RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

"All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrines, canons and rites, and whi fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly."

"Every member of the Parish, 21 years of age or over, shall pay the church an annual dues."

"Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are twenty-one years of age or older, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the Parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members."

"Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies, or to hold elective office within the Parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years."

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

"The agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly."

"At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitue a quorum. Decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting."

"In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must cast in person."

MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

-2-

CLEVELAND, OHIO - FEBRUARY 28, 1993

The Annual Assembly was called to order at 1:20 P.M. by Parish Council Chairman, Florence Karoghlanian. The acting president of the meeting was Deacon Norman Odabashian. Deacon Norman opened the meeting with a prayer. He then addressed the assembly with words of appreciation. He encouraged the parishioners to attend services every Sunday and emphasized the importance of worship.

Diratzoo reported that we have a child in Cleveland from Armenia, Lucina Haroutyounian, who will have open heart surgery this week. She is in Rainbow Babies and Children's Hospital. Aida Davidian is acting as translator and hopes that the Armenian community will visit and encourage the 13 year old girl. Diratzoo asked the parishioners for their comments and suggestions, etc. which will help him do his job better.

Florence Karoghlanian addressed the Assembly with words of appreciation and encouragement for our future as a parish. She then presented Diratzoo with a gift of appreciation from Parish Council.

Jack Hacherian, Treasurer, read the roll call of dues paying members. There were 51 members present which did not constitute a quorum of a possible 104. Motion was made by Thelma Bagdasarian and seconded by Kevork Arslanian that the members present constitute a quorum. The motion was passed.

The meeting was turned over to the Nominating Committee, Louise Demirjian, Anita Arpajian and Arek Torosian, who conducted the election of officers for the day. The nominations and results follow:

There were no corrections or additions to last year's minutes and Jeanne Arslanian was commended by Mona Karoghlanian on the excellent job she did as Secretary of the Day last year. A motion was made by David Andonian and seconded by Alice Hacherian to accept the minutes as presented. The motion passed.

At this point, the Chairman, Richard Aurslanian, presided over the meeting. The Nominating Committee continued with the election of 3 Parish Council members who will serve a two-year term. The slate was as follows:

OLD BUSINESS:

Archie Andonian reported on the Social Services Committee's activities. He reported that 1992 was a very busy year for this committee. We sponsored three refugee families from Baku. Archie asked for community understanding and support toward these people. He thanked those that have helped him with this program. As to the financial aspect, Archie feels we did very well with the support of Interfaith Refugee Services, which contributed \$2,950 in 1992. Our parishioners donated \$1,575.00. He reported that two basic principles are involved with these people and they are love and service.

Chairman, Richard Aurslanian, thanked Archie for his work and service to our community, as did many others in the Assembly.

Ara Bagdasarian reported on the Operation Winter Rescue Program. Through the Operation Winter Rescue Program we were able to contribute \$12,700 from our church; \$5,000 from the Oriental Rug Sale proceeds; \$700 left over from the Earthquake Fund; and, \$7,000 was raised from the community. Ara feels that we as a community should feel very proud of this accomplishment.

Ara Bagdasarian also reported on the sewer and culvert project. He said that the Northeast Ohio Sewer District started on the construction of the Interceptor Sewer Program which begins in August, 1993 and should be finished in 1996. Parish Council is trying to get the City of Richmond Heights to help with the maintenance of the culvert. He reported that Parish Council will pay attention to progress and we plan to tie into the sewer. Anyone wanting detials on this project should see Ara.

NEW BUSINESS:

Russell Arslanian reported that membership dues have been \$104 per person for many years. Diocesan assessment amounts to approximately \$70 per member, which leaves us with \$34 per person to take care of our business. If dues are raised it would be the first time in 8 or 9 years. Parish Council's proposal is that (1) dues be raised to \$150.00 per year per person, effective immediately. This rate would be cut 50% for senior citizens, sick and hardship cases, or (2) an increase in 2 stages which would include \$120.00 for the lst year and \$150 for each year thereafter. After much discussion, Louise Ohanian made a motion to increase the church dues from \$104 to \$120 with the second increase to be reviewed next year. Jack Hatchadorian seconded the motion. This motion was defeated.

Motion was made by Thelma Bagdasarian to raise the church dues to \$150 per year. Jack Hatchadorian seconded. It was said again that senior citizens, sick, and hardship cases (to be decided by Diratzoo and Parish Council) would be reduced by 50%. Diratzoo reported that in case of hardship situations people should come to him and certainly things could be worked out. Parish Council assured.that all considerations would be made if this motion passed. Motion passed.

Russell Arslanian reported that we do not have an exclusive contract with Pasquale Caterers and that we are trying to have another caterer come in with some bookings. Exquisite Caterers was contacted by Parish Council, but has very few bookings. The caterer from Normandy Party Center will be booking our hall to help defray expenses. This caterer has recommended some that some improvements be made. It is hoped that the changes will be made in 1993.

The Chairman called upon the Nominating Committee to report the election results for the 1993 Parish Council which is as follows:

After the election took place, Arek Torosian expressed an interest in resigning. At this time, the Chairman called for a brief break to review the By-Laws. It was decided that after election was ratified by the Primate, Arek could then decide if he wanted to resign.

The Nominating Committee reported the election results for the 1993 Auditing and Nominating Committees. Three members were to be elected for each committee with the following results:

*Archie Andonian - 35 *Cheryl Arslanian - 26 *Jay Bagdasarian - 34 Leslie Bagdasarian - 8 Wanda Ryan - 8 Grace Arslanian - 6 Under New Business, Diratzoo reported on the efforts being made to purchase a new organ for the church. About 6 months ago the organ was serviced and it is in working condition. Parts for the existing organ are not available and might not again be serviceable. The Choir has approximately \$7,000 which is earmarked for a new organ. Diratzoo's friend, Berj Zamgochian, has offered to help in the selection of a new organ. The selected organ by Mr. Zamgochian will cost approximately \$27,000. Diratzoo stressed the fact that it is not the Choir's intention to burden the community with this cost so he has contacted foundations for help. No decision has been made to date.

Parish Council Chairperson, Florence Karoghlanian, expressed her gratitude to the outgoing Parish Council Members (Russell Arslanian, Jack Hacherian and Archie Andonian) for their hard work and the friendship that has developed through their work.

Kevork Arslanian expressed his gratitude and thanks to Parish Council, Diratzoo, Chairman of the Day and Secretary of the Day and congratulated all the newly elected people.

Thelma Bagdasarian made a motion that a tape recorder be made available for the Annual Assembly in future years so that it would make it easier for the Secretary. Seconded by Alice Bagdasarian. Motion passed.

Alice Hacherian asked about the qualifications to be made a Benefactor. Diratzoo answered that it is explained on Page 6 of the March, 1993, issue of Paros. The amount of money to qualify as a benefactor is \$750 payable over a three (3) year period. Alice Hacherian and Lucine Mirakian questioned this guideline because the question of service doesn't enter this program. It was reported by Jack Hacherian that in lieu of flowers donations are not included. Diratzoo explained the importance of service. However, the meaning of a Benefactor, "one who does good" has been reduced to the common understanding of one who donates money. Jack Hacherian explained that equating personal service puts Parish Council in a very difficult position. After much discussion, Mona Karoghlanian made a motion that the existing Memorial Committee and Parish Council meet and examine the Benefactors' Program of St. Gregory of Narek Church and endorse what is currently in place or make changes. The motion was seconded by Grace Arslanian. Motion passed.

Chairman, Dick Aurslanian, thanked the Nominating Committee for their hard work and a job well done. Motion was made by David Andonian and seconded by Mona Karoghlanian that the proposed budget for 1993 be approved. Motion passed.

Annual Report of the Deacon in Charge January - December 1993

I begin my report by humbly offering thanks to our Heavenly Father, the source of all good things, for filling the year 1993 with His blessings and for making His presence real in the life of the parish of St. Gregory of Narek. I truly appreciate the love, support, encouragement and confidence shown me by our Primate, His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian and the faithful Armenian Christians of Cleveland and all Ohio.

During 1993 I have attempted as much as possible to operate within the parameters of my understanding of the role of the Armenian Church. The Armenian Church is the official church of Armenian Christians. She was begun under divine inspiration, through the missionary activities of the holy apostles Thaddeus and Bartholomew and the zealous servant of God, St. Gregory the Enlightener. She lives and is sustained by the grace of God and by the cooperation of those who faithfully participate in her holy sacrmental worship. The Armenian Orthodox Apostolic Church stands on a par with the other Christian churches which surround us in this land. However, she contains a unique spiritual tradition which links us through the centuries back to the first century when Christ our God dwelled in Palestine. This concept is beautifully symbolized by the Holy Muron which seals every soul baptized in the Armenian Church. The national faith has also been and continues to be nourished by the blood of hosts of holy martyrs, confessors of the faith. Thus my greatest challenge is to make the faith real, meaningful and attractive to people of our time, young and old alike. The Armenian Church is **not** a social club, cultural association or museum, but is a community of living Christians bonded together by a unique and inspired tradition.

In order to workttoward this goal I have placed great emphasis on the Sunday experience. As the majority of our parishioners live far from the church, I have been cautious about scheduling weekday events. Sunday is the one day most can and should gather together as it is the Lord's day. I am happy that attendence is increasing, though tardiness continues to be the norm for the majority. I have labored to make the worship meaningful and sermons informative, instructive as well as challenging.

The deacons and choir have been a great source of joy for me. Special thanks go to Serop Demirjian, Haig Arpajian, Thelma Bagdasarian and Anita Arpajian as well as to the entire choir for their unselfish, disciplined and consistent devotion. I am especially glad that the choir is so enthusiastic about the quality of our liturgical music that it has embarked upon a fund drive which has resulted in the purchase of a new organ for our sanctuary. I pray that our new church organ be a source of great pride for our congregation. A church organ should not be viewed simply as a musical instrument, but rather as a liturgical object whose sole purpose is to bring glory to God. It is for this reason that in a short time His Eminence the Primate will bless our new organ.

Mrs. Anna Karayan should be praised for her selfless and long-time commitment to our Church School. After much consideration she decided to take some time off from that position. Since May I have taken a greater role in the weekly operation of the Church School, by leading the opening worship and assembly each Sunday. Special thanks should be extended to teachers: Armine Vosgirichian, Murad Demirjian and Louise Demirjian(substitute). However, I notice that the chronic lack of commitment on behalf of the parents eats away at the morale of staff. Promptness and regular attendence are all essential. I am hopeful that before it is too late parents will become convinced of the importance of learning the Christian faith and morality (in this age when both are out of vogue). Only then will our Church School grow. I am overjoyed with the initiative demonstrated by Leslie Bagdasarian this past summer when she volunteered to organize and head the church's Nursery Program. I see great potential in this program as it affords a safe environment for the youngest members of our community. It is essential that our children grow up together so that they remain together as faithful members and courageous defenders of the Armenian Church. I take this occasion once again to invite parents to take advantage of this growing program.

Thanks be to God, in the last few months an ACYOA Juniors group has been formed. Though the numbers are limited, the children are already beginning to bond in a positive and meaningful way through activities (recreational and religious) and responsibilities. To be a member of ACYOA Juniors one must be between ages 10 and 18. The members are learning that they are fully a part of the Church and they have all been taking an active part in the worship servers as acolytes, readers and choir. This summer four of our members attended church camp, having received partial scholarships from the Parish Council. Greg and Chris Andonian attended Hye Camp in Illinois; Vartan and Nshan Davidian attended St. Vartan Camp in Connecticut. God-willing this coming summer even more will take part in these important programs.

Fellowships following Sunday worship services continue to fulfil an important need of our community life. They are excellent opportunities for bringing people together in a warm and hospitible atmosphere. I am especially proud of the warmth extended by our parishoniers towards visitors and new comers. Thank you to all who have throughout the year sponsored fellowships, especially Florence Karoghlanian and Alice Bagdasarian for putting on coffee when no official fellowship was planned.

I would like to congratulate all of our church organizations and their leadership for the excellent events that they have planned and executed throughout the year, including family nights, Michink Dinner, New Years Eve Party, etc. Unfortunately, despite all the preparation and advertisements which are made for events, full attendance can never be counted upon. Much could be said on this topic, but this is not the place. In short I am convinced that our organizations, event planners and volunteers would work more enthusiastically if they enjoyed the full support and encouragement of the community.

The auxiliary organizations continue to function according to their charters and by-laws although overall attendance and enthusiasm does not always seem constant. I have attempted to be present at all organizational meetings and activities. The organizations have as their ultimate goal the edification of their membership in the context of the faith community. Special thanks are due to the following chairpersons for unselfishly giving of their leadership talents: Mary Arslanian, Women's Guild; David Andonian, Social Club; Louise Demirjian, Church Choir; Arek Torosian, ACYOA.

A word of thanks must go to all the organizations which raised funds for the operation of our Church, especially to the Women's Guild, under Mary Arslanian's lead, in making the Ramage Sale a success. Special thanks to John Davidian for running this year's Rug Sale, Mona Karoghlanian, Bake Sale and Thelma and Bob Bagdasarian for co-chairing the Picnic. All who volunteered truly demonstrated their love for our Church.

One of the more positive aspects of my ministry has been the once a month Adult Christian Education Programs. The average attendance has been 10 and I believe it will go up as we continue. On every Wednesday during Lent I conducted Lenten evening worship according to the traditions of the Armenian Church.

During the week, besides time spent preparing the Sunday bulletin, Paros, sermon and keeping up with office work, i.e. correspondence..., I have been making visitations to the homes and work places of our parishioners. Priority is always given to those who are hospitialized and in nursing homes. I again stress the importance of notifying the church of those who are ill and are in need of the healing ministry of the Church.

As part of my responsibilities I have organized the visiting clergy schedule. The Diocese has been most cooperative in making clergy available to us. During 1993 the following clergy have visited our Church and celebrated the Divine Liturgy:

The traditional services of Holy Week were carried out in a most dignified and meaningful manner, fittingly commemorating the saving events of the last week of our Lord's life. The Very Rev. Fr. Vahan Hovhanessian performed the Washing of the Feet Service on Holy Thursday, April 8; and presided over the Service of Betrayal, April 8 and the Vespers of the Burial, April 9. 12 of our boys had their feet washed during the Holy Thrusday services.

I have made ecumenism a priority and have participated in the monthly meetings of the Hillcrest Ministerium. Through this I have come to know several area clergy. On March 10, I hosted a meeting of clergy from the Disciples of Christ Church. I made a presentation to them about the Armenian Church and later we prayed the Lenten Sunrise Service together in our church. In April I became a member of the Greater Cleveland Fellowship of Orthodox Clergy. With Florence Goekjian and Anna Karayan, I represented our Church at the Eastern Churches' Traditions and Celebrations Seminar at Notre Dame College, October 15-16. I continue to be a member of the planning board which meets throughout the year in preparation for the annual seminar. On October 9 I participated in the Orthodox Mission Walk at Sts. Helen and Constantine Greek Orthodox Church. Funds were raised in support of the Orthodox Church in Indonesia. Fr. Daniel, a missionary priest in Indonesia paid a visit to our church later that day.

The Cleveland Armenian community was fortunate to have in its midst the poets: Ardem Harootunian and Diana Der Hovhannesian, who presented a program in our church hall on Sunday, March 7. Thanks to Professor Greppin of Cleveland State University for his encouragement of Armenian culture. Cleveland Armenians were also made proud by the presence of three young Armenian pianists who participated in the Casadesus competition this summer.

From April 26 - May 1 I participated in and represented our church at the Clergy Conference and Diocesan Assembly hosted by St. Gregory the Enlightener Church of Chicago, Illinois. I was joined by our diocesan delegate, Jack Hacherian, who generously attended at his own expense. Together with Russell Kashian I represented our Church at the National ACYOA General Assembly and Sports Weekend at the St. James Armenian Church in Watertown, MA, September 1-4. With Thelma Bagdasarian I represented our Church at the Association of Armenian Church Choirs of America Assembly at the Armenian Church of Our Saviour in Worcester MA, November 4-7. Thelma graciously attended the assembly at her own expense.

I am truly pleased with the work and cooperation of our Paros Staff. I truly appreciate the tireless dedication of Anita Arpajian and Mona Karoghlanian for the informative, timely and well produced publication of the Paros. The co-editors and I appreciate any positive feedback, suggestions and ideas. We commend our readers for overlooking any shortcomings which may have appeared in our reporting of news events and/or donations.

I appreciate the work and dedication of each and everyone of the members of the Parish Council during the past year. Each of the members has been a source of encouragement and help.

With the beginning of the new year our community faced the unfortunate loss of our parish council chairperson, Florence Karoghlanian. For many years she unselfishly served the Armenian Church as a true daughter of the church, fully giving of her talents for the glory of the Holy Church. This was especially evident in the last few years of her life as she served on parish council where she made full use of her leadership qualities. We pray that the heavenly Father enlighten her soul and grant to her the heavenly kingdom.

Special thanks must also go to our treasurer David Andonian, who constantly keeps the books right on track, also as a sincere labor of love to his Church.

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

This report is written on behalf of Florence Karoghlanian, our beloved Chairman who fell asleep in Christ on January 10, 1994.

I cannot reflect on 1993 without first recognizing her life-long service and major contributions to our church and community. 1993 marked the sixth consecutive year that Parish Council was capably lead by Florence. It was her 15th year as a Parish Council member. St. Gregory of Narek was her second home and its members were her family.

Florence served the church with love, dedication and a tireless devotion that was inspiring to myself and the parish council members she served with. One of her greatest contributions was the period when she held the community together in the absence of a full-time clergyman, while zealously persuing and finally securing the services of our current Deacon-in-Charge. On behalf of Parish Council, I want to express my gratitude for her devotion and years of contribution to St. Gregory of Narek. Florence will be missed greatly by our community. In 1994, we will <u>all</u> have to step forward with our talents and work together to fill the large void left by Florence's passing.

Parish Council is entrusted with the privilege of serving the community and Church. This council was a very positive and productive group that enjoyed a close working relationship and spirit of cooperation. I would like to thank fellow Parish Council members David Andonian, Haig Arpajian, Serop Demirjian, Mona Karoghlanian, and Anton Yeranossian, along with Diocesan Delegate and Advisor, Jack Hacherian, for their contributions in 1993.

1993 was a successful year for our parish under the spiritual guidance of Deacon Norman Odabashian, our dedicated Deacon-in-Charge. We celebrated Divine Liturgy nine times and on the remaining Sundays participated in the Matins and Midday Office. As you can read in both Deacon Norman's and the Parish Council's reports, the year was filled with both religious and cultural activities.

We are fortunate to have dedicated choir members, deacons, and acolytes that assist in our weekly church service. Thank you Serop, Haig, Thelma, Anita, and the choir for sharing your talents and devoting your time.

I would also like to take this opportunity to acknowledge the cooperative efforts of all church-affiliated organizations and parishioners who have volunteered their time and talents throughout the year. Special thanks to Mona and Anita for bringing us a professional-quality Paros each month. Parish Council was assisted by parishioners on several projects in 1993. Naz Yessayan shared his talents by lowering property maintenance costs. George Sakian and Richard Aurslanian spearheaded the effort which resulted in Richmond Heights accepting responsibility and performing a major clean-up of the long-neglected culvert area. Our Memorial Committee, Kevork Arslanian, Richard Aurslanian and George Sakian were also successful in securing several new benefactors for the church. Also, thanks to Alice Bagdasarian for managing and scheduling our weekly coffee hours that we enjoy so much! Although we have accomplished a lot as a community in 1993, we <u>must</u> do better if we are to insure the future of our Armenian church and heritage. The following are areas that we must improve on in 1994:

1. Church Attendance:

Less than 1 out of 5 members of our church attend service on a regular basis. Of those who do attend, most come late (after 11:15). Our Deacon-in-Charge has worked hard to make Sunday worship a meaningful and spiritually rewarding experience. You are all strongly encouraged to attend church on time in order to receive full spiritual benefit.

2. Church School Support:

Armenian Christian education for our young children is the cornerstone for the future of our church. Only a few families have made it a priority to bring their children on time and on a regular basis to church school. We need the support and commitment of the <u>parents</u> of church school age children in order to have viable classes. Where will our children get an Armenian Christian education if they don't get it here? We have a talented and dedicated staff ready to teach your children <u>if</u> you will bring them.

3. Financial Support:

A close review of the parish's Annual Budget indicates that expenses exceeded income in 1993 by \$27,649 and a shortfall of \$9,700 is projected in 1994. A <u>decrease</u> in dues collected and cultural hall income are the major reasons for the deficit. We all must contribute more to the church if it is to remain financially sound. The projected deficits do not allow for unusual expenses or long-term capital projects like the pending sewer tie-in (could cost as much as \$50,000). Please consider that your basic dues is the <u>minimum</u> contribution for a member and is not enough to sustain the church financially. I challenge each family that is able to consider contributing just 1% of their annual income to our spiritual and cultural home.

4. Participation/Involvement:

As we know, the loss of Florence Karoghlanian will leave a large void in the community. Many tasks she performed for the church must now be shared by others. Let her dedication and love for the church be a shining example for all of us.

<u>New volunteers and Parish Council members must now come forward</u> for the church to continue running smoothly. For those that have served in the past, your experience is needed during this transitional time. For those who are new in the community, we welcome your involvement and fresh ideas. The excuses "I served in the past" or "I don't have time" are not acceptable. We all have some time for our church if we make service to God a priority. If you are asked to serve on a committee or on Parish Council, please say "Yes".

As we approach St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church's 30th Anniversary, I have faith that the members of our community will rise to the occasion and carry forward the work of our church in the spirit of love and cooperation that has lasted for three generations. With the full support of our members and the leadership of our talented and dedicated Deacon-in-Charge, St. Gregory of Narek will continue to grow as an Armenian Christian family.

Parish Council welcomes your comments and especially your participation at today's annual meeting.

DIOCESAN DELEGATE REPORT

The 91st Annual Diocesan Assembly was held April 29th through May 1st, 1993, at Chicago, Illinois, hosted by St. Gregory Armenian Church. The Assembly was presided over by His Grace, Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate. Dr. Garo Garibian (Holy Trinity Church, Cheltenham, PA.), was elected Diocesan Assembly Chairman. 144 Diocesan delegates, 43 chairpersons, plus approximately 35 clergy were present. The Cleveland Church was represented by Deacon Norman Odabashian and Jack Hacherian.

Col. Victor Arzoomanian, Executive Director of the Armenian Church Endowment Fund reported the ACEF now has over 600 donors and a potential of over 30 million dollars.

The Rector for St. Nersess Seminary, Deacon Hratch Tchilingirian, reported over 30 churches in North America do not have priests. The student body currently consisted of 7 students. This year 4 St. Nersess graduates were ordained priests. More than 90% of St. Nersess graduates are serving the Armenian Church in various capacities. From August 1st through August 14th, 1993, a "1000 MILE MISSION" will visit 14 parishes and communities from Montreal, Canada to New Rochell, New York. Initially the MISSION will be lead by Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate of the Eastern Diocese and Archbishop Hovnan Derderian, Primate of the Canadian Diocese. The purpose is to increase awareness about St. Nersess, as well as to raise funds.

The Unity Committee report presented by Zarvin Kasparian advised the Assembly meetings were continuing between the Diocesan/Prelacy Unity Committees. The Canadian Diocese was requested to participate in the Unity meetings. Progress was continuing at the Unity meetings with a number of items resolved (where differences existed). However there remained some 15 items to be resolved. In view of the continuing progress, the Diocesan Assembly directed the Unity Committee, with a report to be submitted by February 15th, 1994, for presentation to the 1994 Diocesan Assembly.
