## RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING CHURCH MEMBERS IN GOOD STANDING

## RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

"All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly".

"Every Member of the Parish, 21 years of age or over, shall pay the church an annual due".

"Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are twenty-one years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the Parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members".

"Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies, or to hold elective office within the Parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years".


## RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

"The agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly".

"At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum. Decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting."

"In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be east in person."

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY SAINT GREGORY OF NAREK ARMENIAN CHURCH CLEVELAND, OHIO FEBRUARY 24, 1991

The Annual Parish Assembly of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church was called to order at 1:51 p.m. by Florence Karoghlanian. Acting president of the meeting, Reverend Father Garen Gdanian, opened the meeting with a prayer. Harold Zahigian read the roll call of dues paid members at the Parish Assembly. There were 58 members present, which constituted a quorum.

The Parish Council Chairman, Florence Karoghlanian, addressed the Assembly with words of appreciation, and encouragement for our future as a Parish. She highlighted and focused on key points of the year; in short, a review of 1991. She closed by requesting our continued faith, love and devotion to our Mother Church.

The minutes of the 1990 Assembly were read and approved with one correction. Jack Hacherian suggested to delete the word "gambling" on page 5. Mona Karoghlanian moved to accept the minutes as corrected. The motion was seconded by Jack Hacherian.

The meeting was then turned over to Sandra Aurslanian, Sue Mirakian and Lucine Mirakian. The officers of the day were elected from the following slate:

Next the Nominating Committee presented the nominees for Parish Council: Mona Karoghlanian. Five more nominees were needed for a legal slate which were nominated from the floor. The results were as follows:

#### OLD BUSINESS

Ara Bagdasarian explained that in November 1996, a sewer line will be constructed on Richmond Road. Parish Council recommends to maintain the present Septic System until the new sewer line is put in. The Assembly agreed.

## STEWARDSHIP

Jim Nazarian stated that 60% of dues are sent to Diocese. He said not one pledge form given out at the last Annual Meeting came back. He stressed that dues are not pledges. Father Gdanian mentioned that his parish raised \$40,000 in stewardship pledges.

#### BINGO

Harold Zahigian reported that we renewed our bingo license. A start up cost of \$13,000 is needed for equipment and materials. Also two teams of 12 volunteers are also needed. The bingo should be operated every Thursday from 6:30 p.m. to 11:30 p.m. by unpaid volunteers. Jack Hacherian moved to accept bingo operations and authorize Parish Council to go ahead. Motion was seconded and passed with seven opposing. Archie Andonian seconded this motion.

## CULTURAL HALL ROOF REPAIR

Harold Zahigian explained that the whole roof needs to be redone. The contracts are signed by Parish Council and the work will be done in the spring of 1991. Total cost is \$10,400 for fixing the flat roof part and single part.

## ST. NERSES SEMINARY DONATION

Ara Bagdasarian reported that during the past year Women's Guild donated \$200, ACYOA - \$75, Sunday School - \$50 and Parish Council - \$175. A total of \$500 was sent in January of 1991. Father Gdanian suggested we give a \$500 endowment fund because they only use the interest. Mona Karoghlanian moved that St. Gregory send a minimum of \$500 annually as an endowment to St. Nerses. Archie Andonian seconded. The motion passed.

## ADJACENT LOT

Size 130 ft. frontage x 600 ft. deep. The asking price is \$300.00. David Andonian said we should forego buying it for now. Russell Arslanian said it was a prudent decision. Nobody opposed.

## HALL KITCHEN REFRIGERATOR

Harold Zahigian reported that it would have cost \$4,500 for replacement. The Parish Council had the old refrigerator completely repaired for \$1,250.

## ORIENTAL RUG SALE

Ara Bagdasarian distributed a written proposal saying that rug sales have been successful in other parishes. Maximum church expenses dsc S9,300 in case of zero sales. However, John Davidian, who is equally exposed monetarily, told Ara that such a sale would be feasible. Security costs are included in the expenses. Mona Karoghlanian asked that if there was any dissatisfaction by customers, who would be responsible? Ara Bagdasarian replied that they would be referred to John Davidian. Ara then moved to proceed with this plan. Seconded by Mona. Motion was passed.

## SPRING FESTIVAL

Thelma Bagdasarian asked about the status on the Spring Festival we discussed a year ago. Harold said we still have the plans but as usual no manpower...55-60 people working 3 shifts would be needed.

## PASTORAL SITUATION

Serop Demirjian reported that all previously considered priests and deacons were either retiring or assigned to other churches. Florence Karoghlanian has tried to get as many visiting priegts as possible and Father Gdanian has agreed to come and help us as a visiting priest.

Parish Council has written a letter to the Diocese expressing their disappointment that we didn't get a priest. Since we have one of the largest ACYOA chapters, we asked the Diocese to consider the dire need for a qualified priest and that:

- 1. After Deacon Odabashian's 1 year internship in Worchester, Clevelandgets the first interview with him.
- 2. During 1991, Cleveland can have priority to interview the first available priest.

Florence Karoghlanian read Bishop Barsamian's response which congratulated the Cleveland ACYOA Chapter for the successful Sports Weekend. He also stated that he was anxious to see Cleveland get a priest.

## BUDGET

Harold Zahigian clarified that the cost of the new grill was \$1,000. The grill is stored inside to prevent corrosion. The cost of the new copy machine was \$4,195. Harold reported that \$50% of that cost was recovered through in house production of the Paros for the first 8 months. Currently the Paros is being sent to the printer due to the lack of manpower. We still do the cover, insert printing and assembly. It costs about \$200 a month to get the rest of Paros printed at Officemax. Grace Arslanian suggested that the size of the print of the budget in the Annual

Report be larger. Harold said this would be taken into consideration. David Andonian moved to approve the budget as proposed and Mona seconded. The 1991 Proposed Budget was passed.

#### NEW BUSINESS

Debbie Venditti asked if the Annual Church Picnic would be donations or a set fee. Harold Zahigian said the Parish Council has not decided yet. Ara Bagdasarian pointed out that the donation plan has proved to be more profitable.

Russell Arslanian thanked Fr. Gdanian for presiding with the parish during the Annual Assembly. David Andonian moved to adjourn. Seconded by Archie Andonian. The meeting adjourned at 4:32 p.m. with a benediction given by Fr. Gdanian.

#### DIOCESAN DELEGATE REPORT

The 89th Annual Diocesan Assembly was held May 9-11th, 1991, at Tenafly, NJ., hosted by St. Thomas Armenian Church. The Assembly was presided over by His Grace, Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate. Martin Cholakian was elected Diocesan Assembly Chairman.

Florence Karoghlanian, chairperson for the Parish Council, and Jack Hacherian Diocesan delegate attended the Assembly.

Upon completion of basic Assembly business, the following reports were presented to the Assembly.

The number of fully organized parishes with full-time pastors was 33. Eight fully organized parishes are without pastors, plus 12 mission parishes bring the total number of parishes under the Diocese to 55. Total number of clergy in the Diocese in 1990 totaled 51, including the Primate.

Serious concern was expressed for the Nagorno-Karabagh area and the many thousands of Armenians suffering from constant military attacks by Azerbiaijan. Because of the ongoing tragedy, on Jan. 24th, 1990, an Ecumenical Service was held in St. Patrick's Cathedral organized by His Eminence John Cardinal O'Connor, Archbishop of the New York Catholic Diocese, and His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Primate of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, in cooperation with religious leaders of the Metropolitan area. A candlelight vigil was held near the Soviet Mission in New York in the evening.

A detailed report was presented to the Assembly concerning the 1988 earthquake in Aremenia. The Diocesan Council was directed to establish the Diocesan Fund for Armenia's recovery. A three-pronged assistance program was initiated. Construction of permanent residential housing, an extensive medical program, and continued humanitarian assistance. Under the supervision of K. Hovanian Enterprises, two-story buildings consisting of 16 apartment each will become part of an American-Armenian Village. The first building was completed by late September, 1990. The Medical Relief Program directed relief supplies to Armenia, and established a Medical Fellowship Program sending up to 50 Armenian doctors to the United States to learn about American medical practices, techniques, and medical concepts. Each month 50 medical journals are sent to the Medical Library of the Armenian Ministry of Health. The Humanitarian assistance program established The United Armenian Fund composed of various Armenian organizations in the United States to dispatch airlifts to Armenian with supplies, equipment and resources necessary to bring effective immediate and long-term humanitarian aid to Armenia. 12 airlifts were distatched to Armenia in 1990. By the end of 1990, the Diocese had collected \$14 Million to aid earthquake victims.

The afternoon meeting of the Assembly was cancelled to permit several busloads of delegates to assemble near the Soviet Mission in New York to protest the tragedies upon the Armenian people in the Nogorno-Karabagh area. Speakers from both Armenian churches and many Armenian organizations made passionate speeches on behalf of the beleaguered Armenians.

Discussions were held concerning the youth and our church, possibly to participate in the Assembly meetings. It was suggested, due to a very full agenda, a session be added to the agenda specifically to discuss our youth. However, it was determined this required an extra day to the Assembly, This matter will be discussed further at the 1991 Diocesan Assembly.

# St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church Choir 1991 Annual Report

The energy of the choir was focused on two primary endeavors this year. The first, of course, was rendering faithful service to the church each and every Sunday that church services were held, singing the beautiful, cherished hymns of our beloved church.

The other endeavor, that which consumed most of our energy, was the planning and successful execution of the 45th Annual Assembly of the Association of Armenian Church Choirs of America (AACCA) the first weekend in November. Clergy, delegates and other participants came from all over the Diocese and beyond, even from California and Canada. The weekend was presided over by His Grace Bishop Khajag Barsamian and Vicar General Fr. Haigazoun Najarian was celebrant of Divine Liturgy on Sunday. That Badarak was one not to have missed as clergy, deacons, delegates and our own choir members gathered under the dome of St. Gregory to harmoniously sing the hymns of our Soorp Badarak in a way its never been sung before.

The year 1991 not only marked the return, after 19 years, of the choir assembly to Cleveland, but also saw our own church choir celebrate its 45th year.

Two very special people, in their own separate ways, touched our hearts this year and under somber circumstances.

Margaret Benneian, who sang in the choir years ago but never lost her fondness for us, expressed wishes during her last days that donations in her memory be made to, among other organizations, our church choir. We are grateful to Margaret and to her family for carrying out her wishes.

Gregory Arpajian joined the choir last year as he began his recuperation from Leukemia. People don't need a reason to qualify them for singing in the choir, and we don't ask why they want to sing. We all have our own reasons. But we guess that Gregory wanted sing God's name and music in thanks for His seeing him through his illness. Gregory was a special young man who made every person he knew feel special. He is with God now and we miss him, but we still have a part of him with us every Sunday.
