MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY SAINT GREGORY OF NAREK ARMENIAN CHURCH CLEVELAND, OHIO FEBRUARY 26, 1989

The Annual Assembly of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church was called to order at 1:00 p.m. by Very Reverend Father Souren Chinchinian. Florence Karoghlanian introduced Father Souren who proceeded to address the assembly. Ralph Chakerian read the roll call of dues paid members in attendance at the Parish Assembly. There were 53 members present, which constituted a quorum.

Thelma Bagdasarian noted that in the minutes of the 1988 Parish Assembly, Harold Zahigian and David Andonian were left off the members of the Pastoral Search Committee. Ralph Chakerian read corrections to the 1989 proposed budget These additions and deletions totaled \$21,664 for a revised total of \$96,044 in disbursements and \$97,044 in revenues. Sam Mirakian moved to accept the minutes, as revised, from the 1988 Parish Assembly. The motion was seconded.

The meeting was turned over to Sue Mirakian and Jack Hacherian, Nominating Committee, who asked for nominations for Officers of the Day. Mona Karoghlanian was added to the ballot for Chairperson joining Richard Aurslanian who had previously accepted a nomination from the Nominating Committee. Greg Arpajian was added to the ballot for Secretary joining Martha Hacherian who also had accepted a previous nomination from the Nominating Committee. Results of the closed ballot were:

James Nazarian spoke about the events and opportunities the year of 1988 presented St. Gregory's. He thanked Florence Karoghlanian for her leadership and her instrumentality in the accomplishments of the chapter and presented her with a small token of Parish Council's appreciation. Florence Karoghlanian kindly thanked the Parish Council for their gift, and thanked the community for their contributions and efforts in light of the many tragedies. Sam Mirakian moved to accept the minutes, as revised, from the 1988 Parish Assembly.

The next item on the agenda was the election of three Parish Council members to replace Nazar Yessayan, Ralph Chakerian and James Nazarian. Nominations for Parish Council, Nominating Committee and Auditing Committee were then taken. The question was raised as to whether two members of the same immediate family could serve on the same committee. Ralph Chakerian stated that the Diocesan By-Laws did not prevent two immediate family members from serving on the same committee. James Nazarian then stated that we should not conduct all three elections simultaneously. Richard Aurslanian stated that we should conduct just one committee election at a time. Thelma Bagdasarian moved to separately conduct the election of members to Parish Council. Harold Zahigian seconded. This motion was unanimously accepted. The Nominating Committee then mentioned that for the ballots to be considered legal, the number of the candidate must be circled. Parish Council election were then held.

Richard Aurslanian resumed the assembly. George Sakian inquired about the status of the uncompleted projects. Harold Zahigian spoke about the philosophy of Parish Council to renew, and not repair, those areas in need of attention. Harold continued that Parish Council was studying the feasibility of a number of different alternatives on how best to refurbish the front doors to the Church. These alternatives included bronzing, skinning and replacement. James Nazarian brought up that the questioning of the projects underway was out of order and instead should be discussed during old business.

The Nominating Committee then resumed the elections. Results of the Parish Council election are as follows:

The floor was then opened for nominations for the Nominating Committee. Lucille Andonian, Krikor Ghazarian, Matthew Hatchadorian, Suzanne Hatchadorian, Martha Hacherian and Greg Arpajian accepted nominations for the Nominating Committee. Thelma Bagdasarian moved to close nominations. The motion was seconded. Greg Arpajian motioned for the elections for the Nominating Committee and the Audititng Committee to be separated. The motion was seconded, a vote was taken and the motion was carried.

Richard Aurslanian resumed the assembly. Ralph Chakerian proceeded to clarify numerous questions about both the actual 1988 receipts and the proposed 1989 receipts. Thelma Bagdasarian asked why the Christmas Tree Sale and the Pumpkin Sale were being discontinued for 1989. Ralph Chakerian stated that there were some difficulties with our current associates and the decision to discontinue the sales was made. Krikor Ghazarian asked why the Cultural Hall Rental was so high in the 1989 proposed budget and Ralph Chakerian stated that it was due to a carryover from the 1988 budget. Janis Nazarian asked what project(s) the proposed Income Making amount in the proposed 1989 was and Ralph Chakerian stated that that decision was left to the discretion of the new Parish Council.

The discussion then turned to the proposed 1989 budget-disbursements. Martha Hacherian asked if there were any expenses associated with the Earthquake fund. Ralph Chakerian responded that a minimal amount was donated for miscellaneous supplies (stamps, envelopes). Jeanne Arslanian asked why now that the Pastoral Search Committee and the Earthquake Relief efforts are over the phone expenses are listed so high. Ralph Chakerian stated that we advertise in two different areas of the Yellow Pages, have two phones in the Church House (one just recently having been added) and have long distance phone usage. David Andonian asked about the pay phone issue which was raised at the 1988 Parish Assembly. It was stated that there has not yet been a solution. Greg Arpajian asked what moneys were sent to the Diocese for the Earthquake Relief. David Andonian stated that \$50,000 has been sent and that \$75,000 will be sent shortly.

Nazar Mirakian asked about the extent of the joint efforts between the two churches on the Earthquake Relief. Ralph Chakerian stated that the moneys received by the two churches were never mixed. Jack Hacherian added that

in the future we should not have joint ventures/efforts between the two churches. Grace Arslanian asked about the reason for keeping so much money in the Church Passbook Savings account. It was stated that a significant amount of that money is being transferred to CD's. James Nazarian motioned to accept the budgets as amended, Lucine Andonian seconded the motion. The motion passed.

The Nominating Committee then resumed the elections. The results of the Nominating Committee elections are as follows:

David Andonian motioned for the nominations to be closed. The motion was carried. The suggestion that others may like to be nominated for the position of Diocesan Delegate was made. David Andonian rescinded his motion to close the nominations. No others accepted nominations for Diocesan Delegate. David Andonian then motioned for the nominations to be closed. The motion was seconded. Elections were then held for the Auditing Committee and for Diocesan Delegate.

Richard Aurslanian resumed the program. The next order of business was the discussion of Old Business. A report was made on the very successful activities of the Pastoral Search Committee. Then discussion turned to the issue of restoration of the Church doors. Sam Mirakian asked what the prices were to the various alternatives. Harold Zahigian stated that bronzing the two front church doors would be approximately \$4000-\$5000. Replacing the two doors would be about \$2,500. Landscaping efforts were then discussed. At a cost of \$700, an architect is to draw up plans for future landscaping efforts. Sam Mirakian stated as landscaping efforts were not included in the 1989 proposed budget, how these efforts were to be funded. Ralph Chakerian said that the landscaping is included under Capital Improvements. Kevork Arslanian asked about the status of the canopy to protect the church doors. He said that the Memorial Committee submitted three proposals to the Parish Council about the canopy. James Nazarian that the 1988 assembly charged the Parish Council with considering the canopy issue and not necessarily purchasing one. Sam Mirakian stated that the cost of purchasing new doors appears to be more feasible than bronzing the doors or even installing a canopy over them. Vergin Arslanian stated that the canopy is not exclusively for the protection of the doors, but also for the protection of the parishioners from the bad weather. Harold Zahigian said that if we install a canopy that there is still an unprotected area. The discussion then turned to the warranty/guarantee on

the doors. James Nazarian then stated that Parish Council will again look into the various alternatives and come to a decision. He also stated that the Parish Council will look into carpeting the Church and Cultural Hall, while keeping in mind that the carpet must be both aesthetically pleasing and safe. Florence Karoghlanian spoke about the restoration of the Cultural Hall. The upper area of the Hall will be wallpapered. This will be completed by the 25th Anniversary at a cost of about \$7,000.

The Nominating Committee then resumed elections. The results of the Auditing Committee and Diocesan Delegate Elections are as follows:

Richard Aurslanian resumed the meeting. The next item on the agenda was New Business. Harold Zahigian spoke about the Cooling System in the church. He said that it could be put outside the church in the chancel area at a cost of about \$40,000. Paul Arslanian said that that was an unnecessary investment. Jack Hacherian asked how much it would cost to do the front of the church. Harold Zahigian said that it would cost \$20,000 to do the altar and the chancel. Sam Mirakian suggested putting off this project until a later time.

Florence Goekjian stated that everyone should take a turn getting involved in various volunteer capacities with the church. Martha Hacherian congratulated Florence Goekjian on her fine and dedicated service as Diocesan Delegate for the past 8 years. She went on to say that the Cleveland Church should attempt to get enough members to allow us to have two representatives to the Diocesan Assembly. James Nazarian then motioned for all ten reports Church Organization reports be accepted as submitted. Sam Mirakian seconded the motion. Florence Karoghlanian stated that the church will miss Nazar Yessayan and Ralph Chakerian and all their hard work and dedication. She also welcomed the New members to the Parish Council and stated that next year we all should consider accepting the responsibility of serving the community in a greater capacity.

Very Reverend Father Souren Chinchinian closed with the benediction and the meeting was adjourned at 4:01 p.m.

Pastor's Report

One year ago, when I assumed the pastorate of this church, I considered it a first priority to familiarize myself with the parishioners for the purpose of establishing working relations. I started making daily visitations to the homes of the parishioners after setting up appointments with them. I was willing to visit any Armenian without distinction of his religious and social affiliation because I firmly believed that our church, having national character, felt obligations to all Armenians in our neighborhood and vice-versa. I did not hesitate to go into deteriorated neighborhoods to meet with elderly Armenian widows and widowers since they needed my presence much more than the others. My visitations provided parishioners the opportunity to discuss family and church matters at ease. I managed to visit the homes of all those who responded to my request for an appointment.

In addition to home visitations, I paid visits once a month to elderly Armenians who lived in various nursing homes. Their number stood at eight. They felt cut off from their families, suffering from loneliness. It was not easy for them to make friends with other residents of the nursing home given their different backgrounds. As I conversed with them in Armenian, they got the impression of being at home facing a familiar figure. I took my time to listen patiently to their stories and concerns. After giving them a word of encouragement and comfort, I departed.

Hospital visitations took precedence over all my duties because of their urgent nature. The depressed patients needed to be cheered up so that they could hold out hope for speedy recovery. People, whether they are patients or not, live by hope. If one's hope fades, his life ends up on the rocks. Whenever someone from our parish became hospitalized, I rushed to the hospital to lift his spirits by inspiring him with courage and hope. I did not content myself with visiting the patients only once. I made a special effort to visit them as many times as possible. Each time, I ended my visitation with a prayer.

I attached much importance to Paros, the newsletter of our church. I regarded it as an effective avenue to inform our parishioners in particular and non-parishioners in general of the activities of our church. But its primary purpose lay in educating our people through articles concerning spiritual, social and marital issues. Having this in mind, I contributed one or two articles to the Paros every month. We feel sad that Florence Goekjian, the editor, and Ann Karayan, the typist, have asked to be relieved of their tasks as of June, 1990, for personal reasons. We take this opportunity to express our deep appreciations and gratitude for their longtime dedicated services to our church.

I delivered sermons regularly on all Sundays of the year, regardless of the weather conditions and the size of the attendance. Preaching forms an important part of the worship services in any church since it

is the interpretation of the word of God. On Sundays, the divine Liturgy remains the same, more or less. The only thing which changes is the content of the sermon. Being conscious of this fact, I did not spare time and effort in preparing meaningful sermons. The favorable comments which I have received from many parishioners convinced me that my preaching served its purpose.

I came up with the idea of organizing monthly cultural gatherings designed to complement our parishioners' spiritual needs provided through sacraments of the church. After holding the first one on the reconstruction efforts in Armenia, the continuity was interrupted to give way to more pressing affairs put on by other church organizations. The purpose of these lecture series is two-fold: to awaken consciousness in the members of our new generation about their valuable traditions and cultural heritage; secondly, to help them preserve their national identity and take great pride in it.

Furthermore, I went to the Diocese for one day to familiarize myself with the programs offered by various departments and discover the feasibility of implementing them in our parish. In some of these programs, professors are involved from the New York and New Jersey areas. To ensure their participation, we need to wait for milder weather. One of the many advantages connected with these programs is that the Diocese underwrites all the expenses of the speakers. The Diocese does not take in all the time, it also gives away.

Last year, we had a visiting clergyman on two occasions. While he was celebrating Divine Liturgy, I seized the opportunity to go to the Sunday School to see how the students were doing. I stopped by each classroom and talked to the students. At the end of the classes, as the students assembled for prayer, I spoke to them. Sunday School is in the good hands of Ann Karayan. She is the right person in the right place at the right time. She is surrounded by dedicated teachers.

As the president of the Women's Guild, I feel deeply concerned about the low attendance at the monthly meeting. Only one-fourth of the total members show up at the meetings. It needs all the help it can get from its members. I urgently call upon all members to make time to be present at the meetings. Giving two hours of their time, once a month, is not too much to ask for. To support Women's Guild amounts to supporting our church because the Women's Guild is the backbone of our church.

I tried hard to establish Bible Study Classes, but encountered stumbling blocks. At the first session, a handful of people showed up and then they dropped out. Two of them told me that their schedule did not allow them to come on weekdays. Others cited the distance being a factor in their decision not to come to the Bible Study Classes. Unfortunately, the same thing happened to the Armenian Weekly Language Classes for adults sponsored by AGBU.

I extend my special thanks and deep appreciations to our enthusiastic deacon, Serop Demirjian, as well as to Haig Arpajian, our altar

server, who performed their duties so persistently that we greatly admire them. I feel indebtedness to our energetic choir members for doing their utmost to enhance the beauty of our church services through their harmonious singing. My greatest appreciation goes to the active and dedicated members of the Parish Council for their cooperation.

The response to this project was overwhelming by the Armenian community. The Parish Council hopes to institute this project twice a year — April 24 and December 7.

Serving as Chairman of the Parish Council has been a privilege for me — I would like to take this opportunity to express my most sincere appreciation to the following members of Parish Council: David: Andonian, Ara Bagdasarian, Janis Nazarian, Jim Nazarian, Krikor Yessayan and Harold Zahigian. We would be remiss is we did not thank our dedicated Diocesean Delegate, Jack Hacherian. They have all served their church with interminable dedication, devotion and as a labor of love. The mission of the Parish Council was to work collectively to serve our church and tend to needs of our church family.

As we look to a new decade, we pray for the continued growth of the Parish of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church in meeting the needs and challenges that the 1990's will bring forth.

Church School hours are 10:15 A.M. to 12:00 Noon. Sunday morning consists of a class room session until 11:20 A.M. The Assembly-Devotion period is 20 minutes long, which is followed by church attendance.

The curriculum is entitled: "We Belive" (Havadampk). The Assembly-Devotion is used to teach all of the children about the feasts and traditions of the Armenian Church. Sharagons are being taught and used during the worship period in Assembly. Appropriate Bible readings are shared and taught about in the instruction period of the gathering.

Since school and work schedules of High Schoolers and young adults vary and regular Church School attendance has not been possible; to encourage Church association, a Junior Bible Study group was organized which meets once a month. The average attendance of the group is 6 to 8 attendees. The creed (Havadampk) is being studied in the New Testament, along with studying the Biblical recitations in the Divine Liturgy, and related studies. The teacher of the group is Phillip Karayan.

Goals: To teach about the Life and Teachings of our Lord. To encourage Bible reading.

To teach about the Holy Days and Feasts of the Armenian Church.

To teach Sharagans and Armenian Church-related songs.

To use visual aids and make use of appropriate video tapes during Assembly teaching period.

To make attending Church School a "precious memory", to make it a meaningful, fun, educational and spiritual experience.

To attend Divine Liturgy Services and participate where possible, to partake of Holy Communion on Major Feast Day celebrations.
