RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

"All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrines, canons and rites, and whofulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly."

"Every member of the Parish, 21 years of age or over, shall pay the church an annual dues."

"Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are twenty-one years of age or older, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the Parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members."

"Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies, or to hold elective office within the Parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years."

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

"The agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly."

"At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitue a quorum. Decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting."

"In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must cast in person."

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MINUTES OF THE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

ST. GREGORY OF NAREK ARMENIAN CHURCH, CLEVELAND, OHIO

FEBRUARY 27, 1994

The Annual Parish Assembly was called to order at 1:15 p.m. by Acting Parish Council Chairman, Ara Bagdasarian. Deacon-in-Charge Norman Odabashian opened the meeting with a prayer and a short welcoming speech. He thanked everyone for their assistance in preparing the Annual Report, especially Leslie Bagdasarian. He also gratefully acknowledged Ara Bagdasarian and the other Parish Council members for their hard work and dedication. Diratzoo stressed the importance of communication amongst church organizations and that we should deal with problems and not hold resentment. He also encouraged parents to bring their children to Sunday School so that they may learn the teachings of the church.

Diratzoo also made a correction to the Annual Report of the Church School on page 14 of last year's annual report. Mrs. Anna Karayan was Superintendent of Church School until the end of the 1992-93 school year.

Ara Bagdasarian addressed the assembly on behalf of Florence Karoghlanian. He pointed out Florence's 15 years of serving on Parish Council and her unconditional love and service to the church. He also announced that as part of the 30th Anniversary of the church, Florence would be specially recognized. Ara thanked all Parish Council members and the Diocesan Delegate, Jack Hacherian. Ara noted that Deacon Norman has progressed as a leader in our community but that he needs our support. Attendance in church, volunteering our time, and financial donations are all areas that need improvement. He commended George Sakian for handling the caterer and hall responsibilities and the Women's Guild for handling the organization and ordering of supplies in the hall. Ara stated that the church is our family and that support from everyone is needed to keep it moving forward!

David Andonian took roll call and 45 dues paid members were in attendance which is over 1/3 of the membership. This constituted a quorum.

Next, the Nominating Committee (Lucille Andonian, Anita Arpajian, and Russ Arslanian) conducted the election for Chairman and Secretary of the Day. Results are below:

Ara Bagdasarian noted that the 1993 Assembly Minutes needed to be approved. Alex Bagdasarian made a motion to accept the minutes as corrected. The motion was seconded by Naz Yessayan. Motion passed unanimously.

Diratzoo reviewed some upcoming events during the Nominating Committee's vote counting. He also announced that he was part of a pastoral program at St. Luke's Hospital and that his day off would be Mondays rather than Wednesdays for the next two months.

At this point, the Nominating Committee announced that Russell Arslanian was elected Chairman of the Day and Leslie Bagdasarian, Secretary of the Day. Russ then took nominations from the floor to complete the slate for (4) Parish Council members to be elected:

OLD BUSINESS:

1. Operation Heat: David Andonian reported on the success of our parish's efforts to collect monies for heating Armenia. A total of \$8,300 has been sent to buy heating oil for Armenia.

- 2. Culvert & Sewer: George Sakian reported that a decision was made over 20 years ago to keep the culvert on our property open which created a property maintenance issue. The City of Richmond Heights was contacted in 1993 and they have started the clean-up job of painting the fence and clearing brush, debris, etc. A work schedule for 1994 was requested by us from Richmond Hts. and we are waiting for it. Also, there is a possibility of a sanitary sewer tie-in with the Whitlatch development to the rear of our property. We are investigating this and attending town meetings on the issue.
- 3. Hall Rental: George Sakian (who has volunteered to work with Pasquale Caterers and the hall situation) reported on this issue. He commended Florence Karoghlanian on her work with the caterer. He stated that Pasquale's credit is poor and we are working with them to get a payment schedule. Since one-third of our parish's income comes from the hall rental, it is an important issue.

4. Church's 30th Anniversary: Mona Karoghlanian summarized the activities planned for the 30th Anniversary weekend: The April 9th Dedication of the New Organ in the Church; the Recital by Berj Zamkochian, World-Renowned Organist; Champagne Reception following the recital; Sunday, April 10th Gala Banquet and the special visit by our Primate, Archbishop Khajag Barsamian. She informed everyone of the ticket prices: Saturday Recital & Reception (free) and Sunday Banquet (\$30 per person, \$10 children under 12) and said further publicity would be appearing soon.

- 5. Church Organ Fund: Serop Demirjian reported on the progress made so far and that the fund was \$5,000 short of its goal. He recognized Diratzoo and Louise Demirjian for obtaining grant monies from outside sources for the purchase of our organ. Remaining money needed would be raised during the 30th Anniversary weekend.
- 6. Church School/ACYOA Juniors: Diratzoo reported on these items.

Church School: Since no individual came forward to be superintendent, the duties would be broken down into 3 parts for next fall: Administrator/Program Coordinator, Supply Coordinator, Communications. There is a consistency problem with children's attendance. We need talented people to step forward and take responsibility. He thanked Leslie Bagdasarian for organizing the successful Nursery Program.

ACYOA Juniors: There are 12 members in the newly organized group. He commended them for a successful Poon Paregentan fellowship. He said they have monthly meetings and have already had a religious retreat. Naz Yessayan expressed his gratitude for Diratzoo's reorganization of the Juniors group but also asked ACYOA Seniors to take a more Big Brother/Big Sister role with the juniors' members. Murad Demirjian was also thanked for his help with the group.

The Nominating Committee returned to announce the elected Nominating Committee members for next year: Lucille Andonian, Anita Arpajian, Russell Arslanian.

NEW BUSINESS:

The \$10,000 budget item for improving the cultural hall restrooms prompted a lengthy discussion about the problem of cultural hall and general property maintenance and lack of a Property Manager. It was left up to the new Parish Council to prioritize projects that need attention and to come up with a better maintenance schedule for the property and to consider improvements to the cultural hall since it is such a large part of our income.

7. Parish Council Activities and Financial Report: George Sakian asked that the electric and gas expenditure line items be broken down by building next year as in previous years' reports. Alice Hacherian asked about Paros donations and David Andonian clarified that donations were just asked for recently and are currently being collected. Sam Mirakian asked about how the interest on our CD's etc. are notated. Jack Hacherian asked what the "Misc. Expenditures" were. Sandy Aurslanian asked about what amount of profit was made from the Food Sale at the Rug Sale. Cheryl Arslanian asked if there was a balanced budget amendment in our by-laws. David Andonian expressed concern about raising funds to cover our budget deficit for this year. Anahid Aghajanian asked about the dues increase and the large number of inaccuracies in our Telephone Directory. Louise Demirjian brought up the point for Melanie Gumushdjian that maybe we could collect monies directly from renters of the hall. Louise also recommended the church have a long-range plan for future projects. Thelma Bagdasarian stressed the need for a community-wide fund-raising project.

A motion from the floor was made by Sam Mirakian to approve the Financial Statement & Budget as read, Alex Bagdasarian seconded. Motion passed.

Jack Hacherian commented on his Diocesan Delegate report. He specifically referred to the important Unity issue and said that it is a long process but it is moving forward. Further progress will be reported at this year's Diocesan Assembly.

Russ asked for comments on the remaining Parish Auxiliary reports, there were none. A motion was made by Jack Hacherian to accept them and Thelma Bagdasarian seconded, motion passed.

Results from the Auditing Committee elections were announced. Next year's committee will be the same: Archie Andonian, Cheryl Arslanian and Jay Bagdasarian.

Russ closed the meeting with a few remarks. He noted how our community feels the loss of Florence Karoghlanian and all of the wonderful things she did for our parish. Russ stressed that our community needs to pull together now more than ever. He recognized George Sakian, Naz Yessayan and Dick Aurslanian for volunteering for special projects but especially commended the community for rallying around Diratzoo. He thanked Diratzoo for bringing our groups together and working with the young people who are the church's future. He urged everyone who is not on Parish Council to assist with special projects. David Andonian added that our Parish needs an assistant to Diratzoo and a Property Manager (whether paid or volunteer) to insure the future of our church in the community.

Thelma Bagdasarian thanked Russ and Leslie for serving as officers of the day and also Haig Arpajian and Ara Bagdasarian for serving on Parish Council. Louise Demirjian suggested a team approach to the Property Manager problem and perhaps using some of the Baku families for help.

Mona Karoghlanian mentioned that the Diocese has approached us to sponsor the Diocesan Assembly in 1997. The parish will be informed on future developments.

Diratzoo thanked the officers of the day and for everyone's participation. He also congratulated the new Parish Council members and gave a few remarks about each person elected. Diratzoo closed the meeting with a prayer at 3:38 p.m.

Annual Report of the Deacon in Charge

January - December 1994

I begin my report by rendering thanks to our heavenly Father for the many blessings which He has showered upon our church community during the 30th anniversary year 1994. In August Armenians throughout the world were saddened by the death of His Holiness Vazken I, Catholicos and Supreme Patriarch of All Armenians. We continue to pray for the repose of his soul and that the delegates convening in Holy Etchmiadzin on April 3 will be inspired in their choice of a worthy successor. I am thankful to His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, our Primate for his continued support and encouragement. From the bottom of my heart I thank all of the faithful Armenian Christians throughout Cleveland and Akron for their love and faithfulness in this ministry.

In the past I have stressed the unique character, the divinely inspired beauty and traditions of the Armenian Apostolic Church. The Armenian Church has been spoken of as a flower which makes up the beautiful bouquet of the Christian Churches. The poet has rightly said that the "Armenian Church is the Birthplace of My Soul." The imparting of this feeling to all, young and old, is our greatest goal. The instilling of a sincere love for the worship, teachings and history of the Armenian Church is all essential.

According to the ancient Tradition Sunday is the central day of worship for Christians and is designated as a celebration of the resurrection of Christ our God. Sunday is accordingly the most active day in our church community. On a typical Sunday, our faithful deacons, choir members, parish council members and Church School staff are first to arrive. The faithful arrive at worship anytime from the opening prayers to the commencement of fellowship. Blessed are those who share the psalmist's feelings, "I was glad when they said. 'Let us go unto the House of the Lord!'"

Fellowships following Sunday worship services continue to fulfil an important need of our community life. They are excellent opportunities for bringing the Armenian Community together in a warm and hospitible atmosphere. I am especially proud of the warmth extended by our parishoniers towards visitors and new comers. This year in conjunction with the Sunday School, fellowships have been given in honor of children born that month. Thank you to all who have hosted fellowships.

The deacons and choir continue to be a great source of joy for me. Special thanks go to deacons Serop Demirjian, Haig Arpajian, and organist Anita Arpajian as well as to the entire choir for their unselfish, disciplined and consistent devotion. Last summer a fellowship was held to thank Thelma Bagdasarian for the many years she has served as choir director. Until a new director is found Anita Arpajian is capably leading the choir from the organ.

This summer we spent considerable time and effort in reorganizing our Church School. On June 4 Elise Antreassian of the Diocesan Department of Religious Education met with our new staff and helped in developing a new structure. I am very thankful to Louise Demirjian and Cindy Russell for volunteering and serving as co-superintendents since September. Louise Demirjian took some time off and attended the Mardigian Institute last summer. The entire Church School staff is worthy of our praise. On several Sundays the assembly took place in the context of the regular worship service. Some of the children participated with scripture readings. On other occasions I visited the Church School and conducted a special worship service for the children.

This summer 15 of our children attended the week-long (July 31-August 7) Hye Camp held in Illinois. Dina Aurslanian, John Bashian and Anna Seropian were staff members. I served on the staff as a religion instructor from July 31-August 3. Parish Council subsidized the rental of a van to and from camp.

I would like to congratulate all of our church organizations and their leadership for the excellent events that they have planned and executed throughout the year. The auxiliary organizations continue to function according to their charters and by-laws. I have attempted to attend all organizational meetings and activities. Special thanks are due to the following chairpersons for unselfishly giving of their leadership talents: Sandra Aurslanian, Women's Guild; David Andonian, Social Club; Louise Demirjian & Cindy Russell, Church School; Serop Demirjian, choir; Murad Demirjian, ACYOA Srs and Greg Andonian, ACYOA Jrs.

A word of thanks must go to all the organizations which raised funds for the operation of our Church, especially to the Women's Guild, under Mary Arslanian's lead, in making the Ramage Sale once again a success. Special thanks to John Davidian for running this year's Rug Sale and Bob Dombrowski for chairing the Annual Picnic. I was truly impressed that six Armenian business and organizations came forward and underwrote the picnic expenses.

I conducted the Adult Christian Education Program once a month during the spring and weekly during Lent. On each of the Wednesdays of Lent I conducted the Peace and Rest Services and spoke on the sacraments.

During the week, besides time spent preparing the Sunday bulletin, Paros, sermon and keeping up with office work, i.e. correspondence..., I have been making visitations to the homes and work places of our parishioners. Priority is always given to those who are hospitialized and in nursing homes. I again stress the importance of notifying the church of those who are ill and are in need of the healing ministry of the Church.

As part of my responsibilities I have organized the visiting clergy schedule. The Diocese has been most cooperative in making clergy available to us. During 1994 the following clergy have visited our Church and celebrated the Divine Liturgy:

On June 5 Elise Antreassian gave the sermon.

On the remaining Sundays of the year, Matins and the Midday Office took place with the participation of our deacons, acolytes and choir. With the ecclesiastical approval of His Eminence the Primate, I have administered presanctified holy communion to the spiritually prepared faithful. I have also conducted the Requiem Service as requested. During Great Lent the Sunrise Office replaced the Midday Office. Church services were cancelled on January 9 and 16 due to inclement weather. Services were also cancelled on September 4 (vacation) and November 6 because of the Choir Assembly in Richmond, VA.

The traditional services of Holy Week were carried out in a most dignified and meaningful manner, fittingly commemorating the saving events of the last week of our Lord's life. The Rev. Fr. Garabed Kochakian performed the Washing of the Feet Service on Holy Thursday, March 31; and presided over the Service of Betrayal, March 31 and the Vespers of the Burial, April 1. 12 of our boys had their feet washed during the Holy Thrusday services. Easter Eve Divine Liturgy was celebrated on April 2.

I continue to be a member of the planning board which meets throughout the year in preparation for the annual seminar. On December 7 I hosted a group from Holy Resurrection Orthodox Church of Warren.

St. Gregory of Narek Church enjoyed the presence of the following special guests: Mr. Varoujan Vosganian, president of the Armenian Committee of Rumanian on January 30. On August 17 His Eminence the Primate appointed a parish council and baptized 17 people in Erie. On August 19 the St. Nersess Mission Team conducted Verpers in Columbus. The Primate has asked me to oversee these new communities. I have been visiting each community every other month. The first Divine Liturgy was celebrated in Erie on November 27 by Fr. Diran Papazian.

From April 26 - 30 I participated in and represented our church at the Clergy Conference and Diocesan Assembly hosted by St. Kevork Armenian Church, Houston, Texas. I was joined by our diocesan delegate, Jack Hacherian and Parish Council Chairman Mona Karoghlanian, who generously attended at their own expense. With Anita Arpajian, Thelma Bagdasarian, Louise and Serop Demirjian, I represented our Church at the Association of Armenian Church Choirs of America Assembly at St. James Armenian Church, Richmond, VA, November 3-6. Our representatives graciously attended the assembly at their own expense. I was re-elected for a one year term to the Choir Central Council.

DIOCESAN DELEGATE

The Parish Council was entrusted with the privilege of serving the Armenian Church. At all times we had in mind the true mission and well being of our Church while decisions and actions were taken. Here are some of our 1994 activities:

JANUARY: Armenian Christmas services were celebrated by our guest priest Fr. Krikor Maksudian. Our beloved chairperson Florence Karoglanian fell asleep in Christ on January 10th 1994. Vice chairperson Ara Bagdasarian was entrusted with the privilege of serving the community and our Holy Church. Our Cultural Hall catering services were organized and new agreements singed.

FEBRUARY: Due to severe damages caused to the Western Dioceses by the California earthquake, the Primate requested special collection and appeal letters were sent to the parishioners. Diratzoo initiated an adult Christian education series following the Lenten services.

MARCH: Following the annual elections, new members, Mr. Richard Aurslanian, Sebouh Setrakian and Robert Dombrowski joined the parish council. One of the great accomplishments of the parish was the forming of property committee.

APRIL: During Holy Week Fr. Garabed Kochakian was our guest celebrant. The property committee attained Andy Lebo as our maintenance contractor. The 30th anniversary celebration and new organ dedication were a success. April 24th was commemorated and followed by a Madagh. An agreement was signed between St. Gregory of Narek and Whitlatch & Co. granting us easement over and through the sanitary sewer lines of Hillary Place Condominium.

MAY: New parish council members were ratified and dedication service was held. Diratzoo along with Mona Karoglanian and our delegate Jack Hacherian attended the annual Diocesan Assembly. Our parish was chosen as the site for the 1997 Diocesan Assembly (5/1/1997 to 5/4/1997). Thelma Bagdasarian stepped down as choir director and was honored for her many years of dedicated service to our Church.

JUNE: Various bids were received from contractors to update and renew the Cultural Hall bathrooms. The property committee attended many city council meetings and discussed in detail the assessment fee when the interceptor on Richmond Road is installed. Steven Hovancsek, an engineer was hired to assist us in evaluation of sewer tie in. Mr. Alan Borazanian was a welcome addition to the property committee and arranged negotiations

with Whitlatch & Co. Sunday School committee under the directorship of Louise Demirjian and Cindy Russel Aurslanian made preparations for the new school year. JULY: Our annual church picnic was a smashing success under the leadership of Robert Dombrowski, Haig Arpajian and Serop Demirjian. We thank all the parishioners and sponsors who helped and made such generous contributions. The feast of Transfiguration was celebrated and the Choir hosted the coffee hour.

AUGUST: Armenian President Levon Der Petrosian had an extensive visit to the White House and various communities in the USA. St. Nerses Missionary team was welcomed at our parish on Aug. 18th. Our Catholicos and Supreme Patriarch of all Armenians fell sleep in Christ Aug. 18th. Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, is acting Locum Tenen.

SEPTEMBER: Church School opened with dedicated teachers and enthusiastic students. Fr. Mamigon Kiledjian celebrated the Divine Liturgy and performed the Antasdan on the feast of the Exaltation of Holy Cross.

OCTOBER: Under the leadership of John Davidian, our annual Oriental rug sale was held. Parish council approved the purchase of 175 new chairs for the Cultural Hall. Cultural day was celebrated with a program and dinner by our Women's Guild, our guest speaker was Laurie Jennings of Channel 8 newscaster. ACYOA sponsored a Halloween Party for the Church school children.

NOVEMBER: The Property committee has been following up with the City of Richmond Hts, to obtain in writing that our Church would not be assessed new sewer tie in fees. 1995 has been designated as "The Year of Holy Bible". Diratzoo and four choir members attended the Choir Association meeting in Richmond, Virginia.

DECEMBER: The property committee finalized the sale of two donated properties. ACYOA members along with the Social Club have worked hard to organize the New Year's eve party but unfortunately due to the lack of participation it was canceled. A new financial advisory committee was formed to assist the parish council on financial matters of our parish.

1995 St. Gregory of Narek Property Committee Report

The property committee was formed following the 1994 Annual Assembly. The purpose of the Committee was to relieve Parish Council from the time consuming job of managing the Church property, the caterer, and to complete several capital improvements approved by the Parish.

The following is a brief summary of what was accomplished in 1994:

Catering Revenue:

Through the efforts of George Sakian, a record total of \$46,192 was collected from Pasquale Caterers exceeding the 1994 budget by \$16,192. The \$46,192 represents \$18,000 that was due from 1993 and \$28,192 from events booked in 1994. For the first time in many years, we have a zero balance with Pasquale Caterers.

Major Capital Improvements:

Renovation of Women's Restroom and Powder Room Renovation of Men's Restroom Replacement of Floor in Kitchen and updgrade of kitchen lighting Repair/Leveling of sidewalks Purchase of new chairs for the Parish Hall

Ongoing Maintenance of Entire Property Including cleaning of all Buildings:

Andy Lebo, a paid "hands-on" property manager was hired by Parish Council effective November 1, 1994 for a six month trial. He is now responsible for assisting Parish Council by supervising, managing, coordinating, and following up on all property-related cleaning and maintenance functions. The condition of our property has improved significantly under Andy's care.

Sewer Project/Property Sale:

Numerous meetings were held with County Officials, City Officials, and the Developer (Whitlatch) to determine the best course of action for the Parish. A study was commissioned in July to Stephen Hovancsek to evaluate our sewer situation. It was determined that tying in to the Whitlatch development is clearly the best and lowest cost option for the church. Alan Borazanian provided and is still providing a great deal of assistance to the Parish in this matter.

MEMORIAL FUND

OF

ST. GREGORY OF NAREK ARMENIAN CHURCH

The trustees of the Memorial Fund of St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church, composed of Kevork Arslanian, Richard Aurslanian and George Sakian held two (2) meetings jointly with the representatives of Parish Council in 1994.

A brief history of this Fund began with its formation in January 1, 1987 with the approval and authorization by the Parish Council.

Under Article III of the Guidelines revised 8/8/89... The OBJECTIVES and RESPONSIBILITIES are:

- I. To coordinate with the Parish Council the revenues and gifts which are directed to the Fund.
- II. To inform parishioners (at least 2 times per year in Paros and/or with mailings) of the existence of the Memorial Fund and encourage them to make contributions.
- III. To prepare a list of sacramental vessels, vestments, altar furnishings, religious paintings and other items or improvements needed for the church and provide this list to Parish Council. A list of suggestions will be available for selection by donors as well as approximate cost.
 - IV. To supervise and assure the fulfillment of the wishes of donors after consideration by Parish Council.

The names of thirty-four (34) benefactors were permanently displayed in the church vestibule on brass name plates engraved and mounted on granite.

The number was increased to forty-six (46) in 1988 and currently as of January, 1995, the names of sixty-seven (67) benefactors are respectfully displayed.

Memorial Fund Benefactor donations 1993 thru January 1995 inclusive totaled \$8,660.00.

Additional donations were received from:

Funds transferred from the Memorial Fund for improvement purposes:

Donation to the Church Organ Fund (1993)\$3,500.00

Towards the purchase of new Cultural Hall

Chairs, silverware, misc. items\$10,500.00

MEMORIAL FUND BENEFACTOR PROGRAM

To be eligible as a benefactor, the deceased or the family members representing the deceased person must have donated any one of the following items as listed below to the St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church an amount to total or the equivalent of \$750.00 or more (can be paid over a period of up to 3 years in 3 equal installments of \$250.00.

- I. Family members of the deceased who have donated monies to the church for this specific purpose (to be listed as a benefactor).
- II. The church when included as a beneficiary in the last will and testament of the deceased.
- III. Physical, real property or negotiable investment securities as donated to and accepted by the church by the deceased or family members in the name of the deceased.
- IV. The church as being listed the beneficiary of any interest earned from monies donated to an endowment fund.

In lieu of flowers donations of the deceased to be given to the church will not qualify the deceased as a benefactor of the church. Any monies given the church in honor of a deceased person by a survivor shall be accepted and received as a donation in memory of the deceased person.

The names of all benefactors will be permanently displayed in the church vestibule on brass name plates engraved and mounted on granite.

Annually, on the Sunday preceding Memorial Day, a special Requiem Service will be administered in our church for all benefactors.

It will be imperative that any request from the family or close relatives of the deceased be submitted to the Trustees of the Memorial Fund for determination in the form of a written note or letter, requesting the deceased be listed as a "Benefactor of the Church".

The continuance of adding and maintaining that religious charm and prestige to our fine church and its surrounding can only be achieved through our dedicated efforts.

DIOCESAN DELEGATE REPORT

The 92nd Annual Diocesan Assembly was held April 28th through April 30th, 1994, at Houston, Texas, hosted by St. Kevork Armenian Church. The Assembly was presided over by His grace, Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate. Dr. Garo Garibian was elected Diocesan Assembly Chairman. The Assembly was composed of 98 delegates, 43 chairpersons, and 51 clergy. The Cleveland Church was represented by Deacon Norman Odabashian, Chairperson Mona Karoghlanian, and Jack Hacherian, delegate.

The election of a Primate was reviewed since Archbishop Khajag Barsamian had completed his four year term. A slate of three candidates were presented: Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate of America (Eastern Diocese): Archbishop Aghan Baliozian, Primate of Australia: Bishop Aris Shirvanian, California. Archbishop Khajag Barsamian was re-elected Primate of the Eastern Discese for a four year term.

"THE YEAR OF THE FAMILY" designated by the United Nations for 1994, was adopted by the Diocese as its theme for the year, focusing on the Armenian Church Family. Under the direction of the Diocese, various programs will be presented to the parishes inviting total family activity.

The Diocesan/Prelacy Unity Committee held 7 meetings (1993) aimed at achieving a common By-Laws for a reunified Diocese. A first draft has been completed, to be submitted to the Primate/Prelate and respective Councils by June 1994, with proposed outline for moving into the next stage of implementation.
