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



RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

- "5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
- "6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his (or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased by the Parish Assembly.
- "7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members, provided they have attained the age of 21.
- "8. Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years."

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

- "16. The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
- "17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
- "22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question."

PASTOR'S REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

With the grace and mercy of God, we, the members of St. John's Armenian Church Community, have spent another year under the shadow of our Holy Mother Church. I am grateful to God for the opportunity to serve St. John's Church for another year. I did my human utmost to serve St. John's without sparing the graces which the Lord God has bestowed upon me.

Pastoral Staff

Almost through the end of the year 1977, our Church operated with an adequate pastoral staff. The Rev. Fr. Michael Buttero, Assistant Pastor, and The Very Rev. Fr. Baret Yeretzian, Priest in Residence, assisted me in attending to the needs of our Church and Community. At the beginning of the month of November, I was informed by the Primate, His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, that by December, both Fr. Michael and Fr. Baret were being transferred from St. John's in order to assume pastoral responsibilities in Long Island, New York, and Montreal, Canada, respectively. Both Fr. Michael and Fr. Baret were with us at St. John's for a little over three years, during which time they gave of themselves to our parish; and in turn, they were able to benefit from their experiences in our parish. At this time, on behalf of our parishioners and myself, I thank Fr. Michael and Fr. Baret for their services to our parish and their assistance to me, and pray that the Lord God will bless them in their new responsibilities towards the twin parishes of our Diocese.

Worship Service

Divine Liturgy was celebrated and Armenian and English sermons were delivered every Sunday and at all other occasions of the Church calendar. Services were also offered during the week, according to the requirements of our Church traditions.

Sacraments and Rites

During 1977, the following Sacraments and Rites were officiated: Baptism and Confirmation of infants and adults (60); Engagement Services (7); Holy Matrimony (29); and Funeral Services (62).

Acknowledgements of Services

During the past year, The Most Reverend Archbishop Sion Manoogian has continued to enhance the solemnity of our Church by celebrating the Divine Liturgy and preaching on the Major Feast Days of our Church, and by his monthly sermons, as well as by presiding at various Church Services and Church functions. The following clergymen celebrated the Divine Liturgy and preached, or were present at our Church Services in connection with their visits to Detroit in 1977: His Beatitude, Archbishop Yeghishe Derderian, Armenian Patriarch of Jerusalem; His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Primate of the Armenian Church of North America; The Most Rev. Archbishop Shahe Ajemian, Chancelor of the Armenian Patriarchate of Jerusalem; The Very Rev. Fr. Vazken Keshishian; The Very Rev. Fr. Arshen Ayvazian; The Very Rev. Fr. Ghevont Samoulian; The Very Rev. Fr. Asbed Balian; The Very Rev. Fr. Haigazoun Melkonian; The Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian; The Rev. Fr. Nersess Jebejian; and The Rev. Fr. Garabed Kochakian. On behalf of our Church, I extend my appreciation to our Church hierarchs and her dedicated servants for the opportunity of praying and exalting the Lord together at St. John's. It is my privilege also, at this time, to thank Deacon Levon Zenian for his sermon on May 8, 1977.

In connection with the worship services of our Church, it is my duty and privilege to thank each and every member of our Komitas Choir, including the Deacons of our Church, for their dedication and service to our Church and her worshipping congregation. Again, it is my pleasure to acknowledge, specifically, two individuals from our Choir who worked diligently during the past year to make our services dignified and inspiring: Deacon Ara Haig, Choirmaster; and Miss Michele Menoian, Organist. Unfortunately, because of ill health, Deacon Harry Ekizian has not been able to assist us regularly during the officiation of the Sacraments and Rites of our Church. However, Deacons Ara Haig, Daniel Shahan, John Semizian, Mihran Hoplamazian, Richard Norsigian, and Hagop Asadurian have attempted to bring this assistance to us as much as possible; and we thank all of them for their concern for the dignity of our Sacramental Services. Yet, we must state here that we are in need of a deacon upon whose assistance we can rely regularly for our Sacraments and Rites.

Pastoral Visitations

Hospital visitations, Nursing Home visitations to the sick and elderly, home visitations to the shut-ins, home visitations for consolation and counseling, home blessings, visitations with the families of the Parish in connection with Sacraments and for various other reasons have been attended to by myself, Fr. Michael, and Fr. Baret, and to the utmost of our ability. I would like, at this time, to remind our parishioners again to inform the Church Office directly when the services of a clergyman are needed.

Religious Educational Programs

Throughout the year, the Rev. Fr. Michael Buttero, Assistant Pastor, successfully conducted Bible Study Classes for interested parishioners. At this time, a similar program is in the making. I hope that with the assignment of a new priest to our parish, we will be able to meet this need of our parishioners as well.

On Lenten Sundays during 1977, five lectures were presented by all the clergymen of St. John's on various religious topics in the Sanctuary following the Worship Services. We found this program to be most effective; and, thus, we plan to present similar lectures in 1978.

Administrative Duties

Office work and management; Parish Council; Church Auxiliary Organizations' general body and committee meetings; attendance and participation in organizational functions; organization of religious, cultural, and educational programs; coordination of Church Organizations; involvement and direction in renovation; and fund-raising and social-concern projects have been part of my administrative responsibilities during the past year.

Publications

During the past year, I have continued to follow closely and to offer my time and advice to the Editor of our Church monthly publication. I take this opportunity to thank the Editorial Staff and, particularly, the Editor of the Torch Bearer, Mrs. Gloria Mikaelian, for the commendable service she renders to our Church in connection with this publication.

Special Features of 1977

During the year 1977, our parishioners were again called upon to assist our sisters and brothers in Lebanon. The Fund-Raising Drive for the Relief of the Armenians in Lebanon was jointly sponsored by St. John's and the Armenian General Benevolent Union of Detroit. Our Community raised \$76,500.00 for the project, which characterizes clearly the charitable spirit of our parishioners. In this regard, I would like to thank the members of the Committee and its Chairman, Mr. Martin Apkarian, for their dedication in energetically pursuing this most worthwhile project. Again, for the record, I would like to state that I was the Co-Chairman of the Committee.

September 15, and October 8, 1977, were two very important days in the life of the Detroit Armenian Community. By now, we certainly are aware of St. John's Artifacts Collection and the Armenian Costumes Collection, the latter funded and sponsored jointly by St. John's and the Metro Chapter of the Armenian General Benevolent Union of Detroit. Our Community's most successful public relations venture occurred on September 15, 1977, at a press preview of the Heritage Collection, organized by Mrs. Jeanette Keramedjian. For days and weeks thereafter, the local media praised the effort of reviving the cultural accomplishments of our ancestors. Finally, on October 8, 1977, parishioners and friends were able to see for themselves the presentation of the Heritage Collection and the untiring efforts during the past few years of Mrs. Varsenick Apkarian, Mrs. Anoush Papelian, and Mrs. Sona Yavruian, which were elegantly offered to those in attendance. The General Chairman of this spectacular project was Mrs. Marie Manoogian, assisted by Miss Margaret Derderian, Mrs. Rosemary Hoplamazian, Mrs. Marge Manoogian, Mrs. Mary Simonian, and Mrs. Ruby Yagoobian. Numerous sponsors from our parish made this presentation possible by their generous donations. At this time, I would like to thank each and every member of this presentation, and the benefactors, for an unforgettable event in the life of our Community.

Acknowledgements and Observations

At this time, I would like specifically to acknowledge and praise three Committees and their chairmen for the outstanding service they have rendered to our Church. Without their dedication and perserverance, our Church Budget would have fallen some \$210,000.00 short. They are: the Building Committee, Chairman, Mr. Armen Hovnanian; the Bazaar 77 Committee, Chairman, Mr. Charles Yessaian, and Co-Chairman, Mr. Arthur Mardigian, also Bingo Committee, Chairman, Mr. Vahe Papelian. These Committees and their Chairman have accomplished what would have been considered unthinkable only a few years ago. As the Pastor of St. John's, I extend to them my personal gratitude and wish and pray that St. John's Church will never be deprived of their kind of enthusiasm in the future.

An area of concern for our parishioners should be the income of our Church. A church, in order to grow, must not depend upon income from non-parishioners. Our largest source of income should be the direct pledges of our parishioners. We must not only provide for today, but also for the future, to fall on in lean years. This is our Church. In the long run, we alone can provide for her.

Recommendations

As we enter 1978, I see ahead of us a year of renovation and expansion. Our Church needs more office and storage space; a place for our youth; a home for our elderly; and a house to collect, to maintain, and to preserve our ancestral heritage. We might not be able to embark upon all of these projects at once, but we must begin at whatever we see to be the most urgent now.

Appreciation and Conclusion

I take this opportunity to express my heartfelt gratitude and appreciation to Fr. Michael Buttero; Fr. Baret Yeretzian; the members of the Parish Council; our Church Bodies; Auxiliary Organizations; Standing Committees; as well as to individual parishioners, for their cooperation, services, and sacrifices which enabled our Church to conclude another fruitful year. The accomplishments and the success of our Church are their pride and fulfillment. I pray that God will bless each and every one abundantly, both in their homes and businesses. May the Lord God also give us guidance and perseverance to continue our good works.

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

It has truly been a rewarding experience to have been able to serve our Church as a Parish Council member for the past six years. I thank the Parish of St. John's for affording me this opportunity as it has helped me to grow as an individual and also made me much more aware of the efforts that are required to keep our Church functioning smoothly. I hope in turn I have been able to contribute to the growth of our Church community.

During the past four years as Chairman, I have come to know many fine parishioners who give of themselves unselfishly in their service to our Church. The importance of giving cannot be stressed enough...giving of our time, service and financial assistance. We must give to our Church so that she may be able to provide for us at the time of our needs. It has been my observation, during these past few years, that our Church is here to provide her services to those who are in need, for both joyous and sad occasions, without expectations in return.

The St. John's Parish is fortunate that the majority of its parishioners stand ready to assist the Church in fulfilling her needs. As you are aware, we have been able to meet the financial burdens associated with our vast complex through major fund-raising affairs such as our Annual Bazaar and our Bingo Program. The Bingo Program, under the very capable chairmanship of Mr. Vahe Papelian with the dedicated participation of the committee, has spent week after week to bring us over \$74,000.00 in added revenue. The St. John's Bazaar was again a success this year under the leadership of Mr. Charles Yessaian and Mr. Arthur Mardigian and through the devoted efforts on the part of many parishioners. But the most important support of the Church must come from us, the parishioners, through our offerings. The Parish Council has not raised the dues for membership for six years nor does it propose an increase for 1978. This does not mean that those who are able to do so should not increase their offering. We are justifiably very proud of our Church and, therefore, should recognize that through our gifts she will continue to be the foundation of our faith, heritage, culture, and pride.

The past year has been very eventful for our Parish, and on the whole we can consider that we have been successful in our overall endeavors. The improvements that have been made to our building are detailed in other portions of the annual report. Among the more noteworthy accomplishments is the presentation of the Armenian Heritage Collection. This presentation has given our community an opportunity to view a part of our rich heritage. Among the other noteworthy accomplishments is the acquisition of additional artifacts for our museum, which has grown over the last several years; and we now are able to maintain a permanent display. The museum is a manifestation of our Armenian past that young and old alike can view and enjoy. It is hoped that individuals will offer items to our museum as donations so that the entire Armenian Community may enjoy and appreciate them.

We thank The Very Rev. Fr. Baret Yeretzian and Rev. Fr. Michael Buttero who served our parish for the past three years. We apprecite the contributions they made and wish them well in their new assignments.

Gratitude must be expressed to our Church Secretaries, Mrs. Helen Armoudlian and Mrs. Rose Boudakian for their continued efforts for our Church. They are always willing to assist our parishioners whenever called upon. Their cooperation, energy and encouragement makes the conducting of our operation much easier for all of us. Sincere appreciation and thanks to both of them.

Although the St. John's Parish has successfully grown and completed many projects over the years, there are some important objectives we must yet achieve. There is a need for a senior citizens housing project and we must embark upon the much needed building expansion to accommodate the increased activities within our community. It is sincerely hoped that we will initiate action on these important projects within the near future. We must be tenacious in pursuing our goals to move forward.

We are particularly thankful to our Pastor, The Very Rev. Fr. Paren Avedikian, for his untiring service and devotion to our Parish. His guidance has been invaluable to us in the performance of our duties. May the Lord continue to give him the strength and wisdom to serve the Church capably.

Over the past several years some individuals have indicated reluctance to run for Parish Council. I, too, had this feeling, but since becoming part of the Council I have realized the importance of giving to our Church. I strongly encourage all parishioners to participate in the vast activities associated with the Church. You are needed! With your participation we can continue to be the most energetic and successful Parish in the Diocese. With our support of the Diocese and the Holy Mother See of Etchmiadzin the St. John's Parish will continue to be a source of encouragement and hope for them in securing the future of the Armenian Church in this country.

I thank you for having given me the privilege of serving our Church and I pray that God gives us the wisdom and perseverance to continue our God-pleasing works.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

During 1977, the Parish Council held 25 regular meetings and six special sessions; the first to define the role of building administrator, the second to meet with the new grounds' manager, the third for the election of the Parish Council executive body, the fourth with Diocesan delegates regarding the 1977 Diocesan Assembly, the fifth with the Library Guild regarding their status, and sixth with the Ushers' Corps regarding their responsibilities.

SPECIAL PARISH ASSEMBLIES

During the year, the St. John's Parish Council called two Special Parish Assemblies. The first, which convened April 19, 1977, and was attended by 84 members, was to familiarize parishioners with the Agenda for the forthcoming 1977 Diocesan Assembly. The members gave direction to the St. John's delegation regarding all issues on the Agenda.

The second Special Assembly, held on May 24, 1977, and attended by 61 members, received the reports from the St. John's delegation to the 1977 Diocesan Assembly.

PLEDGE AND MEMBERSHIP

St. John's began 1977 with a pledged membership of 968 units and ended with 987 units, an increase of 19 units over the previous year.

The annual pledge drive was repeated for the year 1978, and so far, 520 pledge cards have been received from parishioners. Of those responding, 75 have increased their pledge and 23 have decreased theirs.

The Church annual minimum pledge remained at \$130.00 per couple, \$65.00 per individual and \$15.00 for students. The minimum pledge has not been raised for the last six years.

We take this opportunity to thank Mrs. Rose Boudakian for her efficient and up-to-date

management of the pledge recording system of our Church, and advise our parishioners to consult with her when and if problems arise regarding their pledges.

ARMENIAN MARTYRS' DAY

The 62nd Anniversary Commemoration of the Armenian Genocide was observed at St. John's on Sunday, April 24, 1977, beginning with Divine Liturgy and Requiem Service at the Church and followed by a Madagh Dinner at the Hall attended by 670 parishioners. Mrs. Pergroohi Javizian from the Ladies' Auxiliary and Mrs. Victoria Reizian from the Women's Guild co-chaired the dinner. Members of A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors and A.C.Y.O. Juniors served the Madagh Dinner.

After the dinner a two-part program was presented, consisting of the eyewitness accounts of three surviving parishioners, Mr. Souren Aprahamian, Mr. Aram Aznavorian, and Mr. Zenas Melkonian, and the presentation of the play, "Sardarabad" written by Mr. Sooren Mamoulian and directed by Mrs. Nora Azadian.

THE VISIT OF HIS BEATITUDE PATRIARCH OF JERUSALEM

St. John's was honored to receive a visit from His Beatitude, Archbishop Yeghishe Derderian, Armenian Patriarch of Jerusalem, accompanied by The Most Rev. Archbishop Shahe Ajemian, Chancellor of the Patriarchate, on the weekend of November 18-20, 1977. His Beatitude was on tour of America. On Friday, November 18, 1977, a dinner was tendered in honor of the Patriarch at the Church Cultural Hall. The Chairman of the dinner was Mr. Richard Apkarian. On Sunday, November 20, His Beatitude was the Celebrant and Preacher in our Church. Following the Divine Liturgy, a Tea was given in honor of the visiting Hierarchs. The Chairman of the Tea was Mrs. Margaret Gozmanian.

LAST OFFICIAL BADARAK AND FAREWELL LUNCHEON IN HONOR OF THE REV. FR. MICHAEL BUTTERO, ASSISTANT PASTOR

AND

THE VERY REV. FR. BARET YERETZIAN

A letter dated November 1, 1977, from His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, The Primate, informed us that as of the end of November 1977, The Very Rev. Fr. Baret Yeretzian was being assigned to St. Gregory The Illuminator Armenian Church of Montreal, Canada as Pastor, and that as of the beginning of December 1977, The Rev. Fr. Michael Buttero, Assistant Pastor of St. John's was being assigned to the Holy Martyrs' Armenian Church of Bayside, Long Island, New York as Pastor.

The Very Rev. Fr. Baret Yeretzian celebrated his last Badarak and delivered the sermon as a member of our Church Pastoral Staff on Sunday, November 27, 1977.

The Rev. Fr. Michael Buttero, Assistant Pastor, celebrated his last Badarak and delivered the sermon as a member of our Church Pastoral Staff on Sunday, December 4, 1977.

On Sunday, November 27, 1977, immediately following Church Services, a farewell luncheon was tendered in honor of both Fr. Baret and Fr. Michael at the Church Hall attended by some 450 people. The Chairman of the luncheon was Mr. Richard Apkarian.

We wish Fr. Baret and Fr. Michael both a fruitful and successful pastoral tenure in their new assignments.

TEA IN HONOR OF VERY REV. FR. HAIGAZOON MELKONIAN

On Sunday, July 31, 1977, The Very Rev. Fr. Haigazoon Melkonian, the first Detroitborn Armenian clergyman, who was visiting his family, was invited to celebrate the Divine Liturgy and deliver the sermon. Following the Services the Parish Council honored Fr. Haigazoon with a Tea at the Church Hall. The Chairman of the Tea was Miss Kathy Mekjian.

THE TORCH BEARER (CHAHAGIR)

Eleven issues of the Torch Bearer (Chahagir) were published during 1977. (Combined July & August issue).

Many informative and interesting articles as well as reports on activities involving the Church and non-Church affiliated organizations, and individuals were published on a timely and current basis.

The Pastor and Parish Council extend their gratitude to the Editor, Mrs. Gloria Mikaelian, and the Editorial Staff of the **Torch Bearer** for their dedicated services for maintaining the quality of our Church publication.

RELIEF FUND FOR ARMENIANS OF LEBANON

Moved by the persisting plight of our fellow Armenians in Lebanon, St. John's Armenian Church and the Armenian General Benevolent Union of Detroit, continued last year's Fund Raising Drive in 1977. The Committee was again Co-chaired by Mr. Martin Apkarian and Very Rev. Fr. Paren Avedikian, who together with the Committee, comprised of representatives of St. John's and the A.G.B.U. worked hard to reach this year's goal set for Detroit. The Committee surpassed its quota by \$5,000.00 by raising a total of \$76,500.00.

In connection with the Fund Raising, two cocktail parties were organized; the first at the Detroit Plaza Hotel on June 3, 1977, a cocktail and dinner gathering, as guests of Mr. and Mrs. Alex Manoogian, and the second at the Church Cultural Hall on June 17, 1977, a cocktail gathering as guests of Mr. and Mrs. Edward Mardigian.

We take this opportunity to express our gratitude to those individuals of our community who rose to the occasion to help their fellow Armenians and again demonstrated the excellent reputation of our community throughout the Armenian Diaspora.

YOUTH SPORTS' ACTIVITIES

We had an outstanding year in Youth Sports' Activities. The Basketball Program covered boys from 9 to 18 years and girls from 12 to 18 years in our own Basketball League. Our Open (16 and over) and Junior (12 to 15) girls' teams participated in the Orthodox Youth Athletic Association (OYAA) Regular Season Basketball. Both teams were unbeaten and won their division championships. The Open team also won the OYAA National Tournament held in Detroit in March, the Junior team lost in the semi-finals. A combined team of girls also won the Pittsburgh Tournament in April held in Pennsylvania. These accomplishments by our girls is a tribute to the success of our Basketball Program.

Our Seniors (18 and over), Intermediate (16 to 18) boys participated in the OYAA Regular Season Basketball. The Seniors had an average season, but the Intermediates were unbeaten and won their division championship. The Intermediates were runners-up in the OYAA National Tournament and they won the Pittsburgh Tournament.

We had Senior and Intermediate boys' Softball teams in the OYAA Regular Season, the

Seniors won their division championship. They lost in the semi-finals of the OYAA National Tournament.

The ACYOA also participated in various Church sponsored sports' activities under the direction of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America.

A sports committee has been established to develop and improve all areas of our Youth Sports' Activities. Anyone with new ideas should contact them with their suggestions. The Pastor and Parish Council wish to express their appreciation to all of those who so generously donated their time to make our Youth Sports Activities Program a success. Our special thanks to the Armenian-American Veterans for the unlimited use of their facilities.

"THE HERITAGE COLLECTION"

As it was reported last year, this is a joint project of St. John's and the Metro Chapter of the A.G.B.U. of Detroit. The Committee for this project has been at work for two and one half years and has reproduced eighteen authentic Armenian costumes. All expenses incurred in the creation of this collection have been underwritten by the two sponsoring Organizations.

One month prior to the presentation of the costumes to the public, Mrs. Jeanette Keramedjian organized and effectuated a remarkable example of public relations. Local press and television personalities were invited to a preview of Armenian artifacts and "The Heritage Collection". The dramatic presentation was extremely well attended. A luncheon of Armenian delicacies was served following the preview. The local media responded with unprecedented coverage in warm and complimentary terms. Father Paren is to be congratulated on his effective presentation of the artifacts at the press preview as well as the October 8 gala.

A benefit dinner was held on October 8, 1977 during which the costumes were presented to the public for the first time. Mrs. Marie Manoogian chaired this affair. Her committee included the five members of the costume committee, Varsenick Apkarian, Margaret Derderian, Rosemary Hoplamazian, Anoush Papelian, Sona Yavruian, and in addition Marge Manoogian, Mary Simonian, Jeanette Keramedjian, and Ruby Yagoobian.

Special thanks must go to Mrs. Alex Manoogian and her committee whose tireless efforts resulted in an exceptional happening.

We gratefully acknowledge the contributions of the following men:

Mr. Berj Fazlian of Montreal traveled to Detroit several times to coordinate the presentation in a very entertaining and professional manner.

Mr. Edmond Azadian was especially helpful in researching and preparing the script.

Mr. Ara Berberian, well known Detroit concert artist, honored us by narrating the script.

Through the generosity of numerous sponsors, the entire presentation was subsidized and, therefore, was a financial success. A ten thousand dollar profit was shared by the sponsoring Organizations.

Future plans include local appearances as well as showing the Collection in other cities. Costumes will be added to the existing eighteen in an attempt to include the dress of various regions which could not be part of the original group.

The committee implores members of our congregation to be aware of any historically significant objects or clothing which may be in their possession. Many irreplaceable items were lost or abused beyond repair in the past, because we have only recently become aware of the importance of our ancient art.

We would welcome, as part of the Collection, any suitable old Armenian clothing, jewelry and accessories.

PRO MUSICA

Pro Musica presented one program in 1977, a recital by three local area college students, Kim Minasian, soprano; Glenn LeClair, pianist; Arpi Demergian, cellist. The three talented artists were well received; and since the program was combined with a student art exhibit, it provided a beautiful showcase of young Armenian talent to our community.

The Pro Musica Committee feels that an excellent lineup of artists are anxious to come to Detroit, but lack of support from the community prevents them from being scheduled. A packed house is possible in our community; but the token attendance, which has been our experience, is rather disappointing for the artist as well as for the hard-working committee.

We hope in the future our community will increase its support of the work of the committee.

STARS OF YEREVAN CONCERT

St. John's Armenian Church, in conjunction with the Tekeyan Cultural Association, sponsored a unique concert on Tuesday, November 15, 1977, featuring Roupen Mateosian and other renowned artist entertainers from Yerevan, Armenia.

The standing-room-only event which took place in St. John's ArmenianCultural Hall was a sellout with close to 800 persons attending.

ARMENIAN ARTIFACTS

Since Bazaar 1976, the Church Library has been used both as a Library and a Museum. During 1977, two additional library bookshelves were constructed for the books; and other cabinets were remodeled to accommodate the growing artifacts' collection of St. John's. New lighting fixtures were also added during the year to better display the artifacts. We hope to have a museum shortly on Church premises.

It is appropriate to mention at this time that during 1977 the St. John's collection was increased with 85 new artifacts.

PRESENTATION OF SLIDES OF INTERIORS OF TURKEY

On Wednesday, August 17, 1977, The Very Rev. Fr. Paren Avedikian presented his impressions and slides of the Interiors of Turkey at the Church Cultural Hall. Seven hundred parishioners attended this memorable presentation.

CHURCH PICNIC

The eighteenth Annual Picnic of St. John's was held on the Church grounds on Sunday, July 17, 1977, under the dynamic Co-chairmenship of Norman and Solange Messelian. More than 1500 parishioners enjoyed the well planned and organized event.

GARAGE SALE

The third "Garage Sale" was held on Monday and Tuesday, August 15 and 16, 1977, which was once again very successful. The Chairwoman for this undertaking was Victoria Reizian, who did an outstanding job.

Parish Council expresses their appreciation to Mrs. Reizian and her committee members. The Bingo Committee, chaired by Mr. Vahe Papelian has been in existence now for the last five years. The efforts and the dedication of the Committee have resulted in providing a substantial income for the operation of our building complex. The excess income, over budget, resulting from the success of the program, made possible for us this year to provide for the needs of our Cultural Building complex.

CHURCH BAZAAR

St. John's Church Bazaar was held on Friday, Saturday and Sunday, November 11, 12 and 13, 1977, with Mr. Charles Yessaian as General Chairman.

Church Organizations and numerous individuals from the parish worked unselfishly to provide manpower and leadership for the numerous Bazaar projects.

This year's Bazaar was a clean sweep for the ladies: they won the Bake Contest, the Dance Contest, the Tavloo Tournament and the Big Raffle.

A total of \$34,577.00 has been realized from the Bazaar.

The Pastor and Parish Council wish to extend their congratulations and appreciation to Mr. Charles Yessaian, General Chairman, and to Mr. Arthur Mardigian, Co-Chairman, and each and every person of the Bazaar Committee who worked so diligently to make this year's Bazaar a great success.

BUILDING REPORT, 1977

During 1977, the Church Cultural Building continued to be used by the Church, Church Organizations, Non-Church Organizations of the community, and for rental purposes by individual Church members and by outsiders. Some of the major improvements for the year 1977 were: Purchased 146 new, long tables ; 700 new cushioned chairs,; 550 complete dinner service sets, including silverware and glassware; a tractor and lawn mower, received as a gift, a dough rolling machine; a slicer and table; redesigned the heating and cooling and air filtration system of the Cultural Hall; and partially repaired the Church roof.

We would like to bring two specific items to the attention of our parishioners. In 1976, we purchased an ice maker for our Hall. Based on the figures of 1977, within six months the ice maker paid for itself and has netted us a savings of \$1,600 for this year. Also, we feel that it is because of the new capital improvement expenditures incurred during the past year related to the Church Hall, that our Hall rental deposits have increased by \$1,300, an increase of four more bookings over the previous year.

The Parish Council has continued to pass the bulk of the burden of the Church Cultural Building operation to the outside rentors of the Church Hall in order to be able to provide the Church facilities to our Church Organizations, Church members, and the Non-Church Organizations within our community at a minimal rental basis.

CHART OF HALL USAGE

The above tables indicate that out of 157 weekend days the Hall was not in use for 51 days. It is important to underline the fact that Church Organizations used the hall 26.4% of the 157 weekend days, while paying, aside from their assessments, only 5.7% of the income; the Armenian Organizations used the Hall 7.5% of the 157 weekend days, while paying only 3.6% of the income; the parishioners used the Hall 14.2% of the 157 weekend days, and paid 18.2% of the income; the outsiders used the Hall 51.9% of the 157 weekend days, and paid 72.5% of the total income of the Hall.

We would like to express our appreciation to Mrs. Helen Armoudlian, and Mr. Nerses Markarian for their management of the various aspects of the Church Cultural Building facilities, and to our maintenance staff for the presentable condition of our buildings.

NEW YEAR'S EVE DINNER DANCE

The annual gala New Year's Eve celebration, under the able chairmanship of Richard Norsigian, was once again a great success with a capacity crowd in attendance. The cooperative spirit of committee members, Helen Armoudlian, Barbara Besh, Katherine Mekjian, and Jacqueline Melkonian made this an outstanding event.

Significant Assembly Actions

- 1. Defeated amendment to by-laws by St. John's parish of Southfield, Michigan. (Presented second time for final approval.) To lift limit of number of Diocesan Delegates from any single parish.
- 2. Defeated proposal by St. Gregory parish of Chicago, Illinois to re-assign clergymen to a different parish every five years.
- 3. Approved proposal of Holy Cross parish of New York City, New York for the creation of a Diocesan Committee for the purposes of identifying and making recommendations for the preservation of historical and religious landmarks, buildings, and institutions having value to the Armenian Church of America.
- 4. Approved proposal of St. James Parish of Watertown, Mass. to establish a theological education fund in the Diocese to educate and provide for the needs of candidates to the priesthood, who would serve in our Diocese. Recommended that funding be by a 1% contribution by each parish of its annual budget.
- 5. a. Adopted a comprehensive mandatory clergy pension plan to be funded by each parish by a minimum payment of \$750.00 annually for each clergyman serving the parish. The Diocese will fund the payments for those clergymen not assigned to a parish. Clergymen can increase their pension benefits by making additional personal payments into the pension fund.
 - b. Approved a \$200.00 monthly benefit to retired clergy of the Diocese for whom there was no retirement provision made previously.
- 6. Adopted the following motion regarding the Church Unity Question:

"It is hereby resolved that this Assembly supports the continuing efforts for achieving unity within the Armenian Church of America. It is further resolved that this - the 75th Diocesan Assembly - empowers the Diocesan Council and the Primate to accept and approve guidelines for unification as may be developed by the combined negotiating committees."

- 7. Approved the creation of a pilot district program to test effectiveness of the archdiocesan plan. Pilot location to be determined by the Primate and Diocesan Council.
- 8. Received reports from and financially supported as line items in the budget the continuation of the activities of the Choir Association, A.C.Y.O.A., Council for Religious Education, Council for Armenian Schools, The Primate's Legate in Washington, D.C. and the office of Vicar General in Canada.
- 9. Accepted the invitation of St. John's parish of Southfield, Michigan to host the 76th Diocesan Assembly in May of 1978.
