with Parish Council.

On the 14th our church celebrated the Feast of Exhaltation and our Guild hosted a pastry and coffee social hour after services.

We also planned a raffle, offering several lovely gifts donated by our members and had the tickets printed and distributed.

A Nominating Committee was also formed to select and nominate new officers for the coming year.

In October one of our members, Alice Boyajian, donated a pair of vases for the church altar, given in memory of deceased Women Guild members.

On October 12th a Mini-Cultural night was held and we were asked to provide refreshments. Our members served apple pie, coffee and cider.

October 24th we served a chicken and pilaf dinner after church services and it was very well attended.

In November we were all busy working on the sale of our raffle tickets and making plans for our contribution to the church's anniversary, as well as making preparations for Christmas activities.

On December 2nd we had a lovely Christmas luncheon for our members and guests and at our business meeting that followed, we discussed our Armenian Christmas dinner, as well as planning a coffee social hour after church on American Christmas.

We are happy to announce that Ursula Findikyan is our new Chairlady, Louise Rockwell, Secretary, and Manoush Seraydarian, our Treasurer. They have our sincere congratulations and we know they will have a very successful term.

1980 was a very productive year for our Women's Guild and our members are all very proud of our accomplishments, both individually and functioning successfully as a group who is working for our church.

We would also like to mention that one of the most important "highlights" of the year was welcoming our new Hi Soorp to the church and community. The time and effort he has given to us is more than sincerely appreciated.

As women always remain the heart of the home, the Women's Guild is one of the strong backbones of the church.
