

ANNUAL REPORT 1962

VERY REV. YEGHISHE GIZIRIAN

DEAR PARISHIONERS:

The year is at an end and once again we are reviewing the debits and credits of the past year as they relate to our spiritual life. Although my report will show satisfying gains in terms of our worthy accomplishments, I must also mention that the future holds even greater possibilities for achievement. In the life of the church, there is no such thing as completion or finality. Our work is fluid and constantly challenging as we face each new year. With God's guidance, there is a definite feeling of zeal and fervor in the hope that we shall fulfill our goals. This is a healthy out-look and is an assurance of deep rooted growth and creativity. One sees the mountain peak long before he reaches the mountain. By this token, our success represents the distance which we must climb in order to reach the top. To be static is to wither on the vine.

As in the past, we must look with hope and determination toward a future of ever increasing accomplishments. I shall now submit my official report for 1962.

CHURCH SERVICE - Church services were conducted with dignity, decorum and fitting solemnity. The Church Choir and the services of the Deacons contributed immeassurably to the enhancement of our regular and special services. Special services were held on the occasions of Armenian Christmas on January 6, Feast of St. Vartan, Lenten Services every Wednesday and the Feast of Acension. During each service, an appropriate sermon was given.

SACRAMENTS - As a matter record we had 28 Baptisms, 2 Engagements, 3 Marriages and 27 funerals. Necessary advice and counceling are always given at these occasions.

<u>VISITATIONS</u> - This is a many-fold service which includes condolence calls, visiting the sick at home and hospitals (when notified), blessing of homes on special occasions and other calls of good will. This is one of the most important aspects of church responsibility. It serves to cement church and family relationships. During this year, I made 500 calls on the following areas: 250 sick calls; 30 calls to the Homes for the Aged; 53 calls to the homes of bereaved; 3 calls pertaining to family difficulties; 15 visits to sister and other churches; 149 calls on festive, social and miscellaneous occasions.

MEETINGS - To the very best of my ability, I attended as many meetings as possible in connection with the life and welfare of our Church. During these meetings, guidance, advice, interpretations and pertinent talks were given. I attended about 155 meetings during 1962.

THE MESSENGER - This paper is published monthly by our church and mailed to the entire membership and other parishes in the diocese. In addition, we send out special circulars on numerous occasions.

OUTLYING COMMUNITIES - As in the past, our interest is actively maintained in every possible way to meet the needs of our surrounding communities. The Fitchburg community held monthly cultural programs and services.

CITY COUNCIL - By special invitation, I gave the opening prayer at 3 City Council meetings.

PILGRIMAGES - During the past year, we have been host to many groups from other churches who have visited our church. It has been our practice to welcome our guests and to interpret aspects of our service which differ and which are significant. This is a service dedicated to community cooperation in the spirit of fellowship.

DIOCESAN CONVENTION - As a delegate with other delegates from our Church, I attended the Diocesan Convention which was held in New York on May 5-6, 1962 at St. Gregory Illuminator Armenian Church. I also attended the Clergy Conference which preceded the Diocesan Convention.

CLERGY CONFERENCE - I attended the Clergy Conference which was held at St. Mary's Armenian Church in Elbron, New Jersey July 10-13 under the presidency of our Primate. There were many discussions concerning our church affairs. Problems were presented and lectures given for the purpose of clarifying our obligations and responsibilities.

PRIMATE'S VISIT TO OUR PARISH - His Eminence Archbishop Sion Manoogian, Primate of our diocese visited our church on the following dates: Sunday, April 8, 1962 on the occasion of the Cathedral Project Fund Banquet; Sunday, October 21, 1962 on the occasion of our Tenth Anniversay Celebration and Kick-off banquet for the Cultural Center. The Primate's presence was a source of great inspiration. We shall long cherish the spiritual message and benefits which we derived from his visit.

VISITING CLERGYMEN TO OUR PARISH - On several occasions, we were honored to have the following guest clergymen: On Sunday, July 8, 1962, Rev. DajadDavidian of Racine, Wisconsin was guest preacher; On Sunday, October 28, 1962 the Reverend. Vertanes Papazian as Celebrant; On Sunday, September 30, 1962, the Very Rev. Zaven Arzoomanian of London, England as celebrant; on Sunday, December 23, 1962 Deacon Hovhannes Kasparian of Evanston, Illinois as preacher. We are indebted to Rev. Arten Ashjian of Watertown, Rev. Vertanes Papazian of New York and Rev. Haik Donikian of Providence for their services.

ADULT EDUCATION - Every Wednesday evening since October, I have been instructing a class in the study of the Armenian Language under the sponsorship of the A.G.B.U.

PERSONAL EDUCATION ENRICHMENT - This year, I took several courses for my educational enrichment at Boston University and Reading Institute of Boston.

CENTRAL COUNCIL OF THE ASSOCIATION OF ARMENIAN CHURCH CHOIRS - As advisor to this group, I attended regular meetings, where we discussed all matters pertaining to the activities of the association. In the mentioned capacity, I attended the annual Convention of the Association of Armenian Church Choirs which took place in Racine, Wisconsin on October 26, 27 and 28.

ARMENIAN SACRED MUSIC BOOK - Last June, I once again assumed the chairmanship of this committee, whichis responsible for the completion of this monumental document under the sponsorship of the Armenian Church Choirs of America. This project is now moving forward slowly because of its unique quality but effectively in the hands of an eminent composer and arranger Wardan Sarxian of Marseilles.

APPRECIATION - With humbleness and thankfulness I acknowledge the support and the recognition which I have received during the past year. It has been a pleasure and privilege to work with the Parish Council, our church organizations: Ladies Auxiliary, Young Women's Guild, Men's Club, Diocesan Auxiliary, ACYOA, Seniors and

Juniors, Choir, P.T.A., Armenian School Committee, Sunday School and Cultural Center Committee. The results of their efforts have added immeasurably to the growth of our church activities.

I have a special sentiment of gratitude to our beloved Diratzoo Hovhannes Kasparian for his outstanding contribution to the welfare of our church. His accomplishments have had a tremendous meaning to all of us and we are indeed grateful for the lasting results of his efforts. We wish him good fortune in his new position at St. Nerses Shnorali Armenian Theological Seminary in Evanston, Illinois.

Through the grace of God and your enthusiastic support reconsecrate and rededicate my efforts in the future to meet the high goals and standards which we have set for ourselves and the welfare of our beloved church. It is my sincere hope and prayer that 1963 usher in the beginning of our vital project, namely the Cultural Center. This is the next stepping stone in the growth of our church. Let us all share in our determination to achieve this goal.

In following the teachings of our great fore-fathers, we must regenerate our determination to keep alive the great heritage of the Armenian Church.

I ask your prayers that God give me, his humble servant, His grace and wisdom in order to fulfill my mission for His greater glory.

In a letter received from the Primate dated February 1, 1962, we were informed that the Diocesan Council has approved the election of our new Council members.

On February 6, 1962 at the regular Parish Council meeting, presided over by our Pastor, the following executive body was formed: Messrs. George A. Herosian, chairman; Gilbert Markarian, vice-chairman; Torkom Hooloian, secretary; Zarvin J. Kasparian, assistant secretary; John Toromanian, treasurer; Peter Nalbandian, assistant treasurer; Charles Garabedian, Michael Kolligian, Asbed Zakarian, Haig Mesrobian and Ara P. Heroian, advisors.

ASSISTANT TO PASTOR - Deacon Hovhannes Kasparian served as assistant to our Pastor until June 30, 1962 at which time by decree from our Primate, His Eminence Archbishop Sion Manoogian, he was transferred to St. Nerses Armenian Theological School in Evanston, Illinois for teaching duties.

On Saturday evening, June 30, 1962, a testimonial dinner was tendered to him at which time he was presented a purse and a plague on behalf of our church and parish for his devoted services over the past eleven years.

VARTANATZ CELEBRATION - On the evening of Sunday, March 4, 1962 the annual celebration of St. Vartan took place.

CATHEDRAL PROJECT - Under the auspices of the Parish Council and the Cathedral Project Committee, a banquet was held on April 8, 1962 under the presidency of our Primate, His Eminence Archbishop Sion Manoogian, which resulted in raising \$15,000.00.

CATHEDRAL IN THE PINES - On Sunday morning, August 12, 1962, outdoor services were held at the Cathedral in the Pines with our Pastor officiating, enjoined by our Choir.

ANNUAL PICNIC - Our annual picnic was held Sunday, August 26, 1962 at Camp Ararat in Maynard. Once again this affair proved to be a huge success.

TENTH ANNIVERSARY - The Tenth Anniversary Celebration of the completion of our new Church was combined with the beginning of the fund raising campaign of the Cultural Center with a banquet on Sunday, October 21, 1962.

At our church services, His Eminence Archbishop Sion Manoogian honored us as celebrant and preacher. In the evening, he presided at the Tenth Anniversary Celebration banquet.

COUNCIL OF CHURCHES - Once again we renewed our membership in the Council of Churches.

STUDENT - At the request of our Catholicos, a letter was received from the dean of the seminary in Etchmiadzin, blessing the Worcester Parish for its generosity in sponsoring a sutdent.

STOLE BEARERS - On Sunday, October 21, 1962, Ara Eresian and Charles Hoogasian, choir members, were elevated to the position of Stole Bearers by our Primate, His Eminence Archbishop Sion Manoogian.

CHOIR DIRECTOR - During the year, Mrs. Jacob Hagopian was appointed Choir Director with Mrs. George Eljanian as Assistant Choir Director.

- d. Repairs in Parish House.

- c. Men's Club for water cooler for Parish House.
- d. Young Women's Guild for substantial contributions to our Church treasury and other deserving purposes.

CHURCH SECRETARY - During the year it became apparent that the services of a secretary for our church office was necessary. For the summer months Miss Ann Sogigian served in this capacity. This position is currently being held on a part-time basis by Mrs. Rose Toromanian.

MEETINGS - During the year the Parish Council convened at 25 regular meetings, 3 special meetings combined with all church organizations and 3 parish meetings.

Kasparian, Marjorie Mesrobian, Ann Sharigian, Sid Davagian and Nancy Hovhanesian.

There are eighty-four students attending classes which are held on Saturday mornings from 10:00 a.m. to 11:45 a.m. These classes are held at the Parish House and the Church Hall. A bus is available for the convenient transportation of the students. Teachers are as follows: Knar Guekguezian, Arshalous Andonian, Angel Srabian, Marcouhi Adjelian and Haroutune Kasparian.

The committee meets on the third Tuesday of each month. Our main funtion is to raise funds for the purpose of maintaining the Armenian School.

In order to meet our weekly expenses of approximately forty-five dollars (\$45.), we have had a bake sale, a rummage sale, and passed a collection plate in church. We anticipate repeating this procedure as well as having additional projects in the near future.

CHURCH SUNDAY SCHOOL

The statistical facts contained herein may well speak for themselves. However, much behind the scenes causes and effects go unobserved and such information should perhaps be brought to the attention of our Parishioners through this annual means.

Though your Sunday School operates with apparent efficiency and this is not to say that every effort is not being spared by those involved to make it so, there remains much to be desired before reaching the state of complete perfection, so necessary to this task. Any organization depends upon the individual contribution that each person makes toward the goal set by supervisory guidance. So it is with Sunday School, people make it tick and it is therefore important that there be a constant source of dedicated, self-less people, willing to serve the Church and our children.

The difficulty of recruiting enough people to serve its needs is one of prime importance. Every thoughtful member of this Parish should realize that the same persons cannot continue, year after year, serving the Sunday School without an occasional respite. Further, that it should be considered a privilege, at one time or another, to serve our Church School by replacing those who find it necessary to undertake other obligations.

The problem of recruiting and keeping qualified teachers for the Sunday School does not always indicate a lack of interest on the part of members. Much time is devoted to social and business obligations and consequently leaves little time for Church duties. But busy or not, we should consider this to be important work. Some stay at home and send the children to Sunday School for "free baby sitting". Parents without children often show more interest. But all of us must think of this problem and avoid the irresponsibility and lack of commitment that prevails.

We do not wish to burden this report with unnecessary remarks but feel it our responsibility to bring these observations to the attention of our Parish so that continued improvements will result. If you are aware of the needs, we are sure that you will take steps to change them for the better. As part of our stewardship, we have tried to make you aware.

The present Sunday School Roster includes 287 children. Approximately forty people are involved, in supervisory, teaching and clerical duties. Fifteen individual classrooms are utilized in the Parish House and the entire Church Hall houses two Primary Grades besides five kindergarten classes. Children ranging in age from three to fifteen years are given religious education.

A booklet containing the Sunday School Curriculum as well as list of Staff was published and mailed to the Parish in November and therefore will not be repeated herein. Our special thanks to Miss Kasabian, Mrs. Davidian, and Mr. Alexanian for their intensive effort in preparation of art work, copy and general contents of this booklet which was undertaken at the suggestion of Father Gizirian.

The childrens Thanksgiving project this year resulted in a generous donation which was partly expended to purchase plants for the ladies and fruit baskets for the men distributed to six shut-in people at Nursing Homes and Belmont Home. The Young Women's Guild of the Armenian Church of Our Saviour is pleased to report that they have completed another year of cultural, religious, social and financial success.

At the membership meeting on Tuesday evening, February 13, 1962, the following executive officers for the year were installed to carry on the work for the coming year. Chairman, Margaret Zakarian; Vice-Chairman, Margaret Bedrosian; Recording Secretary, Marion Nalbandian; Treasurer, Harriet Krikorian; Assistant Treasurer, Alice Papazian; Corresponding Secretary, Hazel Eljanian; Advisors, Agnes Herosian and Ann Mosessian. Appointed to the standing committees were: Auditing Elizabeth Santoian; By-Laws, Ann Sharigian; Hostesses, Alice Chakarian and Mary Shamoian; Membership, Charlotte Anusbigian; Program, Agnes Markarian; Publicity, Rose Toromanian; Visitation, Mae Bedrosian and Mary Elloian; Ways & Means, Siroon Davagian and Ann Vartanian.

A total of 9 Executive Board meetings and 9 membership meetings were held with an average of 45 members attending monthly meetings.

Total membership of the Young Women's Guild number 123, 71 of whom are active; 9 were initiated as new members during the year 1962.

Our Membership meetings are followed with a program of interest to our members. Subjects such as religion, wills, travelogues, and illustrated talks have been presented.

February 19, a Whist Party was held which proved very successful, both financially and socially.

A Guest Night was held on May 15 at which time the Executive Board of the Senior Ladies Auxiliary of the Church were honored guests. An Armenian comedy was the highlight of the evening with Guild members taking part.

On May 29 a Dinner Dance was given jointly with the Men's Club at the Pleasant Valley Country Club in Sutton.

On September 25 a Fashion Show was held at the Fairbrook Country Club with amazing results financially,

This year a new plan of individual Party Projects was instituted in the Guild and to date seven such parties have been held. Hostesses defray all expenses and the gross income is turned over to the Guild treasury.

November 13 a dinner preceded our regular meeting honoring Past Presidents of the Guild at which time Hayr Soorp Yeghishe Gizirian presented, in behalf of the Guild, a pin in grateful appreciation of their work.

Suggested changes made in our By-Laws were approved by the membership at our November meeting. These changes will be presented to Hayr Soorp and the Parish Council for their approval, and in turn they will submit them to the Diocese in New York for further study and approval.

December 8 a Christmas Party was held at Nick's Grill.

The Guild is always willing to help in whatever way possible toward the efficiency of the kitchen, and this year it was felt that an additional supply of dishes should be purchased; this, we did, and we can now serve 300 guests. We have had from twelve to twenty girls act as hostesses for the Senior Ladies Auxiliary Lenten Supper at which time we have been very happy to furnish the dessert. We have also served at the Cathedral Project Dinner, the Kick-Off Banquet for the Cultural Center, the Testimonial Banquet for Diratzoo Hovhannes Kasparian and the 40th Anniversary of the Senior Ladies Auxiliary.

At the close of each year it is with Christian spirit that we aid our Church and its various organizations financially. We are pleased to report that the following gifts have been presented:
