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ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY MINUTES FEBRUARY 10, 1991

- The annual parish assembly, as stipulated in the by-laws, convened in Hovanessian Cultural Hall. presided by Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian, Pastor.
- The meeting was called to order by Garbis Meguerian at 1:15 p.m. following invocation. A quorum of 42 members present, was verified by roll call.
- Sarkis Boyajian was elected to act as Chairman for the meeting, with Lottie Mikaelian, as Secretary. Gary Mazian was appointed by the Chairman to act as parlimentarian.
- For expediency, the Chairman suggested the Nominations and Balloting Committees, act as one committee. Mr. Meguerian moved to follow this procedure. Seconded by Sonia Harlan. Motion carried. Isabelle Gederian and Sarkis Boyajian acted in the name of the conbined committee.
- Chairman recommended we follow the agenda covering the annual reports of the various subordinating organizations, since they were presented to parishoners in advance of the meeting. And, unless there were questions or ammendments, we accept them as presented.
- At this point of the meeting. Dr. Hovanessian moved we accept the minutes of the February 4, 1990 meeting. A second by Greg Srabian. Motion carried.
- Lorene Skinner requested Der Hayr give us the exact literal translation of the Armenian Script above the sanctuary archway, so when asked, we quote correctly. Der Hayr did so, stating it translates: "A new commandment I give you. to love one another".
- While reviewing the Sunday School Report, Dr. Hovanessian moved that any Sunday School teacher, requesting to attend DRE Classes in New York, have expenses paid for by the Parish, as well as those of the Sunday School Superintendent attending the Diocesan Assembly. A second by Mr. Robert Auer. Motion carried. Acknowledgement was expressed for the \$1,429.00 the Sunday School turned over to the Parish Council.

Isabelle Gederian commended the Choir for it's "fantastic and terrific efforts".

- Araxie Samarjian called attention to the fact the Seniors' Organization contributed \$1,200.00 to the Council. Mr. Meguerian acknowledged their donation and commended their enthusiasm.
- It was noted ACYOA Jrs. remitted \$2,000.00 to the Parish Council. Mr. Meguerian accepted and thanked the members for their efforts.
- A round of applause was afforded the Women's Guild for their contribution of \$11,000.00 to the Parish Treasury.
- Dr. Hovanessian requested it be officially noted in the minutes to congratulate the newsletter staff for its efforts in producing the Number One Newsletter in the Chicago area. He also stated, other churches have been influenced by our letter and are commencing work on one of their own. Lorene Skinner graciously accepted accolades on behalf of the staff.
- In reviewing the Budget and Expenses, Mr. Meguerian, as chairman of the council, suggested Trustees take into consideration paying-off the mortgage balance of \$16,400.00 and to report to the mid-year council meeting on same.
- Dr. Hovanessian requested the line item of Delegate Expenses in the 1991 Budget be corrected to read "Delegates' Expenses" which incorporates the Chairman's expenses as well.
- Irene Merijohn moved to accept the 1991 Budget as presented. Mr. Sahagian seconded. Motion carried.
- Regarding the Diocesan Assembly, Dr. Hratch Doumanian asked whether there were any new disclosures on the progress of the Unity Committee. Dr. Hovanessian reported there were absolutely none. The Chair ruled further discussion be taken under New Business of the meeting.
- Mr. Auer moved, seconded by Mr. Srabian, the assembly accept and approve all reports as submitted. Motion carried.
- The next order of business was election for the office of trustee. Chairman related four trustees needed to be elected. Of the present trustees, the following accepted to run for office: Anahid Pridjian Karneg Boyajian and Van Giragosian.

Remaining in office: Hratch Doumanian - Greg Srabian - Gary Mazian - Martin Randall and Garbis Meguerian.

Nominated were: Sonia Harlan - Ara Yeretsian - Elizabeth Sahagian and Irene Merijohn.

Rosie Yeretsian moved nominations be closed. A second by Garbis Meguerian. Motion carried.

The following were elected to serve on the Parish Council for the ensuing year:

Anahid Pridjian - 38

Karneg Boyajian - 45

Van Giragosian - 40

Sonia Harlan - 43

Ara Yeretsian - 6 (to serve in the event one of the above cannot fullfill term)

Alice Boyajian informed the assembly, Anahid Pridjian is a new member of the Women's Guild, and as such will be the representative to the Council.

Dr. Hovanessian accepted nomination for the position of Diocesan Delegate and was elected to office by a popular vote of 42. Vickie Hovanessian to be alternate delegate.

New Business:

Chairman called on Mr. Srabian to report on the Altar Project. He reported meeting with the architect to finalize the design, which will then be submitted to a marble company. His understanding is, that five month's time will be needed to complete the marble work. At which time, it is hopeful, work will commence during the summer months.

Elizabeth Sahagian reported on the April 24th Genocide Committee, concerning joint services with other churches, as in the past year. She related 14 members at the meeting agreed to a joint service. However, the Diocese is disallowing such a joint service.

After general discussion, Karneg Boyajian moved to direct the assembly to request a letter be drafted and forwarded to the Arachnort requesting permission to participate with area churches in a joint service. Greg Srabian seconded. Motion carried. Karneg Boyajian was directed to prepare such a letter, to be signed by Sarkis Boyajian as Chairman of the Parish Assembly.

- Dr. Hovanessian requested the council consider paying a stipend to visiting deacons. After discussion and lack of motion, subject was dispensed with.
- Dr. Hovanessian moved the Council work up a proposal to be addressed to the Diocesan Assembly, requesting quarterly reports from the Unity Committee. Seconded by Mr. Auer. Motion carried.

Martha Auer suggested Mr. Meguerian approach the council with a proposal suggesting each parish member contribute a computed sum of money to afford paying the mortgage balance in full. Mr. Meguerian agreed to do so and stated a report on same would be made at the mid-year assembly.

Dr. Hovanessian commended Der Hayr, the Council and subordinating groups for a great job in fullfilling the budget and activities during 1990.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, Sona Doumanian moved to adjourn. A second by Lottie Mikaelian. Meeting closed 3: 50 p.m. Der Hayr concluded the assembly with a sharagan for Vartanantz and a popular Armenian song and benediction.

PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT 1991

Submitted to the Parish Assembly of Sts. Joachim & Anne Armenian Apostolic Church Palos Heights, Illinois Sunday, February 9, 1991

Dear Parishioners:

With the grace of God, we completed another year with worthy and noticeable accomplishments. With the close of 1991, I've concluded my third year as pastor of Sts. Joachim & Anne Armenian Church.

It is my privilege to submit, for your review, my pastoral activities and varied accomplishments during the course of the past year.

The nature of a pastor's work is such that he is almost involved in every phase of the parish life and it is hard to see him detached from the overall operation of the parish. He is priest, preacher and spiritual leader, simultaneously. His work encompasses the administration of the parish and the whole parish life in all its multiple phases. He brings God's love to people through sacerdotal and pastoral works, namely sacraments, rites, worship, Badarak, homily and entire range of pastoral activities, both in the Church and in the parish and in the community at large.

Pastor's Annual Report can be viewed in a panoramic way through certain categories, without being involved in detailed information, as it is outlined below.

1. ADMINISTRATIVE

Our Annual parish Assembly for 1990 convened on Sunday, February 10, 1991. New Parish Council, after ratification of the election by the Primate, took office with chairmanship of Dr. Garbis Meguerian.

The day-to-day affairs of the parish was maintained by the pastor. The Parish Council mainly supervized the financial matters, raising funds, apporpriating the budget and kept the Church ground and building in good shape.

Also, we had, as in the past, a Mid-year Parish Assembly, which met on May 26th, to receive the Diocesan Assembly reports.

The Diocesan Assembly was held in Teaneck, NJ, hosted by St. Thomas Armenian Church, May 9-11, 1991; the Clergy Conference preceded the Assembly in the same week, May 6-8, at Don Bosco Retreat Center, West Haverstraw (Rockland County), NY.

2. PASTORAL

Pastor discharged his pastoral duties conscientiously. He made sick calls at hospitals, when he was aware of the hospitalization of parishioners. Homes were visited on special occasions. Invitations were always welcommed by the pastor. It is important that parishioners should create opportunities once a year to welcome their pastor into their home, so that he can maintain contact with them and know them on individual family basis.

3. LITURGY

Soorp Badarak was celebrated, Church services conducted, sermons preached in Armenian and English every Sunday, with the exception of pastor's annual vacation and other out-of-town engagements.

All the major feast days were properly observed according to the requirements of our liturgical traditions. Armenian Christmas was observed on its canonical day (January 5-6) with Candlemas on the Eve of Theophany and with Solemn High Mass and "Blessing of Water" ceremony (Churorhnek) in commemoration of Lord's Baptism. Godfather of the Cross was Martin Randall, Jr., son of Martin & June (Semerdjian) Randall. For the first time in our Church, the ceremony was interpreted and narrated by Sunday School students intermittently with the ceremony. This was Yeretzgin Rosalie's innovation with her own preparation.

During Lenten period, on Sundays, Closed Badarak and "Sunrise Service" (Arevakal) were performed. On Wednesday evenings, "Vigil" service was performed. On Palm Sunday, "Opening of Gates" (Turunpatsek) was conducted. During Holy Week, the ceremonies of "Washing of Feet" on Maundy Thursday and "Burial and "Entombment of our Lord" (Taghoum) on Good Friday were conducted. Badarak was celebrated on Easter Eve. On Easter day, the glorious Easter celebrations were performed with ceremony of "Antasdan" (Blessing of Fields). On the Feast of the Assumption of Virgin Mary, in August, the traditional ceremony of "Blessing of Grapes" (Khaghoghornek) was performed and on the Feast of the Elevation of the Holy Cross (Khatchveratz), in September, the "Processional Antasdan" was performed.

In addition, other ceremonies and Church services, as well, were conducted throughout the year, as our canonical traditions demanded and special circumstances warranted.

American Christmas was observed both with caroling on Sunday preceding Christmas, December 22nd, after Badarak, and with Christmas Eve Service in English on December 24th. Jana Brotherhood volunteered to be our organist on Christmas Eve, as she did the previous year; we appreciate her willingness to avail herself at a time when our organists are unavailable to participate.

"Hokehankist" (Requiem Service) was performed after Badarak in fulfillment of occasional requests and also on Armenian Memorial days (Merelotz) and other special occasions, such as Armenian Martyrs Day and the third anniversary of the earthquake in Armenia.

5. CHURCH AUXILIARY ORGANIZATIONS

We have Women's Guild, Senior Citizens, Choir, Sunday School and ACYOA, Jrs.

A. WOMEN'S GUILD - The Guild is indispensable for our parish. Bazaar and Rummage Sale are their main money making affairs.

This year, the Guild was involved in several other activities with more social, cultural and educational character.

A leadership program was led by Yeretzgin Rosalie Papazian on January 8th.

The Guild participated in the University Women's Association program, providing Armenian ethnic food. A lecture was given by

Sonia Harlan on the distinctive character of the Armenian culture on January 10th. A Retreat, sponsored by the Women's Guild Central Council, was hosted by our Guild at St. Francis Retreat House, Oak Brook, on April 20th. Elizabeth Sahagian was District Leader and Yeretzgin Rosalie was Retreat Program Leader.

Armenian Women's Saints Day observance with three area sister churches, Sts. Joachim & Anne, St. James and St. Gregory the Illuminator was held in Chicago with a special Peace Service, having in mind the Gulf War, prepared by Der Diran on March 6th. A similar service was held for Wisconsin Armenian Church Guilds in Waukegan, with our Pastor as guest preacher, on March 16th. This year's Woman Saint was Sahaganoush, mother of St. Vartan the Brave. The area Armenian clergy participated in both services.

Our Women's Guild hosted a luncheon for the Moraine Valley

Clergy Association on April 18th.

For the second year, Twelve-Month Dinner was given in September. We are happy that it is gaining popularity.

The Guild is under the capable co-chairmanship of Isabelle Gederian and Alice Boyajian. The load of the work are on the shoulders of a few members who constitute the core of Women's Guild. Obviously, the Guild needs to be expanded with new members.

- B. SENIOR CITIZENS Their monthly "kheyma" luncheons are getting more popular all the time. It is a labor of love on the part of Alice Boyajian who graciously prepares these luncheons every month. Senior Citizens are even able to contribute yearly to the Parish Council towards the annual budget.
- C. CHOIR Our Choir is small but is of fine quality. Our Deacons are stole-bearers Nazar Halajian, Dr. Norayr Madanyan and John Hovsepian. Other Acolytes who serve the altar are Shunt and Onnig Madanyan, brothers, and John & Leo Doumanian, brothers.

From time to time, whenever pastor feels the need, on invitation, guest Deacons from Evanston, participate in our Liturgy. They are Deacons Krikor Goshgarian, Krikor Mirijanian and Dikran Kelekian. Dikran Kelekian is always accompanied by his wife, Zaghik, who sings in the Choir, greatly enhancing it with her powerful and beautiful voice. Dr. Susan Mardoian is our Choir Director and Martha Auer is the organist. Choir needs practices on a regular monthly basis.

D. SUNDAY SCHOOL - Sunday School operates on the academic years from September to June. New projects are underway. The Annual Christmas Dinner/Pageant on Armenian Christmas is very popular. The participation of the Senior Class members in the interpretation of the Ceremony of the "Blessing of Water" was well received. The first Sunday of every month was designated for reception of Holy Communion and the sermons were geared towards them. The program of "Breakfast with Der Hayr" was continued with the help of parents. As a new project, fruit baskets were distributed to our home-bounds.

The academic year of 1990-91 ended on June 2, 1991. The new academic year of 1991-92 began on September 15, 1991. On October 13th, we had a Staff Dedication ceremony in the Sanctuary.

Superintendent is Yeretzgin Rosalie Papazian and Assistant Superintendent is Dick Atkian. We have a fine teaching and support staff. The school needs the wholehearted cooperation of the parents.

E. ACYOA JRS. - Under ACYOA, Jrs. we include the young people of our parish under 18 years old who constitue ACYOA Jrs. We greatly appreciate the efforts of Violet Bargamian, Debbie Simonian and Irene Arakelian, who under a reorganization program, assumed the position of Advisors and reactivated the ACYOA.

The Annual Palm Sunday Bake Sale sponsored by ACYOA is always successful.

This year, Acting ACYOA Executive Secretary, Tony Barsamian, made a special trip to our Parish on March 27th in order to prepare the way for the ACYOA Mission Program to our parish, which was held April 12-14. A group of ACYOA members from St. George Armenian Church, Hartford, CT, spent a weekend in our parish. That Saturday, they conducted workshops and seminars for the benefit of our youth. The group joined our Choir on Sunday and sang the Badarak with their lovely voices. Anoush Khachoyan played the organ. All their expenses were paid by ACYOA Central Council. They came to stimulate the young adults in our parish.

Unfortunately, after the graduation of many members from High School and attending colleges, our small group of ACYOA, Jrs. shrank. Now ACYOA needs reorganization; we hope the new crop will arrive soon and once again ACYOA will be active.

6. "ANI" NEWSLETTER

"Ani" is our Parish Newsletter which is prepared with great care, bimonthly. The Editorial staff is under pastor's editorship, and is comprised by Lorene Skinner as co-editor, Annette Sultanian as computer specialist and Sona Diorio as proofreader. This is a terrific team; with joint effort they produce a very commandable parish paper which is indeed a treasure-house of history of our community.

Along with the Newsletter, also prepared are Sunday Bulletins, special bulletins for Christmas and Easter, as well as occasional flyers for important activities.

7. HAYGIAN ARMENIAN SCHOOL

Although Haygian Armenian School is not an integral part of our Church activities, nevertheless, to teach Armenian is a never-ending mission of any priest. The weekly Armenian classes for young students of our parish are continued in two locations in Indiana; Munster and Merrillville.

8. MAJOR ANNUAL PARISH EVENTS

- A. Christmas Dinner/Program on Armenian Christmas is a Sunday School affair.
- B. Mardi-Gras (Paregentan) Dinner/Dance at the Center for Visual and Performing Arts in Munster, Indiana, February 2nd. Rosy Yeretsian is the driving force behind it.
- C. Church Picnic at the Church grounds which is mostly the endeavor of Parish Council, on July 15th. Sonya Doumanian was actively involved in the last two picnics, insuring success.
- D. Rummage Sale this is mostly a Women's Guild affair, held May 4th.
- E. Twelve-Month Dinner a Women's Guild affair, held Sept. 29th.
 - F. Holiday Bazaar Women's Guild affair, held November 9th
- G. Anniversary Consecration this yearly observance with banquet/program is the responsibility of the Parish Council, November 17th.

In addition to the above major events, also mention should be made of our Lenten Suppers in conjunction with Lenten Vigil Services on Wednesday evenings during Lent. The lenten suppers are sponsored by various organizations or groups of our Church.

The first lenten supper was given by Women's Guild on February 20th. Sonia Harlan presented a lecture on the topic of "How to Present Ourselves to 'Odars'" (non-Armenians). The second lenten supper was given jointly by Sunday School and Choir on February 27th. The third lenten supper was sponsored by Parish Council on March 13th. Professor Apraham Terian spoke on an illustrated manuscript of Hymns which is in his possession. The fourth lenten supper was given by the parents of Haygian Armenian School students on March 20th.

9. ASBED BREAKFAST

Knights of Vartan provided their annual breakfast for our parish on October 20th, proceeds of which was donated to ACYOA, Jrs. activities. This is a generous gesture on their part and worthy of recognition.

10. COMMEMORATION OF THE ANNIVERSARY OF GENOCIDE

The 76th Commemoration of the Armenian Genocide was observed with an appropriate program in a united way on April 27th at Fairview High School in Skokie. Our own Dr. Raffy Hovanessian was the Armenian main speaker. We were not permitted, by the Diocese, to hold joint liturgy.

11. 8TH ANNIVERSARY AND MORTGAGE BURNING

Certainly one of the highlights of the year for our parish was the Church Anniversary and Mortgage B urning, held on Sunday, November 17th, with our Primate, The Rt. Rev. Bishop Khajag presiding. In the morning, Surpazan Hayr was the celebrant and preacher in the Church. At the conclusion of Badarak, Surpazan Hayr conferred the rank of stole-bearer to John Hovsepian. The Banquet/Program was very enjoyable. The burning of the Church mortgage was a realization through the generosity of our people, with over \$20,000 realized.

12. HYE CAMP

Hye Camp has been operating for many year in Elkhorn, Wisconsin, on Keishian property, who donate its use on a yearly basis, for the benefit of our youngsters. Administratively it is operated under the direction of Midwest Regional Council (MRC). Anna Giragosian, from our parish is the Camp Director. Many others from our parish are involved in different phases of it. Many children from our parish attend camp which is one week long, July 28- August 3. This year I was asked to be the Religious Director. Fortunately, I could employ the services of Yeretzgin Rosalie and seminarian Deacon Gregory Dudukian, as my assistants; they taught religion. Primate visited and celebrated Badarak. I conducted the ceremony of "Blessing of Grapes."

13. CHICAGO MISSION

This year, I was asked by the Diocese to visit the Chicago Armenian Church in the absence of their visiting clergyman. I could only accommodate them once, by visiting St. Gregory the Illuminator to celebrate Badarak on Sunday, October 6th. On that day, I tried to fulfill all their spiritual needs.

14. INTERNATIONAL ARMENIAN CLERGY CONVOCATION

I attended an unprecedented historic meeting, convened June 17-21, in New York. The meeting was called with the consent and blessings of Vehapar Vazken I and was organized by our Primate, Bishop Khajag Barsamian. The purpose of the meeting was the renewal of the Church. All the expenses were paid by Louise Manoogian Simone, President of AGBU.

15. MIDWEST CLERGY MEETINGS

On two occasions when the Primate visited our region, I attended meetings of Midwest Clergy, presided by the Primate. The first one was in South Milwaukee, on February 16, and the second at our Church on November 18. Surpazan Hayr and clergy were hosted with a luncheon by our Women's Guild.

16. MIDWEST REGION SUPERINTENDENTS ASSOCIATION

On October 29th, Nancy Barsamian, Co-Director of DRE in New York, met with Sunday School Superintendents and clergy of Midwest Armenian Churches in Waukegan, and as a result established, for the first time a Midwest Regional Superintendents Association. Our Sunday School Superintendent, Yeretzgin Rosalie was appointed to head this new Association. She has already embarked into a variety of joint activities with other Sunday Schools of Armenian Churches in Midwest.

17. OFFICIAL FROM ARMENIA IN OUR MIDST

Hrachig Simonian, Chairman of Committee of Cultural Relations between Armenia and Diaspora visited Chicago with his wife, under the patronage of our Diocese. He was a guest of Chicago area Armenian Churches during his one week stay. He gave a public lecture on November 20 at the AGBU Center which was sponsored by area Armenian Churches, including Sts. Joachim & Anne.

18. A PRINCELY DONATION

In response to my request, Mr. Alex Manoogian, the great humanitarian and benefactor, and Life President of AGBU, sent a donation of \$5,000 to our Church, to be used for any project deemed important for our Church. Our deepest respect and gratitude to him.

19. GUEST CLERGY AND GUEST PARTICIPANTS IN OUR LITURGY

Fr. Arnak Kasparian of New Jersey, Fr. Garabed Kochakian of Racine, Wis., and Deacon Crosby Kazarian of Providence, RI participated in a wedding ceremony in our Church on September 14th. Deacon Kazarian also participated in our Church worship service on Sunday, September 15th. Other guest participants in our Liturgy on that day were Louise Yardumanian of Florida as organist and Stepan Karougian as soloist from Detroit, MI.

20. COMING CHALLENGES

Within two years, in 1993, the Church in Palos Heights will be celebrating its 10th Anniversary. This is a significant milestone and it should be celebrated on a grand scale. This occasion should take into consideration the history of Sts.

Joachim & Anne since it came into existence in West Pullman in 1958. Therefore, it will be the 35th Anniversary of the Armenian Church in West Pullman, the forerunner of Palos Heights. The combined 35th & 10th Anniversaries of our Church should be a glorious opportunity for our parishioners in Palos Heights. It is imperative that Parish Council immediately appoint a special Anniversary Committee with new plans and new projects. The time is short for such a celebration which needs lots of planning.

Another challenge is the project of a new marble altar in Armenian design for our Church. this project is very dear to our parishioner, Greg Srabian, who has even founded a special fund for this purpose. Now the fund is over \$50,000 which grows all the time. This project should be given every encouragement by the Parish Council so that this cherished dream will be realized soon. If possible, this project should be combined with the 10th Anniversary celebration.

Another challenge o our Church is considering the forming of an Auxiliary organization, targeting all the adults, singles and couples of the parish. Such an organization may enrich the parish life and become a blessing for both parish and parishioners, as well.

REPORT OF THE PARISH COUNCIL

1991

INTRODUCTION

The newly elected and in-office members of the Parish Council met on February 11, 1991 to elect officers and thereafter met at least once a month to plan, organize and oversee the various projects and activities of the Church. The 1991 Parish Council consisted of:

PRINCIPAL ACTIVITIES AND ACCOMPLISHMENTS

- 1. The activities of the Parish Council continued to be run mainly through 3 Committees: Membership (Anahid Pridjian Chairlady); Finance: (Bumanian Chairman); Buildings and Grounds (Karneg Boyajian Chairman). Also, to better inform the Parish Council of the plans and activities of sub rdinate organizations, the following Liaisons were appointed: Pridjian Venen's Guild; Fr. Diran Sunday School; Fr. Diran Jr. ACYOA and NEWSLETTER; Sonia Harlan Senior Citizens; Greg Srabian Choir.
- 2. During 1991 the dues paying parish members numbered 92. Two new memberes joined the Church but 3 members effectively resigned because of moving out of the area and/or financial difficulties. Of the 92 members 17 members had not paid their 1991 dues by December 31, 1991 inspite of the quarterly statements sent to all members reminding of their obligations.
- 3. Religious gifts in 1991 were a great deal less than previous years: \$13,189 vs \$21,011 in 1990; \$20,460 in 1989; \$21,905 in 1988; \$24,525 in 1987; and \$27,385 in 1986. If the rate of decrease continues, in a few years our church will be subject to financial difficulties.
- 4. "The Husband and Wife Sunday Greeters" continued in 1991 on special occasions.
- 5. The Newsletter, ANI, was issued bimonthly on regular basis thanks to the tireless efforts of Laurene Skinner and our secretary, Anette Sultanian.
- 6. The sixth Annual Dinner-Dance of our Church was held at the Visual and

Performing Arts Center, Munster, Indiana, on February 2, 1991. The affair was very successful thanks to the efforts of the Committee chaired by Rosy Yeretsian. A profit of about \$3,600 was achieved.

- 7. On April 21, 1991 April 24 was commemorated simply with a Hokehankist. The Council decided not to join the other Chicago shurches in the religious commemoration of the event.
- 8. At a Special Parish Assembly on May 26, 1991 Fr. Diran and Garbis Meguerian reported on the proceedings at the Clergy Conferece and the Diocesan Assembly. Also, various Church matters, including the "burning of the mortgage" were also discussed.
- 9. Thanks to the efforts of Greg Srabian and his Committee plaques honoring the donors for the building of the Church were mounted on the east wall of the lobby.
- 9. Buildings and Grounds Committee took care of the necessary repairs to the buildings and equipments. The surface of the flat roof of the Hovanessain Hall was completely overhauled with modified rubber composition at a cost of about \$14,000. Also, new shelves were purchased for Fr. Diran's office.
- 10. The annual Church picnic was held on Sunday, July 21, 1991, on the church grounds. It was very successful and netted about \$7,500 thanks to the tireless efforts of the Picinic Committee headed by Mrs Sona Doumanian and to the support of our members and friends. We appreciate
- 11. The 8th Annual Anniversary Dinner celebrating the consecration of our Church took place on November 17, 1991. His Grace Bishop Khajag Barsamian, our Primate, was the guest speaker. Mr. Stepan Karougian from Detroit, accompanied by Dr. Susan Mardoyan, entertained us with several songs. Also, our Rita Yeretsian, accompanied by her father, Dr. Ara Yeretsian, performed two musical pieces on her violin. Sonia Harlan was in charge of Dinner arrangements.
- 12. At the February Parish Assembly the Parish Councilwas charged to formulate a plan for paying up the remaining princile of about \$13,000 of the church mortgage. Upon the recommendation of the Finance Committee, the Parish Council decided to initiate a special fund raising to "burn the mortgage" at the Church Anniversary Dinner on November 17, 1991 in the presence of the Primate. Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners more than \$20,000 was raised which is enough to cover the building debt and part of the cost of the roof.

CONCLUSION

The Parish Council is gratified with the 1991 accomplishments which contributed to the effective running of church affairs. Hoever, these accomplishments could not have been achieved without the cooperations of Father Diran and the enthusiastic support of our parish members, which are greatly appreciated. Our special thanks go to the the members of the various Council Committees and to the energetic members of our Women's

Guild who helped to make our lunches successful and contributed to the financial well being of our Church by organizing the rummage sale and the bazaar.
