A total of 27 regular meetings were held between January 1, 1966, and December 31st, 1966. At the first regular meeting the following officers were elected:

The Parish Council assisted the Building Committee in the Consecration Anniversary weekend plans. Much time and energy was devoted by both groups which assured the

weekend would be a success.

3. The farewell dinner for Father Vahrij was sponsored by the Parish Council. In this endeavor both the Ladies Auxiliary and the Young Ladies Auxiliary outdid themselves in their service to the church.

The main problem that faced the Parish Council during the past year was to find a replacement for Father Vahrij. After much correspondence, many phone calls, some very anxious moments and with the help of the then, Primate-elect, Bishop Torkom, Father Sarkis Kashikjian was appointed our temporary pastor. In our sincere and honest opinion, we feel we now have serving our Parish one of the finest clergymen in the Armenian Church. We say that without reservation. Through some very depressing times, when he was living away from his family he showed us the intense devotion and determination that he serves his God and his Church with. We should feel fortunate he is with us, for he is a constant source of inspiration and guidance. It is our recommendation and feeling that Father Sarkis should be given an overwhelming vote of confidence at this meeting by stripping him of his title "temporary pastor" and electing him to a full five year term as our Priest.

We have tried to serve our church as best we could. At times we were lax and at times we were overzealous in our endeavors. It is
