# STS. JOACHIM & ANNE ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY Sunday, January 31, 1988

The meeting was calle to order at 12:50 p.m. by Garbis Meguerian, Chairman of the Parish Council. The roll call was taken, 47 members begin present, quarum was established.

The following members were elected officers of the assembly.

Chairman -- Dr. Heratch Doumanian

Secretary -- Sonya Doumanian

Garbis Meguerian entertained a motion to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last assembly. Virginia Boghosian moved to do so, Greg Serabian seconded. Motion carried. There being no corrections or alterations in the minutes, Virginia moved to accept the minutes as presented. Greg seconded. Motion carried.

Chairman Dr. Doumanian then proceeded with the discussion of the annual reports.

Treasurer's report - Revenues: Virginia Boghosian asked an explanation for:

- 1) The big difference between the actual dues collected in 1986 (\$18,500) and in 1987 (\$12,912). The \$18,500 figure included back dues from the previous year.
- 2) The difference between religious gifts collected in 1986 (\$32,505) in 1987 (\$19,630). The 1986 gifts included donations for 1987.

#### Expenses:

- 1) Under operating expenses "Contributions" include donations to Daniel Hairabedian (\$400) and to Rose Hairabedian (\$300); special plate collections for renovation of Sysian church in Armenian (\$200) and gifts of Bibles for newlyweds.
- 2) Under Building and Grounds, most of Repairs and Maintenance expenses were for the repairs of parking lot. The 1987 budget of \$7,500 includes contracts for snow removal, landscaping, etc.

# Garbis Meguerian announced that:

1) There are nine more windows of the church that are available for purchase, eight of which are priced at \$2,000 each, and one is priced at \$5,000;

- 2) 1992 will be the last year we collect payments for the old church;
- 3) Mrs. Lourian's Certificate of Deposits has been cashed; and
- 4) Women's Guild will be asked to transfer 80% of the monies collected during the year to Parish Council.

Andy Sahagian read the report of the Auditing committee (prepared by Martin Randall). Virginia moved to accept the report as read. Susan Mardoian seconded. Motion carried.

## New Business:

Raffy Hovanessian thought that our church needed to be vitalized by some new projects. One example he gave, was to help Armenians scattered all over Europe (10,000 in number), by sponsoring a family to come to the U.S.

Sarkis Boyajian stated that there is a lack of enthusiasm, motivation, concern and attendance. But, he said, we don't have to have a goal in order to revitalize the church increase attendance. We have worked very hard to get what we have today he added.

Garbis said that our average attendance has increased since the arrival of Der Hayr. However, our young adults are not coming to church. We have to encourage them to come to church and take active part in church affairs.

Garbis also explained the Kinsman plan. This is a means to keep track of our college students in different states all over the U.S. to bring them to the community and to church. The committee that will be the liaison for our church will be headed by Fr. Hairabedian with Rose Hairabedian and Susan Mardoian, as members.

Ara Yeretsian suggested that the Parish Council do some brain storming to determine internal goals and external goals.

Sona Diorio moved to form a committee representing each group of the church, for example, Women's Guild, Sunday School, etc. to sit down with the parish council and discuss possibilities. Raffy Hovanessian seconded. Motion carried.

The meeting was adjourned at 3:10 p.m.

# PASTORAL REPORT

(From January, 1988 to September, 1988)

Dear Parish Members,

I would like to welcome all of you to the annual Parish Assembly. I hope that you will have a fruitful and constructive meeting. Thanks be to God for the blessed time we enjoyed each other as the special family of Sts. Joachim and Anne Armenian Apostolic Church.

This is my 4th pastoral annual report, covering the first nine months of 1988. This report will touch upon the basic areas of my ministry without going into details.

## A - SUNDAY WORSHIP

Sunday is the day when the faithfuls come together to worship the Lord of our fathers. It is a privilege for us to share God's blessings during the Divine Liturgy. My desire has always been that we can internalize the inspiring experience of His presence in a very unique way.

I delivered two sermons on every Sunday, one in Armenian and one in English. On some Sundays I developed the same theme with two different approaches. I was always very pleased of your appreciative attitudes in sharing with me the Sunday messages.

It had been my plan to start the Divine Liturgy at 10:00 a.m. and end approximately around 12:00 noon. Sunday morning worship is a celebration. I always wanted to see the family unit together, sharing and enjoying the sacramental presence of our Lord from the beginning to end. Sunday morning worships require only 2 hours out of the 168 hours per week, and it is a beautiful and spiritually uplifting way to spend those 2 hours. My desire has always been to see the church family worshipping together as a whole.

#### C - PARISH COUNCIL

As the pastor and the president of the parish council, I always enjoyed serving our Lord and to the parish needs together with the parish council. The parish council, through the year, worked honestly and sincerely to meet the many needs of the parish. Each and every member of the council, deserves mine and our thanks and comments for their unselfish service under the careful and wise chairmanship of Dr. Garbis Meguerian.

To serve God and through Him to serve each other's needs is an honor and privilege. May we see many more members of the church come forward to do so for His great glory and the growth of the faith-community.

# D - MOMEN'S GRIFD

To preside over the Women's Guild meetings and to be the part of their plans and goals for the parish was another pleasant and encouraging experience for me.

The chairlady, Peggy Belcher, and the elected officers were always receptive of my pastoral fellowship and guidance. I had no problem to identify myself as their pastor and they made me feel needed.

Witnessing their many hours, week nights, and Saturdays of kneading, baking, and rolling dough, I believe strongly, that they should be provided with any needed help in order to facilitate their task in relation to bazaars and many orders of Armenian baked goods.

I would strongly encourage all the ladies of the parish to join the Women's Guild and take part in the growing needs of the church.

# E - ACYOA JRS

We had a fine group of teen-agers in our ACYOA JRS group who met and organized activities under the leadership of the dedicated advisors Anna Giragosian, Sam Arzumanian, Keg Giragosian and Fr. Yeghia Hairabedian as the Midwest Youth Coordinator. The ACYOA JRS Chairlady was Jennifer Winternheimer.

I have always been very much concerned with their spiritual, cultural and social needs, and to the best of my ability worked towards these goals. I encourage all the teen-agers of the parish to become members of the ACYOA JRS and take steps in the growth of our youth body.

# F - SUNDAY SCHOOL

As in the past, and this year too, the Sunday School superintendent, June Randall, along with the teaching staff, has done tremendous work.

Sunday School is one powerful extension of the church to reach our children for Christ. It will be a grave mistake to keep our children out of Sunday School and discourage the dedicated teachers who are willing to spend their comfort, time and energy for the sake of our children.

It is Jesus' command to lead our children to Him and Sunday School is one powerful channel for it.

I was very pleased at the response I received from Sunday School and deeply moved by their regular approach to Communion and attendance during my sermon time. Also, I would like to commend June Randall for her constant Christian approach and recognition of my position as the spiritual servant of the church, and sharing my guidance in her Sunday School hour.

# G - NEWSLETTER

As the editor of our church newsletter, I appreciated very much the valuable service of our typist Rose Hairabedian, with Sonia Dioro handling the labels and proofreading, and Lorene Skinner who took care of the sorting and bulk mailing. We always tried to complete every issue on time considering all the work involved. They honestly deserve all the credit our newsletter earned.

# H - VISITATIONS TO HOMES AND HOSPITALS

To the best of my knowledge I visited the patients of the parish in hospitals and in nursing homes.

It is Biblical to inform the pastors of any family members who are sick at home or in hospitals and ask for prayer. I have done my best to have pastoral routine visitations. These visitations gave me the chance to know you and help you to know me better as your pastor. I felt blessed to share your fellowship.

# I - BIBLE STUDY

On Thursdays from 7:30 p.m. to 8:40 p.m. we had Bible Study in English in my home.

Our Bible Studies were in a very friendly atmosphere. There was no pressure at all. The pressure was on me. I prepared myself spiritually and intellectually to share the topic or the study of the day. I related the scripture to the teaching of our church and to our personal needs.

The Bible study is one easy and fruitful way to discuss freely and share with each other all that God intends us to know, for the Bible is His Book for us.

# J - ARMENIAN SCHOOL

I regularly conducted Armenian Schools in Munster and Merrillville. A small group of boys and girls were willing to learn to read and write Armenian, and it was my duty to respond to their desire.

## K - YOUNG ADULTS

In order to continue the ACYOA SRS group, we needed some boys and girls 18 years old and up. Those who were in the Senior

group were for many years and their age was suitable more for a Young Adult Group, therefore, the former seniors decided to organize a Young Adults group of singles and married members.

Under the leadership of Fr. Yeghia Hairabedian, and a small concerned group, they participated in all aspects of the church functions, such as hosting a lenten dinner, taking part in the church picnic.

The main focus of the Young Adults Group was to work with the core group, the former seniors, together with the Youth Director, Fr. Yeghia Hairabedian, in order to organize activities, religious and social, until the interest and the need for such a group grows and forms an official body.

# L - NEW MEMBERS

Archbishop Torkom Manoogian ordained Fr. Yeghia in two services, Saturday, June 18 and Sunday June 19. On Sunday the 19th the church honored the new priest with a Banquet. It was truly a once in a lifetime experience for the church.

#### REPORT OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

#### 1988

#### INTRODUCTION

The newly elected and in-office members of the Parish Council met briefly on February 9, 1988, to elect officers and thereafter met at least once a month to plan, organize and oversee the various projects and activities of the Church. The 1988 Parish Council consisted of:

With the untimely and very sad death of Bob Alcocer in April Of 1988, Edma Dumanian, who had received the next highest votes during the last elections, was invited to join the Farish Council to complete Bob's term. Also, Liz Sahagian took over the duties of the recording secretary.

# PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 1. The activities of the Parish Council continued to be run mainly through 3 Committees: Membership (Susan Boyajian Chairlady); Finance: (Meguerian Chairman); Buildings and Grounds (Karneg Boyajian Chiarman). Also, to better inform the Parish Council of the plans and activities of subordinate organizations, the following Liaisons were appointed: Sahagian Women's Guild; Martin Randall Sunday School; Fr. Krikor Jr. ACYOA; Susan Mardoian Choir; Van Giragosian Young Adults.
- 2.The "Husband and Wife Sunday Greeters" continued in 1988 although not on regular basis.
- 3. The Parish Council adopted the recommendation of the Finance Committee to open a CMA account at Merrill Lynch and to transfer periodically part of the Church funds to this account which, at present, pays about 8% compared to 5.5% paid by the banks.
- 4. At the Diocesean Assembly in May of 1988 we proposed that the attendance of the clergy at the continuing education sessions organized by the Diocese be made obligatory and that parish councils should cover the expenses. The proposal was adopted by the Assembly.

- 5. In May the Parish Council learned that the Primate has directed Fr. Krikor Hairabedian and Fr. Yeghia Hairabedian (father and son) to serve the Holy Martyrs Church in Bayside, New York. Our efforts to keep Fr. Krikor at Sts Joachim & Anne were unsuccessful. Consequently, we were asked to present a list of possible candidates for replacement of Fr. Krikor. Whereupon the Primate agreed to make Fr. Diran Papazian available to our Church if Fr. Diran and the Parish Council could come to a mutual agreement. Arrangements for Fr. Diran's transfer from Holy Cross Church in New York to Sts Joachim & Anne Church took almost 5 months. During these months Fr. Diran visited Palos Heights 4 times: on August 23 for an interview with the Parish Council and representatives of other church organizations; and on October 16, November 20 and December 11 to celebrate Mass as visiting pastor. Fr. Diran's transfer to our Church was completed on January 7, 1989. Fr. Krikor's transfer from our Church became effective on October 10, 1988.
- 6. At a Special Parish Assembly on September 11 Dr. Raffy Hovanessian, our delegate to the Diocesan Assembly, reported on the actions of the May Diocesan Assembly and Garbis Meguerian presented the credentials of Fr. Diran and reported on the interview with Fr. Diran on August 23.
- 7. Our Parish had the honor to host the ordination of Daniel Hairabedian to priesthood. The ceremonies took place on June 18 and 19, 1988 at our Church. On Sunday, following the church service, Fr. Yeghia was honored with a Banquet at Giorgio's in Orkland Park.
- 8. Buildings and Grounds Committee took care of the necessary repairs to the buildings and equipment. The organ was repaired; the chandelier bulbs were cleaned and replaced as needed; sprinklers were repaired; plants and shrubs damaged by the dry weather were replaced; the sod around the trees in the picnic area was dug up and replaced by mulch.
- 9. The third annual dinner-dance was held at the Olympia Fields Country Club on February 13, 1988. It's theme again was "Puttin' On The Ritz". Because of various activities in the Armenian community of Chicago the attendance was short of our expectation. However, those in attendance had a very good time.
- 10. Our Church commemorated the 72nd Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide on Sunday, April 24, 1988, with Divine Liturgy and Madagh, and an appropriate program after lunch. Professor Abraham Terian was the guest speaker.
- 11. The annual Church picnic was held on Sunday, June 26, 1988, on the church grounds. It was very successful and netted about \$5,000 thanks to the tireless efforts of the Picinic Committee headed by Marty Randall and to the support of our members and friends.
- 12. Since the side altar paintings by Mr. Mark Akgulian were not acceptable to the Parish members and Mr. Akgulian was not willing to redo them, in the fall of 1987 the Parish Council commissioned Mrs. Dorothy Kishibay to paint three paintings: one for each side altar and another one for the candles niche. Mrs. Kishibay offerred to donate her labor to the Church and charge

us only for materials and for incidental expenses. In November of 1988 the Kishibays brought the paintings to Palos Heights. The beautiful paintings will be framed and displayed in the Church sometime in the Spring of 1989 and will be blessed by the Primate probably in early Summer.

- 13. The fifth Annual Anniversary Dinner celebrating the consecration of our Church took place on November 20, 1988. After Divine Liturgy celebrated by Fr. Diran and a lunch served by the Women's Guild, a very appropriate program was presented with Fr. Diran as the guest speaker.
- 14. On August 2, 1988, the Parish Council, in compliance with the resolution of the Parish Assembly of January 31, 1988, met with representatives of the subordinate organizations to determine the needs of our Church and to find solutions. The decreasing membership of the Women's Guild was identified as the major problem. To increase membership it was decided to broaden the objectives of the Guild to include cultural, educational and recreational activities.
- 15. Complying with the instructions of the Primate we began collecting money for the Diocesan Earthquake Fund beginning on December 11, 1988. By the end of 1988 we have collected and transmitted to the Diocese \$18382.

# CONCLUSION

The Parish Council is gratified with the 1988 accomplishments which contributed to the effective running of church affairs. Hoever, these accomplishments could not have been achieved without the cooperation of Father Krikor and the enthusiastic support of our parish members, which are greatly appreciated. Our special thanks go to the the members of the various Council Committees and to the energetic members of our Women's Guild who devoted tireless efforts and time to make our lunches successful and contributed to the financial well being of our Church by organizing the rummage sale and the bazaar.
