

PASTOR'S 1969 ANNUAL REPORT

CHURCH SERVICE - Every Sunday we held a short morning service and then celebrated Badarak and preached the sermon. We also held special morning services on Vartanantz and Ascension Days, as well as an evening service on each Wednesday during Lent, after which a Bible Study was held in the church hall, organized by the ACYOA Seniors.

SACRAMENTS - Last year the church had 15 baptisms, 5 weddings and 20 funerals. Necessary advice and counceling are given on these occasions.

<u>VISITATION</u> - The pastor made more than 450 visits, approximately 250 sick persons at the hospitals of our city, and nearly 100 homes, when he had the opportunity.

<u>MEETINGS</u> - The pastor attended about 200 meetings of our organizations and various committees.

OUTLYING COMMUNITIES - We officiated at several funerals in Fitchburg and Milford. During such times the pastor visited the homes of the deceased. The pastor also visited several sick persons, who were recuperating at the hospitals in Whitins-ville and Milford. The pastor joined the group of ACYOA Srs, who on a Sunday in Lent showed the colored film "Where Are My People", at the Armenian-American Veterans Home in Milford.

RELATION WITH THE ARMENIAN PROTESTANT CHURCH - The relation of our church with the Armenian Congregational Church of Martyrs was cordial, as in the past.

RELATION WITH THE COUNCIL OF CHURCHES - Our church, being a member, keeps a good relation with the Greater Worcester Area Council of Churches, and pays an annual dues. Also some members of our church are involved in the administrative and planning activities of the Council of Churches: Zarvin J. Kasparian of the Board of Directors, Van Aroian and Ralph Yagjian of United Church Men, Clara Takesian of the Department of Christian Education, and ACYOA numbers Diane Zakarian and Benjamin Hagopian Jr. are representing our youth in the United Christian Youth Movement

Last January the Council organized an Interfaith Service of prayer, opening the Week of Christian Unity, which was held in our church, and also in September, the Fall Assembly of the Council of Churches was held in our church hall and Cultural Center Auditorium.

THE MESSENGER - The church paper is published monthly, except July and August, in eight consecutive numbers, and mailed to the entire membership. If there are parishioners who do not receive our monthly paper, or the Armenian and English publications of the Diccese, they may call the church office and give

their names and addresses. These three publications are sent to all dues paying members free of charge.

PASTORAL ATTENTION TO SCHOOLS AND YOUTH GROUPS - All these church organizations enjoyed the pastor's attention and interest.

CELEBRATION AND VISITATION - In accordance with our church's and community's invitation, the following persons took part in our various celebrations.

<u>Dr. Ara Avakian</u> On Vartanantz Day, showed colored slides of various Armenian cities in Turkish-Armenia, which he took during his visit a year ago.

Lucine Zakarian, soprano and Maryanna Harutunian pianist of Yerevan, Armenia, presented a musicale in early spring.

Very Rev. Oshin Nigolian On Sunday May 4, and Rev. Dajad Davidian on Sunday May 11, celebrated the divine liturgy and delivered the sermon in our church.

Very Rev. Ghevont Samourian On the Catholic Holy Etchmiatzin Day, celebrated the divine liturgy and preached the sermon in our church, and then, he was the main speaker at the Sunday School closing exercise, which was held in the Cultural Center Auditorium.

Asdghig (Antreassian) Dedeyan Soprano, and Ilse Sass, pianist, presented a musicale in the Cultural Center Auditorium on the occasion of the Gomidas Centennial observance.

Rev. Arnak Kasparian and Very Rev. Shnork Kasparian paid a short visit to our church and Cultural Center, after attending the Annual Diocesan Convention.

PILGRIMAGE - The pilgrimage to St. Vartan Cathedral on the feast day of Exaltation of the Cross, was a memorable day for our community.

EXCHANGE OF CHOIRS - The exchange of choirs between Holy Trinity Armenian Church of Cambridge, Mass. and our Church was well received by both communities.

<u>DEPARTURE</u> - Deacon Dikran Metjian, who as assistant to the pastor, was conscientiously serving our church since 1964 was appointed Deacon in charge of the St. George Armenian Church, Houston, Texas aby His Grace Archbishop Torcom Manoogian, Primate.

The Parish Council respectfully submits the following report of activities for 1969:

The Annual Parish Assembly was held 8 p.m., Thursday, January 23, 1969, and was continued on Sunday, January 26th for the purposes of electing members of the Parish Council, Auditing Committee, Diocesan Delegates, and Nominating Committee. The Assembly was chaired by Mr. Harry Sogigian; the Assembly secretary was Harold Gregory. The following were elected as Parish Council members: John Toromanian, Zarvin Kasparian, Van Aroian, Harry Sahagian and Ralph Yagjian. Elected as Auditing Committee members: Anne Demirjian, Edward Bilzerian, Barbara Nalkranian; as Nominating Committee: Charles Garabedian, Jacob Hagopian, Ara Eresian, Manasse Jardarian, Suney Kachadoorian. The Diocesan Delegates elected were: Harry Sogigian, Harold Gregory, George Shamgochian, Simon Zakarian and Gilbert Markarian.

On March 18, 1969, the Very Reverend Muron Dz. V. Gurjikian, Pastor, presided at the organizational meeting of the Parish Council. The following executive officers were elected: Chairman, Zarvin Kasparian, Vice-Chairman, Gerald Mosessian; Secretary, Van Aroian; Treasurer, John Toromanian; Assistant Treasurer, Abraham Sivazlian; and Assistant Secretary, Haroutune Kasparian; Advisors, Gerald Aharonian, Seth Bilazerian, Ara Heroian, Harry Sahagian and Ralph Yagjian.

The total effort of our Church community succeeded in a substantial increase for 1969 in the amount of the year's receipts which were \$56,294.74. Expenditures were \$53,737.43, and included five mort-gage payments totaling \$7,309.51 to the Worcester Federal Savings and Loan Association. In addition, income for 1969 allowed the Parish to pay \$5,000 in January, 1970 to Mechanics National Bank for the first reduction of the \$75,000 note. Cooperative efforts yielded a cooperative dividend.

The Parish Council held 24 regular meetings during 1969. In addition, 14 special meetings were held with executive bodies or special interest groups to maintain communication and work out problems of mutual concern.

A special Parish Assembly was called on May 20, 1969 as requested by the Cultural Center Building Committee to consider certain recommendations regarding the Cultural Center project. Thus, the Assembly, after a full presentation of the history, development and execution of the Cultural Center project, recognized its successful completion and approved the transfer of the project to the Parish Council. The Assembly moved unanimously to commend the successful efforts of the Building Committee who for nearly eight years, since June 6, 1961, had been charged with the great task of constructing the Cultural Center. On December 7, 1969, a banquet was held in recognition of the efforts of the Cultural Center Building Committee. Thus, the completion of this significant task in our Parish marked the successful end of a long and difficult phase which absorbed great personal sacrifice, energy, money, skill and time. This end marked the beginning of new challenge and God-given opportunities for our Parish community to respond with faith to the new challenges. "One door closes and another opens."

The Assistant to the Pastor, Deacon Dickran Metjian, left the service of the Parish in July, and was assigned as Deacon in charge of the small Armenian parish in Houston, Texas. Miss Clara Takesian was reappointed as Program and Education Director.

This year witnessed the Parish develop new organizational structures, expand and innovate a variety of activities and extend itself further into the community-at-large, with an ecumenical and community outreach. Thus, the new Center provided the Armenian Church of Our Saviour with the opportunity of hosting several community affairs. The Inter-faith prayer service sponsored by the Interfaith Clergy Committee was well attended by the community-at-large. The Parish also extended its "welcome" to our neighbors with an open house program on March 28th. The Cultural Center was also the site of the International Institute's Annual meeting and the fall assembly of the Greater Worcester Area Council of Churches.

The year experienced many activities and programs under the direct supervision of the Program and Education Director. In February, the Sunday School students participated in an essay contest which honored the memory of St. Vartan. The spring of the year saw the initiation of an Armenian dancing class for those who enjoyed the art form of classical Armenian dancing. The ACYOA enjoyed a retreat at the Passionist Fathers in Shrewsbury. Activities were developed for the junior high level and a new program called "Junior High Thing" came into being with enthusiastic response from our young people. In April, the ECHO was first heard, and became the monthly publication of the young members of our Parish giving them an opportunity to communicate their views amongst their parents and peers. As the result of

a joint meeting of the young people and Parish Council, an Ad Hoc Committee was designated by the young people to develop a Senior High Youth Activity Program. This Committee developed TUBS, or "Teen Up Beat", which has enjoyed great popularity.

The Parish Council also appointed an Athletic and Recreational Coordinator who formed a Committee to develop, through the Program and Education Director, an athletic and recreation program.

Members of the Committee were Gerald Mosessian, Coordinator, as well as Leon Kachadoorian, John Merzigian, Richard Papazian, John Balian, Charles Sharigian, George Markarian and Brian Davis.

Under this Committee a great spate of athletic activities were developed which saw an invitational basketball tournament held in December at the Cultural Center. This tournament involved participation of four sister Armenian Churches.

The Boy Scouts also continued to train our young men in the tradition of Scouting under the leadership of Scoutmaster Kachadoor Toromanian and his able committee.

For those who enjoy Table Tennis, Mr. John Tateosian, a recognized table tennis player, donated a complete table tennis set.

The Parish had responded well to some of the needs of our young people; a need poignantly expressed at the Parish Assembly by Nerses Zeytoonian who stated: "Drop-in With Your Children Before They Drop-out Without You". That challenge continues.

Other Church family needs were met by a cultural program honoring the centennial birth of the great Armenian religious composer, Gomidas Vartabed. The enthusiastic Centennial Committee was Chaired by Harry Sogigian and ably assisted by Margaret Hagopian, Torkom Boyajian, Mary Tateosian and Clara Takesian. This Committee invited Mrs. Ashdig Dedeyan, soloist, who performed in a memorable program, on November 21, 1969, dedicated mostly to the songs of the immortal Gomidas.

Many Parishoners (160) were inspired by their enjoyable fall trip to New York when the Parish went on a pilgrimage to the Cathedral. Many expressed a desire to continue this event as an annual affair. Parish bonds were also made stronger with sister religious organizations by the exchange of clergy and choirs with the Holy Trinity Church of Boston.

To meet the new challenge of the Parish, a Coordinating Committee was brought into being composed of representatives of all Church auxiliary organizations. The purpose of this Coordinating Committee

was to develop a Parish-wide approach to major fund-raising activi-The success of this approach is self-evident and was demonstrated by the substantial financial success of the Church bazaar. A second Parish organizational innovation was developed to meet the increased financial obligations of the Parish. The Parish Council asked Mr. George Shamgochian to Chair a Committee to investigate methods of promoting the sale of bonds for the purpose of reducing the existing indebtedness of the Parish. Mr. Shamgochian developed a committee which felt that a more accurate description of its role would be comprehended by the title "Mortgage Reduction Committee." On September 3, 1969, this Committee elected the following: Chairman, Dr. Sherman Santoian; Vice-Chairman, Dr. Harry Kavookjian; Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Margaret Hagopian; Recording Secretary, Arthur Yagjian; and a host of capable advisors. May God speed the work of these worthy people.

A year full of activity and growth has passed. There were successes and failures in our Parish life, and prayerfully we believe that all of those who participated in both have grown spiritually. The increase in cooperation and contributions of our people indicates that with God's help our community problems can be overcome.

May we each pray -- through our good and dedicated works -- for the spiritual health of our brothers and sisters in the Parish family.

A Resume

The 67th Annual Diocesan Assembly convened on Friday, May 2 and Saturday, May 3, 1969 at Saint James Armenian Apostolic Church, Watertown, Mass. under the presidency of our Primate Archbishop Torkom Manoogian.

There were 104 clergy and lay delegates present out of a total of 143.

Some Highlights

- Educational and Academic Council committee be appointed to pursue such matters within our Diocese.
- <u>Diving Liturgy</u> suggestions to make appropriate changes to make it more meaningful and appealing was rejected.
- Religious Consultant for the Diocese was voted upon and passed at an annual stipend at \$9,000. per annum.
- <u>Uniform Stipend</u> for clergy submitted by the Diocesan Council was passed together with the guidelines regulating them.
- A New Constitution for the uniform governance of the Armenian Church requested from His Holiness submitted by the New England Churches voted and passed.
- Rotation of Clergy every 5 years a committee to study its feasibility for a rotation plan was tabled by the Assembly.
- Rules for Procedure of Assembly A stydy by a special committee to adopt rules for procedure was submitted and adopted by the Assembly.
- Canada Suffragan Bishop Vatche Hovsepian addressed the Assembly.

 He told of the challenge and problems of the Parishes
 and urged everyone to co-operate and help fulfill their
 needs.

- "every year from now on, every step we take and even those we do not take will be progressively critical.."

ARMENIAN SCHOOL

The 1968-69 Armenian School term started on September 28, 1968, and continued until June 7, 1969. There were 28 weeks of school with the closing hantes on June 13, 1969.

Seventy-five pupils were registered and 71 students completed the 1968-69 year. Some 63 students were enrolled for the 1969-70 school year.

The teaching staff was organized under Deacon Dickran Metjian with Mrs. Mary Arakelian, first year students; Mrs. Anita Bazigian, second year; Mrs. Araxie Garabedian, third year; Mrs. Ani Kapour, fourth year; Mrs. Mary Aroian, fifth year; Mrs. Astrid Shaljian, sixth year; and Mrs. Angele Srabian, seventh and eighth years.

The members of the Armenian School Committee were: President, Very Reverend Muron Dz. V. Gurjikian; Executive Secretary, Deacon Dickran Metjian; Chairman, Mrs. Rose V. Houmere; Vice-Chairman, Mrs. Arshalous Andonian; Secretary, Mrs. Mary Arakelian; Treasurer, Mrs. Rose Aslanian; Advisors, Torcom Hooloian, Mary Aroian, Haroutune Kasparian; Liaison Officer, Ralph Yagjian. This Armenian School Committee functioned throughout the 1968-69 school year until the installation of a new School Committee on October 15, This new Committee is under the presidency of Very Reverend Muron Gurjikian; the Chairman is Torcom Hooloian; Secretary, Anna Krikorian; Treasurer, Torkom Boyajian, Corresponding Secretary, Mrs. Arshalous Andonian; Advisors, Mrs. Mary Arakelian, Mr. Malig Soghomonian, and Mrs. Alice Yarumian. Liaison Officer is Van Aroian. The principal for the current academic year is Mr. Manasse Jardarian. New teachers are: Jean Benglian, first year; Mrs. Helen Maralian, third year, Rose Aslanian, Fourth year; Mary Tateosian, fifth year. Also teaching are Mrs. Mary Arakelian, first year and Mary Aroian, sixth year. Substitute teachers are Mrs. Grace Kheboian and Miss Roseanne Bagdassarian.

Both the 1968-69 School Committee and the current committee have spent much time at the improvement of the school curriculum. This is a difficult task which will require much energy and commitment on behalf of capable people to develop a modern curriculum suitable to third and fourth generation American Armenians. The current Committee is now working under the guideline of an outline curriculum drawn up by the Very Reverend Muron Gurjikian. It is

the hope of the Committee that the hard work of the teaching staff and School Committee and widening Parish support will contribute to the continuing revitalization of the Armenian School. The opening of our excellent teaching facility further challenges us all to develop a better Armenian School for the future.

PROGRAM & CURRICULUM: Classes began on September 21st, and the total registration as of December 31st is 282.

Supervisors conduct opening assemblies in their respective departments in an atmosphere of worship that includes Bible Readings, prayers and hymns of the Armenian Church, the collection of offerings, and lessons from the Armenian Church Liturgical Calendar.

Classroom curriculum for ages 3 to 8 is the David Cook Bible-in-Life Series; age 9, the faith of the Armenian Church; age 10, the saints and sacraments of the Armenian Church; age 11, the life of Jesus; age 12, Armenian Church history; and ages 13 & 14, a new text, "Light on Life" designed to help students relate their faith and knowledge of their Church with their development as young persons. Ages 15, 16 & 17 are participating in a program of elective academic courses which are held every other week on the topics "Divine Liturgey", "Armenian History", and "Religions of Man". On alternate Sunday mornings, students attend church services, sing in the choir, serve as teaching assistants in the Sunday Church School, or spend the time with their families.

Students attend church services monthly by department and periodically by class, including attendance on two Sundays a year for receiving Holy Communion by class.
