

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING OF ST. GREGORY CHURCH OF

BINGHAMTON, N. Y. - 1985

The annual parish meeting was held on Sunday, December 8, 1985 at 1:30 pm with an opening prayer by Father Sooren. Dr. Vahe

Garabedian was chairman pro-tem and Mrs. Rose Ketchoyian was secretary of the meeting.

Roll call was read with 36 paying members present. Father Sooren read his report and Dr. George Rejebian read chairman report. Pamela Russell gave report on church dance and Adrienne Kachadourian presented a check for \$500.00 to parish council; the second \$500.00 payment from Ladies Auxiliary. Dr. A. Kachadourian reported on Diocesan Assembly (he was our delegate) and Michael Ketchoyian read financial report.

From the audit, M. Ketchoyian revealed the cancellation of priest's health policy during the year. Dr. Kachadourian will follow up in this matter. This has been rectified.

John Bogdasarian read the budget report.

The Sarkisian brothers pledged \$5000.00 toward roof repairs. Of the \$13,000.00 expense, \$6500.00 will be earmarked toward painting trim, church roof and gutters, and PAINTING INTERIOR.

New Business

Michael Ketchoyian proposed a separate building fund drive for the roof. Motion was seconded and carried.

Dr. G. Rejebian made a proposal to increase church dues next year to \$25.00. Motion was seconded and carried.

Nomination for parish council with four openings was made and the following people were voted with 35 votes each with one abstention.

NominATING committee was voted with 35 votes each and one abstention.
