Bowling is a sport we participate in frequently because it accommodates the wide age range of our group and always seems to be enjoyed by all.

The month of December was a particularly active month during which we planned the Carroling and Christmas Party, and made hand painted decorations for the Church Christmas Tree and decorated it. The youth made cookies which were made up into gayly decorated plates to pass out at the 15 homes at which we carroled. This activity brought as much cheer to the youth as it did to the widowed and the ill whem we visited. It was followed by a Christmas Party at the Rejebian home. At the next meeting, our group assumed the responsibility of taking down the Church Christmas Tree.

Although the youth of St. Gregory's Church have always willingly accepted the chore of waiting on tables, they decided to be responsible for the planning and executing of serving of the church dinners. from now thru June. Vivian Rejebian and Andrea Meorgan volunteered to be in charge. Before each dinner Vivian or Andrea will contact the responsible family to ask them how many tables are to be served. On a rotating basis, the youth will then serve the main course, dessert, and help clean the tables. This will free the adults responsible for preparing the dinner but it is suggested that one adult still supervise the serving to make sure that each table is adequately taken care of.
