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MINUTES - ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

The Annual Parish Assembly of the Church of Our Saviour, Worcester, Massachusetts convened on Sunday, January 31, 1982 in the church hall immediately after church services.

The polls were opened at 11:15 a.m. for balloting for members of the Parish Council, Nominating Committee and Auditing Committee. The polls were closed at 12:30 p.m. and a lunch was served to all present by the Senior Ladies Auxiliary.

At 1:10 p.m. the Co-Chairman Gilbert Markarian called the Assembly to order with Reverend Father Garabed Kochakian, Pastor presiding. Der Hayr led the assembly in prayers after which the Chair was turned over to Mr. Vahan Pogharian who called for nominations and election of officers for the Assembly. Mr. Vahan Pogharian was elected Chairman and Mr. Gilbert Markarian was elected Secretary of the Annual Assembly.

It was noted that there were 86 members in attendance.

The Chair asked if there were any items of "New Business" that any members wished to add to the agenda. Two proposals were made:

- 1. A recommendation from the Auditing Committee to increase the size and alter the terms of office for this committee; and
- 2. A proposal from Mr. Haroutune Kasparian to study the feasibility of an everyday Armenian School.

The assembly voted to add both items to the agenda.

Since all in attendance had copies, the reading of the minutes of the previous assembly were waived after noting a correction to be made to include the name of Mr. Asbed Zakarian as having been elected to the Parish Council.

The report of the Pastor was read by Reverend Father Kochakian who in his comments stressed his concern for the enrollment of children in both the language and church schools. He urged all to support these endeavors and to insure attendance of their children.

The reading of the Parish Council Report was also waived and the Chair called for discussions and questions on a page by page review since all in attendance had copies. A question was raised as to what constituted "church treasures" on inventory which had been made.

Der Hayr explained that they were the vessels, candlesticks, altar appointments, pictures, chalices, Gontags and other ancient documents and church records which had been collected and placed in the archives. He also informed those present that the Aivososki painting had been appraised again. Mr. Zarvin Kasparian assured all that these items are listed in insurance policies that are being

purchased by the church. In further explanation of the figures shown on pages 18, 19, 20 & 21, Mr. Zarvin Kasparian offered charts which disclosed that while some \$56,000 had been added to the Church Treasury this year that only some \$1400 was realized from everyday church activities, the balance of some \$54,600 resulted from the sale of the Mrs. Thompson-Thomasian property and interest on our Church Reserve Fund.

Mr. Kasparian also stated that the Parish Council wished to acknowledge the services of Mrs. Marion Aharonian and Mrs. Tina Bilzarain who were involved in the sale of the Thompson-Thomasian property and who served without any fee in this transaction.

There ensued a lengthy discussion on membership and a count as to how many dues paying members there were in 1980 and 1981. Final figures were not available at this time since the Council was still receiving monies for 1981 dues. The voting list for the balloting this year consisted of over 500 names. The need for accuracy by all Parishes in these figures was stressed since they are a part of the formula for assessments as well as determining the number of Diocesan Delegates.

The Chair called for a report from the Auditing Committee. Mr. Bartev J. Bagdasarian, Jr. stated the books had been audited and found in good order. He also stated that a standardized record system was being worked on with the Council to facilitate future audits.

The Assembly voted to accept the report of the Parish Council which also included the financial statements.

The Chair called for discussion of the proposed 1982 Budget. It was noted that no income is anticipated from Baptisms and Funerals. This results from a policy adopted by the Parish Council not to charge for these services which is in keeping with the Assembly's wishes expressed last year. The Assembly voted to approve the actions of the Council in this regard and to urge the Council to continue its study regarding fees for services and sacraments to Church members. After a brief discussion the budget was approved as presented by the Council.

The Assembly then reviewed reports from the Senior Ladies Auxiliary, the Avak Group, the Ekmalian Choir, Armenian School, Sunday Church School, Cultural Organization, Library Committee, Women's Guild, Church School Parent's Association, ACYOA Seniors and ACYOA Juniors.

During the review of the Church School Report, Mrs. Arlene Manos stressed the need for parent paricipation as well as the critical need for assistance in conducting nursery age student classes. There is a curriculum. However, there is a shortage of teachers. There was also some lenthy discussion on the "human resources" available to the parish and the enrollment in our Church School, Armenian School, etc. It was felt that this should be of continuous concern and a motion was made that "the Parish Council" conduct a survey on a continuing basis on our human resources. Motion was seconded and approved by the Assembly.

During the review of the ACYOA Seniors report, Mr. Scott Najarian asked that consideration be given to students over age 18 on payment of church dues. He was invited to attend a Parish Council meeting to state his proposal.

During the review of the Library Committee report, Mr. Ken Krikorian suggested the committee be involved with the preservation of our treasures, a part of which is our library, and also with those involved in the preparation of our 100th. Anniversary observance.

The Chair asked for and receive from the Parish Assembly approval of all reports as submitted.

The Chair called on Mr. William Aslanian to report the results of the balloting, There were 164 ballots cast and the results were as follows:

Mr. Aslanian expressed his appreciation and thanks to all of his Committee members, to the ladies who helped prepare and serve the lunch and to Mr. Ramon Hovsepian who had developed a new system that expedited the tally of the ballots.

On behalf of the Assembly the Chair thanked Mr. Aslanian and his Committee for a job well done.

The Chair then called for "New Business". The first item was a proposal suggested by the Auditing Committee which was offered as a motion as follows:

The Auditing Committee shall consist of four members who will serve for two years and half of whom will be elected in alternate years. At the first election which is today, the two that receive the hightest votes shall serve for two years and the two that receive the next highest votes shall serve for one year. Next year and each year thereafter two of the four members will be elected for two year terms.

The option was seconded and approved by the assembly.

The second item of new business was a suggestion that:

A committee study the feasibility of sponsoring a daily Armenian School in Worcester.

This suggestion was made by Mr. Haroutune Kasparian and supported by Mr. Kenneth Krikorian. After a brief discussion, the Assembly asked Mr. Kasparian to select a committee and to conduct the study and submit a report to the Council.

There being no further business before the Assembly, it was moved we adjourn and the reading of the minutes be waived to permit the Secretary time to prepare them in due form.

The Assembly voted to adjourn at 4:20 p.m. with a closing prayer and blessing from Der Hayr Kochakian.

Scene of the 80th Annual Diocesan Assembly of the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of North America was the Holy Resurrection Armenian Church of New Britain, Connecticut during the period May 4-9, 1982. Approximately 150 Clergy and Lay Delegates attended the convocation as well as church members who participated in sessions of the DRE, Armenian Schools and Women's Organizations. A supreme effort by the parish members of the host church resulted in a highly organized preparation in which all segments functioned for an efficient and satisfying experience.

Clergy Conference

The Diocesan Clergy conference occupied the first two days of the Assembly and their report to the Lay Delegates included the following:

Resolution adopted to petition His Holiness Catholicos Vasken I to permit ordination to the priesthood of three young deacons, now serving in the Diocese, without the requirement of their marriage before ordination.

Resolution that this Diocesan Clergy Conference publicly record its deep concern about the present danger to world peace and even to the existence of humanity and civilization, and its fervent desire that both world super-powers and all governments throughout the world exercise extreme caution and reserve in the production of nuclear weapons and especially maintain by all means the principle of never being the first to use such weapons.

Primate's Message

A summary of the message from His Eminence Archbishop Torkom Manoogian reveals his deep concern for the spiritual and social welfare of his flock. The religious and language education of our young people and the fruition of plans to strengthen the numbers of the clergy body in this Diocese. He mentions the areas of new curriculum preparation for the use of Sunday Schools, the vast amount of published material for Armenian Language teaching and the steps taken to implement the development of new members to the Clergy. These areas are now strongly staffed and financed to promote direct aid at the local level and continuing effort is directed to enhance the quality and approach to enrichment of programs as well as recruitment and education of seminarians.

He mentions the successful conclusion of raising funds to complete payment of the mortage on the Cathedral and Cultural Center and decries the necessity of over a million budget for the current operation of the Diocese. Excerpt from his remarks is the following:

"The changes have been immense, and many of us have been somehow unaware of them; our psychology has been oriented to the old conditions. Our attitudes must change and they must keep changing, because even more profound changes await us in the near future, with the development of new parishes, with the need for new programs, with the evolution of what appears to be a different kind of community, with the necessary revival of the spiritual energies of our people, and perhaps most critically with the undefferable unification of the church in our Diocese which will undoubtedly enhance both the image and mission of our Church."

Elections

Officers of the Assembly were elected and took on their responsibilities for the duration of the Assembly.

Candidates for Diocesan Board of Trustees, Nominating Committee, Proposals, Auditing and Budget Committees were presented and voted.

Upon presentation of candidates for the Office of Primate, balloting was conducted and the Most Reverend Archbishop Torkom Manoogian was reelected for the fifth consecutive term.

Report of The Diocesan Council

It is reported that the number of established, newly organized and mission parishes of the Diocese, including Canada, is sixty. \$2,600,00 is the amount being expended throughout the Diocese for Construction of Church Facilities and Purchase and Sale of Property.

Total number of Clergy in the Diocese is 53, including the Primate, 3 Bishops and 2 Deacons. Additionally there are four students, two retired clergymen and four other clergy serving in various capacities throughout the Diocese. Six parishes with existing houses of prayer are currently without Pastors but expect to have resident pastors in the near future.

A Clergy recruitment committee has been organized and has recently appointed Deacon Michael Chevian as Director of Clergy Recruitment.

The 30th and 40th anniversary of a group of twelve clergymen serving in the Diocese will be celebrated at the 80th Assembly. A Clergy Stipend Committee was appointed to monitor the regulations and implement the guidelines.

Four regional meetings were sponsored by the Council during the year 1981.

Dialogue between the Western and Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Church of America was established by a meeting at the headquarters of the Western Diocese on Dec. 1, 1981. A subsequent meeting is to be held in New York during 1982. Subjects discussed included Exchanges of Information-Orientation of Each Diocese, Joint Action Issues and Exchange of Departmental Information.

On the issue of Holy Cross-Toronto the Assembly voted to accept and ratify the action of the

Primate and Diocesan Council relative to the Parish in Canada which was dissolution of the Parish on February 1, 1982.

The Diocesan Council took the necessary steps to implement the decision of the Supreme Patriarch, His Holiness Vasken I to establish a new Diocese in Canada. Revised By-Laws are being reviewed by the Council prior to submission to His Holiness for ratification.

The Fund Raising Program of the Diocese, Special Bequests and Donations resulted in a total income of about 290,000 dollars most of which is deposited in the Endowment Fund and proceeds of interest will be used by the Diocese for operational needs.

Treasurer's Report

The treasurer's report which was audited by an accounting firm as well as being audited and approved by the Diocesan Auditing Committee listed total assets of \$6,152,031 and liabilities of \$873,620.00 Revenues for the year 1981 were a total of \$1,291,491. with expenses totaling \$1,202,977. showing an excess of \$88,514.

1982 Budget

A balanced budget of \$1,340,000. was presented by the treasurer of the council and had previously been examined by the Budget Committee. Following questions from the floor and after approval of proposals by the delegates to make certain that there would be no budgetary changes the amount indicated was approved.

Proposals

Four amendments to the By-Laws which were approved at the 79th Assembly were re-submitted for the second time and upon approval will be submitted for ratification to His Holiness, Catholicos Vasken I. The proposals involving amendments to Article 14 B, 17, 33-0 and 36 were carried by a majority of the delegates voting.

An amendment submitted initially for a change in Article 62 increasing the number of members in the Diocesan Council from nine to eleven was approved.

Several proposals of an administrative nature were approved and were as follows:

- 1. That a Diocesan Council member visit parishes in the Mid-West region upon request at least once a year.
- 2. Date of Mid-West regional meeting be changed to one other than the winter season.
- 3. Earlier mailing of the Diocesan calendar
- 4. Preparation of Guidelines for uniform performance of Church Sacraments.

Endowment Fund

A report by the executive director of the Armenian Church Endowment Fund indicated total donations received in 1981 as \$376,975. Donations for the Diocese in the Fund now total \$1,246,156 which in 1981 generated \$115,370 for operational expenses of the Diocese.

Resolutions

The assembly approved a resolution condemning all acts of violence and terrorism.

A report of the Courtesies Committee was approved.

Future Assemblies

Site of 1983 (81st) will be St. Joachim and St. Anne Church at Palos Heights, Illinois.

Site of 1984 (82nd) will be Holy Martyrs Church, Bayside, N.Y.

Site of 1985 (83rd) will be St. Leon Church, Fairlawn, N.J.

Unity

A lengthy report by John Najarian, chairman of the Unity Committee was presented to the delegates and asked for approval by this Assembly of a document entitled "Guidelines for the Unification of the Armenian Church in America." It is intended to be and should also be the exact duplicate which will be submitted to the Prelacy assembly in meeting subsequent to the Diocesan Assembly. When and if approved by both bodies, it will serve as the assurance of continuing dialogue between the two parties for an eventual determination of unification.

The Assembly, by a majority vote of delegates present, approved the document as printed but including changes and the addition of one paragraph as advised by a member of the Committee.

PRIMATE'S VISIT AND ORDINATIONS

We continue our membership on the Worcester County Council of Churches and relations with non-Armenian Churches of the area.

We are active participants in the Eastern and Oriental Orthodox and Roman Catholic Dialogue group.

We participated and preached at the group's annual Ecumenical Thanksgiving Service held at St. Georges Cathedral on Sunday, November 21, 1982.

Wednesday, September 22, 1982 we were invited to talk to an Armenian class at Clark University.

Thursday, September 30, 1982 we attended a service and reception at St. Spyridon Greek Orthodox Church to welcome the Greek Patriarch of Jerusalem to the city.

Tuesday, October 12, 1982 we were invited by the City Clerk to say the invocation before the Worcester City Council meeting.

As a member of the St. James Brotherhood of Jerusalem, we and other clergymen had to make an unscheduled trip to the Holy Land from November 29 - December 16, 1982 for special meetings concerning the internal life and administration of our Brotherhood.

They involve the participation of many parishioners whose various talents are co-ordinated by the members of the Parish Council.

For the many gifts of time, talent and monies we have received; for the faith and support displayed by our Parishioners, the Parish Council is indeed grateful.

SUNDAY SCHOOL REPORT

This has been an unusual year in which the Sunday School has been caught up in many changes. Not only do we have new clergy, but there have been changes in the staff and administration of the Sunday School. We truly miss those who left us last year.

We began the school year in September with an enrollment of eighty-eight students, to which three students have been added. Attendance on Sunday morning tends to run between thirty-five and forty-five.

There are nine classes ranging from a preschool/nursery group to the tenth graders who will be graduating this year. Classes vary in size, with serveral groups being combined. There are twelve teachers for the classes, but there is one class that has been without a teacher this year so far. This illustrates our main problem - a need for more people who are willing to donate their time to teach our youth, particularly the older grades.

Each grade is working with a specific curriculum. Each class follows a communion schedule so all of our children have a regular opportunity to participate in the Church Service, and often teachers may choose to bring their children upstairs at other times.

Thanks to many parents and Church members we were able to have a Sunday School Christmas party on December 19th.

It has been a hectic year so far as we have dealt with many changes, and we are still working through the answers to some of the problems we have faced in the transition. Our biggest dilemma has been to find enough teachers to adequately handle especially our older students. This makes us thankful for the dedicated staff and parents we do have.

During the year we have been fortunate to have had the participation and assistance of the Library Committee members and are grateful for their support.

ARMENIAN DAY SCHOOL

Upon accepting the appointment of the Annual Parish Assembly of our Church I was charged with the responsibility of studying the possibilities of establishing an Armenian Day School for the Armenian community of Worcester and reporting back its findings for further development.

A Committee was formed with the following individuals: Vahan Pogharian, Vahram Uluhogian, Sooren Kachadoorian, Linda Agazarian and Haroutune Kasparian.

The Committee met a number of times, visited the principals of AGBU Armenian Day School of Watertown, received consultation from our Primate and other individuals, reviewed the baptismal records, met with the Parish Council, and sent out a questionnaire in November to our parishioners with a cover letter indicating its purpose, philosophy, and objectives. The Committee received only a handful of returns - answered by individuals who do not even have school age children.

In order to determine the possibility of establishing an Armenian Day School beginning with a nursery (ages 3 and 4) and a Kindergarten (5 Years old) the Committee wanted to know if such an undertaking meets the needs and expectations of our community. Upon receiving the questionnaire the Committee was planning to address to the other basic issues like curriculum, staffing, expenses, location, transportation and formation of sub-committees. The responses of our invitation led us to believe reluctantly that our community is not yet ready to accept such a challenge.
