthew Khachadourian as speaker, jointly sponsored by Parish Council and AGBU (June 15).

Three church picnics (June 3, July 8 and August 12).

Strawberry festival evening (July 20).

Annual picnic by Sons of Malatia in Parma (August 25).

70th anniversary convention and banquet of Malatia Compatriotic Union (August 31 - September 3).

White elephant sale and bake sale by Armenian Women's Guild in our church yard (September 7 and 8).

Spagetti supper and bingo (September 29).

Observance of 800th anniversary of St. Nerses Shnorhali (October 7).

Joint celebration of Armenian Cultural Day and 75th anniversary of our Diocese with guest speaker Dr. Vartkes Najarian (October 21).

Las Vegas night (October 27).

Interpretative demonstration of colored Divine Liturgy slides, narrated and presented by Yeretzgin Rosalie Papazian, both to Church Sunday School children and congregation sponsored by Church Sunday School (November 4).

Armenian Women's Guild annual affair dinner-play (December 2).

Christmas tree sale during the preceding two weeks of Christmas season (December 10-December 24).

Annual New Year Eve party by Armenian Women's Guild (December 31).

F. WITH PARISH COUNCIL, CHURCH AUXILIARY ORGANIZATIONS AND PARISH SCHOOLS

Our parish membership meeting was held the last Sunday of January (January 28).

Parish Council dedication ceremony was held on April 8 with a new board of officers. Mr. Micky Bagdassarian is the new chairman.

- (1) Meetings: Parish Council meetings are being held every other week on Mondays; the pastor presided at all meetings. Pastor attended also the meetings of both Church Auxiliary Organizations and the boards of both schools if the schedule of meetings coincided with his schedule.
- (2) Church Sunday School: During the summer season on the suggestion of the pastor a dinner was given to the school staff with the participation of Parish Council members in appreciation of their devoted work, also to introduce to the staff the newly appointed superintendent, Miss Marthe Hacherian.
Church School dedication ceremony for the new season took place (Sept. 9) and the school was formally opened following Sunday (September 16).
- (3) AGBU Saturday Armenian Language School: The Saturday Armenian Language school opened its door for the new season (on Saturday, September 22). The school board members are Mr. Souren Mirakian and Mrs. Anahid Abdalian who promote the work with a handful dedicated teachers. Pastor gives guidance to the school whenever he is approached.
- (4) ACYOA: The Parish Council in order to prove its interest in our youth has appointed a task force to get the interest of young people. Fr. Nerses Jebekjian, Youth Director of our Diocese made a special trip to Cleveland for organizational purposes (April 12).
Parish Council sent Mona Karoghlanian to Youth Leaders Conference at the Diocesan Headquarters in New York (November 17).
Our community was proud having two youths participating an ACYO Educational program in Armenia under the patronage of the Diocese for a month's duration. They were Mona Karoghlanian and Debbie Abdalian.

- (5) Choir: The choir is the main concern of the pastor, because of the lack of choirmaster and an organist. On the suggestion of the pastor a Choir Appreciation Day was held with elaborate coffee hour and distribution of choir pins to every member who participated during the year regardless the frequency (November 11). The pastor also tried to reorganize the choir with a meeting (November 14). We are fortunate for the time being to have an organist Mrs. Marvin Treske (formerly Linda Parnagian) who recently moved to our city from Philadelphia after her marriage. Unfortunately however, we could not secure yet a choir leader. With God's help we hope our choir will improve during the coming year. We would like to take the opportunity to specially commend the devotion of Mrs. Adele Ourlian who at times single-handedly does the whole singing. Of course we value the services of deacons Garbis Balderian and Dr. Kegham Geokjian. Mr. Hagop Khatchadourian of Toronto is our guest singer and during the year he almost participated in all major feast days and assisted in the performance of weddings. Their two sons Simon and Vartavar acted as acolytes every time they came to Cleveland.
- (6) Other Organizations: The Ladies Auxiliary and the Armenian Women's Guild function quite satisfactorily and contribute greatly to the church under the leadership of Mrs. Ojen Chakemian and Miss Alice Hacherian respectively.

In our community also exists the Knights of Vartan for so many year. We hope they will organize themselves and become once again a vital and constructive organization.

G. CHURCH PUBLICATION - PAROS

"Paros" is our parish paper 8½" x 5½" in size and about 20 pages, published monthly. It is almost a year that "Paros" is reorganized with the appointment of Mr. George Sakian as Editor with the approval of the pastor and Parish Council. We hope "Paros" will improve with more experience. We commend the work of Mr. George Sakian for being in charge of the publication and also Mrs. Sandra Aurslanian as the typist.

Wayne State University Armenian Studies 20th anniversary at McGregor Studies Center, at W.S.U. in Detroit, Michigan (September 30).

For the 4th Sports weekend on Labor Day weekend in Philadelphia, we had three youths from our parish participating (August 3-September 3).

For Armenian Church Choirs Association Annual Assembly held in Philadelphia, unfortunately we could not participate with a representative from our parish, we could only show our interest in the work carried by the Association with a telegram (October 19-21).

Diocesan Regional meeting with St. John's of Detroit and St. Gregory of Narek of Cleveland in Detroit, Michigan (October 25).

I. THE UNIQUE OBSERVANCE OF APRIL 24 - ARMENIAN MARTYRS DAY

This year the Armenian community of Greater Cleveland has observed the Armenian Memorial day in a very unique way giving blood to the American Red Cross. Fr. Diran and Dr. V. Najarian were granted an interview concerning the Armenian massacres on Television. Papers gave wide coverage (April 23).

J. PUBLIC RELATIONS

Throughout the year there were few occasions for our church to contact with other churches and people.

Church Women United, Mayfield District held their installation meeting in our church (April 13).

World Trade week in down town mall (May 21-May 24).

The pastor participated in a meeting at Euclid General Hospital for evaluation of the chaplaincy service at the hospital (October 18).

The pastor attended and delivered the Benediction at the Inaugural Ball by the Democratic Club in Richmond Heights in honor of the new mayor of Richmond Heights, Hon. Frank F. Brundic (Dec. 21).

In the area with public relations with Cleveland Newspapers, we acknowledge the important role that Mrs. Florence Geokjian carries. Through her efforts, the major activities of the community had almost wide coverage in the Cleveland Press and a lot of other publicity.

K. A GLORIOUS CELEBRATION OF ARMENIAN CHRISTMAS

Although Armenian Christmas was celebrated on January 6, 1974, however, the preparation being worked out months before and also it is being yet quite fresh in our minds, it is worth mentioning in this report.

The Badarak singing harmoniously in four voices in Gomidassian version by C.S.A.I. from Detroit, Michigan was an unprecedented event for our community and it will be remembered for long time to come. The choir was under the direction of Mr. Onnik Hepsen of New York, one of the original founders of Gomidas Choir in New York. We hope to have this choir again among us.

L. WORTHWHILE ACCOMPLISHMENTS AND WILLS

During 1973 the parish Council has accomplished at least few of the proposed projects and will continue to accomplish more if funds are available.

Sam Atamian's will about Six Thousand dollars permitted the Parish Council to expand our parking lot facilities and to cover a new roof over the pastor's residence, both were very urgent.

It is worth mentioning another will, even though it is small, only Two Hundres dollars. The benefactor is George Margosian of Akron, Ohio.

Our church needs to be remembered in will, whether they be small or big, to carry on its projects for the benefit of our people.

Parish Council has devised a master plan for future expansions.

Parish Council finalized the complete inventory of the church.

A play-ground equipments were made available for our school children as a project by our Church Sunday School.

Our Cultural hall was endowed with beautiful drapery as a project by the Armenian Women's Guild.

M. FUTURE PROJECTS

The future projects should embrace all memos that the pastor gave to the Parish Council concerning the parish house as both pastor's living quarter and pastor's study need some touching. The pastor's study on the first floor needs a great deal of attention to make it look both functional and attractive. Beside, we need to endow our office with useful office machinery and filing cabinets. The lounge should be furnished for group activities and youth meetings.

The Parish Council during 1974 should embark into these projects according to the priorities.

EPILOGUE

With the year 1974 we embark into the 10th anniversary of the Church. Sunday, April 21st is put aside for the 10th anniversary celebrations with our primate.


We continuously pray to God to pour His rich blessings upon this community so that the church may continue her sacred historic mission for the Armenian people.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT FOR "73"

The Parish Council of St. Gregory of Narek with Reverend Father Diran Papazian presiding as President, elected the following to serve as the 1973 officers:

During the course of the year, Parish Council met and conducted 18 business meetings, 1 meeting with all church organizations and 1 with the Building Committee.

The responsibility of the complete operation and supervision of Church, Cultural Hall and Parish House was accomplished by the following standing committees:

Sacraments: *Kevork Arslanian, Nazar Mirakian

This committee arranged the lobby service schedule; attempted to establish a choir; searched for an organist; pursued getting a Choir Director; and arranged for altar flowers.

Maintenance: *Carlos Bozoklian, Charlie Arpajian, Harry Odabashian

The diversified duties of this committee included: cleaning up the parish grounds; fixing the Parish House kitchen tile; fixing the lock on the Church vestment door; changing the entranceway to the side of the Parish House; fixing the lounge door of the Parish House; making screens for the Parish House basement windows; maintaining the Priest's car; fixing Father Diran's shower and tub drains; fixing the coat rack in the Church; repairing Church and Parish House furnaces; seeing that fire extinguisher violations were corrected; having pessi machine replaced; disposing of rats; disposing of bees; fixing the folding door in the Cultural Hall which separates nursery classroom; fixing broken Church window and broken Cultural Hall window; cleaning the septic tank area of the culvert; replacing keys for Sunday School file cabinets; and contracting snow removal.

Cultural Hall: Jack Hacherian

In this area specific responsibilities for Zaven were established; a telephone buzzer was installed in the kitchen; the heating and cooling system was repaired; the 1974 Pasquale contract was written and signed; and together with organization chairmen, the 1974 calendar was organized.

REPORT FROM DIOCESAN DELEGATES

The 71st Annual Diocesan Assembly of the Armenian Church of America was held on the week-end of May 4th of this past year at the Church of Our Saviour in Worcester, Massachusetts. The meeting presented much discussion, which showed that at least some of the 108 delegates present thought that a change in church policy was in order. However, little policy change was made, expressing, perhaps, the cautious disposition of the delegates and the need for more developed and concrete proposals in advance of the next meeting.

Sadly, the Clergy Stipends Committee offered only an interim report on a most important and urgent topic. This committee composed of both lay and clergy members expressed a hope that next year they could present a written report. The reassignment of clergy issue was, for the second year in succession,

given little clarification beyond that pastoral reassignment and the rotation of clergy are unrelated. A proposal to help the beleaguered Patriarch of Jerusalem was offered, discussed, and then withdrawn by the delegates who originally offered the proposal. Also, the requisite age of church membership was changed to 18. Father Nersess Jebejian, formally of Cleveland's St. Gregory, was appointed part-time youth director for the Diocese. Significantly a motion to re-open the matter of church unity within the Armenian community was voted upon and passed. The motion is reported in its entirety below:

The 71st Diocesan Assembly expresses its deep desire to unite with our Separated Brethren and Sisters while we commend the Unity Committee's dialogue with our Separated Brethren for its efforts thus far, and pledge our support to their endeavors, we urge them and the Diocesan Council to leave no stones unturned to make our Vehapar's expressed wish of unity of the Armenian Christian community a reality.

The meeting commenced with a prayer by Archbishop Torkom Manoogian and His Holiness, Vaskin I, sent prayer and good wishes with the delegates.
