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DEACON'S ANNUAL REPORT

As spiritual administrator and Deacon-in-Charge during the past 16 months, my responsibilities have been to arrange for and ensure the fulfillment of the spiritual needs of our faithful. Fortunately we have always had clergymen to officiate at all liturgical and worship services, thus fulfilling our parishioners spiritual needs.

CHURCH SERVICES- The Divine Liturgy is the Central worship service of our church. We have celebrated this service on Sunday mornings as well as special weekday feasts. Our sermons have been delivered in two languages, Armenian and English in order to reach our entire bi-lingual community.

Aside from our weekly liturgies five *pecial celebrations were offered:

- 1. Women'Saint's Day of the Armenian Church (March)
- 2. Lazarus Saturday Children's Communion Service (Mar.)
- 3. Holy Thursday Eucharist (March)
- 4. Ascension Thursday (May)
- 5. Feast of Holy Translators SS. Sahag & Mesrob (June)

Also the Feast of St. Stephen (Western Christmas Eve) was commemorated with a special concert of Christmas Carols and the celebration of the Divine Liturgy by Rev. Fr. Nersess Jebejian of Springfield St. John The Divine Armenian Church. This special service has become a tradition of our parish and has served to satisfy the needs of those faithful who are eager to go to church that night as well as to make the Divine Liturgy more comprehensible. The parishioner's response was very encouraging.

During Lent and Holy Week, special services were offered. Every Wednesday evening during Lent, penetential services were said. During Holy Week the full cycle of services were offered. It was very encouraging to see the parishioners positive response.

Several weddings, baptisms and funerals have been performed. We have made every attempt to perform these services according to canon and with dignity so that they would be spiritually stimulating to our faithful.

EDUCATIONAL- We have also organized special gatherings for adults and adolescents to educate them about important religious and cultural subjects. A spedial 8 week Summer Studies course was conducted by the Very Rev. Khajag Barsamian and myself teaching elementary and advanced modern Armenian and Armenian Church History. The response was very encouraging.

Five of our young Acolytes were sent from our church to participate at the St. Nersess Summer Study Conference which was held in Hope, New Jersey during August 2-14. The time spent at this conference proved to be quite beneficial to these fine young men who presently serve our church faithfully every week.

We have established an elementary training course for young boys to serve at the altar. These young boys have not only been learning how to serve at the altar but also have learned the proper decorum and behaviour of one serving in church. Along with our advanced group we have 18 young boys now prepared to serve our church.

We have endeavored to continue the programs of the Church School under the capable leadershio of Mr. Michael Zeytoonian, our Program and Education Director and Mrs. Joan Handleman and Mr. Seth Bilazarian, our supervisors.

Fellowship and communication being part of Christian Education, we wish to mention here that we have on several occasions during the year held fellowship gatherings for the strengthening of ties amongst parish members in a warm atmosphere.

We are also pleased to note that our inactive ACYOA Seniors group have reorganized and are busily endeavoring to plan programs of interest to reach our youth between the ages of 18-30 years of age.

SACRAMENTS - During the past year, all sacraments excluding the celebration of the Divine Liturgy and funeral services have been canonically performed by the visiting clergymen to our parish. Total sacraments for 1975:

Baptisms: 10; Weddings: 9; Funerals: 31

CHOIR- We are happy to mention that our sub-deacons, acolytes and choir members have participated in all of our church services making them more joyful by their singing and devoted spirit. It is gratifying to notice more and more young members joining our Church Choir which is under the capable direction of Mrs. Margaret Hagopian.

VISITATION- Visitations are another important part of our ministry. We feel that contact with our faithful is an important means of keeping our members close to their church. This is particularly true with those who are hospitalized or ill at home, the bereaved, the lonely shut-ins and those who are in pain and sorrow. We have shared their grief and offered consolation through prayer and God's message and also by administering the sacrament of Holy Communion to strengthen their faith.

THE MESSENGER- This church publication is mailed to all members and Diocesan parishes in order to keep them aware of our church's activities and community life. Owing to shortage of staff, often we must combine issues. We continually strive to improve this publication and earnestly encourage our church organizations to support this periodical through their literary efforts. invite all comments. Much thanks to Mrs. Rose Toromanian for her assistance in the preparation of this publication. At the present time, in order to reduce costs, The Messenger is being printed on our office machines.

MEETINGS- As President of all parish groups, we have with much interest attended meetings and enthusiastically participated in their functions. We certainly feel that the only way that the clergy can keep abreast of what is happening in the parish is to make every effort to be present at their weekly or monthly meetings.

INTER-CHURCH RELATIONS- We have on occasions been invited to participate in various programs of ecumenical character. During Holy Week, we were invited to attend and participate in special services at St. Paul's Cathedral. Our lay participant at this service was Mr. Harry Sogigian. In November, we participated in a Symposium and Conference at Quinsigamond Community College. This program sponsored by the Ecumenical Council of Churches, dealt with ministry to the aged. We have also continued our involvement with the Orthodox-Catholic encounter groups created to develop a greater awareness of our two Apostolic traditions.

Our relations with all non-Armenian Churches in Worcester are mainly through the Ecumenical Council of Churches to which we continue our membership.

PARISH COUNCIL REPORT

The Parish Council respectfully submits the following report of its activities for the year 1975.

The first session of the Annual Parish Assembly was held on Wednesday, January 29, 1975 with a second continuing session on Sunday, February 2, 1975. Chairman for these sessions was Mr. Barbev: Bagdasarian and Mr. Gilbert Markarian, secretary. Elections were held, during these Assembly sessions for Parish Council, Nominating Committee and Auditing Committee. elected to the Parish Council were Messra George Migridichian, Aaron Hovenesian, George Avakian, Francis Najarian and Lutwig Stepanian. Elected to the Nominating Committee were Mrs. Rose Aslanian, Mrs. Lucy Kasparian and Messrs. John Toromanian, Henry Shooshan, and Asbed Zakarian. Elected to the Auditing Committee were Miss Anne Demirjian, Mr. Edward Bilzerian and Mr. Harry Sogigian. One of the prime concerns of the parishioners present during these Assembly sessions, was the investment of the surplus cash. The Parish Council has forged ahead on this issue by establishing two committees (a) Investmen and Ways and Means. The responsibility of the former is to seek better ways of investing any surplus cash; the responsibility of the latter is to investigate means of (a) raising monies and (b) increasing our membership and (c) having more of our :members take an active role in the affairs of the Church.

The Parish Council met with the Investment Committee and after a study, the Committee determined that our present investment of our reserve funds in time deposits offer the best and safest return. The Parish Council has also met with the members of the Ways and Means Committee who are now examining various methods of improving the ultimate financial position of the parish.

On March 4, 1975, an organizational meeting of the Council took place. Elections were held and the following persons elected to the indicated positions:
Chairman, Mr. George Migridichian; Vice-Chairman, Mr. Kazar Kazarian; Treasurer, Mr. Peter Nalbandian; Assistant Treasurer, Mr. George Avakian; Secretary, Mr. Lutwig Stepanian; Assistant Secretary, Mr. Aaron Hovenesian. Advisors to the Executive Committee of the Council are Mrs. Alyce Yarumian, Mr. Carnig Alexanderian, Mr. John Kabian, Mr. David Adishian and Mr. Francis Najarian.

On February 16th, Vartanantz Day was celebrated with a banquet in the Cultural Center. This was a joint affair with Knights of Vartan. The first of a series of Special Parish Assemblies was held on March 2nd with Mr. Bagdasarian acting as Chairman and Mr. Markarian as Secretary. The proposed 1975 budget,

which was not approved at the January-February sessions, was reviewed and debated again. It was finally agreed to show an income of \$65,350 and an expense ceiling of \$78,900. The parishioners also voted to have our Deacon, Daniel Kochakian become our pastor upon his ordination. An Appreciation Dinner was also held on March 16th for the fifteen parishioners who co-signed the \$75,000 note.

In April, the Very Rev. Father Khajag Barsamian was assigned to our parish on a temporary basis, pending his matriculation at St. Vladimir's Theological Seminary in the Fall. The Sixtieth anniversary of the Armenian Genocide was observed this month both within the Church and the Armenian Community at-large.

A Special Parish Assembly was held on May 21st with Mr. George Migridichian as Chairman and Mr. Lutwig Stepanian as Secretary. The purpose of this Assembly was (a) to hear the report of the Diocesan Delegates who had attended the Annual Diocesan Assembly in Cambridge and (b) to discuss our pastoral status.

In June of this year, Mr. Kazar Kazarian, Vice-Chairman of the Parish Council, resigned for personal reasons. Mr. John Kabian was elected to this post. Mr. Haroutune Kasparian, first alternate, filled the existing Council vacancy.

During the month of August, Mr. Michael Zeytoonian began his duties as Youth Educational Director on a part-time basis. Our Annual Church Picnic was also held this month. The turn-out by our parishioners was overwhelming and the picnic a success. The Very Rev. Father Khajag Barsamian had to depart our parish this month for overseas on personal business.

The Annual Church Pilgrimage to St. Vartan Cathedral in New York took place on October 12th. Over 120 parishioners took part in the pilgrimage displaying a genuine spiritual dedication for the Church. The Parish Council subsidized a portion of the overall cost on a per person basis.

On November 15-16, the Annual Church Bazaar was held in the Cultural Center. Again, the turnout by our members and friends was splendid-- and the affair a success.

The last of the Special Parish Assemblies took place on December 3rd with Mr. Migridichian and Mr. Stepanian acting as Chairman and Secretary respectively. Our pastoral status was again reviewed and our parishioners again reaffirmed their vote of last March 2nd. The year ended with a gala New Year's Eve Dinner-Dance in the Cultural Center with over ninety couples attending this event and thoroughly enjoying themselves.

During this past year, the Parish Council continued the program wherein Council members and Clergy visit any and all parish families who are in mourning. The Council undertook some major capital improvements: (a) the heating system in the Parish House was updated by the installation of a gas unit (b) an A.B.Dick Stencil maker and Mimeograph were purchased in an effort to cut printing costs to a minimum and (c) became acutely aware of needed capital improvements to the Church Complex. These improvements will be undertaken in the Spring of 1976 and within budgetary limitations. The Cultural Center mortgage was reduced to a more reasonable level thanks to the many generous financial contributions by our parishioners. The Cultural Center mortgage as of December 31, 1975 stood at \$113,102. as compared to \$142,589.14 at the end of 1974.

In closing, the Parish Council wishes to express its sincere appreciation and gratitude to each and every member of our parish who has participated in worshipping and glorifying God and who has shared and given of their time and talents in various Church organizations and activities by creating fellowship with one another. May the good Lord bless us all and give us the wisdom to know ourselves better so that we may continue to worship Him for His glory.

The Cultural Center Building Fund fared well in 1975 due primarily to increased receipts from Church related organizations. Monthly payments of \$1,461.90 are promptly disbursed as due on the Building Loan. Current balance of the mortgage is \$113,102.00 with about nine years to maturity at 61% interest.

The above statement reflects the Funds present cash position. Accounting records, bank statements and mortgage transactions were reviewed by the Augiting Committee.

ANNUAL DIOCESAN ASSEMBLY

Deliberations of the Diocesan Assembly took place at Holy Trinity Church of Greater Boston in Cambridge, Mass. on May 2 and 3, 1975. The Assembly was conducted in five separate sessions all of which were attended by the Parish delegates. His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian presided at all of the meetings.

Upon confirmation of Delegates, the Assembly proceeded to election of officers wherein two delegates from the Church of Our Saviour were nominated and elected to office. Gilbert Markarian as Vice Chairman and Bart Bagdasarian, Secretary English Language.

Minutes of the previous Assembly were approved and a message from His Holiness Catholicos Vasken I was read to the delegates. Incidentally, this message and all reports presented at the Assembly as well as detailed minutes of the body are available for any member of the Parish at the Church Office.

A report presented by Archbishop Manoogian contained details of the operation and activities of the past year as well as proposals for future growth and well-being of our Diocese.

A proposal to amend article 50 of the By-Laws was voted affirmatively. A proposal to catergorize the Diocesan budget in three separate classifications was accepted by the Delegates. A proposal to establish a Hunger Relief Fund was accepted by a majority of the delegates. A proposal directed to the Diocesan Council to draft ammendments to the By-Laws for payment of assessments by the Parishes was accepted. A resolution in regard to presentation of additional candidates to list of nominees for office to Diocesan Assembly was found acceptable.

Clergy Stipends Committee presented an up-dated report which is to be incorporated by the Diocesan Office.

A request for a separate Canadian Diocese was briefed to the Assembly by Rt. Rev. Bishop Aris Shirvanian, Vicar of Canada and submitted to the Diocesan Council for consideration.

The Assembly was apprised of the passing of Mr. Dickran H. Boyajian, many years delegate to these Assemblies. A prayer for the soul of departed brother was offered by Rt. Rev. Bishop Papken Varjabedian.

Rev. Arten Ashjian reported on the deliberations of the Clergy conference which had been held prior to the Assembly.

Diocesan Council report was presented and approved following due consideration.

The Budget report indicated a need for \$431,900.00 total sum for the year 1975 operation of the Diocese. It was approved.

A session of the Assembly was devoted to consideration of Unity Committee Report. In essence, it contained details of their work and requested guide lines for future discussion by both parties.

Auditinggand Courtesies Committee reports were offered and approved.

The Arch-Diocesan Study Committee, chaired by Zarvin Kasparian, reported its activity during the past year having brought the last Assemblies request into implementation. The re-structuring of our present Diocese into an Arch-Diocese will take a period of time and may be accomplished in several stages. The revised By-Laws to carryout this purpose have been prepared and the work of the Committee was approved for continued development.

Elections were conducted for Diocesan Council Members, Proposals and Nominating Committees as well as Budget and Auditing. A new member for the Board of Trustees was also elected.

The Assembly concluded with a tribute to Mr. Boyajian, gratitude to the Officers and blessing of the Delegates by His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian.

PROGRAMMING For the first time, students pre-registered in the summer months for the 1975-76 academid year. Conducted through the church office, the new system avoided much of the first day commotion. Thus on September 14, 1975 Church opened with a good majority of the total of 145 registrants already registered. The system was a success and will be continued, although a push is needed to bolster enrollment which has decreased universally in the past few years.

This year's program consists of the classroom, the worship assembly and exposure and participation in our Divine Liturgy through Holy Communion. The first 20 minutes of Church School is given to worship assembly, designed to parallel and reflect our services and their traditional make-up. assembly is divided, the primary grades (Pre-School to Grade three) in a more formative assembly while grades four through seven attend an assembly designed similarly to our Jashou Service and led by the acolytes of the day. The remainder of the time is given to the classroom, ensuring at least one hour of class time perweek. Classes are scheduled for group Holy Communion usually one Sunday out of each month and on their day will spend the final 1/2 hour in Church. is hoped that in the future, the program will be designed to give every student an opportunity to be in Church every Sunday and to schedule classes in Church so that every student may participate and witness every portion of the Liturgy and not only the end as has been the case.

Three elements contribute to making the Church School program a success. The first element is the student participation,

which comes often as a result of the efforts of the other two elements, the teaching staff and the parents. Just as the effort of the teacher must amount to much more than being there for the 1½ hours each Sunday morning, it is vital that the parental role be more than merely seeing that the child is attending. A parent must be an example and a constant encouragement, interested in the student's progress and involved himself. If the Church School is to thrive in the future, it must be led by the parents as well as the teachers.

SPECIAL ACTIVITIES and PROGRAMS

There were several special activities during the 1975 year of Christian Education. On Sunday, February 9th, the school celebrated the Feast of Great Baregentan with a party and games, after which they attended Church, witnessed the Lenten Closing of the Curtain. During the Lenten season, the students contributed through participation in our Church Services. On Lazarus Saturday, March 22nd, the entire school received Holy Communion with breakfast following the service. Our students also participated on Palmisunday and in the Holy Week services. On Sunday, May 18, the Pentecost Feast, the Parish of St. John The Divine Church of Springfield visited our parish and Church School, exchanging ideas, lunching together and planning future teamwork.

Closing exercises for the 74-75 school year was held on June 15, highlighted by the presentation of awards to students and an explanation of the curriculum to the parents and friends present.

Prior to the re-opening of Church School for the 75-76 year, our teachers were hosts and participants along with Providence in the first CRE "Teaching Workshop" on September 6th in our Cultural Center. The program included a full day of training and presentations for our teachers. Miss Valerie Goekjian and Mr. Michael Chevian, St. Nersess students, did an excellent job with this workshop and the teachers benefitted as well. On opening day, September 14, our staff was that much more prepared for the new year.

On October 12, our Church School and entire Parish departed for New York City on a Pilgrimage to St. Vartan Cathedral. Over 120 people made the trip and took part in the Divine Liturgy, adinner, movie and tour of the Cathedral complex. On Saturday, October 25th, our teachers hosted the annual Church School Halloween Party, complete with refreshments, games, movies and costume contest and prizes. Many thanks to Joan Handleman, along with several of our teachers who planned the party and also the Christmas Party which was held in a similar fashiom, though delayed a week due to a snow storm on Sunday, December 28th.

November was a busy month for the Church School. On Sunday

November 23, our eldest class members narrated and gave an explanation of our Liturgy during the actual Divine Liturgy with Rev. Father Terenig Kondralian celebrating. The following week, Sunday, November 30, our older classes (grades 7,8,9) hosted the classes of the Providence SS. Sahag & Mesrob Church School and offered a light lunch after class. This visitation was the first half of an exchange program. Our students will be the guests of the Providence Church School on Sunday, January 25, 1976.
