Oct.: Halloween Party for entire student body, families and church members who attend with their potential Sunday School children. Held in our auditorium. Very successful.

Nov. - Advent services each of the 4 weeks before Christmas during our assembly.

Dec. Christmas Program and Luncheon (modified this year because of the Armenian Earthquake) Two of our Sunday collections were donated to the Earthquake Fund this month.
