**RULES AND REGULATIONS
CONCERNING CHURCH MEMBERSHIP**

- “5. All persons who have been baptized and confirmed in the Armenian Church, who accept its doctrine, canons and rites, and who fulfill their obligations to the church and community, shall be members in good standing of the Parish Church and shall constitute the Parish Assembly.
6. Every member of the Parish, 18 years of age or over, shall pay to his (or her) church an annual due, the amount of which shall be determined by the Diocesan Assembly. Such amount may be increased, but not decreased by the Parish Assembly.
7. Members in good standing of a Parish Church, who are 18 years of age or over, may participate in the assemblies of the same parish and may vote, provided that at least six months have elapsed since the date of their registration as members of the parish and their dues have been paid. They may be eligible for office one year after becoming members, provided they have attained the age of 21.
8. Members who fail to pay their dues for one or more years, automatically forfeit their right to vote at Parish Assemblies or to hold elective office within the parish. Such members may reinstate these rights by payment of their dues in arrears for at least the previous two years.
9. No one may be a voting member in more than one parish at the same time.”

**Excerpted from the BY-LAWS
OF THE ARMENIAN CHURCH OF AMERICA
(Eastern Diocese)**

**RULES AND REGULATIONS
GOVERNING PARISH ASSEMBLY**

- “16. The Agenda of the Parish Assembly shall be prepared by the Parish Priest and the Parish Council. Other matters of new business may be added by majority vote of the Parish Assembly.
17. At Parish Assemblies the presence of a minimum of one-third of the eligible voting membership or fifty members shall constitute a quorum, and decisions shall be rendered by majority vote of members present and voting.
22. In a Parish Assembly each member shall be entitled to one vote which is not transferable and must be cast in person. In case of a tie vote the presiding officer shall cast the deciding vote or he shall authorize a second balloting upon the same question.
43. The Parish Priest shall preside over the meeting of the Parish Council and the Parish Assembly.”

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Parish Council had 37 regular meetings. Throughout the year, 6 special meetings were held as well as numerous ad hoc meetings.

The Parish Council also chaired a number of functions during the year.

WORSHIP SERVICES

Divine Liturgy was celebrated with Armenian and English sermons being delivered every Sunday. We are happy to inform you that the services for Armenian Christmas, Vartanantz, Hampartzoom, and Ascension were celebrated during the week in accordance with our Church traditions. Also thank you to our children for participating in the Feet Washing and Bible readings during the Tre-Ore service, Jarakalouytz or Easter Eve service.

SACRAMENTS AND RITES

During 1998, the following Sacraments and Rites were officiated: Baptisms and Confirmations of infants and adults, 51; Holy Matrimony, 23; Engagements, 3; and Funeral Services, 52.

PLEDGE REPORT

In accordance with the decision of the 1993 Parish Assembly, the minimum pledge of \$175.00 per individual member and \$350 per couple was in effect during 1998. As of December 31, 1998, St. John's had 646 members paying the minimum pledge or over.

SENIOR CITIZENS' LUNCHEONS

St. John's continued to sponsor Senior Citizens' Luncheons every Tuesday of the month as it has since 1975. In 1998, the Church held 52 luncheons, to offer the Senior Citizens of our community the opportunity to gather together with their friends and acquaintances for a relaxed luncheon and to spend the afternoon to socialize with their peers.

Mrs. Helen Mardigian has, again this year, continued to jointly subsidize this program with St. John's, as she has since the programs' inception in 1975.

The Parish Council extend their sincere gratitude to Mrs. Helen Mardigian for her thoughtfulness, generosity, and support; to Mr. Leo Zamanigian and Star Sarkissian who are present at the luncheons assisting our Senior Citizens in every way possible and to Edward Jizmejian for his dedicated services.

CHURCH PICNIC

The 39th Annual Picnic was held on Sunday, August 16, 1998 on the Church grounds immediately following Church Services. The weather was excellent and approximately 500 enjoyed a day of fellowship that included Armenian food and music.

The Men's Society was responsible for cooking the chicken and lamb kebobs and selling tickets. The Women's Guild Bakery Booth prepared an outstanding assortment of Armenian and American delicacies. Women's Guild, Men's Society, and the A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors and Juniors all contributed their efforts in various capacities at the picnic.

Thanks to all who participated in this traditional annual event.

BINGO COMMITTEE

The Bingo Committee has generated \$34,199.73 for St. John's during the 1998 year. The Bingo Committee operates under the chairmanship of Paul Yousoufian.

I am sure the Parish Council, as well as all the parishioners greatly appreciate the efforts of our core workers; Elizabeth Aprahamian, Paul Andonian, Sara Andonian, Helen Armoudlian, John Bahadurian, Ruth Blake, Charlotte Boshnakian, Onnig Boyajian, Queenie Hazergian, George Kudanian, George Kouzoujian, Nicole Matoian, Arpie Mechigian, Helen Mekjian, June Mekjian, Kathy Mekjian, Diane Merigian, Mary Negosian, and Joyce Obenhoff. We welcome back Frank Pulice, a long time volunteer to bingo,

who after a short vacation, has come back to help improve bingo. These volunteers have managed to be here on a very regular basis giving up personal time and other commitments knowing the importance this committee has to help fulfill the needs of our community.

Other volunteers including, Rosette Bagdasarian, and Sam Malkasian have also come to help from time to time, we appreciate their efforts.

Again this year, we would like to thank the Women's Guild workers of the Bingo Food Concession under the Chairmanship of Almas Derderian; Her committee has helped support us in Bingo and has fed us well; Araxsie Andonian, Agnes Arpajian, Pam & Jerry Dayinian, Margaret Dayinian, Agnes & Peter Hovsepien, Sue Janigian, Archie & Hermalene Kahayian, Jean Sarkisian, Star Sarkissian, Sam & Ann Soultanian, and Mary Ryan. In addition to the \$34,199.73, Bingo has brought in and additional \$8,000.00 from the Women's Guild Concession Committee.

The Bingo Committee has grown in size and has broadened their efforts; "The Spice Girls" (Joyce, Diane and Sara) have put together a Summer Picnic, Christmas Party and New Year's Day Bingo Dinner for the Bingo workers. Mary Negosian has taken on the task of special Holiday Bingos, and addressing any special concerns of our Bingo workers. Arpie Mechigian has contributed to most of the weight gain of the Bingo workers due to the home made sweets she brings in every week and Alice Arpajian's special dishes that she brings in can only be topped by the slippers she knitted for all the Bingo workers. Although these girls are enjoying what they're doing, we owe a special thanks for their extra efforts in trying to show their appreciation to their fellow committee members.

With week day rentals increasing, it has been the responsibility of the Maintenance men to set up Bingo in a relative short period of time. We have never had to cancel Bingo due to day time rentals. We do appreciate the hard work the staff has done this past year, making sure we are ready to go every week, and taking care of our many special needs. Our thanks to the Building Manager, Michael Schaefer and his staff Phillip Sikora and John Draheim and our set up crew Joe Patterson, Jr. and Knut Shattuck.

Although we have been very fortunate to have the volunteers we have, we still are short 10 people. The Bingo Committee is looking for helpers from 6:00-7:00p.m. through 10:00p.m. every other week on Thursday. Our committee is proud to be the largest contributor, as a committee, to the Church for the year of 1998. In addition, this report clearly shows that this committee and Fund Raiser is not just about money but about friends, some fellowship, and of course food and a caring about our community. We have worked hard but no more or less than any other committee and we have had fun and enjoyed working with each other. We hope to keep this Fund Raiser going with a little of your help. Our goal this year is \$40,000.00.

BAZAAR '98

The Parish Council chaired the Bazaar under the supervision of parish council member, Howard Atesian acting as the coordinator, with all the other Council members being assigned different areas of responsibility. Despite the very short lead time of less than four weeks, everyone pitched in to insure that a very successful BAZAAR was held in 1998.

Parish Council's job was made easy since our parishioners know what to do, and do what has to be done. The Women's Guild, under the supervision of Barbara Haroutunian, the Guild's chairperson, and Diane Ekizian and Angie Banerian, took care of all the preparations, baking, and serving of the Armenian hot foods from the kitchen. The dinners were cooked and served by the Komitas Choir under the supervision of choir member George Boyagian. Salads were prepared by the group organized by Mike Blakian and Star Sarkisian. The pilaf was made by Alberta Godoshian. Paul Yousoufian made the Armenian pizza and chi-kufta sandwiches. Refreshments and the Snack Bar were coordinated by the A.C.Y.O.A. Juniors under the supervision of our Youth Coordinator, Lisa Mardigian. The Hye Bar was organized by Greg Boyajian. Marty Mouradian literally saved the Country Store by doing all the purchasing that made the store possible, as well as the set up and supervision. The Men's Society, under the chairmanship of George Kasparian, supplied the man power that made the Country Store a success. Art and Carol Aprahamian purchased all the paper goods. Cathy Atesian arranged for all the vendors and ran the Gift-a-rama. Janice Torosian scheduled and supervised all the cashiers. John and Alice Semizian ran the 50/50 raffles. Nick Evarian handled all the electrical needs. Souren and Virginia Keoleian were in charge of the publicity and the Sports Memorabilia silent auction. The Fine Arts Committee, under the chairpersons of Gary and Zabel Belian, presented the Fine Arts Exhibit. The Church Book Store was supervised by Lucy Ardash. Everyone enjoyed the live music played by the Negosian Band. Armen Hovnanian and our Church Bookkeeper, Shannon Roup, handled all the purchasing and spent countless hours on accounting. The Church Sanctuary Tours were conducted by Yertzgin Rosalie Papazian, and Sirvart Mezian. A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors ran the Kids Korner under the supervision of John and Laura Lucassian. Mary Ryan and Ann Soultanian ran the Women's Guild Thrift Store (garage sale) on the Friday before the Bazaar. A special thanks to Roxie Choukourian and Dolly Matoian for donating the jars of tourshi that, as predicted, all sold out. Finally, though there are too many names and not enough space to list everyone here, a special thanks to all parishioners who did all the work throughout the year as well as during the Bazaar.

The 1998 Bazaar was a very successful and profitable event with the only shortfall resulting from insufficient time to get gifts donated for the raffles. To avoid the last minute push we seem to fall victim of, the Pastor and Parish Council would like to have someone, or group of parishioners, volunteer now to start planning for 1999's bazaar, with fresh approaches and ideas.

ST. JOHN'S ARMENIAN CHURCH EDWARD & HELEN MARDIGIAN LIBRARY

Researchers and the general public have regularly utilized the facilities offered by the Edward and Helen Mardigian Library throughout 1998. The library currently houses over 6,000 books in Armenian, English, French and German. The collection includes many rare and valuable editions. Since there is available shelving for 50,000 titles, parishioners have been encouraged to donate books on Armenian subjects. Over one hundred books and periodicals in the Armenian and English languages were donated during the past year by parishioners and friends. Our sincere appreciation to all of the donors.

Although books cannot be checked out of the library at the present time, comfortable reading areas are provided for the convenience of those who wish to conduct research or read books or Armenian newspapers for pleasure.

Computers in the library have also been in constant use throughout the year for desktop publishing and publicity.

FUN & FUND RAISING COMMITTEE

The Fun Raising Committee, for the third year, have achieved their Mission of putting on activities that will foster fellowship in our community by bringing parishioners and whole families together to perpetuate our Armenian heritage in a Christian environment. This is accomplished through the efforts of its' very dedicated 58 members.

The functions that were held in 1998 were: On Friday, February 6, 1998 a Family Bingo Night, chaired by Joy Callan. There were 307 adults and children in attendance with pizza, salad, and dessert. Everyone was a bingo winner with prizes for both adults and children.

Our next activity was assisting the A.C.Y.O.A. by putting on their Monday, May 25, 1998 Memorial Day Sports Weekend Picnic. The food was coordinated by Joy Callan with hamburgers, hot dogs, and a variety of salads served along with watermelon and desserts as well as games for the children.

On Friday, October 23, 1998, Marianne Dardarian chaired our third annual Fall Family Dance with a Halloween theme. Approximately 325 adults and children were served coney hot dogs, Greek salad, and ice cream sundaes and danced to the Armenian music of the Johnites, and American music from D.J. Alex Sarafian, with party favors of masks and light-up necklaces for all the children.

Thanks to all the committee members for their help. A special thanks to Sirvart Mezian, Peter and Agnes Hovsepien, and Mihran Hoplamazian for their generous donations during the year. The Fun Raisers is an open and informal committee. Anyone interested in helping to achieve our Mission is welcome to join.

ST. JOHN'S BASKETBALL PROGRAM

Monday Night Men's Basketball League runs from October to April with Robert Simonian as Coordinator.

St. John's Men's Orthodox Team runs from October to April with Roy Callan as the coach.

Wednesday Night Youth Basketball, a source for St. John's Orthodox League Teams, runs from October to March: Girls team, Junior Boys team and Intermediate Boys team are led by Coaches, Bill Derderian, Lisa Mardigian, Jack Karakashian and Tom Banks.

Thursday Night Youth Basketball Clinic runs from October to March. Special thanks to Tom Banks and Lisa Mardigian for coordinating this enjoyable activity for the children of our community. Thanks to our fathers and older players who lend a helping hand whenever needed.

The general Coordinator of the Basketball Program is Lisa Mardigian. The Sunday concession stand, which helps to offset the costs of the Basketball program, is coordinated and operated by Lisa Mardigian & Almas Derderian. Thank you to our devoted mothers and players who assist with the concessions stand. The Pastor and the Parish Council extend their appreciation to all who have volunteered to make St. John's Basketball Program a big success!

TEAS

In 1998, teas were held on several occasions. St. John's Armenian Church sponsored a tea in honor of Rev. Fr. Diran Papazian's 40th anniversary of his ordination. The traditional Easter Sunday tea was held again in parishioners and friends to gather and exchange Easter greetings.

On the second anniversary of the passing of Mr. Alex Manoogian, a tea was served following Church Services.

The Pastor and Parish Council extend their appreciation to the Women's Guild for assuming responsibility of coordinating the teas for the benefit of our parishioners. Also, special thanks to the Komitas Choir and the A.C.Y.O.A. Seniors and Juniors for sponsoring our Christmas Eve Tea.

NEIGHBORHOOD DEVELOPMENT

As of December 31, 1998, we have two parishioners who have outstanding balances totaling approximately \$10,800 in principal. Through the years, a total of approximately twenty-three parishioners have received financial assistance. The Parish Council has terminated the program of granting new neighborhood development loans as of January, 1998.

IN LIEU OF FLOWERS

FUTURE MAINTENANCE PROVISION OF ST. JOHN'S

As approved by the Parish Assembly of 1997, all the In Lieu of Flowers donations payable to St. John's Armenian Church of Greater Detroit as the beneficiary, are dedicated and designated to the future maintenance provision

of the Church as shown on the balance sheet under Building Maintenance Funds.

The policy states: That all checks should be made payable to the Church and that only the donations payable to the Church will be acknowledged in the Torch Bearer.

Checks made payable to St. John's Armenian Church will not be divided among any other charities or funds.

Checks received for "in-lieu-of-flowers" funds, that are not payable to St. John's will be forwarded to the families for delivery to the proper organization. St. John's will not maintain records or acknowledge any donation other than to St. John's.

Endowments cannot be established with "in-lieu-of-flowers" funds, but families may continue to establish endowments with their own private funds.

All of our mechanical systems, the physical structures, furniture, and our grounds reflect the wear of the over thirty years of usage by our community and now requires constant attention for the repair and replacement to the physical plant.

We thank all our parishioners and friends who designate St. John's Armenian Church as the beneficiary for In Lieu of Flowers donations. Their thoughtfulness assists us in meeting the on-going needs of maintenance and renovation of our Church and Cultural Complex.

ST. JOHN'S ARMENIAN CHURCH ALEX & MARIE MANOOGIAN MUSEUM

During 1998, hundreds of visitors from the United States, Canada, Europe & South America toured the eight galleries of the Alex and Marie Manoogian Museum. North America's largest Armenian Museum is known to international art patrons and historians as well as to our local universities and schools. The Museum was open on a regular basis during the entire year.

Guided group tours were arranged for the A.G.B.U. Alex & Marie Manoogian School, DIA Founders Society, DIA Art to the Schools, DIA Gallery Docents, Birmingham-Bloomfield Art Association, University of Michigan-Ann Arbor, Macomb Community College, Oakland Community College, Wayne State University, Henry Ford Community College, Plymouth-Salem High School, Southfield High School, Stevenson High School, Derby Middle School, St. John's Church School, A.C.Y.O.A. Sports Weekend, Summer Day Camp, and dozens of area church organizations of various denominations.

Comprehensive individual tours were also provided for representatives of the Detroit Institute of Arts, Detroit Historical Museum, Pierpont-Morgan Library, Toledo Art Museum, Wayne State University, University of California-Los Angeles, University of Michigan and the Southfield Com-

munity Public Relations Dept. as well as for the community at large.

During the past year, the museum was enriched by two oil paintings by two oil paintings by Aivazovsky, one oil by Carnig Eksergian, one oil by Mahokian, one 18th century Kutahya ceramic ewer, one pair of Kutahya tiles, and one set of four Kutahya tiles, all through the courtesy of the Alex and Marie Manoogian Foundation. Seventeen textiles, two silver spoons, one 19th century book of Psalms, and one 19th century book of lamentations were donated by Ms. Anahid Meramedjian of Alexandria, Egypt. A 19th century velvet dress embroidered with gold metallic thread was donated by the Papaghanian Family. Our sincere appreciation to all of the donors.

Featured articles of interest and ancient relics from Armenia's past provide a unique glimpse of our history and create a sense of pride in our heritage.

The Parish Council expresses their appreciation to Mrs. Lucy Ardash for her dedicated efforts in overseeing the museum.

83rd ANNIVERSARY OF ARMENIAN GENOCIDE

Over five hundred faithful attended St. John's Armenian Church on Sunday, April 26, 1998 to observe the 83rd Anniversary of the Armenian Genocide.

Mr. & Mrs. Richard and Jane Manoogian graciously donated the madagh in memory of parents, Alex and Marie Manoogian. The featured speaker was Rabbi Sherwin Wine who spoke about the historical facts on the World scene and how governments maneuvered and manipulated in leading up to the events of April, 1915. His outstanding emotional presentation kept the entire audience interested and anxious to know all of the history concerning the Armenian Genocide. Our sincere thanks to the entire committee and volunteers who served our parish for this observance.

IN APPRECIATION

The Parish council extends a special thanks to Rev. Diran Papazian and all the visiting Diocesan Clergy who assisted St. John's in 1998. The Parish Council also extend their appreciation to the Apostolic Society, Diocesan Delegates, Church Auditors, Church Organizations and their Executive and Standing Committee members, the entire Church School, Church Choir, Deacons, Ushers, Church Staff, Church Building Staff, volunteer workers assisting in the Church Office, Church Projects' Committee chairmen and members, Bingo Committee and to all the faithful parishioners who, during the past year, gave unselfishly of their time and financial resources for the life, the vitality and the improvement of our Church and Community for the Glory of God.

BUILDING REPORT

During 1998, the Church Cultural Complex continued to be used by the Church and Church organizations, as well as for rental purposes to generate income to the Church through rentals to parishioners, Armenian Organizations as well as individual non-members and Corporate clientele. Rental income to the Church was increased by \$66,816.00 (29.2%) to a new record high of \$295,985.00. Church Organizations weekend usage increased by 33.3% in Calendar 1998 and non-weekend rentals grew by 45.2%.

Major renovation and maintenance projects in the Church Complex continued to be undertaken in 1998. A complete new sound system was installed in the Church. Repairs to the Church exterior walls were completed. New stain glass windows were reinstalled in the Church. The Church chimes were repaired. The Church and building complex boilers were repaired. The ceiling and lighting in the Museum and Library lobby area was completely replaced. New carpeting was installed in the Armenian American Veterans Building as well as drapes in the Dining Room. A new Gene electric lift was purchased to enable our maintenance staff to safely service the Church, Halls, Gym and parking lot light systems. Our 30 year old folding machine had to be replaced and a Pitney-Bowes postage machine was purchased for the office to facilitate the Church's mailings.

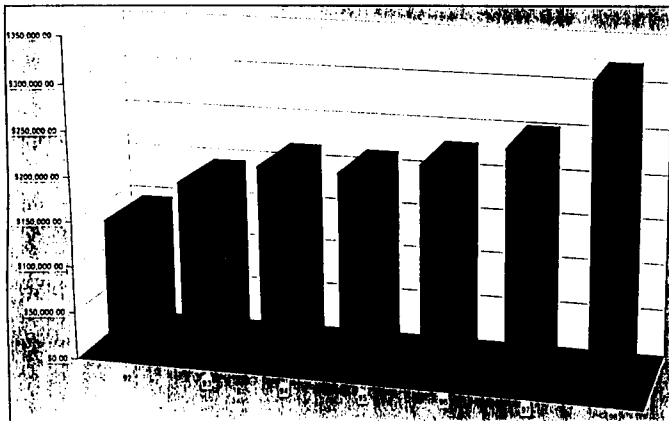
