SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 4, 1990

On Sunday, February 4, 1990, following Soorp Badarak and after serving a light luncheon, the annual parish meeting was convened at Hovanessian Cultural Hall, presided by Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian, pastor. The meeting was called to order at 1:00 P.M., immediately after the Invocation pronounced by the pastor, the quorum was established by the roll call and the verification of the members. Forty seven (47) members were present out of a total membership of ninety one (91).

The meeting was proceeded according to the agenda with some minor rearrangements. The booklet containing the meeting notice, agenda and the annual reports of Church organizations was previsouly sent to the parishioners by mail or distributed by hand.

- (1) Election of Chairman and Secretary
 Chairman Greg Srabian
 Secretary Sonia Harlan
- (2) Ballot Committee: Garbis Meguerian recommended that the Nominating Committee be accepted as the Ballot Committee. Members of that Committee are Sark Boyajian, Virginia Bogosian, Elizabeth Gederian and Martin Randall.
- (3) Parlimentarian: Kachig Bogosian was appointed as Parlimentarian.
- (4) Approval of last year's Annual Parish Assembly. A motion was made by Dr. Raffy Hovanessian to accept the minutes of the prior Annual Parish Assembly (1988) which was accepted with minor changes.

The assembly proceeded with the discussion of annual reports.

- A. Pastor's Report unanimously approved, with a special appreciation for a job well done.
- B. Parish Council Report was similarly unanimously approved with appreciation
- C. Women's Guild Report unanimously accepted. A contribution of \$12,000 was transferred to the Church treasury.
- D. Sunday School Report no treasurer's report was submitted, but when asked, it was stated that \$600 is in the account. The changes in the Sunday School schedule was clarified by June Randall, Superintendent. Chairman requested a formal report regarding the new schedule, as well as a treasurer's report to be submitted within two weeks.
- E. Choir Report Vicky Hovanessian observed that the Choir needs more practice. Furthermore, it was observed that the Choir needs organizational structure. Sonya Doumanian accepted responsibility of notifying choir members of practices and meetings. Report was unanimously accepted.
- F. ACYOA Report unanimously accepted
- G. "Ani" Newsletter Report Rosy Yeretsian thanked the "designer" of the new cover and commented on the excellence of the newsletter. Report was unanimously accepted.
- H. Senior Citizen's Report unanimously accepted. Nazar Halajian presented a \$1,200 to the Church.
- I. Auditor's Report Andy Sahagian, a member of the Auditing Committee reported that his committee observed everything to be in order.
- J. Budget The Budget was introducted by Garbis Meguerian, Chairman of Parish Council. After a lengthy discussion, a budget of \$90,523 was unanimously accepted. This represented a deficit budget with anticipated revenues of \$84,000.
 - 1. Srabian Altar Fund total of \$29,531 in the account. This is a separate account according to the proposition which was accepted at last year's Parish Assembly meeting.
 - 2. Pledging It was suggested to change the name of "Priestly Pledge" to "Religious Gift".
 - 3. Volunteer Work Keg Giragosian suggested volunteer lawn care in order to save money. He was asked to oversee the project. Virginia Bogosian suggested that the Parish Council have one member to coordinate volunteer help.
- K. Diocesan Delegate Report Dr. Raffy Hovanessian, our Diocesan delegate, had already given a full report during a special Parish Assembly meeting concerning the 87th Annual Diocesan Assembly. His report was unanimously accepted.
 - 1. Amendments to the By-laws Any Diocesan amendments to the By-Laws should be sent in by march 2, 1990.
 - 2. Unification Committee This committee was instructed to draw its By-Laws by February 24, 1990. It was also decided that April 24, 1990 commemorative events be done jointly as it is now being done on Diocesan, as well as

- on regional levels. The 75th anniversary of the Armenian Genocide will be commemorated jointly with all churches and segments in the Chicago area during the week of April 24, 1990.
- Earthquake Relief Fund Considering the lack of an accounting report from the Diocese, it was decided that we make a formal request to the Diocese asking for an accounting report on a quarterly basis. Accordingly, it was moved (motion made by Virginia Bogosian) that delegate Dr. Raffy Hovanessian be entrusted with the authority to ask for this accouting at the Diocese Assembly in May. It was also moved (motion made by Vicki Hovanessian) that prior to that date, a letter be sent to the Primate asking for clarification as to why our parish has not received any communication from his office regarding this Fund. In a related motion (made by Keg Giragosian), it was decided that any communication about the Earthquake Fund be included in the Parish annual report from now on, as well as the Diocesan Delegate's report.

NEW BUSINESS

- A. Pioneer Project Sonia Harlen reminded the old-timers, as well as the Armenians raised in our former parish of West Pullman that the Geneological Society in South Suburban Chicago wopuld like to conduct interviews with them for historical posterity and all those with such intention may contact her.
- B. Plaque Program Kachie Bogosian reintroduced the Plague Program started some years ago, as an alternate source of income for the Church. Parish Council will take this matter under advisement.
- C. New Altar and Sanctuary Paintings Greg Srabian explained his vision of a new altar and sanctuary paintings which he and his family are willing to finance. In order to give an idea about the sanctuary paintings, he then exhibited three samples, which were commissioned with the knowledge of Parish Council to Mr. Arman Moumjian, the artist who rendered the altar paintings at St. David Armenian Apostolic Church in Boca Raton, Florida. Rather lengthy discussions resulted. The decision was postponed until the newly elected Parish Council, or if need be, another Parish Assembly on the subject, would come up with a resulution, which can be presented to Greg Srabian and his family for consideration.

ADJOURNMENT.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:45 P.M. With the pronouncement of Benediction by the Pastor and community singing of "Hayr Mer", the Annual Assembly was officially ended.

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 1990

Submitted to the Parish Assembly of Sts. Joachim & Anne Armenian Apostolic Church Palos Heights, Illinois Sunday, February 10, 1991

Dear Parishioners:

With the grace of God, we completed another year. With the close of 1990, I've concluded my second year of service to this parish as Pastor of Sts. Joachim & Anne Armenian Church in Palos Heights, Illinois.

I deem it as my distinct privilege to serve this community and I rejoice upon the completion of the second year of my pastorate with considerable progress in many phases of Church operations. I'm grateful to God for giving me this chance to serve Him through serving His people and His Church in this remote corner of our Diocese which is a living part of the ancient Holy Armenian Apostolic church, established by His Only-Begotten Son and our Lord Jesus Christ.

Herewith I submit for your review, in a panoramic way, my pastoral activities and varied accomplishments of our parish, realized during the course of the year.

A pastor's life is a varied one in which he serves simultaneously as priest, preacher and spiritual leader; His work includes that of being administrator, teacher, counselor and a spiritual Father who tries to bring God's love to the people through the sacraments, rites, worship, homily and in general through pastoral work.

As many activities and projects and programs occupy the pastor's time, so it is true of the Church's life. The nature of a pastor's work is such that he is almost involved in every phase of the parish life and it is hard to see him detached from the overall operation of the parish.

Nevertheless, pastor's work can be viewed summarily through certain categories which I've outlined below.

CHURCH SERVICES

Holy Badarak celebrated and Church services conducted every Sunday with the only exceptions when pastor's duties took him out-of-town and also during his annual vacation which are necessary and normal exceptions in any given parish life.

During the Church year, besides the regular Sunday services, all major feast days and seasons were observed with proper ceremonies according to the requirements of our liturgical traditions.

Holy Theophany (Armenian Christmas) was observed with the ceremony of the Consecration of Holy Water (Tchurorhnek). This year's Godfather of the Lord's Baptismal Cross was John Doumanian, son of Dr. & Mrs. Heratch Doumanian.

Other liturgical ceremonies performed: Lenten period with "Closed Badarak" and Sunrise Service (Arevakal) and Vigil services on Lenten Friday evenings, Palm Sunday with "Opening of Gates" ceremony (Turunpatzek), Holy Week observances with "Washing of Feet" ceremony (Vodnaluva) on Maundy Thursday and the office of "Burial of our Lord" (Taghoum) on Good Friday and glorious Easter celebrations; Feast of the Assumption of Virgin Mary with the traditional ceremony of "Blessing of Grapes" (Khaghogorhnek) in August; Feast of Elevation of Holy Cross (Khatchveratz) with "Processional Antasdan" (Blessing of the four corners of the World) in September. In addition, other ceremonies and services were conducted throughout the Church year, such as "Litany for Pontiff" (Hayrabedagan Maghtank), as our canonical traditions demanded. Also, Theophany Eve and Easter Eve were celebrated with candlelight Badarak (Jurakalouytz) with appropriate traditional observance (Yeritz Mangantz). Christmas caroling on Sunday preceding December 25th and Christmas Eve (December 24th night) Candlelight service in English were performed:

The Second Anniversary (December 7, 1988) of the devastating earthquake in Armenia was observed with a solemn Badarak and special Hokahankist on December 9th. On this occasion, the Church bells tolled in memory of the victims and the sermon was dedicated to the unfortunate victims and to the somber anniversary of this disaster.

Sermons were delivered every Sunday both in Armenian and English, taking into consideration a segment of our parishioners whose language is limited to English only. Our worship hours in general is 10:00-12:00, that is two hours every Sunday. It is merely a meager two hours in a weeks time. It is needless to say, our Church attendance needs to be improved. How I desire to see the Church filled with worshippers. Our Soorp Badarak is inspiring and uplifting. It is sheer joy to attend Church and participate in Badarak and then to have Christian fellowship in our hall. It is incomprehensible to me how some people can deny themselves the spiritual joy generated from our ancient Church ceremonies. It takes, I guess, for us to develope a habit for it and be sensitive to our innate need of spirituality with our participation in sacramental life. We have a beautiful Church, let us enjoy it.

ENGAGEMENT

PASTORAL CALLS AND VISITATIONS

Pastor made sick calls at hospitals, as soon as he was made aware of the hospitalization of parishioners. Homes were visited throughout the year on special occasions. Every invitation extended to the pastor was met with willing response on the part of the Pastor.

Pastor feels that home visitations are important to maintain contact with parishioners on individual family basis. Once a year each family should be visited in our parish by the Pastor and families should facilitate this with their willing cooperation.

PASTOR AND PARISH COUNCIL

The administration of the our parish is governed effectively by the Pastor and Parish Council. The day-to-day affairs of the parish was maintained by the Pastor with secretarial help.

Parish Council consisted of highly dedicated members who conscientiously attended to their duties under the competent chairmanship of Dr. Garbis Meguerian. The Parish Council mainly supervized the financial matters of the parish by raising funds, appropriating budget and keeping the Church grounds and building in good shape.

We are fortunate for the high caliber of our Parish Council whose members for the most time served the parish by contributing their pariticular expertise, saving the Church considerable amounts.

ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

Our Annual Parish Assembly convened February 4, 1990 to review the acitivites of 1989. The mid-year Parish Assembly met on June 24th. Dr. Raffy Hovanessian, our Church Delegate, presented a comprehensive report of the Diocesan Annual Assembly, held May 3-6, 1990 in Worcester, Massachusetts, Hosted by Holy Saviour Armenian Church. Dr. Garbis Meguerian gave his views concerning the Diocesan Assembly in the capacity of Parish Council Chairman. The Parish Priest gave his report concerning the Clergy Conference, held preceding the Diocesan Assembly, on April 30-May 3, 1990 at Calvary Retreat Center, Shrewsbury, Massachusetts.

WOMEN'S GUILD

The importance of our Women's Guild cannot be overestimated. This is one organization which is the backbone of our Church and the right arm of the Parish Council in the sense that their theatre of activities is the kitchen and they are indespensible in this area. Their main money-making affair is the Bazaar for which the members and other parishioners worked many months with great effectiveness. The Guild is led under the dynamic leadership of a hard-working team, co-chaired by Alice Boyajian and Isabelle Gederian.

The Guild is expected to extend its activities beyond the confines of the kitchen with more social and cultural or educational activities.

CHOIR

Our Choir is small but high in quality. We are fortunate for the fine voices of the members.

Our Choir-master is Susan Mardoian, assisted by, in her absence, Greg Srabian. Martha Auer is our organist and in her absence, our Choir-master plays the organ or Genevieve Semerdjian is drafted from the Sunday School to accompany the Choir.

Our Deacons are Nazar Halajian and Dr. Norayr Madanyan. Those who also serve on the altar are Shunt and Onnig Madanyan, brothers and John and Leo Doumanian, brothers.

Guest Deacons from St. James, Evanston, who come to assist us on urgent occasions are Senior Deacons, Krikor Goshgarian, Krikor Mirijanian and Dikran Kelekian, as well as acting Deacon John Hovsepian. Dikran Kelekian and John Hovsepian always are accompanied by their wives who sing in the Choir with their wonderful voices.

It would be a major accomplishment if only we succeed to hold rehearsels before each major feast day or prior to the changes of liturgical seasons.

<u>ACYOA</u>

Our ACYOA membership consists of young people of ages under 18, and as such they constitute only the ACYOA, Juniors. Our wish is naturally to have organized ACYOA, Seniors, if it is at all possible.

Under reorganization of ACYOA, Jrs., three young mothers came forward and assumed the position of Advisors, and we owe a great deal of gratitude to these young mothers, Irene Arakelian, Violet Bargamian ad Debbie Simonian.

Our ACYOA, Jrs. are commendable for their successful Annual Palm Sunday Bake Sale and a Dance, as well as for their participation in a Walk-a-Thon (Hunger Walk). The visit of the Detroit ACYOA, Jrs. on July 15th weekend, coincided with our Annual Church picnic and was a memorable event for our ACYOA, Jrs., who are expected to reciprocate their visit one day.

SUNDAY SCHOOL

We are happy for our Sunday School which is flourishing under a fine teaching staff. The new Superintendent is Yeretsgin Rosalie Papazian, with Assistant Superintendent, Dick Atkian. Their Annual Christmas Dinner/Program is very popular and well attended. New projects are underway. The participating of the Senior class members in the Interpretation of the Ceremony of the Baptism of Christ on Armenian Christmas was well received. The first Sunday of each month, during the school year, is designated as Holy Communion Sunday and the sermon of the day is addressed to them.

The program of "Breakfast with Der Hayr" continued this school year with the help of parents. Our Sunday School is indeed our joy and pride and we look forward for steady progress.

Martin Randall, Jr. received the Diocesan St. Gregory Award for Cub Scouts. So far, he is the only one in our parish who has received this award.

SENIOR CITIZENS

Our Senior Citizens are thriving with their monthly kheyma luncheon and games. We are indebted to Alice Boyajian who prepares very graciously these monthly luncheons and feeds an ever-growing number of elderly people and guests who are not necessarily elderly.

ANI NEWSLETTER

ANI is our Parish Newsletter. With great care, it is prepared and published bi-monthly and mailed to a large number of addresses. The Editorial Staff is comprised of Pastor, Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian as Editor; Lorene Skinner, Co-Editor; Annette Sultanian, Computer Specialist; and Sona Diorio, Proofreader. Pastor in his capacity as Editor, could not ask more capable and dedicated staff as his co-workers, who with joint effort produce a first class parish paper which will be a treasure-house of history of our community. Noticeably, the cover of ANI was redesigned by Lynn (Simonian) Capen, to whom we express our thanks.

Along with the Parish Newsletter, also prepared were weekly Sunday Bulletins and Special Bulletins on Christmas and Easter, as well as occasional flyers.

COMMEMORATION OF THE 75TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE ARMENIAN GENOCIDE

Certainly the most memorable and eventful occurance of the year was the United Commemoration of the 75th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide with a series of events held April 20-24, 1990. For the first time in recent history, all the Armenians, through their Churches, political parties and/or charitable organizations were united. Our Church was involved in all phases of this unprecended historic Commemoration. It is worth mentioning that one of the meetings of the 60-member United Committee, representing 18 organizations including Churches, was held in our Church premises, hosted by our Church.

GUEST CLERGY

We were fortunate in having guest clergymen in our parish who celebrated Soorp Badarak and delivered the sermon in our Church. The guest clergymen were:

LECTURES AND EDUCATIONAL ENDEAVORS

Yeretsgin Rosalie Papazian led Bible Study for a group of women in our parish on several occasions during Lenten evenings. Again, Yeretsgin spoke on the significance of Vartanatz Movement, after Church services in the Church on Carnival Sunday (Poon Berekantan, February 25th).

Professor Apraham Terian gave a lecture to our community on the "International Interest in the Armenian Bible" on December 16th.

Pastor tried to make available Adult Bible Study and Armenian Language Classes under a program entitled "Faith and Language", however a coordinator is needed in this respect to make the program workable.

HAYGIAN ARMENIAN SCHOOL

Pastor continued his weekly Armenian classes for young students in Munster and Merrillville, Indiana. He also recently launched Armenian classes for adults in another location in Munster.

Pastor tried to make available Armenian language for children at our Church premises, however, it seems that a coordinator is needed in this respect to get such a program underway.

COMMUNITY AFFAIRS

Pastor made it his business to attend religious, educational, social, testimonial and commemorative events and banquets in the greater Chicago area. Likewise, he attended, by invitation, graduation, weddings anniversaries and birthday parties. Pastor also took part in seminars, workshops, symposiums and lectures, whenever it was available.

Certainly, the most elegant affair of the year was the AGBU Debutantes Presentation Ball, which was the Ninth Biennial at the magnificant Grand Ballroom of the Hilton Towers on November 24th. We were delighted that some of the participants were from our parish, as well as those who were in leading positions.

WAUKEGAN MISSION

Pastor visited St. George, Waukegan, twice during the year (July 22nd and October 14th), out of the four visits assigned to him.

OUT-OF-TOWN ENGAGEMENTS

Pastor attended the Annual Clergy Conference and Diocesan Assembly, Worcester, Massachusetts (April 30th-May 6th). He attended, with Yeretsgin, the ACYOA General Assembly and Sports Weekend in Cleveland, Ohio (August 29th-September 3rd).

Pastor also attended, as sole representative of the Midwest region, the "Hrashapar Service" in honor of our newly-elected Diocesan Primate Bishop Khajag Barsamian on the occasion of his consecration as Bishop on his return from Holy See of Etchmiadzin, at St. Vartan Cathedral and Diocesan Center in New York City (October 12th).

MORRAINE VALLEY CLERGY ASSOCIATION

Pastor continued his membership in this Clergy Association with monthly luncheons, meetings and lectures. On one occasion, Pastor spoke to the clergy on Armenian Lenten traditions (February 25th). Pastor also participated in TRE-ORE Service on Good Friday, under the auspices of Clergy Association giving one of seven meditations at Peace Memorial Church, Palos Park (April 13th).

REPORT OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

1990

INTRODUCTION

The newly elected and in-office members of the Parish Council met on February 7, 1990 to elect officers and thereafter met at least once a month to plan, organize and oversee the various projects and activities of the Church. The 1990 Parish Council consisted of:

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 1. The activities of the Parish Council continued to be run mainly through 3 Committees: Membership (Anahid Pridjian Chairlady); Finance: (Doumanian Chairman); Buildings and Grounds (Karneg Boyajian Chairman). Also, to better inform the Parish Council of the plans and activities of subordinate organizations, the following Liaisons were appointed: Pridjian Women's Guild; Martin Randall Sunday School; Fr. Diran Jr. ACYOA and NEWSLETTER; Van Giragosian Young Adults.
- 2. During 1990 the dues paying parish members numbered 90. Two new memberes joined the Church but 3 members effectively resigned because of moving out of the area and/or financial difficulties. Of the 90 members 18 members had not paid their 1990 dues by December 31, 1990 inspite of the quarterly statements sent to all members reminding of their obligations.
- 3. Religious gifts in 1990 were again less than previous years: \$19,314 vs \$20,460 in 1989; \$21,905 in 1988; \$24,525 in 1987; and \$27,385 in 1986. If the rate of decrease continues, in a few years our church will be subject to financial difficulties.
- 4. "The Husband and Wife Sunday Greeters" continued in 1990 on special occasions.
- 5. The Newsletter, ANI, was issued bimonthly on regular basis thanks to the tireless efforts of Laurene Skinner and our secretary, Anette Sultanian.
- 6. The sixth Annual Dinner-Dance of our Church was held at the Visual and

Performing Arts Center, Munster, Indiana, on February 17, 1990. The affair was very successful thanks to the efforts of the Committee chaired by Rosy Yeretsian. A profit of about \$4,700 was achieved. Special thanks to Rose Galovich who alone sold 2000 raffle tickets.

- 7. Our Church participated in the organization of the commemoration of the 75th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide which took place during April 20 to 24, 1990. Our representatives on the Commemoration committee included Raffy Hovanessian, Elizabeth Sahagian and Rosy Yeretsian. Elizabeth Sahagian continues to represent our Church on the permanent Committee.
- 8. On April 29, 1990, by a special service, one of the stained glass windows in the Choir area was dedicated to the memory of Dr. Robert Alcocer on the second anniversary of his untimely death. Dr Alcocer was a member of the Parish Council when he became ill and died at an early age.
- 9. At a Special Parish Assembly on June 24, 1990, Dr. Raffy Hovanessian, our delegate to the Diocesan Assembly, reported on the proceedings at the May Diocesan Assembly. During this Assembly Bishop Khajag Barsamian was elected Primate of North America.
- 10. Buildings and Grounds Committee took care of the necessary repairs to the buildings and equipments. Leaks in the flat roof of the Hovanessain Hall were repaired and the ceiling tiles were replaced or repainted; The walls of the Sanctuary were repainted and the stained glass windows were cleaned, among other activities.
- 11. An inscription in gold Armenian letters was placed above the altar. The inscription, wchic translates: "I advise you to love each other", was a gift from Mr. & Mrs. Bedros Gopoian.
- 12. The annual Church picnic was held on Sunday, July 15, 1990, on the church grounds. It was very successful and netted about \$5,500 thanks to the tireless efforts of the Picinic Committee headed by Mrs Sona Doumanian and to the support of our members and friends. We appreciate the help of Mr. Nick Cory who catered the shish kebab at cost.
- 13. The seventh Annual Anniversary Dinner celebrating the consecration of our Church took place on November 18, 1990. Siragan Kerkonian and Dzaghig Kelikian entertained us and Mrs Dorothy Kishibay, the artist. Anahid Pridjian prepared the Chicken dinner.
- 14. A donor's plaque was placed on the wall between the cry-room and the secratrys office displaying the names of members who have donated articles which could not carry individual plaques.

CONCLUSION

The Parish Council is gratified with the 1990 accomplishments which contributed to the effective running of church affairs. Hoever, these accomplishments could not have been achieved without the cooperations of Father Diran and the enthusiastic support of our parish members, which are greatly appreciated. Our special thanks go to the the members of the

various Council Committees and to the energetic members of our Women's Guild who devoted tireless efforts and time to make our lunches successful and contributed to the financial well being of our Church by organizing the rummage sale and the bazaar.
