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MINUTES OF THE 1996 ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

· OPENING PRAYER AND PRAYER FOR DECEASED PARISH MEMBERS

The Annual Parish Assembly was called to order at 1:00 P.M. by Father Simeon Odabashian. He opened the meeting with a special prayer for the deceased members of our church (Marie Bosnoian, Anahis Davidian and Louise Ohanian).

WELCOMING REMARKS BY FR. SIMEON ODABASHIAN
Father Simeon reviewed highlights of the year and thanked Parish Council members for their hard work and dedication. He emphasized unity and encouraged parishioners to participate and serve their church. He stated the importance of the upcoming 1997 Diocesan Assembly sponsored by our parish and encouraged everybody to attend the events. He read parts of his report and shared the joy and happiness that came to him with his ordination.

WELCOMING REMARKS BY DR. SEBOUH SETRAKIAN. PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN Dr. Setkrakian emphasized the importance of serving the church. He recognized the efforts of volunteers and expressed appreciation. He invited parishioners to serve on committees and work together. He spoke about the financial status of the church and said that more than the church's income is being spent. Dr. Setrakian recommended activities be held to raise money for church use. He gave the activity of the 1997 Diocesan Assembly as an example of a project to raise money and encouraged everyone to participate. He thanked the out-going Parish Council members. Robert Bagdasarian, Mona Karoglanian and Naz Yessayan for their loving service on the Parish Council.

VERIFICATION OF DUES-PAYING MEMBERS

Naz Yessayan took roll call. 52 members were present, constituting a quorum.

ELECTION OF PARISH ASSEMBLY OFFICERS

Dr. Setkrakian invited the Nominating Committee led by Deacon Serop Demirjian to conduct the election of the Chairman and Secretary of the The candidates were as follows: day.

Chairman of the Day Jay Bagdasarian Alice Bagdasarian

Secretary of the Day <u>Anna Karayan</u> Mary Arslanian

Jay Bagdasarian and Anna Karayan were respectively elected Chairman of the Day and Secretary of the Day.

Jay announced that the proceedings were being tape recorded to aid the Secretary in transcription of proceedings. He said that only dues-paying members would be able to vote on motions on the floor.

Jay referred to Father Simeon's report, and read an inspirational excerpt to the assembly ...

> "For all the countless hours spent in negative talk about this one or that one. I challenge everyone who reads my words to redirect that energy in a positive and edifying direction by holding up God's holy name and keeping alive our beautiful and preciously unique Armenian tradition for generations to come.

MINUTES OF THE 1996 PARISH ASSEMBLY

An amendment to the minutes was made by Thelma Bagdasarian. She referred to page 8. under the heading 'Annual Assembly Minutes'. in the last paragraph, the name of "Alan Borazanian" should be replaced with "Richard Aurslanian".

ELECTIONS - CONDUCTED BY THE NOMINATING COMMITTEE (Continued)
Regarding the Auditing Committee, Dr. Setrakian pointed out that there is a church-wide change in the by-laws of the committee. To begin the new system of rotation, initially, the persons elected will serve varying terms. The person receiving the highest amount of votes will serve a 3-year term, the person receiving the second highest amount of votes will serve a 2-year term and the one who receives the third highest amount of votes will serve a one-year term. After this year, there will only be one person elected to the Auditing Committee, with only one person going off the Committee. There was discussion regarding the implementation of the new Auditing Committee by-laws.

Ballots were collected. The Nominating Committee departed to tally the votes.

OLD AND NEW BUSINESS

1997 DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY (MAY 1 THROUGH MAY 4, 1997) (Co-Chairmen: Mona Karoglanian and Eileen Hacherian)

Mona presented an up-to-date report on the progress of the 1997 Diocesan Assembly Committee. She encouraged community participation. Mona said that there will be 200 to 250 Clergy, Diocesan Delegates, Women's Guild Delegates, Yeretzgins. Parish Council Chairmen and friends coming to Cleveland to attend the Diocesan Assembly.

Mona said that an "Armenian of the Year" is yet to be announced by the Diocese, who will be honored at the banquet.

Dr. Kenneth Zahka was nominated as "friend of the Armenians". Mona listed activities that will be taking place, along with announcing the schedules of the 3 business sessions and luncheons, banquet and social activities with a final gathering on Sunday at our church for Divine Liturgy and a delegates/Clergy/community farewell brunch.

The Ritz-Carlton Cleveland and Renaissance Hotels were chosen as the sites for various planned events. There will be sight-seeing activities for all attendees of the Assembly

ST. GREGORY OF NAREK ENDOWMENT FUND

Dick Aurslanian said that instead of sending money elsewhere that a local Endowment Fund be established. He said that anyone who wants to establish an Endowment Fund in their name should bring it to the attention of the group. If there is an interest, a Fund could be setup. Richard explained that whoever sets up a fund would receive the interest income during ones lifetime with the assets going to the church. There was discussion of the tax benefits to the one who establishes the fund. Dina Aurslanian said that the Finance Committee could possibly work on the Endowment Fund concept. Jay said the church could work with the professional financial and legal guidance in conjunction with the Finance Committee and create a format should someone wish to participate in an Endowment Fund. There was further discussion of the proposed Endowment Fund.

Dick Aurslanian suggested the creation of two community groups: a "A Garden Club" and a "Church Visitation Committee". He said that he is circulating information on the proposed formation of the groups.

1996 ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL ACTIVITIES/FINANCIAL REPORT
Regarding the Parish Council's Annual Report, Thelma Bagdasarian made three revisions which were as follows:

- October 13, 1996 should be deleted, as the whole Cultural Day event took place only on October 20, 1996.
- December 22, 1996 The Church School Christmas Pageant
 Reception was sponsored by the Guild (not
 the Choir as is written). Replace 'Choir'
 with 'Guild'.
- December 24, 1996 to be deleted. There was no observance of Western Christmas Eve Service of Carols.

1996 ANNUAL PARISH COUNCIL ACTIVITIES/FINANCIAL REPORT Sue Mirakian moved that the Treasurer's Report be accepted as printed. Jack Hacherian seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

APPROVAL OF THE 1997 BUDGET
Alex Bagdasarian moved to accept the 1997 budget as submitted. Hacherian seconded the motion. The motion was passed as submitted.

DIOCESAN DELEGATES REPORT (Page 16)

- Jack Hacherian, Diocesan Delegate, corrected the typing errors in his report as follows:
 - -In the last paragraph, second sentence, the figure "\$3,500.00" should be \$3,500,000.
 - -In the last paragraph, the last sentence, the final figure should read \$1,247,000.

PARISH AUXILIARY REPORTS

Choir Treasurer's Report - Thelma Bagdasarian said that the church plate offering from one of the Sundays when the feast of the Assumption was observed had not been received by the Choir. She said traditionally, this money is used as the Choir's Dues to the Choir Association. Thelma asked the amount of the plate collection of Sunday, August 18 (Observance day of the feast) and the amount of the check that was forwarded to the A.A.C.C.A. (Association of Armenian Church Choirs in America).

Grace Arslanian questioned the bank fee expense item of \$90. Demirjian. Treasurer, explained the entry. He said that the bank fees were going to be removed and adjusted, but since the record showed the charge, the Treasurer's report had to reflect the actual status of the account.

Sam Mirakian said that with the exception of the choir report questions. he moved to accept the Auxiliary Reports as submitted. Louise Demirjian seconded the motion.

Alice Hacherian said that of all the auxiliary organizations, the only group that paid the parish council assessment was the Social Club. 600 over \$500 in treasury assets are assessed by the parish council. The Social Club paid their assessment in a timely fashion. Bob Bagdasarian clarified the procedure by suggesting that at the end of the year a check should be written by the organization's treasurer turning over the assessed funds to Parish Council along with their annual report.

At this time Naz Yessayan. Treasurer, responded to Thelma Bagdasarian's earlier request. He said that on September 23, 1996, a check was sent to the A.A.C.C.A. in the amount of \$102. Naz commented that he recalled in the past that when the Treasurer's report was turned in for auditing, the assessment check was also provided. He said that the only group which paid their assessment timely was the Social Club.

Dr. Setrakian said that "reminder letters" will be prepared for mailing to auxiliary organizations, except the Social Club, for their forwarding their treasury assessments to the Parish Council.

Bob Bagdasarian made a motion that when a church organization submits their year-end report that a check should be stapled to their report so that it is all handled at one time. Naz Yessayan seconded the motion. The motion was carried. Thelma suggested that at the end of the year when reminders are sent to organizations about their reports being due, that at that time there could be an additional reminder of the need to submit their assessment when their treasury reports are submitted.

Jay amended the motion adding "...when the year-end reminders go out to the various organization treasurers, to state that they need to include their assessment with their reports to the Parish Council." Jack Hacherian seconded the amendment. The amended motion was passed.

ELECTION RESULTS (Continued)

that rules and regulations are already in place to resolve problems. Jay added that the Parish Council is always open for comments and suggestions. Also, that Father Simeon, from experience, is open to any concerns that anyone has. Jay commended the Parish Council and Father Simeon for the time and love they have for the church.

Ara Bagdasarian thanked Jack Hacherian for the work he did as Diocesan Delegate saying that he, as the newly elected Delegate, would call upon him for guidance and words of wisdom.

Ara thanked the following who put behind us the "misappropriation of funds" issue and restored credibility to the office of Treasurer, and to the church by accounting for every penny: Naz Yessayan, Cindy Russell, and Jay Bagdasarah. He thanked Father Simeon and Dr. Sebouh Setrakian for aiding and allowing the community to put those happenings behind us. Ara also commended the Parishioners who bounced back from the depth of concern, restoring credibility. Jay Bagdasarian also noted Archi Andonian's key role in this regard.

Jay requested the membership to again read Father Simeon's message which encompasses and reinforces many of the ideas and goals presented.

Concluding Discussion

Dick requested to know the consensus of the assembly regarding a ''Grievance Committee''. The response from many members was an audible agreement saying 'do it'. Dick said he would take care of it by forming a small group. He added that he will keep the Parish Council advised of their activities.

Alice Hacherian commended Jay Bagdasarian on his fine handling of the meeting and Anna Karayan who served as Secretary of the Day.

Jay said that Father Simeon made an administrative point, showing Jay last year's meeting notes that we voted to mail the minutes to all dues-paying members within 30 days rather than waiting until the next annual meeting. He asked whether the membership would want to revert back to historical methods of handling the minutes? Anita Arpajian made a motion to remain the coint of what was decided between horses it helped everyone to in the spirit of what was decided last year because it helped everyone-to mail the minutes to dues-paying members within 30 days of the Annual Assembly Meeting. Mona Karoglanian seconded the motion. The motion was passed.

ADJOURNMENT AND CLOSING PRAYER

Mona Karoglanian moved to adjourn the meeting. Grace Arslanian seconded the motion.

Prior to adjournment, Grace asked that the out-going Parish Council Members be commended and recognized. Jay again expressed appreciation to the Bob Bagdasarian, Mona Karoglanian and Naz Yessayan.

Father Simeon closed the meeting with a prayer. The meeting was adjourned at 3:15 P.M.

Day to Day Activities

Besides keeping daily office hours, I ministered to the sick and elderly. I visited and blessed the work places and the homes of parishioners. I held meetings for those preparing for baptism and marriage. Although I have specific office hours, I always encourage parishioners to call at anytime according to their needs.

Parish Life and Special Events

I have attended and presided over meetings and programs of the various organizations of our Church to the best of my ability and as my schedule allowed. I am especially thankful to the executive bodies of the various organizations for their successful programming throughout the year. The work of Louise Demirjian (spring) and Lisa Richardson (fall) and the church school staff is to be commended for their dedication and love for the Christian edification of our children.

On November 20, I received two high level employees of the Central Bank of Armenia, Edward Sandoyan and Babik Najarian, at our church complex.

I presided over a special parish meeting in review of the current financial situation on December 14.

Diocesan Events

I represented our Church at: the Annual Clergy Conference and 95th Diocesan Assembly hosted by our own parish - April 28 - May 4; the ACYOA Annual Assembly & Sports Weekend in Washington, DC - May 23 - 25; MidWest Regional Assembly (with Sebouh Setrakian) in Chicago, II - October 4.

Mission Parishes

Under the direction of His Eminence the Primate, I conducted divine liturgies, baptisms, grave and home blessings for the mission communities of Columbus - April 5, July 18 &19, September 20, October 25, November 22; and Erie - February 22, May 17, September 27, November 1, December 13. I am thankful to Anna Karayan for her assistance in establishing a church school in Columbus and to Sam & Sue Mirakian, who help with the Erie Mission's Choir, Armenian School and Youth Group.

Ecumenical Activities

I took part in an interfaith seminar and ecumenical service on January 21 at St. Joseph Christian Life Center.

I concelebrated Divine Liturgy at St. Mark Coptic Church on April 26 (Julian Calendar Easter).

I arranged for a meeting with Bishop Anthony Pilla, R.C. Bishop of Cleveland and Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate of the Armenian Diocese, on April 30.

Dn. Michael Findikyan and I represented our church at the Celebration of the 150th Anniversary of the Catholic Diocese of Cleveland on August 17.

I continued to bring my active participation to the organizing group of the Eastern Christian Celebrations and Traditions Seminar. In 1997 we sponsored the annual seminar on Catholic, Orthodox and Oriental Orthodox relations at Notre Dame College - October 10 & 11. Among the guest lecturers was our diocesan chancellor, Fr. Garabed Kochakian. I enjoyed the honor of moderating the October 11 session.

Goris Church School Fund

This fund was instituted at my ordination on December 1, 1996. Half of monetary gifts received on the occasion of my ordination would be placed into a fund to assist the church school in Goris, Armenia, while the other half would defray costs incurred for the ordination festivities. In June, I personally administered \$3880 of the funds collected. Through generous gifts given during house blessings the balance in this fund has grown to the present balance of \$2423.31. Sometime during the summer of 1998 additional funds will be forwarded to Goris.

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S REPORT

Nineteen ninety seven was another exciting year for our Parish. We have hosted the 95th Annual Diocesan Assembly in Cleveland. This was a premier event for our Community and a big honor for our Parish. The delegation was led by His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate of the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of America. The assembly was a great success. All the delegates were extremely pleased and impressed by the high quality organization, and warm hospitality. Moreover, this event brought to our Parish the much needed additional income. In fact, this was the highest income our Church has achieved from a single event in recent years.

In February, we had the privilege to host Dean Shahinian and Reverend Father Garabed Kochakian as moderators for a special program on "How can St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church meet the spiritual and cultural needs of our changing community?" In April, the entire Armenian Community of Cleveland came together to celebrate the 82nd Martyr's day commemoration. After a long winter, we enjoyed a very nice, good spirited picnic where over 300 Armenians enjoyed a day of great food, fun and fellowship. It was a big family reunion. Indeed, Arek and Sona Torossian and their committee did a superb job organizing it. In August, Mary Arslanian headed with all her enthusiasm the 13th annual rummage sale. It was the biggest success ever with over \$2,000 income. Thank you Mary. In October, the Ladies Auxiliary along with the Parish Council organized a very interesting cultural day with Reverend Father Garabed Kochakian, Chancellor of our Dioceses, who spoke on the artistic heritage of the Armenian Church. The Sunday School continues to be vibrant thanks to very dedicated superintendent: Lisa Richardson, dedicated teachers and enthusiastic children.

We continued the face-lifting of St. Gregory of Narek Church compound with the addition of a new roof for the Parish House and a partial new roof for the Parish Hall. Carpeting and parquet dance floor were added in the Parish Hall.

I would like to express my sincere gratitude to "Hayr" Simeon for his spiritual leadership, his continuous and relentless work, encouragement and support. I would like to thank all members of the Parish Council and their families for their dedication to our Church. Indeed, the task of this elected body is very heavy. The Pastor and Parish Council are entrusted with the difficult mission in keeping a parish vibrant, viable and enriched with our religious and cultural traditions, as well as financially stable. I would like also to thank every parishioner who helped us during the year in different capacities. Without their presence and help, the Parish Council alone could not have accomplished all the tasks. I would like particularly to thank Cindy Russell for her outstanding and meticulous work by keeping our accounting in order and up-to-date. I would like to thank George Sakian for the tremendous effort in assuring the much needed income from the hall rental. I would like to thank Mona Karoghlanian for heading the difficult task of organizing the Diocesan Assembly. Also, I would like to thank Dick Aurslanian for his continuous help and advice. 1997 DIOCESAN DELEGATE REPORT

Our parish had the great honor, and did an outstanding job of hosting the 95th Annual Diocesan Assembly from May 1-4, 1997. Delegates and guests stayed at Cleveland's two premiere hotels: The Ritz Carlton and The Renaissance. All diocesan plenary sessions and panel discussions were conducted at The Renaissance Hotel.

The Assembly was presided over by His Eminence Archbishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate. Dr. Garo Garibian of Cheltenham, PA and chaired the Assembly with Arthur Mardigian of Detroit serving as Vice-Chairman. St. Gregory of Narek was represented by Father Simeon Odabashian attending his first assembly as an ordained priest along with Dr. Sebough Setrakian (parish council chairman) and Ara Bagdasarian (delegate). There were 136 delegates in attendance.

The theme of the assembly as well as the year 1997 was Mission and Outreach. This theme was carried through to the various panel/discussion groups that were conducted throughout the second day of the Assembly. The panel meetings designed by each of the departments were designed to inform the delegates and encourage feedback to improve effectiveness in serving the parishes of our diocese. Panels were conducted by: 1. Dept. of Religious Education; 2. Dept. of Youth Ministry; 3. Christian Mission and Outreach; 4. Armenian Language Lab and Resource Center; and 5. Diocesan Finances, Budget and Administration.

The work of the mission department headed by Father Nerses Jebejian was highlighted throughout the weekend. There are now 18 mission parishes and communities. To further support this effort, the Cleveland delegate made a motion to allocate \$20,000 in the diocesan budget for mission programs in 1997 which was approved by the assembly.

This year's assembly marked an encouraging shift in demographics as many younger professionals assumed new roles as delegates and took their places among the veterans.

The Primate recognized, gave his blessing and congratulations to Father Simeon on his recent ordination into the priesthood. The Primate's message to the assembly focused on three upcoming milestones and we as a diocese must prepare to commemorate and use these events as opportunities for enrichment and renewal: The Centennial of the Diocese (1998), the anniversary of the birth of Christ (2000), and the 1700th anniversary of the conversion of Armenia to Christianity (2001). He presented the "Primate's Plan" as a model of preparation for the upcoming century, planning the focus and goals for the next four years: Faith in 1998, focusing on Christ and the Holy Gospel, Hope in 1999, focusing on the Holy Spirit, worship and sacraments; Love in 2000, with a focus on God the Father, charity and service; and Baptism in 2001, stressing Christ, Etchmiadzin and a renewed church.

The following individuals were elected to the Diocesan Council: Father Aved Terzian, Father Dajad Davidian, John Amboian, Oscar Tatosian, George Papelian, and George Chakoian.

After receiving the Diocesan Unity Report, the Assembly was courageously presented with a dissenting Minority Report by Father Dajad Davidian. The assembly supported the Minority Report and voted to move the Unity process along by holding three regional seminar/meetings where delegates from both the Diocese and the Prelacy would review the proposed bylaws for a unified church.

95th Diocesan Assembly

The 95th Diocesan Assembly and Annual Clergy Conference was hosted by St. Gregory of Narek Armenian Church April 28 through May 4, 1997 in Cleveland, Ohio. The weeklong assemblage by all accounts was heralded an overwhelming success on all accounts by the 200 clergy, Diocesan Delegates, Women's Guild Delegates and guests.
