PASTOR'S ANNUAL REPORT

As you all know, I arrived in Worcester during the month of June to take over the pastoral office of this Parish. The previous Pastor, Very Rev. Muron Dz.V. Gurjikian continued in office almost till the end of June, therefore my report will cover the work of only six months (July - Dec.).

CHURCH SERVICE The Sunday services took place regularly with a short morning service and then celebrated the Divine Liturgy. Upon the request of many of our parishioners, the summer church schedule has been continued for the rest of the year. In this way church services are over at 11:30 a.m. and our people have more time to spend with their families. We have noticed that this new timing has been well accepted by the majority and the attendance in church has improved.

Another thing we established is the preaching in both Armenian and English languages every Sunday so that our English speaking generation would be able to receive a message also. The presence of the young people is again noticed in the church.

On the Feast of St. Stephen, which was Western Christmas Eve, we had a special English service in order to make the Armenian Holy Badarak more comprehensible. This new attempt was well received by everybody, both senior and young generation, and the church was full with no such precedent before.

On the day of Armenian Christmas, a special service was prepared for the children's Holy Communion which was relevant to their age and understanding. Many parents and seniors were present that day also.

We are happy to confirm the presence of the teen agers and young people in our church who especially participate in the services.

The coffee fellowship gatherings in the church hall after church services which we have held twice so far, was again a new approach and very encouraging. The aim of course is to strengthen the communication among the members of the church and to keep the parish close to the church life for the edification of the community. We felt an overwhelming enthusiasm due to the favorable results and we will plan more of these in the future as we are sure everyone is looking forward to these fellowship gatherings.

NEW MEMBERS It is with sorrow we affirm that over the years, some families for some reason or other have alienated themselves from their spiritual home, the Armenian Church and have joined other communities becoming members of Protestant Churches. This we consider a disgrace to the Armenian History and an ungrateful attitude toward our martyrs who did not hesitate to bargain their lives and for centuries our forefathers have undergone immeasurable sacrifices for the preservation of this Church as a community. We think it is only fair and decent for any person who is of Armenian descent to be proud of his heritage, to be aware of the values and not to deny his

Church and the faith of his fathers especially in an age where circumstances are not threatening to our existance. It is our aim to see the scattered some and daughters of St. Gregory The Enlightener return to their home where they belong.

We are happy to announce that several families have been enlisted into the community of the church family. The following families have become members as of the end of December: Mr. & Mrs. Jeff Starr Mararian, Mrs. Anna Hovenesian, Harry Hovenesian and Aaron Hovenesian.

SACRAMENTS According to the church records, during 1972 we had 13 baptisms, 9 weddings and 19 funerals.

VISITATIONS Being a new member in this 80 year old historic parish, I believe that the only way to know the community members well is by means of visitations in order to create a communication and to strengthen the church tie among the parishioners. We have done our best to make use of all available opportunities to visit the families, whether on a happy or sad occasion, and we have never refused any invitation to visit any home. As regularly as possible, we have visited also the sick at the six local hospitals whenever we have been notified by the hospitals or individuals; this applies also to nursing homes. At all times, besides communicating and making new acquaintances in this way, we have tried to strengthen and comfort them by the word of God and encouraged them not to remain far from the sacraments or from paryer.

As far as visitation is concerned, it is our desire to visit also the near-by towns where small Armenian communities are located. We would like to do this as soon as the opportunity and the cooperation is presented to us.

MEETINGS We have presided and attended almost all of the meetings of our parish organizations, trying to bring our active cooperation in the resolutions of current matters. There have also been other meetings which we have attended outside the parish which are listed below.

RELATIONSHIPS With no special effort, our relationships have automatically expanded outside the sphere of our community. Along with the organizations of our parish, we have been invited by the Ladies Auxiliary of St. James, Watertown and Arlington Armenian School Committee at Holy Trinity, Cambride to speak during the cultural month of October. The Armenian Martyrs Protestant Church invited me to be the main speaker at their 80th Anniversary Banquet. We took part in the Special Study Committee of the Council of Churches attending several meetings. Also was invited to join the Board of Directors of the Interfaith Clergy Association of Greater Worcester: for six consecutive days (Nov. 27-Dec. 2) we delivered a message and a prayer from the WTAG radio station. We have also been invited to give the opening prayer at the City Council meeting on November 8th.

Our relations with the Greater Worcester Area Council of Churches as a member church continues its normal participation at all times. As in the past year, the President of the Council of Churches is Van Aroian.

THE MESSENGER The Church paper is another matter which occupies our special attention to make it attractive and instructive for our parishioners. At this time we wish to express our appreciation in public to Mrs. Rose Toromanian, who apart from her everyday duties, does a fine job in making the paper as efficient as can be, both in the contents and in publishing, which in itself is a task of considerable magnitude.

OTHER ACCOMPLISHMENTS It is almost four months now that we have established a religious seminar in the Armenian language for our senior members and we are glad to say that a small group regularly attends these meetings every Thursday afternoon. The purpose of the seminar is to explain and study the faith, the rituals, the history and traditions of the Armenian Church based on the teachings of the Bible.

In the educational field, we have participated by teaching Armenian every Friday afternoon to a group of nine students who originally are the graduate class of our Armenian School.

The young generation being the center of our attention, we foster a special affection for them and also have some particular anxieties. For this reason, we try to support and strengthen our Sunday School students and the junior youth group (ACYOA) with special care and various educational means.

We are happy to state that we have a new committee consisting of three ladies, Mrs. Arousiag Najarian, Mrs. Anna Taraian and Mrs. Dirouhi Ishlemejian, who are undertaking the care and embelishment of our Altars. In a short period, they have accomplished quite a lot and we would like to thank them and express our appreciation for their devoted attention; particularly to Mrs. Najarian, who personally has contributed a great deal. We pray that the Good Lord may reward them with His richest blessings for the service to His church.

On the occasion of our Church's 20th anniversary, the traditional Madagh and the Agape Dinner was both an exciting novelty and a rewarding experience for our parishioners who were inspired and encouraged by the spiritual as well as the financial effects of the affair.

GIFTS It is with great appreciation we wish to mention again the generous donation of Mr. & Mrs. Jack (Ghevont) Hagopian and Mr. & Mrs. Ray Hovsepian for the furniture of their late parents which was used in furnishing the new rectory for the Parish Pastor, thus adding a distinguished asset in the community and creating the possibility to be able to host our guests in our premises instead of taking them to the hotels.

At his point, we would advise our parishioners that in case they wish to donate any of their furniture, let them contact us first because it is possible that we might make use of them in some of the Rectory rooms which are still unfurnished.

Our thanks to Mrs. Yeghis Chararian who donated a pair of beautiful

crowns to be used for the bride and groom during the wedding ceremony. Our thanks also to Mrs. Mary Kachigian and Elizabeth Krik for don-ating a pair of large Pascal candles for the sanctuary of our Church.

FUTURE ENDEAVORS In view of the lack of spiritual and Christian education and noting the desire thereof, we are planning to start a young adult study group where possibly through panel discussion, and explanation of some religious and present day moral subjects might enlighten our members to better understand the Bible and get more acquainted with their church heritage.

We recently sent flyers in order to approach those who are eager to learn the Armenian language, culture or history and we are pleased by the replies we have received. We shall, therefore, start these classes on Wednesday, February 7, 1973 from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. and continue each Wednesday evening thereafter in one of the Classroom at the Cultural Center.

We have noticed that our junior youth group needs to spend more time together and in the church premises with various creative activities. For this purpose, we have deemed it necessary to make it possible for them to have a "recreation room" where it would be possible for them to get together a few times during the week. Upon the presentation to both the Parish Council and the youth group, we are glad that it has been approved by the first and welcomed by the latter; it remains therefore to execute for the realization of the said Rec Room.

In a large parish like Worcester, we hope to be able to bring together a substantial number of youngsters and teenagers who play any sort of musical instrument. We are looking forward to organizing a small orchestra of young people under the leadership of a capable director. We urge all parents therefore, to bring to our attention and give us the names of all youngsters who play an instrument and would like to participate in performing in the above mentioned project.

It has come to our attention that there are a good number of Armenian students in the city colleges and universities; some of them are from abroad. We think it is an advisable attempt to gather them around our community center in order to strengthen their spiritual and ethnical awarness because the influence of the age might be a threat and a danger of their complete alienation.

Finally, before we bring to an end our report for six months activity, we wish to express our gratitude first and foremost to God our Lord, who granted us all the good health and the opportunity to work.

Many are those who brought their share of service for the Lord and the community, the names of whom are known to our Father. We pray that they may all be rewarded abundantly according to their good heart.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

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The Parish Council respectfully submits the following report of activities for 1972.

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The Annual Parish Assembly was held at 1:10 P.M. on Sunday, January 23, 1972 and was continued on Sunday, January 30, 1972 for the purpose of electing members of the Parish Council, Auditing Committee and Nominating Committee.

The Assembly was chaired by Harry Sogigian; the Assembly secretary was Bartev Bagdasarian.

The following were elected as Parish Council members: David Adishian, George Megrdichian, Charles Garabedian, Leon Kachadorian, Gilbert Markarian, and Peter Nalbandian.

Elected as Auditing Committee members: Jacob Bilzerian, Anne Demirjian, and Henry Shooshan; as nominating committee: Ruth Kaprelian, George Migridichian, Charles Sharigian, George Sogigian, and Berjoohie Zakarian.

On March 7, 1972 the Very Rev. Muron Dz.V. Gurjikian, Pastor presided at the organization meeting of the Parish Council. The following executive officers were elected: Chairman, Jacob Hagopian; Vice Chairman, Charles Garabedian; Secretary, David Adishian, Treasurer, Peter Nalbandian; Assistant Secretary, Gilbert Markarian; and Assistant Treasurer, Leon Kachadorian. Advisors were Zarvin Kasparian, Van Aroian, John Toromanian, Arsen Haroian, and George Megrdichian.

During 1972 Hayr Soorp Muron Gurjikian retired after serving our parish for nine years and thrity-eight years of service in the priesthood. Hayr Muron's retirement date was May 1, 1972 but he stayed through June 18, 1972 when he celebrated his last official Divine Liturgy. The Parish honored Hayr Soorp Gurjikian at a dinner in the Cultural Center on the same date. Hayr Soorp's contributions to our Parish and to our community were many for which we are most grateful. He will certainly be long remembered by all of us.

Effective June 25, 1972 Very Rev. Shnork Kasparian assumed the Pastorship of our church with the celebration of the Divine Liturgy. He was formally welcomed in the Cultural Center with a coffee fellowship after church services. We all wished Hayr Shnork the best in his new endeavor and offered him our complete support.

Hayr Shnork is now living on the second floor of the parish house which was completely redecorated and furnished last summer. Most of the work was done on a voluntary basis by the parish members and the total cost represented a fraction of the total value.

We also purchased a new 1972 automobile for Hayr Soorp after he had many problems with the used car originally purchased.

Two of the many highlights since Hayr Shnork's arrival have been the Madagh commemorating the 20th anniversary of our Church on Salisbury Street on November 19th and the celebration of Western Christmas Eve (Dec. 24) Midnight Mass (a first) with the live Nativity scene. Both events were well attended and met with considerable success in the eyes of our parishioners.

Financially we held our own and operated within our planned budget for which we are most thankful to all parishioners. Of particular significance is the fact that we paid off our \$75,000 Cultural Center note to the Mechanics National Bank.

The Parish Council remains aware of the needs for programs and services for our church members and efforts have been and are continually being made to identify areas of <u>interest</u> and <u>need</u> of the various segments within our parish and community.

Emphasis is on a closer communication with the membership to more clearly identify and implement programs and services consistent with our objectives of providing a rich spiritual parish life for our membership.

A RESUME '- 70th ANNUAL DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY

The 70th Annual Diocesan Assembly gathered on May 5-6, 1972 at St. Peter's Armenian Church, Watervliet, New York with Archbishop Torkom Manoogian presiding.

Participating in this year's Assembly were three guest clergymen: Bishop Dirayr Mardigian, Primate of the Armenian Church in Rumania and Bulgaria, Very Rev. Kevork Saraydarian and Rev. Garabed Kludjian, guest from Holy Etchmiadzin.

All participated in the meetings and worship services.

A number of innovations marked this year's Assembly. Among them was the first conference of Church Ladies' organizations and youth groups as well as separate hearings and discussions on budget and proposals.

The Ladies Conference examined the role of woman in our Church and heard an impressive message from Mrs. Zabelle Atesian who discussed and broadened the range and nature of the responsibilities of women in our activities and religious life.

AMENDMENTS: TO BY-LAWS PASSED FOR THE FIRST TIME

- a. Article 51 proposal, "to have one half, or close to one half as possible, of the delegates of each Church shall be elected every other year."
- b. Article 54. insert- "Parish Council Chairman shall be ex-officio to the Diocesan Assembly with the same privileges and rights as elected delegates."

PROPOSALS ADOPTED

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Section,

- 1. 1973 being the 75th anniversary of the founding of our diocese, a campaign for a \$2,000.000.00 trust fund be created-the income of which will be used to cover a major portion of the operating and programming expenses of the Diocese.
- 2. Celebrate the Jubilee of our Primate throughout the various regions of our Diocese under the auspices of the Diocesan Assembly.
- 3. Budget for 1972- \$295,000. adopted, with \$31,000. additional income for 1972. Increase in parish assessments a certainty.
- 4. A proposal was adopted requesting the National Council of Churches to make an appeal on behalf of the Patriarchate of Turkey to safeguard the future of humanitarian institutions in that country.

The 1973 Diocesan Assembly will take place in Worcester at the Armenian Churchoof Our Saviour, the Diocese' birthplace in America.

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ARMENIAN SCHOOL COMMITTEE

The 1971-72 Armenian School year began with registration on September 25, 1971, with classes starting on October 2, 1971 and ending June 10, 1972. Classes were held on Saturday mornings from 10 a.m. to noon. There were 28 days of school, with a total of 45 students registered, of which 40 completed the year.

The faculty: Mrs. Mary Arakelian, Mrs. Mary Aroian, Mrs. Rose Aslanian, Miss Lucy Mooradian, Miss Sonia Yagjian and Mrs. Alyce Yarumian. During the year, Miss Marcia Gazoorian was available as a substitute teacher.

The School Committee: Very Rev. Muron Gurjikian; Mrs. Alyce Yarumian, Chairman; Mr. Torkom Boyajian, Treasurer; Mrs. Arshalouis Andonian, Corr. Secretary; Miss Charlotte Calfaian, Recording Secretary; Mrs. Armenoohi Jardarian; Mr. Zarvin Kasparian and Mr. Van Aroian, Liaison. Mr. Manase Jardarian continued as principal. The Committee had 14 regularly scheduled meetings, plus 2 meetings with the principal and teachers.

Special Events: a Christmas party was given on December 18 for the children to which the parents were also invited; a food sale on Palm Sunday; a seminar was held in Worcester on May 5, 1972 with representatives from Holy Trinity Church, Cambridge and St. James of Watertown to discuss common problems and possible solutions and to exchange ideas.

The establishment of a satisfactory curriculum was the principle goal of the Committee during the year. Much progress was made along these lines. Criteria and achievement goals were determined, outlining specific objectives for each grade.

As of October, 1972, we have initiated the use of the new textbook and material along with the tape recordings which have been prepared by the Diocese with the assurance that additional textbooks are being prepared on a graduated level.

We are pleased to also state, that Friday afternoon classes 3:30 p.m. to 5:30 p.m. are being conducted by Hayr Soorp for students 12 years and older. Also beginning Wednesday, February 7, 1973 classes in Armenian language, culture and history will be taught by Hayr Soorp to young adults from 7 p.m. to 9 p.m. in a classroom at the Cultural Center.

We now have a student body of sixty and with a fervent wish to attain an ever increasing higher goal.

The Treasurer's report for the period Aug. 1, 1971 - July 31, 1972 shows a total income of \$1040.74; total expense \$791.31; balance \$249.43.
