RULES AND REGULATIONS CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP

- 5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fullfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
- 6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his (or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased by the Parish Assembly.
- 7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members, provided they have attained the age of 21.
- 8. Members who fail their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years.
- 9. No one may be a voting member in more than one parish at the same time."

RULES AND REGULATIONS GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY

- "16. The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
- 17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
- 22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question.
- 43. The Parish Priest shall preside over the meeting of the Parish Council and the Parish Assembly."

PASTOR'S REPORT

Dear Parishioners:

With the grace and mercy of God, we the members of St. John's Armenian Church Community, have spent another year under the shadow of our Holy Mother Church. With a clear conscience, I declare that I did my human utmost in providing pastoral care and guidance to St. John's and her members, without sparing the graces which the Lord God has bestowed upon me. I am grateful to God for the opportunity to serve St. John's Armenian Church for another year.

WORSHIP SERVICES

Throughout the year 1991, the Very Rev. Fr. Samuel Aghoyan, Assistant Pastor, has helped me in attending to the needs of our Church Community.

Divine Liturgy was celebrated and Armenian and English sermons were delivered every Sunday. Services were also offered during the week in accordance with our Church traditions.

SACRAMENTS AND RITES

During 1991, the following Sacraments and Rites were officiated: Baptism and Confirmation of infants and adults, 80; Engagement Services, 4; Holy Matrimony, 18; Funeral Services, 50.

PASTORAL VISITATIONS

Hospital visitations, nursing home visitation to the sick and elderly, home visitations for consolation, home blessings, visitations with families of the Parish in connection with Sacraments and for various other reasons have been attended to by myself and the Very Rev. Fr. Samuel Aghoyan. I would like to remind our parishioners to inform the Church Office directly when the services of a clergyman are needed.

ADMINISTRATIVE AND RELATED DUTIES

My administrative responsibilities during the past year have included office work and management, Parish Council and Church Auxiliary Organizations' general body and committee meetings, attendance and participation in organizational functions, coordination of Church organizations, fundraising, identification of each book in the Library, its categorization and proper placement on the shelves and identification and description of artifacts for cataloging purposes.

THE PASSING OF THE LATE PASTOR AND PRIMATE

It is with great sadness that we record the passing of the late Pastor of St. John's, The Most Rev. Archbishop Sion Manoogian, on July 16, 1991 in Holy Etchmiadsin, Armenia. Archbishop Sion served as the Pastor of St. John's from 1946-1952, and for two terms, from 1958-1966, he served as the Primate of our Diocese. From 1969 to mid 1970's Archbishop Sion was the Resident Bishop at St. John's. More recently Archbishop Sion served as the Chairman of the Supreme Spiritual Council of the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadsin. Archbishop Sion left behind him a legacy of abiding faith in God and devotion and love for the Armenian Church and the Mother See of Holy Etchmiadsin. His love for the Armenian Church led him to bequeath his life's savings to Holy Mother See to continue her mission of educating and preparing clergymen. May the Lord God have mercy upon the soul of His Servant and reward him in His Eternal Kingdom.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF SERVICES

The following clergymen celebrated the Divine Liturgy, preached, or were present at our Church Services in connection with their visits to Detroit in 1991: His Grace, Bishop Khajag Barsamian, Primate, Diocese of the Armenian Church; Most Rev. Archbishop Shahe Ajemian of Jerusalem; His Grace Bishop Barkev Mardirosian, Primate, Diocese of Karabagh; The Very Rev. Fr. Haigazoun Melkonian, Pastor, Holy Trinity Armenian Church of Cheltenham, Pa. I extend my appreciation to our Church hierarchs and her servants for the opportunity of praying and exalting the Lord together at St. John's.

In connection with the worship services of our Church, it is my duty and privilege to thank each and every member of our Komitas Choir and the Deacons of our Church for their dedication and service to our Church and her worshipping congregation. I specifically acknowledge Deacon Ara Haig, Choirmaster; and Mrs. Michele Medley, Organist, who worked diligently during the past year to make our services dignified and inspiring.

During the officiation of the Sacraments and Rites of our Church, our Deacons and Altar Servers have assisted us as often as possible, and we thank them for their concern for the dignity of our Sacramental Services, without expectation of remuneration, as they donate any gifts received to the Komitas Choir of St. John's. I also extend my appreciation to Mr. Mardiros Hatcherian for conscientiously carrying out the duties of the sacristan, maintaining the beauty and decor of the sanctuary without benefit of remuneration.

ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF COMMITTEES

With deep gratitude, I would like to extend my appreciation to the following Committees and their Chairman: Bingo Committee, Chairman, Michael Blakian; Oriental Rug Sale Committee, Chairmen, Richard and Isabelle Vahratian; 1000 Club Raffle Committee, Chairmen, Arthur Apkarian and Richard Apkarian, and Picnic Committee, Chairman, Greg Boyajian, and to every member of these and the Bazaar Committee for their tireless efforts to improve the financial position of our Church.

We have come to rely upon all of the above annual fundraising projects. It is a concern of mine, as it should be the concern of each and every parishioner, that without the efforts of these committees, the resources of our Church would fall far shorter than her needs.

SPECIAL FEATURES OF 1991

The dedication of the Edward and Helen Mardigian Library on July 26 was the most important event within St. John's Community during 1991. Finally the one phase of our cultural expansion had been realized and all of you were invited to be part of the celebration. The great festive mood which prevailed among the 400 who attended was the expression of

pride in seeing a task fulfilled after many years of anticipation. The Mardigians, Edward and Helen, had more reason than any of us to be proud seeing that what they had so generously donated to, had materialized and finally in their home parish, there was a special Center of Learning and Information bearing their proud name.

At the end of 1991, in spite of another financial set back, St. John's has reached a humble, yet important milestone. In 1985 at the time of the celebration of the 25th Anniversary of my ordination to the Priesthood, with a personal donation of \$5,000 I set the pace for this Parish to establish an Endowment Fund to insure the ease of its' financial operations. Concurrent to that, the Committee heading the celebration of my anniversary set up an Educational and Cultural Fund in my name. Gradually as people heard and inquired about the Funds they also set up Funds in their own or their loved ones names. Thus by the end of 1991 total perpetual endowments for various purposes within St. John's had reached a respectable sum of over half a million dollars. We already know now that the sum will grow at least to \$600,000 by the end of the year 1992. It is the obligation of each parishioner to encourage others, or to set up themselves, endowments as a means of securing the mission and the future of the Church.

Almost beginning in January 1991 our community started to witness the not yet acculturalized countenance of a special group of Armenians, the displaced Armenians from Baku. By the end of the year we had almost one hundred families living in the Greater Detroit Metropolitan area, Lansing, and Grand Rapids. I have had the opportunity to meet with them, both on an individual basis and as a group, and my impression is that these people are no different than the survivors of the Genocide who arrived on these shores some 75 years ago. Aside from being ill-prepared in many ways, they also have the unfortunate lack of knowledge of their mother-tongue, the Armenian language; but they are Armenian and they have a great desire to belong. To receive these people in a proper manner, and to make them feel welcome and wanted should be our goal. Some individuals in our community have already expressed these proper attitudes in many ways; by opening their homes to them, by guiding them to meet the challenges of their new environment, by providing them means of transportation, and by very generous support. My hope is that this attitude becomes the attitude of the majority within our community.

A TASK ACCOMPLISHED

For many years, with you, I was anticipating that the Museum would become a reality. Without knowing the complexities of the task, in the past I even declared its opening was within our grasp. However, finally we are over the intricacies, the hurdles, and the obstacles and in a few months we will be dedicating the Alex and Marie Manoogian Museum of St. John's. Without the fear of exaggeration, let me state that ours is not only the largest collection of Armenian Artifacts in America, but also a respectable collection throughout the Armenian world. The collection will finally be on display according to standards unheard of in Armenian circles, each artifact being presented in a manner befitting it or in relation to other artifacts bearing relevance to it. The benefactors of the Museum, Alex and Marie Manoogian should be commended for having had the foresight and the generosity of spirit to leave a legacy of this magnitude in their home community.

CHALLENGES FACING US IN THE FUTURE

Armenia and our commitment to its survival ought to be our foremost concern. When I say Armenia, as an integral part of it, I mean Karabagh as well. The Farm Project which we started in 1991 ought to continue, the goal being to add as many projects as possible to make Armenia self-sustaining; to which end we will continue our direct appeals, our publicity to inform the community and our annual Walk-a-Thon project. Any suggestion to augment or improve on these means is welcome, wholeheartedly. Aside from our financial contributions, though, our active involvement in winning American governmental support for the defense and the integrity of Armenian lands as well as foreign aid to benefit Armenia is the responsibility of each and every Armenian. As citizens of a country to which we contribute our share, we are entitled to demand that among other nations, our own is not neglected.

To improve the financial resources of our Church, in 1991, I was part of a small committee to investigate the feasibility of the complete renovation of our facilities. The investigation led us to the conclusion that in order to do a thorough renovation, 1.5 million dollars would be needed. The need for the renovation, itself, ought not to be questioned. Neglecting it will lead us definitely to annual deficits, simply because the age of our facilities has put us out of competition. Probably, myself included, the Committee arrived at a hasty conclusion that the renovation ought to proceed soon. Keep in mind that our concern was the diminishing returns from the hall operation. The deteriorating economic climate in the country and in particular the state, did not help. Renovation in phases is not the answer either. I am more than ever convinced that we should do a quick face-lift to the Cultural Hall, put together a Fund-Raising Committee, target a date of five to seven years in the future and with full force run after that goal. The cooperation of parishioners, however, is vital in the success of this approach. Simply, either we renovate our facilities and reap the financial benefits from it, or at the minimum double our annual pledges to make up the deficit created because of it.

I feel that for a long time now there is one group among our parishioners whose education, talents, and expertise have not been utilized for the betterment of our community. Without sounding like a male chauvinist, simply stated I have in mind, the thirty to fifty year old men of our community. The ladies who are willing to contribute already have the necessary outlets within the organizational make-up of the Church, and if some feel that the outlets are inadequate, our organizations are flexible enough to provide new ones. It is my fault as well as the fault of the total community for not challenging the group I have in mind to contribute their share for the well being and the vitality of our Parish. I am hopeful that these words touch some people to organize a group for the good and further progress of this Parish.

APPRECIATION AND CONCLUSION

I take this opportunity to express my heartfelt appreciation to Very Rev. Fr. Samuel Aghoyan, to the members of the Parish Council, and especially the Chairman of the Parish Council, Mr. Vahram Fantazian, the Armenian Apostolic Society, Church Auxiliary Organizations and their Executive Bodies, Church Standing Committees, as well as to the individual parishioners for their cooperation, services, and sacrifices.

At this time, I also extend my sincere gratitude to all those who contributed to the Cultural and Educational Endowment Fund established in my name on the occasion of the 25th anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood in 1985. The total of these contributions is \$91,066.90, for which I am deeply indebted to the donors.

I pray that God will bless each and every one of us abundantly. May the Lord God also give us guidance and perseverance to continue our good works.

Throughout this past year, 1991, the 60th Anniversary of St. John's Armenian Church and the thirtieth year at our present sight, our thoughts were once again with our brethren in the independent Republic of Armenia. We were elated with the fact that we now have a free and independent government that has been officially recognized by the United States of America. Our brothers and sisters can finally, after years of Soviet domination, determine their own destiny. My final thanks is to our pastor, The Very Reverend Father Paren Avedikian who has demonstrated his love for the Armenian Church and our parish by serving the needs of our church community with unselfish dedication and devotion. We are thankful for his spiritual and cultural guidance.

PARISH COUNCIL MEETINGS

The Parish Council held 28 regular meetings. Throughout the year special meetings were held for the election of the Parish Council Executive Body, building policies and combined Parish Council and Diocesan Delegates.

The Parish Council chaired the annual Church Bazaar and in that capacity held Bazaar meetings with representatives of Church organizations immediately preceding each Parish Council meeting beginning in July 1991 and concluding in October 1991.

PLEDGE REPORT

In accordance with the decision of the 1990 Parish Assembly, the minimum pledge of \$125 per individual member and \$250 per couple was in effect during 1991. The year began with 1264 members and ended with a membership of 1221 because of deletions due to deaths or removal from membership due to non-payment of pledges for three consecutive years. Out of the total membership, 760 pay the minimum pledge versus 799 last year, 295 pay under the minimum versus 270 last year; and 166 pay over the minimum versus 195 last year.

St. John's is assessed \$80 a year by the Diocese for each pledge member. In addition, the added costs related to membership privileges create an out-of-pocket expense for our Church in the amount of \$25 per member. These costs ought to be borne in mind by individuals who make less than the minimum pledge. Our desire is to see that at least these expenses are covered.

The timely payment of pledges should be adhered to by each member. There are some wonderful souls who include a check for their total pledge along with their pledge card. Because of these people, as we began 1992, we had advance payment of pledges amounting to \$37,789. On the other hand, there are some on our pledge system who wait until December to pay their pledges. These people sent in a total of \$42,000 in December, 1991. Paying one's pledge on a more timely basis will make it easier for the Church to meet its expenses. There is another group who is accustomed to sending in their pledges for the prior year in January or February of the following year. If these people are trying to prove a point that the Church By-Laws entitles them this privilege, they are then hiding behind the letter and not the spirit of the law.

In 1989, St. John's operated with a deficit of \$100,000, in 1990 the deficit was \$60,497 and in 1991 it is \$96,401. In our 1991 message we had made an appeal to exceed our pledge payments by \$5, \$10, \$25 or \$100. Unfortunately only a handful took us seriously, for which we record our thanks to those who increased their pledges. At this rate, unless drastic measures are taken soon the surplus which we have accumlated over the years, and upon whose interest we rely, will be depleted within two to three years.

SENIOR CITIZENS' LUNCHEONS

St. John's continued to sponsor Senior Citizens' Luncheons every Tuesday of the month at the Church Cultural Hall. The Senior Citizens' Program, since its inception in 1975, has been subsidized by St. John's with only a minimal amount charged to those who attend. Mr. and Mrs. Edward Mardigian, again this year, have graciously offered to subsidize two or three Senior Citizens' Luncheons per month creating additional opportunities for the Senior Citizens of our community to gather and socialize.

Pastors and Parish Council extend their sincere gratitude to Mr. and Mrs. Edward Mardigian for their thoughtfulness and generosity, and to Mr. Leo Zamanigian who is present at the luncheons assisting our Senior Citizens in every way possible.

BUILDING REPORT

During 1991, the Church Cultural Building continued to be used by the Church, Church Organizations, non-Church Organizations of the community, and for rental purposes by individual Church and non-Church members.

In 1991, we renovated the Ladies' and Men's Rooms of the Cultural Hall and installed stainless steel waste containers in all of them. We also purchased new skirting, insulated coffee and water servers, and serving trays and stands. The major renovations for the year 1991 are listed under Future Maintenance Provision Expenses.

The hall operating income further decreased in 1991. The hall continued to incur the total linen bill amounting to \$6,760 and advertising in the yellow pages amounting to \$5,441. The accompanying tables indicate that out of 156 Fridays, Saturdays and Sundays, the Hall was not in use 86 days during 1991. The Church Organizations used the Hall 18.57% of the total weekend days used, while paying only 6.25% of the income. The Armenian Organizations used the Hall 10.00% of the total weekend days used, while paying only 3.99% of the weekend income. The parishioners used the Hall 14.29% of the total weekend days used, while paying 11.51% of the total income. The outsiders used the Hall 57.14% of the total weekend days used and paid 78.25% of the total income.

We again record with dismay that some of our parishioners and even some organizations of the community, rather than taking advantage of our facilities, are choosing other places to hold their weddings and banquets.

In 1991 we continued to put aside one dollar per plate from the operation of the Cultural Hall in a Kitchen Major Maintenance Provision which totaled \$12,562, as reflected on our balance sheet. Church organizations, Armenian Organizations and Hokejashes were absolved from contributing to this major maintenance fund.

As of the month of May we will also be putting aside \$1.50 per plate for Future Hall Maintenance Provision. Hokejashes and Rec. Center Dinners will be exempt from this policy.

We express our sincere appreciation to Mrs. Helen Armoudlian for handling all aspects of management of the Church Cultural Hall and Recreation Center rental facilities.

IN LIEU OF FLOWERS FUTURE MAINTENANCE PROVISION OF ST. JOHN'S

For some time now, we have been advising and encouraging friends to designate St. John's as the beneficiary of the In Lieu of Flowers donations for loved ones. After all, the burden of maintenance, improvement, and renovation of St. John's facilities are our responsibilities, and ours alone. No outside organization will come to our aid when periodically renovations are needed. At this time, to no one's surprise, renovations in some areas are long overdue.

We draw the funds from the Future Maintenance Provision as reflected on the balance sheet. This provision is realized solely from the In Lieu of Flowers donations of the last nineteen years. Every ten or twenty years and possibly more often we will need to renovate various areas of our complex. These funds must be readily available to enable us to respond to the needs as they occur.

We assume and we hope that these were factors in the minds of parishioners and friends who had the unfortunate responsibility of making decisions regarding the distribution of funds from the In Lieu of Flowers donations made on behalf of their loved ones.

In 1991 St. John's received \$58,827 as a result of these wise and considerate decisions for which we thank the families of the deceased and the donors. We pray that the Lord will show special mercy on the souls of the departed.

ADULT AND YOUTH ENRICHMENT PROGRAMS F.A.C.E. Fellowship and Armenian Cultural Enrichments and SUPER SATURDAYS

Two new cultural-educational programs were implemented in the fall of 1991. The adult program, F.A.C.E. consisted of offerings of; 5 Evening Lectures in the subject areas of Armenia-Current Events, Armenian Folk Instruments, Armenian Art, A Comparative Study of the Armenian Church, and in health on the subject of A.I.D.S.. In addition, 3 cooking classes (Kourabia, Manti, and Lahmajoon), 2 levels of Armenian Language Classes and a Wine Tasting Social were part of the Fall Series.

Our SUPER SATURDAYS AT ST. JOHN'S PROGRAM for children ages 5-12 took place in our Recreation Center 2 Saturdays per month. Armenian Language, Cooking, Dance, Music, Religion, Literature, History, and Recreation were the areas of emphasis. A Field Trip to the Ground Round and a visit to The Manoogian Manor where the children performed the songs they had learned, and personally delivered the cards and ornaments they had made for the residents.

Special thanks to all instructors, speakers, and individuals who assisted with supervision - all doing so on a volunteer basis whose efforts made these programs possible.

YOUTH COORDINATORS

St. John's Youth Coordinator, Laura Gononian continued her responsibilities in 1991 by assisting the Mr. & Mrs. Society to organize Family Bingo Night. Laura helped coordinate the ACYO Jrs. efforts in sponsoring the Lenten Fish Dinners, arranged the Juniors Ski Trip, and finally coordinated the 3rd Annual Armenian Earthquake Walk-a-Thon. She resigned on May 2, 1991, after completing a year and a half in her position.

Lisa Mardigian assumed the position of Youth Coordinator as of May 15, 1991. Lisa organized and supervised the 6 week summer day camp, and the one week overnight camp at Echo Grove Camp in Leonard, Michigan. She coordinated the ACYOA Seniors and ACYO Juniors Project Youth participation in the Church Picnic. She also coordinated the ACYO Juniors Project Youth participation in the Bazaar and helped to organize two Church School Breakfasts - Family Fun Days, assisted the committee of the Mr. & Mrs. Halloween Party, helped organize the ACYO Juniors first Family Dance, "Moonstruck," and arranged the ACYO Juniors Cedar Pointe and Canoe Trips.

TEAS

In 1991, St. John's continued the tradition of an Easter Sunday Tea. Following Church Services, a Tea featuring Armenian Easter eggs, bread and cheese was sponsored by our Church in the Church Cultural Hall. Hundreds of parishioners and friends gathered to exchange Easter greetings with friends and acquaintances. Mary Demir coordinated the Tea with the assistance of the Women's Guild.

On the occasions of the Transfiguration of Jesus Christ and the Exhaltation of the Holy Cross, Teas were sponsored by the Women's Guild. Both Teas were coordinated by Mary Demir.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to Mary Demir and her committee from the Women's Guild.

76th ANNIVERSARY OF ARMENIAN GENOCIDE

On Sunday, April 21, 1991, St. John's observed the 76th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide during the Divine Liturgy followed by a memorial meal and a program attended by 600 parishioners and friends. The keynote speaker was Col. Moorad Mooradian, U.S. Army, retired.

Members of the Women's Guild and ACYO Juniors coordinated the preparation and the serving of the meal.

FOOD FOR ARMENIA

In 1991, St. John's continued fund raising for Food For Armenia. As it has become a tradition, we solicited contributions on the occasion of the 76th Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide and the Third Annual Walk-a-Thon. Aside from our efforts, parishioners and friends also responded to the need by designating In Lieu of Gifts donations for birthdays and anniversaries, as well as, In Lieu of Flowers donations received on the occasion of the demise of their loved ones.

Having been disappointed several times for not seeing any tangible results of our efforts or seeing our good intentioned offerings misdirected, in 1991 we made the decision to directly sponsor a project in Armenia. We are pleased to report that in the area of Spitak, in the Village of Hartakugh we have renovated two barns, purchased and housed approximately 300 cows, calfs, and bulls, a sufficient supply of feed for the winter, an electric generator and a truck for the farm, in the name of St. John's. We have signed a contract with a group of villagers with the intent that they can benefit from the milk from the cows for the next three years in exchange for taking care of the herd. At the conclusion of the 3 years, the co-operative will be entitled annually to slaughter one third of the herd for their own benefit, 30% of which they are expected to share with hospitals, orphanages, schools, and other public facilities.

The above project cost St. John's \$65,000.00.

ORIENTAL RUG SALE

St. John's Armenian Church sponsored another four-day Oriental Rug Sale in conjunction with Edward Bashian and Sons, Inc., importers from New York City. The Rug Sale coinciding with St. John's Bazaar, took place on the weekend of October 1, 11, 12, 13, in the Church Recreation Center. St. John's realized a net profit of \$15,730 from the Rug Sale.

Since the first Rug Sale, the Bashian Family has donated a rug annually for our Bazaar raffle, and has also participated in our fundraisings and has supported St. John's in a number of other ways.

The Pastors and Parish Council extend their appreciation to the Bashian Family and to General Co-Chairman, Richard and Isabelle Vahratian along with all those who assisted in various capacities to insure the success of this profitable project.

CHURCH OWNED PROPERTIES

Both the Winora Avenue home and the late Nevart Alexanian's house, which were sold to parishioners on 10 year land contracts in 1990, continued to bring revenues to the Church according to contracts.

SOCIAL CONCERN FUND

During 1991, St. John's Social Concern Fund helped eighty-three families who either sought assistance from the Church or of whose predicaments the Church was made aware. It should be no surprise to our parishioners that the increase in the number of the recipient families is due to the settlement of Armenian Families from Baku, Azerbaijan in the Detroit, Lansing and the Grand Rapids areas. Financial assistance to these families through St. John's Social Concern Fund amounted to \$25,036 in 1991.

Again this year the Funds in the Social Concern Fund were generated from the following sources: Special and very generous contributions by concerned parishioners as their reaction to the new circumstances within the community; Contributions from parishioners as a response to our appeals in the weekly Sunday Bulletins; In Lieu of Flowers contributions received on the occasion of the funeral of a deceased; In Lieu of Cards contributions made to send Christmas and New Year's greetings to friends and parishioners through a special Christmas Bulletin; interest from an Endowment Fund at St. John's; A generous contribution on the occasion of Christmas from the Armenian-American Veterans Organization of Detroit and from gifts given to Fr. Paren on the occasion of the officiation of sacraments and rites. Funds needed to supplement these sources of income were direct contributions from St. John's Armenian Church as reflected on the line item "Social Concern" on the Expense side of our Budget.

We thank all who contributed directly or indirectly to the Social Concern Fund of St. John's.

NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT

During 1991, there were two requests by parishioners for financial assistance to purchase homes in Magnolia Subdivision. As of the end of the year, 1991, we had thirteen parishioners who have outstanding balances totaling \$102,200. Through the years a total of fourteen parishioners have repaid the Church the full amount of the financial assistance they have received.

NEW YEAR'S EVE DINNER DANCE

The Annual New Year's Eve Dinner Dance under the co-chairmanship of Barbara and Richard Norsigian and Joanne and Jerry Nassar was enjoyed by 350 guests who attended. The evening featured a gourmet mezza table, lavish dinner, and continental breakfast. Musical entertainment was provided by Hachig Kazarian Ensemble and Hot Ice.

Although no profit was realized from the event, proceeds covered the expenses.

Pastors and Parish Council extend their thanks to Barbara and Richard Norsigian and Joanne and Jerry Nassar and their committee for making this an enjoyable evening for those who attended.

FINE ARTS COMMITTEE

St. John's Fine Arts Committee sponsored an exhibition of Valerie Boyakchian's Pastels and Collages on February 23 and 24 1991 and the exhibition and sale of Krikor Avakian's Watercolors in conjunction with Bazaar '91 on October 11, 12, 13, 1991.

Dr. Gary Belian is Chairman of the Fine Arts Committee. Members are, Edmond and Nora Azadian, Zabel Belian, Jack and Vera Kazanjian, and Dr. Jack and Ruby Yagoobian.

The Pastors and the Parish Council extend their appreciation to the Fine Arts Committee for their efforts for the introduction and promotion of Armenian Artists and their Art.

ARMENIAN ARTIFACTS

During 1991, St. John's artifacts continued to be systematically catalogued. Many of the artifacts have been installed in the Museum display cases; the remainder are temporarily housed in the Museum Preparation Room. Selected articles of interest and ancient relics from the Armenian past comprise the collection.

In 1991, fifty-eight additional artifacts enriched our Museum which has the largest collection of Armenian artifacts in this country. Following is a list of new acquisitions: eight square Kutahya ceramic tiles, one Kutahya ceramic tile panel, one Kutahya pictorial tile, one Kutahya ceramic hexagon tile, one Kutahya ceramic egg, one Kutahya ceramic dish, one manuscript, one silver lantern, one Urartian bronze belt, twenty-nine rugs, one silver belt, one brass plate, three silver ornamentations, one silver rose water sprinkler, one rectangular brass container, one hexagon silver container, one painting, one brass candlestick, one copper cauldron, one silver communion pyx, and one ancient print book.

PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

On a number of occasions during 1991 we called upon parishioners for assistance in their professional fields, Mr. Alex Jemal, Esquire; Mr. Garabed Hoplamazian, engineer; Mrs. Cynthia Ohanian, A.S.I.D. and Mr. Mike Kojaian of the Kojaian Construction Company, who when called upon, tendered services to St. John's without benefit of remuneration.
