



WINTER RELIEF FOR ARMENIA

Chicago community responded to Armenian plight by contributing generously to ARMENIA FUND USA for the purchase of heating oil for Winter Relief 1994. Our tiny community of Sts. Joachim & Anne was once again on the forefront through the devoted work parishioners involved in the actual fundraising. The Chicago community was also fortunate having an anonymous benefactor who promised matching dollars which later was multiplied many folds by the double matching of Lincy Foundation. Thus the total contributions of the Chicago community to ARMENIA FUND USA was well over \$700,000.

MIDWEST REGIONAL ACTIVITIES

Armenian Language Crash Course, a one day affair, with presentation and discussion of Armenian cultural subjects, designed for young adults and organized by the Diocesan Armenian Language Lab and Resource Center (ALLARC), took place at St. Gregory the Illuminator Armenian Church, Chicago on Saturday, December 11th. The participating guest scholars were Prof. Apraham Terian of Kansas, Prof. Kevork Bandakjian of Michigan and Prof. Vartan Abdo of New Jersey. A **Concert** of Composer Vazken Muradian was performed by the Chicago Chamber Orchestra, October 31st. The enthusiastic reception of the audience, coupled with the composer's presence made this concert very special.

A Benefit Recital for Armenia was held on January 7th at the AGBU Center, Chicago. Sisters, Marta and Ani Aznavoorian performed with great artistry on piano and cello, under the auspices of AGBU. Proceeds of the recital reached over \$80,000 through the local matching program, both locally and through the Lincy Foundation. This figure will be added to the total Chicago contribution for Winter Relief 1994.

A Lecture on "Armenian American from Being to Feeling" was given by Dr. Anny Bakalian on January 23rd at the AGBU Center. She is Professor of Sociology at the College of Notre Dame, Baltimore, Maryland.

To all our supporters within and outside our Church, your efforts have contributed beyond words to the preserving of our Church in Palos Heights. Thank you!



PASTORAL REFLECTIONS TO THE CONTROL OF CHRISTIANITY

Love is the supreme reality and the epitome of the Christian value system. Faith, Hope and Love constitute the three theological virtues, "but the greatest of these is love", as Apostle Paul ascertains. These three virtues are inseparable; if you don't have all three, then you don't really have any. Love being the greatest is the proof of faith and hope; without love the other two loose their quality of genuiness.

Faith without love is cold, and hope without love is grim! Love is the fire which kindles faith and it is the light which turns hope into certainty.

In his famous passage of First Corinthians, chapter 13, Apostle Paul in discussing Christian Love (charity), uses three illustrations to show that even the highest achievements in life are meaningless when they lack love.

In his first illustration he says; "Though I speak with the tongues of men and angels, and have not love, then I become as sounding brass or a tinkling cymbal."

Speech is our basic means of communication, but if it does not serve as a channel for the expression of love, then it does not serve its purpose at all and loses its real value. Even the most refined eloquence becomes nothing but noise, when it is without the power of love.

In his second illustration, Paul says: "Though / have the gift of prophecy, and understand all naysteries and possess all knowledge, and I have all faith so that I could remove mountains and have not love, I am nothing."

Think of all the great minds and all the spiritual giants in history; these are men of vision and men of faith. In his sweeping statement, Apostle Paul is saying that unless they were motivated by true love in their thinking and believing, they are literally nothing in the sight of God.

Men of vision and men of faith must be men of love first and foremost. It is not a question of how much we know, or how wise we are, nor even how good we are; it all depends how much love we have in our heart. Jesus said, "He that is the greatest among you shall be your servant." Gifts of God bestowed on us are intended to make us servants and not masters; the greater the gifts, the greater must be the service.

Apostle Paul is even more astonishing in his third striking illustration, where he says, "Though I bestow all my goods to feed the poor,

and though I give my body to be burned, and I have no love, it profiteth me nothing."

This illustration presents an incredible picture. We are told that even benevolence and martyrdom can be worthless in the sight of God if they are void of love. Think of the great benefactors and the heroic martyrs in history, whose names are written in golden scripts on the pages of history; their deeds have become legends and inspired generations; monuments have been erected in their honor. Yes, men can do such great things and yet they amount to nothing in the sight of God if they are not motivated by love.

It is entirely possible for a man to be self-centered in his self-denial and self-righteous in his self-sacrifice, and as such, be generous only to feed his vanity and pious only to feed his pride. The human heart can become so pervert that it can turn the noblest virtue into the lowest vice; thus, without true love benevolence can become egotism and martyrdom hypocricy.

The most eloquent speakers, the most profound thinkers, the most pious believers, the most generous donors, and the most heroic martyrs are failures from God's point of view if they lack love in their intention. Conversely, even the smallest achievement of man has infinite value in the sight of God if it is motivated by true love.

Love transcends death and endures forever. Everything in this world passes but love never ends. It is the only virtue which St. John the Evangelist identifies with God by stating, "God is love; and anyone who lives in love, lives in God, and God lives in him." (1 John 4:16).

This love supercedes the Law of the Old Testament, as a New Commandment, given by our Lord which is the only criteria of our being Christian, "A new commandment | give to you, that you love one another; even as | have loved you. That you also love one another. By this all men will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another. "(John 13:34-35)

One cannot help but ask, is this Christian ideal of love much too high for us to attain? Love is not an accomplishment on our part, but it is simply the gift of God. All one has to do is to respond wholeheartedly to the love of God which He freely and unconditionally offers to man.

In the words of St. John the Evangelist, "We love because He first loved us." (1 John 4:10)

LENTEN PERIOD IN THE ARMENIAN CHURCH

February 14-March 26, 1994

Our Lord Jesus Christ went into the desert for 40 days for seclusion after His Baptism in the River Jordan to prepare Himself for His mission by praying and fasting. At the end of this period, the devil, disguised as an angel, came to Him and tempted Him with food, power and wealth. Each time Jesus rebuffed the "bad angel" and finally he left Jesus. The good angels came to Jesus and cared for Him. (Matthew 4:1-11) Lent is designated in commemoration of our Lord's withdrawal into the wilderness.

SIX-STEP PLAN FOR MEDZ BAHK

The forty day period of Great Lent ("Medz Bahk") is a time of preparation for the events of Holy Week and Easter. Here are six suggestions for adequate observance for this year's Lent:

- 1. Fasting Church tradition says that we should abstain from all meat and dairy products during Great Lent. Though difficult, this is not impossible, especially with the wealth of cookbooks containing meatless recipes (both Armenian and non-Armenian) available. If family members have favorite meatless meals, be sure to include them in your menu planning. If traditional fasting is not possible, consider eating one meal a day or less portions.
- 2. **Bible Reading** Start with the Scriptures for each Sunday of Lent (see schedule below). Read and discuss with family members. Aside from Sunday Gospel passages, set a goal to read through one of the Gospels in its entirety. Try a chapter a night and pick a time when the whole family is together.
- 3. Attend Lenten Services Check parish calendar. Get involved in Lenten vigils and suppers. The Lenten Services consist of Psalms, Prayers and Hymns. Subdued and penitential in tone, the service sets the mood for drawing into ourselves for the soul-searching which we must do during Lent.
- 4. **Penance** This is the time to make amends for the wrongs we've done. Send notes of apology, do good deeds to make up for those to whom you have been less than loving, phone those with whom you must rebuild bridges of love and friendship. Make an appointment with your priest for private counseling and penance.
- 5. **Prayer** Gather favorite prayers, penitential prayers, "With Faith I Confess" a set of 24 prayers (intended for each hour of the day) by St. Nersess the Graceful, favorite Psalms (32 and 51 are good ones) to read and meditate during Lent. Discuss the meaning and purpose of prayer and designat best times to pray. Try to arrange a family prayer time.
- 6. Alms Giving up something during Lent doesn't refer to food alone. It also means giving up frivolous entertainment and activities. The money that would have been spent on meat and frivolous entertainment could be given to a favorite charity, such as sponsoring an Armenian orphan; helping school children in Armenia; and assisting homeland and Karabagh liberation struggles.

Lent is a period which strengthens us spiritually. Make a special effort to attend Church during this period. Let it be a time of growth for the whole family.

SERVICES AND SACRAMENTS

During Lent, the alter curtain in the Armenian Church is traditionally veiled in black. The black alter curtain and the solemnity of the Lenten Services make us realize how much we truly value our Badarak and liturgical traditions. The absence of Holy Communion, the inability to see the priest in his regal vestments as he raises the chalice or signs "Peace unto all" (Khaghaghootyoon Amenetzoon"), and not passing the Kiss of Peace, all work to remind us how bleak and lifeless our existence would be without the splendor of the Divine Liturgy.

The Lenten period heightens our awareness and evokes yearning in our souls for the Lord Jesus Christ in a more vivid way.




