RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

- "5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
- 6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his (or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased by the Parish Assembly.
- 7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members, provided they have attained the age of 21.
- 8. Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years."

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

- "16. The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
 - 17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
 - 22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question."

PASTOR'S REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

With the grace and mercy of God, we, the members of St. John's Armenian Church Community, have spent another year under the shadow of our Holy Mother Church. With a clear conscience, I declare that I did my human utmost to serve St. John's without sparing the graces which the Lord God has bestowed upon me. I am grateful to God for the opportunity to serve St. John's Armenian Church for another year.

WORSHIP SERVICES

Divine Liturgy was celebrated, and Armenian and English sermons were delivered every Sunday. Services were also offered during the week in accordance with the requirements of our Church traditions.

Under the auspices of St. John's Armenian Church, Divine Liturgy was celebrated in Ann Arbor, Michigan on two separate occasions.

We also assisted our Sister Parishes throughout the year whenever the need arose. We will continue to provide the services of a clergyman to our Sister Parishes in their times of need.

PASTORAL STAFF

In 1981, our Church operated with an adequate pastoral staff. The Rev. Fr. Haik Donikian, Assistant Pastor, and the Very Rev. Fr. Papken Anoushian, resident undergraduate student at Wayne State University assisted me in attending to the needs of our Church and Community.

SACRAMENTS AND RITES

During 1981, the following Sacraments and Rites were officiated: Baptism and Confirmation of infants and adults, 87; Engagement Services, 8; Holy Matrimony, 48; and Funeral Services, 79.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS OF SERVICES

The following clergymen celebrated the Divine Liturgy and preached, or were present at our Church Services in connection with their visits to Detroit in 1981; Most Rev. Archbishop Sion Manoogian, Chairman of the Supreme Spiritual Council of Holy Etchmiadsin; His Eminence, Archbishop Shahe Ajemian, Chancellor of the Armenian Patriarchate of Jerusalem; His Grace, Bishop Papken Varjabedian, Diocesan Legate of the Armenian Church in the Nation's Capitol; Very Rev. Fr. Asbed Balian, Chief of Patrolcal, Armenian Patriarchate of Jerusalem; Very Rev. Fr. Haigazoun Melkonian, Pastor, St. Gregory the Illuminator Armenian Church, Haverhill, Mass.; Rev. Fr. Nerses Jebejian, Dean, Seminary of the Armenian Patriarchate of Jerusalem; Rev. Fr. Garabed Kochakian, Pastor, Armenian Church of Our Saviour, Worchester, Mass. On behalf of our Church, I extend my appreciation to our Church hierarchs and her dedicated servants for the opportunity of praying and exalting the Lord together at St. John's,

In connection with the worship service of our Church, it is my duty and privilege to thank each and every member of our Komitas Choir and the Deacons of our Church for their dedication and service to our Church and her worshipping congregation. Again, it is my pleasure to acknowledge, specifically Deacon Ara Haig, Choirmaster, who worked diligently during the past year to make our services dignified and inspiring. During the officiation of the Sacraments and Rites of our Church, Deacons Ara Haig, Daniel Shahan, John Semizian, Michael Ohanesian, Mihran Hoplamazian, Richard Norsigian and Hagop Asadurian have assisted us as often as possible and we thank them for their concern for the dignity of our Sacramental Services. Again, we must state here that we are in need of a deacon upon whose assistance we can rely upon regularly for our Sacraments and Rites.

PASTORAL VISITATIONS

Hospital visitations, nursing home visitations to the sick and elderly, home visitations to the shut-ins, home visitations for consolation, home blessings, visitations with families of the Parish in connection with the Sacraments and for various other reasons have been attended to by myself, Father Haik Donikian and Father Papken Anoushian conscientiously and to the utmost of our ability. I would like to remind our parishioners again to inform the Church Office directly when the services of a clergyman are needed.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Under the sponsorship of St. John's Armenian Church and the Church School, the Adult Religious Education Program continued in 1981.

Self-contained Adult Religious Education Courses, Section I were again offered by Mr. Martin Cholakian. I take this opportunity to express my gratitude to Mr. Cholakian for his commendable efforts in this regard. Self-contained Courses, Section II were held under my instruction.

Bible Study Classes were conducted during the year in Armenian by Father Haik Donikian.

We encourage our parishioners to avail themselves of the opportunities to learn more about our Church and her teachings.

ADMINISTRATIVE DUTIES

My administrative responsibilities during the past year have included office work and management, Parish Council and Church Auxiliary Organizations' general body and committee meetings, attendance and participation in organizational functions, promotion of educational and cultural programs, coordination of Church organizations, fundraising and involvement in the various aspects of the building expansion program.

PUBLICATIONS AND PUBLIC RELATIONS

During the past year, I have continued to follow closely and offer my time and advice to the Editor of our Church Monthly Publication. I take this opportunity to thank the Editorial Staff and, particularly, the Editor of the Torch Bearer, Mrs. Gloria Mikaelian for the commendable services she renders to our Church in connection with this publication.

Public Relations during 1981 were generally confined to presence at, and offering invocations and presenting lectures to various Armenian organizations, conducting Church and Museum tours for religious, educational, and youth groups for the purpose of introducing the Armenian Church, history, and cultural heritage.

SPECIAL FEATURES OF 1981 AND ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS OF COMMITTEES

Construction of the Family Recreation Center progressed during 1981, and will culminate with the Dedication Ceremonies of the Center, on Sunday, February 14, 1982, coinciding with the 50th Anniversary Celebration of St. John's Armenian Church.

During the past year the Activities Committee, which had been initially established in 1980, to develop programs of interest for all segments of our community, was formally structured and appointed. Activities and programs have been coordinated by our full-time Activities Director, Miss Barbara Sarkisian, since she assumed her position in May, 1981. With the opening of the Recreation Center, it is my expectation that wider community interest in the programs will be generated.

For the second year, a capable and resourceful group of young parishioners accepted the challenge of raising funds to help offset the Parish Council's commitment of \$200,000 towards the Building Expansion Project. Under the chairmanship of Dr. and Mrs. V. Michael Armoudlian, these young people coordinated one of the finest dinners tendered in our Parish. "Duglass & Dorsey" was a culinary masterpiece, as well as a highly entertaining evening. I thank the Special Fund-Raising Committee for their efforts.

Super Raffle '81 sponsored by the Special Events Committee, chaired by Miss Helen Bagdasarian deserves recognition as a tremendously successful fund-raiser. This Committee, comprised of staunch supporters of our Church, rose to accept the challenge when they were needed the most, and distinguished themselves by their experienced performance.

With deep gratitude I would like, at this time, to extend my appreciation to St. John's Parish Council Member Mr. Andrew Tarpinian, in charge of the St. John's Complex; the Bazaar '81 Committee Chairman, Mr. Edward Haic Korkoian; and the Bingo Committee Chairman, Mr. Vahe Papelian; and to each and every member of their committees for their dedication and their tireless efforts to improve the financial position of St. John's. Without their contributions, the resources of our Church would have fallen short of our growing needs.

DYNAMIC DETROIT – A COMMUNITY UNPARALLELED IN ACCOMPLISHMENTS

In spite of the adverse economic conditions in 1981, particularly in the Detroit area, our dynamic community plunged forth and overwhelmingly supported new projects which will leave a legacy to succeeding generations. St. John's can be proud of the same driving spirit and courage which enabled our forefathers to preserve our heritage.

In April, 1981, we witnessed the culmination of the long and intense process of bringing the Armenian Chair at the University of Michigan into being. The Alex Manoogian Chair of Modern Armenian History was officially announced at a reception held in Ann Arbor. Scores of dignitaries, faculty, friends, and students were present at the ceremony firmly establishing the Armenian Studies Program at the University, made possible through the generosity and commitment of internationally recognized philanthropist Mr. Alex Manoogian.

Detroit Armenians rallied to the call of the Armenian Memorial Monument Committee, spearheaded by Chairman Michael Assarian. St. John's Armenian Church strongly supported the efforts of this Committee resulting in the erection of a bronze and granite statue of Gomidas Vartabed in June, 1981, symbolizing the tragedy of the Armenian people. This magnificent gift to the city of Detroit in commemoration of the Genocide of the Armenian People, stands at a prominent location in downtown Detroit, serving as a tribute not only to the 1½ million Armenians who perished, but also to those whose determination have kept alive the memory of our martyrs.

With St. John's Armenian Church, St. John's Parishioners, and the Detroit Armenian Community providing moral and financial support, the Michigan Opera Theatre presented the premiere professional production in the Western World of Armenia's greatest and most beloved opera, "Anoush" by Armen Tigranian. This ambitious production performed in a new English translation of the traditional opera achieved wide acclaim throughout the media. Our enthusiastic and dedicated community came forth to meet the commitments of production costs.

THE CHALLENGES FACING US IN THE NEW YEAR AND IN THE FUTURE

As we enter 1982, the major challenge facing our community is the completion of St. John's Building Expansion Project. Before us lies the construction of our Museum, Library, and the renovation of our Cultural Building. Although our present facilities are the largest and most impressive in America, we are faced with the necessity of expanding our Complex to enable us to remain in the mainstream of American society with pride and dignity, while we guard our faith, our Armenian culture and heritage. At this time, I strongly urge our parishioners who have not yet made a pledge commitment to the project, to come forth and add their names to the growing list of supporters.

During the past year we have spent consideragle time and resources for the establishment of St. John's Senior Citizens Housing Project. Our efforts thus far have not yet borne fruit, but we are hopeful. In the new year, we will continue our determined efforts for the development of a Senior Citizens Complex.

On Sunday, February 14, 1982, St. John's Armenian Church will celebrate its Fiftieth Anniversary, 1931 - 1981. For the past fifty years St. John's has played a significant role in the life of our community and holds the distinction as the leading Parish in our Diocese, both in size and accomplishments. Every person who was born from the font of St. John's, every couple who has received the blessing of marriage at the Altar of St. John's, and every parishioner who has been raised under the shadow of St. John's must rise to the occasion and join us at this historic Celebration. We must come together on this occasion to thank God for his bountiful blessings and celebrate our accomplishments.

Although it is satisfying to know that we are a strong Parish and that our accomplishments are known not only throughout our Diocese, but throughout the world, and that we possess the resources to build for our future, we cannot, and should not rest. In addition to providing for our own community, during the past few years we have responded generously to the needs of our brothers and sisters living in less desirable circumstances in both Lebanon and Turkey. Here in this country we have also distinguished ourselves as one of the few parishes in the Diocese to participate in the Primates's voluntary Clergy Education Fund. In 1981, St. John's has contributed \$54,000 in annual dues to the Diocese of the Armenian Church, a sizable amount for any single parish.

However, all of our accomplishments and benefactions are not enough. Fortunetely God has blessed our community, and it is our moral duty to share these blessings with others, both within our Diocese and elsewhere in the Armenian Church and Community. I feel that this tremendous Parish, in addition to providing the example and inspiration to others, must help to develop the potential of the total Diocese and the Armenian Church. We are an integral part of the Armenian Church and as such must devise a means a method to assist the Armenian Church. We must start acting our part by being involved on behalf of the Armenian Church. We might consider to make a commitment towards the publication efforts of the Armenian Church. We might consider to underwrite one of the programs of the Diocese; thus helping the Armenian Church to meet one of its needs.

Just responding to an appeal is not enough. We must initiate programs on behalf of the Armenian Church; only then can we find fulfillment and gratification.

APPRECIATION AND CONCLUSION

I take this opportunity to express my heartfelt gratitude and appreciation to Rev. Fr. Haik Donikian, Very Rev. Fr. Papken Anoushian, to the members of the Parish Council, and the Chairman of the Parish Council, Mr. Arthur S. Mardigian, the Armenian Apostolic Society, Auxiliary Organizations and their Executive Bodies, Church Standing Committees, as well as to individual parishioners for their cooperation, services, and sacrifices which enabled our Church to conclude another fruitful year. The accomplishments and the success of our Church are their pride and fulfillment. I pray that God will bless each and every one abundantly. May the Lord God also give us guidance and perseverance to continue our good works.

PARISH COUNCIL CHAIRMAN'S MESSAGE

St. John's Armenian Church has completed an outstanding 1981, due to the total participation of our parishioners and Church Auxiliary Organizations. Their dedication and service despite the economic blight of the automobile industry has made this success possible.

The Parish Council has worked very hard on a number of issues but the Parish Assembly is the governing body of our Church. Unless our Parishioners take an active part in the Annual Parish Assembly to give direction, the Parish cannot meet its' future challenges.

The Armenian Apostolic Society has nearly completed the first phase of our Building Expansion Project. The formal dedication of the Activities Center and Gymnasium will take place on February 14, 1982, in conjunction with the 50th Anniversary of our Parish.

We must continue to move forward and complete the final phase of the total project. The Parish Council has made a total commitment to Senior Citizens Housing with the establishment of the proper legal organizations. We will continue to actively pursue this most important matter until the necessary federal funds have been obtained to make this project a reality.

The Parish Council has added a full time activities director to the Church Staff. We are planning to schedule year round activities for all age groups within our Parish. The development of this program will continue to grow and improve with the completion of the Activities Center and Gymnasium.

Despite rising operational costs of our Church Complex we are trying to keep these costs in perspective with the current inflationary factors. We will be facing many new problems in the future and we must be prepared. We have not had a dues increase for several years. As much as we would like to keep dues at a minimum it has become a very difficult task to generate income to keep our yearly budget balanced.

We must continue to expand our Parish. We must always support the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America, and the Holy Mother See of Etchmiadzin. We must maintain our position as the largest Parish of our Diocese.

We must be proud of our Heritage. We have 50 years behind us. With all your help and dedication and devotion of our Pastor the Very Reverend Father Paren Avedikian, St. John's will always be a dynamic Parish.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Parish Council held 27 regular meetings and six special meetings. The special meetings were held for the election of the Parish Council Executive body and also with the Diocesan Delegates and Church Organization.

The Council also held meetings with various other committees concerning Church Projects and activities.

SPECIAL PARISH ASSEMBLIES

The St. John's Parish Council called a Special Parish Assembly on Tuesday, April 28, 1981. The members gave direction to St. John's delegates regarding issues on the agenda of the 1981 Diocesan Assembly.

Tuesday, May 26, 1981, another Special Parish Assembly was called at which time the Diocesan Delegates reported on the decisions of the Diocesan Assembly.

PLEDGE REPORT

The minimum pledge per annum remained at \$78.00 per individual member and \$156.00 per couple in 1981. The year began with 1147 members and ended with a total membership of 1186, in spite of deletions due to death or removal from membership for non payment of pledges for three consecutive years. Out of the total membership 617 pay the minimum pledge, 349 pay under the minimum, and 220 pay over the minimum.

We would like to bring to the attention of our parishioners that it is the privilege of only the limited income senior citizens and students to make less than the minimum pledge to the Church, All those who are gainfully employed or can afford are expected to abide by the decisions of the Parish Assembly.

St. John's is assessed \$45,00 a year by the Diocese for each pledged member. In addition, the added costs related to membership privileges create an out-of-pocket expense for our Church of \$15.00 a year per member. It is obvious from these figures that it is the duty of each member to pledge no less than the minimum.

THE TORCH BEARER (CHAHAGIR)

Eleven issues of the Torch Bearer (Chahagir) were published during 1981. (Combined July and August issue)

With the cooperation of the reporters, who assisted us in reporting the news and coming events, on a current basis, we were able to maintain the deadline for the monthly publication.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their gratitude to the Editor, Mrs. Gloria Mikaelian, and the Editorial Staff of the Torch Bearer for their dedicated services enabling us to maintain the quality of our Church publication.

YOUTH SPORTS PROGRAM

The 1981 Youth Sports Program experienced successes in two of its three activity programs. The area experiencing the most difficulty in 1981 was the intra-Church basketball league. Enrollments were generally down, and as a result, intra-Church league was confined to the Tuesday girls' program. Unfortunately, the Wednesday and Thursday enrollment would not allow for league play, however, the gymnasium was open for basketball clinic sessions and periods of unstructured activity. Despite the reduced enrollments, the program did produce sufficient numbers of boys and girls who were placed on special teams to compete in the Orthodox Youth Athletic Association Basketball League. In this second activity area, we were represented in four divisions: Senior men, senior girls, intermediate boys, and junior girls. These teams competed on Saturdays and Sundays from December to March. Following the league play, the same teams, along with a Junior boys' team competed in the Annual OYAA sponsored tournament in early March.

During the early summer months the youth were also involved in slow pitch baseball, the third activity area. Teams consisting of senior men, senior girls, and intermediate girls were placed in competition. The games sponsored by OYAA were held Saturdays and Sundays. The baseball season was capped by a OYAA Mid-Western Tournament involving five states.

The 1981 winter basketball program along with the summer baseball program did provide recreational as well as social outlets for our youth. However, we are experiencing the effects of declining enrollments. With the construction of the new youth facility coupled with parent encouragement and participation, it is our hope to attrack a larger segment of youth to participate in social and athletic events in the coming years. Furthermore, we are hoping to expand our program in a variety of areas.

SENIOR CITIZEN LUNCHEONS

St. John's increased its program to twice a month per the decision of the 1981 Parish Assembly. The second and fourth Tuesdays of every month are designated Senior Citizens Day at St. John's Cultural Hall. There is ample time for fellowship among those

who attend following the luncheon and program. A special Thanksgiving luncheon was given the Senior Citizens in November and a special program was presented at their Christmas Party in December.

The entire Senior Citizens Program is subsidized by St. John's with only a minimal amount of charged of those present. Parish Council member, Leo Zamanigian, is present at every luncheon to assist our Senior Citizens in every way possible.

SENIOR CITIZENS HOUSING COMPLEX

As we had stated last year, our legal consultants had advised us to re-submit our application to the Federal Government for funds under the name of a new corporation. In other words in 1980, we were too hasty to apply for Federal Funds for the Senior Citizens' Housing Complex.

In 1981, we created a new corporation, namely St. John's Manor Corporation, specifically to provide housing for the elderly and the handicapped. The Corporation is presently a bonafide Corporation in the eyes of the Government and can qualify for funds. Moreover, the Corporation has it's own savings and checking accounts; the source of these funds being St. John's Armenian Church.

The St. John's Manor Corporation applied to the Federal Government for funding in 1981. The application and the rezoning procedures thus far have cost us \$11,122.32. In spite of initial discouraging news, we are hopeful that eventually our application will be approved for funding, since technically it was found to be acceptable to the Government.

We assure St. John's parishioners that we have not, and we will not spare any effort or funds to make this dream of so many of our parishioners a reality.

SPECIAL FUND-RAISING EVENTS

Super Raffle '81

This Committee was formed this year to handle "Super Raffle 81". This was to assist St. John's Building Fund Committee in meeting the proposed budget for 1981 of \$38.000.

Within a period of nine weeks a total of \$49,000 was collected. After prizes and expenses approximately \$25,000 was applied toward the budget.

A sincere thank you to the committee members and all who assisted them in selling so many tickets in such a short time. Their deligent hard work really paid off. The number of \$100 tickets (490) sold for a single raffle was a first for St. John's.

Duglass and Dorsey

This gala event started with an exquisite gourmet dinner prepared by the world famous chef, Duglass Duglass. A string quartet provided musical selections during the dinner. The dinner was followed by a comedian who entertained the guests. The evening was concluded with big band dancing featuring the Tommy Dorsey Orchestra. The net proceeds for this event were over \$11,700.00.

THE ARMENIAN HERITAGE COLLECTION

The first appearance of 1981, was a showing in Detroit on February 25, sponsored by the Daughters of Vartan. The Daughters changed their format from a luncheon to dinner at the Church Hall. Although this was the sixth Detroit showing, over 400 persons attended.

On September 26 and 27, the Collection was shown in Watertown, Mass., under the sponsorship of the Armenian Cultural and Educational Center. On this occasion Varsenick Apkarian, Margaret Derderian, and Sona Yavruian accompanied the Collection and prepared the presentation.

Th. A.G.B.U. of Chicago sponsored an appearance of the Heritage Collection on Sunday, November 8, 1:00 P.M. at the Westin Hotel in downtown Chicago. Mrs. Alex Manoogian was honored at this event and Mr. and Mrs. Edward Mardigian attended from the tri state area.

The Armenian Heritage Collection which is co-sponsored by the A.G.B.U. and St. John's was featured in the special 75th Anniversary issue of the Hoosharar, the A.G.B.U. periodical. It was noted to be a meaningful contribution to the Armenian cultural scene.

ARMENIAN ARTIFACTS

Guided tours of St. John's Museum were provided in 1981 to Church Auxiliary Organizations, community organizations, student groups, visiting groups, and visiting Armenian and non-Armenian dignitaries.

Featured articles of interest and ancient relics from the Armenian past continue to arouse curiosity and create a sense of pride in our heritage

During the year eleven artifacts have enriched the Museum which houses the largest collection of Armenian artifacts in this country. The following is the list of the new acquisitions for the year 1981: One Kemancha, one Manuscript, two paintings, one silver belt, one silver box, one large dining tray, one cooking pot with cover, one metal plate, a set of gold and silver medallions of the Vehapar, and a complete set of Cilician Armenian silver and brass coins.

BUILDING REPORT 1981

During 1981, the Church Cultural Building continued to be used by the Church, Church Organizations, non-Church Organizations of the community, and for rental purposes by individual Church members and by outsiders.

We have received repeat abd referral customers throughout 1981, and have increased our hall operating income by 4.6% over 1980. One of the major improvements for the year of 1981 was the installation of three new 150 kilovolt amp transformers by Detroit Edison, at no cost to the Church, to correct a perpetual problem of our hall and church lights dimming approximately every twelve minutes when the air conditioning compressor cycles. We would like to express our appreciation to Mr. Noray Sarkisian for his tireless efforts in discovering our undersized transformer problems. Some of the other improvements include: Installation of four new handicapped parking spaces, new carpeting in the main church and side hall entrances, and the enclosure of our unsightly trash dumpster.

The accompanying tables indicate that out of 156 weekend days the hall was not in use for 54 days. During 1981, Church Organizations used the hall 13.7% of the total weekend days used while paying, aside from their assessments, only 2% of the income; the Armenian Organizations used the hall 11.8% of the total weekend days used while paying only 4.8% of the income; the parishioners used the hall 18.6% of the total weekend days used while paying 18.7% of the total income; the outsiders used the hall 55.9% of the total weekend days used and paid 74.5% of the total income.

Every Thursday of the year (with the exception of Church holidays), between 200 and 300 persons attend the popular bingo offered by St. John's

We wish the thank the many Church organizations for their volunteer assistance on a once-a-month basis. Church organizations are encouraged to cooperate with their leaders when called upon for assistance. All available volunteers are needed to continue our fine program.

The dedication of the members of this committee makes possible an indispensable addition to the annual income of St. John's. The Bingo Program has provided almost \$460,000 in the nine years it has been in existence.

The Executive Committee wishes to express its appreciation to Rose Boudakain, who stays on top of every aspect of the Bingo Program and assures a successful operation.

NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT

During 1981, there were two requests for financial assistance for purchasing homes in the Magnolia Sub-division. These parishioner received the maximum financial assistance. As of the year ending 1981, we have 7 parishioners out of 8 that still have outstanding balances totaling \$50,000. The amount paid back during the past year by these parishioners totaled \$11,500. An additional \$40,157 was used to purchase a house on Winora

Avenue which is immediately adjacent to our Church complex. The Parish Council, as previously reported, has committed itself to our parishioners in purchasing all homes on Winora Avenue that are for sale; and will, in turn, rent or re-sell these homes to our parishioners in order to preserve our entire complex.

Presently the house we purchased is being rented to a parishioner who is contemplating purchase of this house in the near future.

SOCIAL CONCERN FUND

During 1981, St. John's Social Concern Fund has helped various individuals or families who either have sought assistance from the Church or about whose predicament the Church was made aware of. The total contributions to these recipients for the year 1981 was \$5,200.

STERLING HEIGHTS PROPERTY

The decision was made by the 1980 Parish Assembly to sell the Sterling Heights property. After approval from the Primate and the Diocesan Council, the property was listed with a real estate company. The property is again listed with the B. F. Chamberlain Real Estate Company and the listing is to expire in July of 1982.

ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE

The Activities Committee was formalized in April, 1981, and a full time Activities Director was added to the Church Staff. The Activities Board consists of 5 members and is accountable to the Parish Council. The Board Members are Miss Barbara Sarkisian, Activities Director; Mr. Ron Godoshian, Parish Council Liaison; Dr. Rose Berberian, Dr. Paul Hovsepian, and Mr. Michael Megregian, members at large.

The Committee worked very hard to prepare year round activities for all segments of our parish. Brochures were prepared and mailed to parishioners informing them of all of the various activities during 1981.

COMPUTER SERVICES

During 1981, St. John's has continued to utilize the computer services for many tasks. Through the Church Office the computer can provide mailing lists, membership lists, and labels for each Church organization. Today most of the work for the Church general ledger system is being done at our Church Office.

With continued planned improvements the efficiency of our Church Office will enhance in the future.

FINE ARTS COMMITTEE

"Fanciful World of Sculptures" featured an outstanding collection of sculpture along with a variety of paintings, watercolors, drawings, and graphics by a select group of Armenian artists during the weekend of November 13, coinciding with St. John's Bazaar '81. The Fine Arts Committee coordinated one of the finest and richest exhibitions in this particular event.

Because of the prevailing economic conditions, the Fine Arts Committee limited their activities during 1981, and concentrated their efforts on the Bazaar Exhibition. The results were extremely successful.

CULTURAL EVENTS SPONSORED BY ST. JOHN'S

St. John's Armenian Church, St. John's Parishioners and the Detroit Armenian Community overwhelmingly supported the Michigan Opera Theatre's production of "Anoush" by Armen Tigranian, presented in October 1981. St. John's assisted MOT General Director Dr. David DiChiera and his assistants in every way possible to meet the challenge of creating production details for the new English translation of Armenia's greatest opera. St. John's hosted a three-day planning session for the production team and also donated the use of the Cultural Hall for a benefit luncheon planned by one of the fund-raising committees. The determined fund-raising efforts of Mrs. Alice Haidostian to help offset the tremendous production costs, were strongly supported by St. John's.

GOMIDAS MEMORIAL MONUMENT ERECTED IN DETROIT

In honor of the one and one-half million Armenians massacred during the Genocide of the Armenian Nation, a beautiful and symbolic statue of Gomidas Vartabed was erected on the corner of Woodward and Jefferson Avenues in downtown Detroit, in July, 1981.

Through the efforts of the Armenian Memorial Monument Committee led by its dynamic Chairman, Mr. Michael Assarian, along with the moral and financial support of the community, the dream of immortalizing our martyrs became a reality.

St. John's Armenian Church participated in the fund-raising effort, by donating \$2,500 towards the monument on behalf of the parishioners. An additional \$10,940 was donated through St. John's Armenian Church by individual parishioners. Also, a number of our parishioners made contributions directly to the Committee.

The Diocesan Assembly was presided over by His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Primate of the Diocese of the Armenian Church of America..

SIGNIFICANT ASSEMBLY MATTERS

- 1. Judge Vincent Gurahian (St. James, Westchester) was elected Chairman of the Assembly.
- 2. Very Reverend Father Arshen Aivazian (Holy Trinity, Cheltenham) was elected to a 4-year term on the Diocesan Council.
- 3. Reverend Father Karekin Kasparian (St. James, Westchester) was elected to a 4-year term on the Diocesan Council).

- 4. Mr. Edward Berberian (St. James, Watertown) was elected to a 4-year term on the Diocesan Council.
- Mr. Sarkis Bedevian (St. Leon, Fairlawn) was elected to a 4-year term on the Diocesan Council.
- 6. Mr. Zarvin Kasparian (Armenian Church of Our Saviour, Worcester) was elected to a 4-year term on the Diocesan Council.
- 7. Colonel George Juskalian (St. Mary, Washington, D. C.) was elected to a 10-year term on the Diocesan Board of Trustees.
- 8. Messrs. Simon Javizian, Arthur S. Mardigian, and Edward Korkoian (St. John's, Southfield) were elected to a one-year term on the Diocesan Budget Committee.
- 9. Mr. Harry Terzian (St. John's, Southfield) was appointed as one of three Parlimentarians of the Assembly.
- 10. Mr. Simon Javizian (St. John's, Southfield) was appointed to the Courtesies Committee of the Assembly.
- 11. A Committee was appointed to deal with the uncanonical acts of the Holy Cross Armenian Church of Toronto, Canada. This Committee proposed to give full authority to the Primate and Diocesan Council to deal with the Holy Cross parish and to take the necessary actions to resolve the problem.
- 12. Archbishop Torkom Manoogian's address to the Assembly included the following highlights:
 - The question of unity in the Armenian Church is one of ecclesiastical discipline and not a question of two "sides," because there are not two Armenian Churches.
 - Finances have become an overriding concern. While the sums raised by our head-quarters have increased in recent years, and while parish assessments, even though declining proportionately, have nonetheless soared in absolute terms, we are having trouble keeping pace with dramatically rising costs.
 - We must expand in the area of social services.
- 13. Approved for the first time a change to Article 14B of the Bylaws concerning the selection of candidates for elections and the governing of elections.
- 14. Approved for the first time a change to Article 17 of the Bylaws concerning the voting procedures at Parish Assemblies.
- 15. Approved for the first time an addition to Article 33 of the Bylaws concerning the proper payment of Diocesan Assessments,
- 16. Approved for the first time an addition to Article 36 of the Bylaws concerning the duties of the Auditing Committee.
- 17. Approved a proposal to appoint a "study committee" concerning special membership status for semi-residents in Florida.
- 18. Approved a proposal concerning unity discussions with the separated brethren:
 - a. That this Assembly directs that Unity discussions with the Prelacy shall resume and continue without letup until an agreement acceptable to the Diocesan Assembly has been reached.
 - b. That the Diocesan Bylaws Committee be and the the same is hereby dissolved.
 - c. That this Assembly appoint or elect a Diocesan Unity Committee consisting of seven (7) members who shall be either Diocesan Delegates or members of a Parish Council.
 - d. That such Unity Committee shall elect its own Chairman.
 - e. That such Committee shall immediately upon the adjournment of this Assembly communicate with its Prelacy counterpart to arrange for as many meetings as may be necessary to bring about mutually agreeable guidelines for the uni-

fication of the Armenian Church in America subject to the approval of the next annual Diocesan Assembly.

f. That such Committee shall submit its report and recommendations to the next annual Diocesan Assembly.

By means of a substitute motion, the existing Diocesan Bylaws Committee was elected to continue the dialogue with our separated brethren and to pursue the unity of the Armenian Church in the United States acceptable to the Diocesan Assembly.

- 19. Approved a proposal concerning punitive actions that may be taken by the Primate and the Diocesan Council on the payment of dues to the Diocese.
- 20. Approved a 1981 budget totaling \$1,175.00.00.
- 21. Approved a proposed 1982 budget totaling \$1,145,000.00.
- 22. Approved a proposal to appoint a five-member committee to formulate the plans and organizational details for the creation of a Department of Clergy Recruitment within the Diocese and allocate a sum of \$10,000 for the performance of its function.
- 23. Accepted the invitation of the Holy Resurrection Armenian Church of New Britain, Connecticut to host the 80th Annual Diocesan Assembly in 1982.

Dear Parishioners:

By the time you receive this report, the first phase of our major Building Expansion Project will be entirely completed. We had originally planned a much earlier completion date; however, substantial delays beyond our control, caused by the Sheet Metal Workers strike and the bankruptcy of one of our major contractors, hindered our plans.

At this time, the gymnasium, which is larger than a regulation size high school gym, and the racquet ball court are completed. The kitchen, locker rooms, shower rooms, sauna, craft room and exercise room will be completed by January 18. The basement corridor and lobby will be completed by the first of February. We believe that our facilities will be the finest of their kind, and I am certain that you will agree upon visiting the new Recreation Center. Our children, grandchildren, and great-grandchildren will forever be grateful for our foresight and thoughtfulness in providing these beautiful recreation facilities.

It is our feeling that the occasion of the 50th Anniversary Celebration of our St. John's Armenian Church on February 14, 1982 will be a fitting occasion on which to officially open these new facilities. The Dedication Ceremonies for the Recreation Center will be presided over by His Eminence, Archbishop Torkom Manoogian, Primate of the Armenian Church of America, immediately preceeding the Celebration Banquet.

At the present time, we are approximately \$175,000 short in the cash funds required to completely fund the first phase of our project. We would like to enter our new facilities, without a mortgage, as we did with our Church and Cultural Building. It is our firm belief that our parishioners will do their utmost to make this possible.

On behalf of the entire Committee, I express our heartfelt appreciation for the cooperation, support, and contributions of our parishioners. We look forward to see all of you at the 50th Anniversary Celebration of St. John's Armenian Church and at the Dedication Ceremonies of our Recreation Center.

AUDITORS' RECOMMENDATIONS
